Two leaders were seen in a huddle with President Xi Jinping at the SCO venue, earlier too were seen discussing various issues in the car.

President Trump may not visit India this year for Quad summit

New Delhi :Despite the acceptance of India's invitation had in June said that US President Donald Trump had accepted Prime Minister Narendra Modi's invitation to visit India for the Quad Leaders' Summit later this year, but according to a New York Times report Trump may not be visiting India this fall. There is, however, no confirmation from New Delhi or Washington on the proposed visit. Both countries were expected to complete the negotiations over the bilateral trade agreement and wrap up the deal during Trump's visit to



India. India was one of the first countries to start discussions over a trade deal with the US way back in February, but President Trump has taken exception to India's purchase of Russian oil and levied an extra 25 per cent tariff on top of the reciprocal tariff of 25 per cent imposed on India. US halted talks and held back from sending its team to New Delhi for

another round of negotiations scheduled on August 25. Sources in the Commerce and Industry Ministry in New Delhi too said it was not practical to hold trade talks with the additional 25 per cent tariffs being imposed on India's exports to the US. As per a NYT report on Saturday, which cited people aware of the President's schedule, "After telling (Indian Prime Minister Narendra) Modi that he would travel to India later this year for the Quad summit, Mr. Trump no longer has plans to visit in the fall, according to people familiar with the president's schedule."

The local masses gathered on 1st September to see the painful bare crumbling (pictures in photograph) of the residential structures . Never has there been

calamitous attack of rain as now being faced by us, bemoaned Suresh Kumar, a victim family member of the village. The house has started caving in, how can we stay and ignore, our life is unsafe said another family member. No one is coming to shelter our family members, comprising 5 constituents. We have raised through Panchayat members our voice before district administration for our economic reconstruction. In P' kula, several roads have



been battered by the persistent rains as Ghagar river touched it's danger mark. The bridge in Raipur Rani block between Alipur and Khatouli was destroyed, damaging direct access.

Commuters were asked to follow Mauli - Raipur Rani route, Mattala road, must not adopt Khatouli route, the road near Vikas Nagar too was seen broken causing traffic jams. In order to breath peacefully, the Chandigarh administration had open the flood gates, of Sukhna Lake on Monday after

the water level crossed the danger mark of 1163 ft. Mr Manjit Singh Brar, chief secretary in charge directed officials to continuously assess and monitor the situation particularly vulnerable points. Situation has deteriorated as the city had 3 major choes, like Sukhna Choe, N Choe, and Patiala ki Rao started overflowing, severely impacting the National slop of the drainage system triggering the Civic Body to remain round the clock on alert.

Rick Sanchez slams Donald Trump for imposing 50% tariff on India

Washington : Rick Sanchez American journalist and political commentator who hosts 'The Sanchez Effect' on Russia, rubbished the United States' decision to impose tariffs on India for its purchase of Russian crude oil, labelling it as a "disrespectful and ignorant policy."

Mr Sanchez accused Donald Trump of sometimes making decisions based on "grudges and non-scientific thinking."

Sanchez asserted that "India's the big boy, not a schoolchild" and its push-back against US pressure marks a "cataclysmic, transformational moment" that will be viewed by historians as a point when global



power began to shift from the West to the global South in which the premier countries are going to be India and China, along with Russia, South Africa and Brazil. Sanchez stated Trump's decision to impose a total of 50% in tariffs on Indian goods, including a 25% secondary tariff for importing Russian oil, appears to be based on "personal vendettas" rather than sound geopolitical strategy.

Australia sees anti-immigration rallies, govt deplores them for 'spreading hate'

Sydney : Thousands of Australians joined anti-immigration rallies across the country, including its most populous city Sydney, on Sunday, even as the government said these 'March for Australia' events were spreading racism, hatred and were linked to neo-Nazis. Promotional material for the 'March for Australia' rallies included flyers that pointed specifically towards Indian-born residents, who form over 3% of Australia's total population, with their numbers having doubled from 2013 to 2023 to reach around 8.5 lakh (845,800 as per latest census). "More Indians in 5 years, than Greeks and Italians in 100...



This isn't a slight cultural change — it's replacement plain and simple," opined the flyers. The March for Australia website says mass migration has "torn at the bonds that held our communities together". The group said on X that it wants to do what mainstream politicians "never have the courage to do". that is, "demand an end to mass

immigration". The group claims no political affiliation and describes itself as "a grassroots, organic effort to unite Australians around a common cause ending mass immigration". "Recent claims have been made by various groups attempting to take ownership of March For Australia or attach their own agendas to it. We wish to make it clear: the organisers are not members of, nor acting on behalf of, any other group," it posted recently. Australia is largely a country of immigrants; around half its people are either born overseas or have a parent born overseas, according to revelation of data.

Compounding regime of synthetic milk

human body causing swelling in the eyes and many other complication in the liver and kidney. The journey of synthetic milk, now a days, has been heading from urban area to rural populace to acclimatise to their propensities. Our nation has been notoriously becoming famous, leaving concentration away from genuine natural milk. Japan's top trade negotiator cancels trip to U.S. over trade deal issues