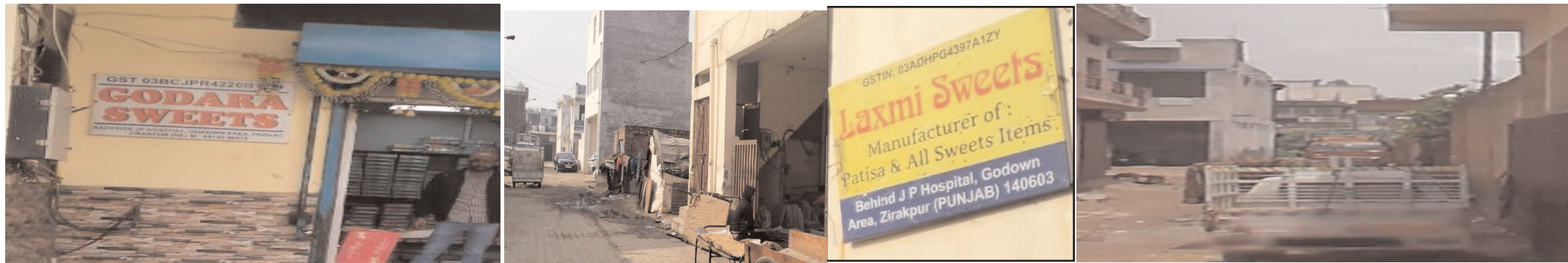

Wholesale sweet manufactures trading stale confectioneries to tricity retailers

Zirakpur : The necessity of legislating Food & Safety Law, FSSAI 2006 was widely felt as the adulteration, and stale food was being medically unchecked and sold sans any fear

and fancy. No manifest of expiry period, date is reflected by the unscrupulous sweet manufacturers, subjecting the consumerism to unprecedented ailments. The food law consoli-

dated various acts and orders, came into being on Sept 5, 2008, but where is its full fledged compliance round the calendar year. No validity on the sweet packages is ever mentioned by the avail-

able wholesalers trader make hay day to exploit the consumerism belt. This trading class stakes the sweets in one go for the scheduled supply to tricity populace, as sweets are always

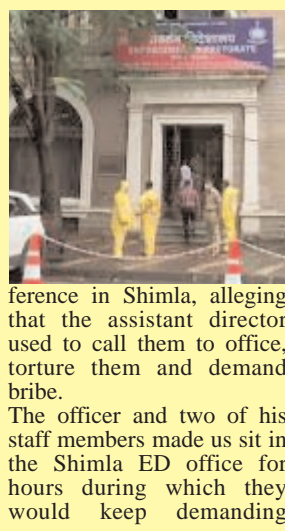
enticing and loved bereft of serious attention to potentially inherent biomolecules of maladies, comments PS Viridi, an health worker on anonymity grounds. All such practice is

adopted since long loose rope is given to these sweets makers where no food safety official tuns up, echoes a trader of sweets manufacturing business in the local town of Z i r a k p u r .

As expected, Health and family welfare department must carry out the execution of frequent raids to ensure disease free stale food. Several scrupulous physicians alleged that food safety, health workers are not conscientious in their frequent raids, as round the year sweets are not daily celebrated, but are a few, wholesaler are running their business and keep staking over the already prepared bulk of sweets.

ED officer booked against recovery of Rs 1Cr from educational institute

Shimla :An assistant director in Enforcement Directorate posted in Shimla was booked by CBI who had escaped during a trap operation conducted by the agency last week, said an CBI official on Monday. The Central Bureau of Investigation has now registered two FIRs with one pertaining to alleged bribe demand of Rs 85 lakh and another of Rs 80 lakh from the promoters of educational institutes in Himachal Pradesh, said the officials of the central agency. The promoters, who were also the complainants in the case, addressed a press con-



ference in Shimla, alleging that the assistant director used to call them to office, torture them and demand bribe. The officer and two of his staff members made us sit in the Shimla ED office for hours during which they would keep demanding money," they alleged. The CBI has three suspects under scanner in the case with the brother of the accused and a middleman already arrested, while the officer is understood to be on the run and has not joined the investigation so far, they said. had brother, a senior manager at the Punjab National Bank in Delhi, had allegedly gone to a location near Chandigarh to receive the bribe from an educational institute promoter, who is facing a probe under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act, the officials said.

Highest figure for clearing stubble burning paid to Punjab - Centre

New Delhi : A mammoth amount of Rs 1681.45 Crores of funds were released ,said minister of state of the Union Ministry of Environment,forest and climate change, to a question raised in the Rajya S a b h a . The amount paid to Punjab was meant to provide subsidy to farmers for purchase of crop residue machinery and the establishment of custom hiring centre (CHCs) for in situ management of paddy straw said Kirti Vardhan Singh, minister of state in the ministry of environment ,forest and climate change. Many states had distributed more than 3 lakh machines



including 4500 balers and rakes used for collection of straws in the form of bales for further ex situ utilisation. The Central Pollution Control Board deployed 26 teams in 16 districts of Punjab and 10 districts of Haryana from Oct 1 to Nov ,30 2024 to intensifying monitoring and enforcement action with regard to stubble burning.

Does really no difference exist between Bhutan and China ?

On December 6, King Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck of Bhutan was on an unprecedented third official visit to India in the last 20 months. No King of Bhutan has come to India that frequently, but there was a reason. This year, Bhutan has been relatively silent about border resolution with China, especially after the previous government had signed a three-step roadmap in January 2023, held three expert group (on the 11th, 12th and 13th) and two joint technical group meetings, all packed in 2023, even as the 10th expert group meeting was held in 2021. The cat was set among the pigeons after the previous PM, Lotay Tshering, in an interview to a Belgian newspaper in March 2023, said: “Soon we will be able to resolve the border issue, including Doklam, as there are no real differences between China and Bhutan.” The Tshering interview triggered alarm bells in New Delhi and a chain of events, including a virtual air-dash by the King for talks with PM Narendra Modi. Following the joint statement which steered clear of the border issues, the then Foreign Secretary Vinay Kwatra said: “India will take all necessary measures to safeguard its national interest.” Modi did some plain-speaking with the King, emphasising that their border disputes with China were intertwined. In the past, Bhutanese officials consulted their Indian counterparts prior to holding border talks with China. Especially regarding Doklam, where, in 2017, New Delhi invoked the India-Bhutan Treaty of Perpetual Friendship 2007 to intervene on Bhutanese territory (which China claims) to prevent the PLA from constructing a road to Gipmochi — its version of the tri-junction between India, Bhutan and China. Tshering said his government had a month left in office, but “it was inching towards an agreement of the border.”

Also, last October, previous Foreign Minister Tandi Dorji had visited Beijing, a first for any Bhutanese minister, and met his counterpart Wang Yi, signed the Cooperation Agreement on Joint Technical Team for Delimitation and Demarcation of Border and endorsed the One-China policy. Wang urged Dorji to establish diplomatic relations with China as Thimphu has none with any P5 country. In 2023, the Tshering government was actually racing (not inching) towards a border resolution. Dorji, after his 25th round of talks in Kunming, told journalists in Thimphu that talks with China had been accelerated. His visit to Beijing and the agreements clinched with China, like the Tshering interviews earlier, shocked India’s security establishment. It forced the King days later to make an unprecedented second visit to India. Being asked to come to New Delhi twice within six months over border issues was plainly discomfiting for the King, though the second visit was disguised as Bhutan’s curtain-raiser for the Gelephu Smart City project. Tshering said: “The first leader the King wanted to discuss Gelephu with was PM Modi.” In the elections held in November last year, Lotay Tshering’s party was eliminated in the first round and Tshering Tobgay became PM in January 2024. Not a word has been heard about the three-step roadmap since then from the new PM or the Foreign Minister. In 2013, PM Jigme Thinley was defeated by Tobgay in elections after he was seen getting closer to China. Clearly, the King was in the loop of the policy shift for an early resolution of the border with China, including the Doklam package deal, delinked from its adverse impact on India’s strategic concerns in the Chumbi valley. ‘Kuensel’, a weekly broadsheet from Thimphu, has reported that young and educated Bhutanese

have been urging the government to establish diplomatic relations with China and resolve the border issue. During my visit to Thimphu and Paro after Doklam, I felt that people were unhappy over the way Doklam was handled as also the economy and presence of Indian soldiers on Bhutanese soil. Thimphu’s \$3-billion economy supports a population of seven lakh Bhutanese, with hydropower as its main source of revenue, and with India financing all its five-year development plans. In fact, this year, the government doubled the Rs 5,000-crore outlay for the 12th plan to Rs 10,000 crore for the 13th plan. Half the population is below 30 years and with 30 per cent unemployment, nearly 15,000 persons left Bhutan in 2023 for Australia, Canada and the US. Gelephu, the King believes, will be the open-sesame to get the young and educated Bhutanese to return. Some believe Gelephu is the King’s idea of a diversion from the vexed border issues and economic hardship. The Gelephu SEZ will have energy and c o m m u n i c a t i o n connectivity, an international airport, a university, a healthcare facility, etc. A new dream city on the India-Bhutan border will soon come up with international aid and assistance to address Bhutan’s declining Gross National Happiness. India is a key player in the project. India’s worry will remain the Doklam package deal, which the Tshering government was on the verge of signing. It would have plunged the Chumbi dagger deeper into the Siliguri corridor, popularly called Chicken’s Neck. While the Tobgay government will go slow on the three-step roadmap, the 26th round of Bhutan-China talks was held quietly at Thimphu in August.

UT captures second slot in energy conservation

The SEEI assesses various factors, including energy consumption patterns, its production, power-saving policies and initiatives, renewable energy usage, infrastructure and overall energy-efficiency practices within a given state, specifically in buildings, industry, transport, municipal and the cross sector. Every year, the BEE divides all states/UTs into four categories based on their Total Final Energy Consumption (TFEC) to enable a rational peer comparison.

Noise pollution lands Diljit Dosanjh show organisers into Rs 15L penalty

CHANDIGARH : The orchestrated concert at the Exhibition Ground in Sector 34 on December 14 has pricked the soul of the organisers. The UT Administration is purportedly gearing up to impose a maximum of penalty on the organisers of the Diljit Dosanjh show for the violation of noise-level restrictions. Out of the range, the noise level had transgressed between 76.1 and 93.1 during the concert. The laid down limit by the Punjab and Haryana High Court had been mandated 75-decibel. The Sub-Divisional Magistrate (SDM) of the area has submitted a detailed report to the Environment Department, which has forwarded its recommendations under the Environment Protection Act to the Administration. A notice will soon be issued to the organisers to seek their response before a final decision is made. They emphasised that giving the organisers a hearing is mandatory under the Act. The Administration is likely to recommend a maximum penalty of Rs 15 lakh for this violation revealed the officials. The High Court had issued strict instructions ahead of the shows, capping noise levels at 75 decibels. Despite the restrictions, noise level at both events of Diljit Dosanjh and AP Dhillon exceeded the permissible limits. The UT Administration had stated in an affidavit submitted before a Division Bench of the Punjab and Haryana High Court, that the



noise levels exceeded the permissible limits during the Diljit Dosanjh concert on December 14. Action under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, and the Noise Pollution Rules had been proposed. To prevent similar issues in the future, it has formed a committee, led by the Deputy Commissioner, to draft a standard operating procedure (SOP) for large gatherings. The SOP will address noise monitoring, traffic management and minimising inconvenience to residents, said the Administration. The authorities will also initiate action against the organisers of the AP Dhillon concert for a similar violation during the show in Sector 25 on December 21. An official said for a maximum time, the noise level remained 80 decibels and reached 85 decibels for a short period. Following complaints from residents and traders in and around Sector 34 about severe traffic congestion, noise pollution and loss to businesses during the Karan Aujla and Diljit Dosanjh concerts, the UT Administration shifted the venue for the AP Dhillon event from Sector 34 to the Rally Ground in Sector 25. It is unlikely to allow any huge gathering in Sector 34 in the future.

Extension provided to “Vivad Se Vishwas Scheme” for one-month

NEW DELHI : The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) extended the due date for determining amount payable from December 31, 2024, to January 31, 2025. The CBDT has put out a notification in this regard on Monday. For resolving pending appeals, the government has extended by a month the due date in the case of income tax disputes under the Vivad Se Vishwas Scheme. In the Union Budget for 2024-25, the Vivad Se Vishwas Scheme was initially announced On September 20, the CBDT notified the Scheme that came into force



with effect from October 1. The Scheme provides for lesser settlement amounts for a 'new appellant' in comparison to an 'old appellant'. Also, it provides for lesser settlement amounts for taxpayers who file declaration on or before January 31, 2025, in comparison to those who file thereafter. This Scheme is another initiative of the government towards litigation management.

Including Prime Minister’s National Relief Fund, Rashtriya Arogya Nidhi, Health Minister’s Discretionary Grant, National Policy for Rare Diseases and Dr Ambedkar Medical Aid Scheme, assist poor patients with healthcare needs at the premier health institute, witnessed materialisation of the government schemes. Besides, the PGI runs Poor Patient Welfare Fund for the underprivileged. In FY 2023-24, Rs 3.24 crore was disbursed to support poor patients under the scheme. In addition, Rs 18.59 crore



worth of medicines were procured under the Janani Shishu Suraksha Karyakaram (JSSK) scheme, benefiting countless mothers and their children. From 2024, the hospital also introduced a cashless treatment programme under the Central Government Health Scheme (CGHS) for beneficiaries. The PGI also operates seven Amrit Pharmacy centres, the highest number of such centres in any public-sector hospital in India. This

coupled with two Jan Aushadi centres help provide generic medicines at significantly lower prices ensuring affordable healthcare to economically disadvantaged individuals. In 2023-24, the PGI provided treatment to 32,000 Ayushman Bharat Yojana beneficiaries with package amount over Rs 130 crore, ensuring that the highest number of patients in Union Territories received essential medical treatments.

Chandigarh Administrator urged for parity of excise duty with Punjab by liquor contractors

CHANDIGARH : Chandigarh Wine Contractors Association (CWCA) comprising president Darshan Singh Kler, secretary Gurinderbir Singh, and legal consultants Shivi Jaiswal and Sachit Jaiswal met the UT Administrator. The delegation apprised the Punjab Governor and UT Administrator Gulab Chand Kataria and raised issues related to the coming Excise Policy 2025-26. The association requested



that the EDP (ex-distillery price) should not be increased and VAT and duty should be reduced and made equal to that of Punjab. The delegation also raised the issue to reduction in EBP (ex-brewery price) so that the people would switch from strong alcohol drinks to

mild ones. The delegation said the revenue of Punjab Excise has increased from Rs 6,000 crore to Rs 10,500 crore whereas Chandigarh faces a revenue loss of Rs 200 crore each year. “This has affected the liquor contractors of Chandigarh. Due to heavy losses, the policy has failed and the contractors were unable to deposit the licence fees, leading to vends being closed throughout the year,” said Kler.

4.29L fined against jumping red light offence in UT

CHANDIGARH : An astounding figure of 4,29,355 challans were issued for the offence. The police collected a whopping Rs 19.70 crore as fine for different traffic offences this year. Red light jumping has emerged as the leading traffic violation in the UT this year, accounting for 48.41% of the total 8,86,881 challans issued till November 18. While red light jumping led the chart, overspeeding wasn’t far behind. With 1,29,545 challans, it became the second most common offence followed closely by violation of stopping vehicles on zebra crossing, which saw 94,824 challans. Helmetless riding also remained rampant on the city roads. This year, 81,957 challans were issued to riders and pillion riders without



helmet. Among them, women riders were caught in significant numbers — 6,722 were fined for riding without helmet, and 43,852 for riding pillion without the protective headgear. Wrong parking, too, remained a common sight in the city, leading to 30,969 challans. Meanwhile, social media played a significant role in traffic enforcement. The traffic police’s social media cell issued 8,331 challans based on photos of violations sent by vigilant citizens. Behind the enforcement effort were the city’s high-resolution CCTV cameras, silently

capturing traffic offenders in action. A total of 7,38,703 challans were issued through the cameras. The official data further revealed only 68 challans were issued for underage driving. The high number of challans issued for offences like red light jumping and helmetless riding underscores the need for better road safety awareness. “The emphasis must shift from enforcement to education. Building a culture of responsible driving, respecting traffic rules, and prioritising safety can make Chandigarh roads safer for everyone. This year’s numbers are not just statistics but call for action by citizens and the authorities alike,” said Harman Singh Sidhu, president, ArriveSafe, an NGO on road safety.

NEW DELHI : "It is clarified that as on date there is no such move by the @IncomeTaxIndia department, to crack down on tax evaders" it said on X. The Income Tax department on Monday said it is not looking at Digi Yatra data to crack down on tax evaders. The I-T department in a post on X refuted reports which stated that the Digi Yatra data will be used to crack down on tax evaders. Based on Facial Recognition Technology (FRT), Digi Yatra provides for contactless, seamless movement of passengers at various check points at airports.



The data shared by a passenger for Digi Yatra is stored in an encrypted format. For availing the service, a passenger has to register his or her details on the Digi Yatra app using Aadhaar-based validation and a self-image capture. In the next step, the boarding pass has to be scanned and the credentials are shared with the airport. Digi Yatra is managed

by Digi Yatra Foundation. Its shareholders are Airport Authority of India (AAI), Cochin International Airport Ltd (CIAL), Bangalore International Airport Ltd (BIAL), Delhi International Airport Ltd (DIAL), Hyderabad International Airport Ltd (HIAL) and Mumbai International Airport Ltd (MIAL).

"Based on feedback from past years, it is also essential to continuously improve the examination process to provide a better, more efficient and conducive environment for students taking CUET. In this spirit, the UGC has constituted an expert committee to review the conduct of CUET-UG and CUET-PG for 2025," said Kumar. "The committee has examined various aspects of

the test, such as its structure, number of papers, duration of test papers, syllabus alignment and operational logistics. The commission considered these recommendations in a recent meeting," he added. The UGC chief informed that the commission will soon release a draft proposal detailing the revised guidelines for conducting CUET-UG and CUET-PG 2025, inviting feedback and suggestions from students, parents teachers and institutions. In the first edition of the exam in 2022, CUET-UG was plagued by technical glitches. Also, as a result of tests for a subject being conducted over multiple shifts, the scores had to be normalised during the announcement of results. The exam was conducted in hybrid mode for the first time in 2024. It was cancelled across Delhi a night before it was to be held citing logistical reasons.

Naxalism will be wiped out from country by March 2026: Amit Shah

We fear Sambhal will lose its identity as they try to turn the country's oldest Mughal-era mosque into a temple," a 56-year-old school teacher from the minority community said on Thursday as a house was being emptied in anticipation of men and machines who had vowed to bring it down, reports Kanwardeep Singh. Sambhal's Samajwadi Party MP Zia Ur Rehman Barq is facing mounting legal troubles.

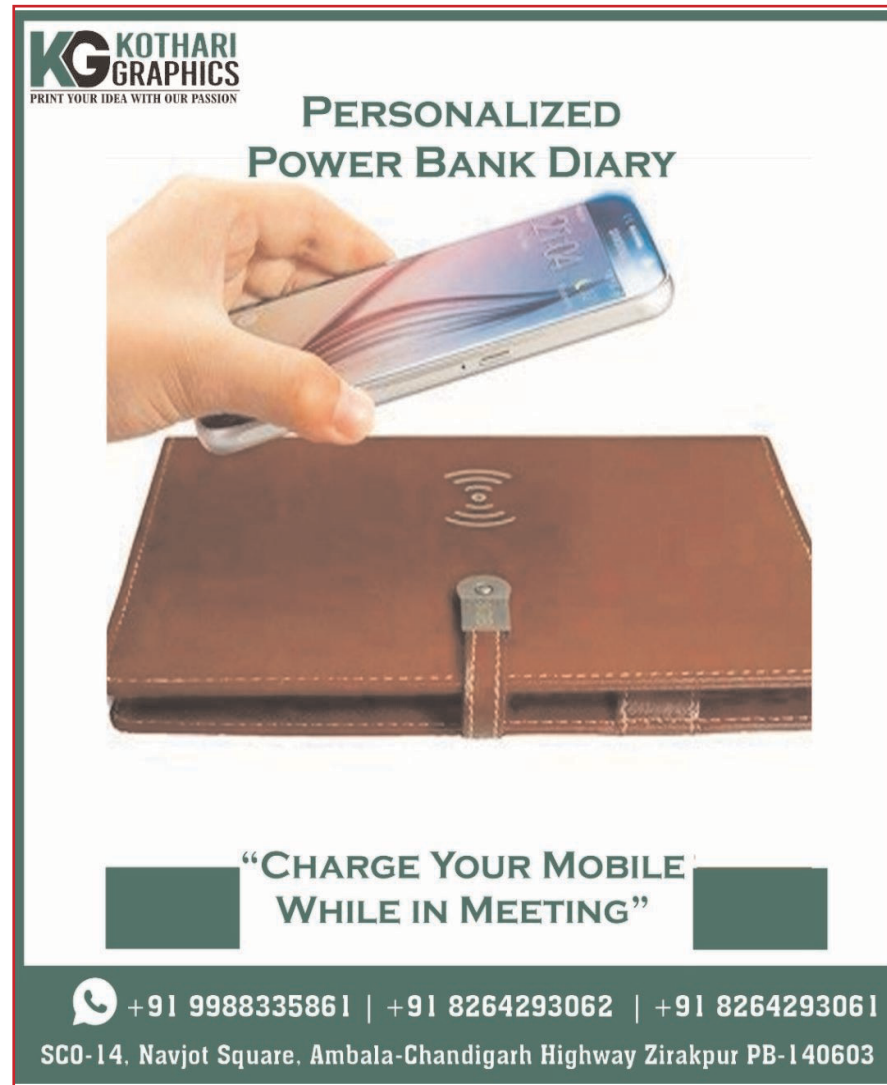
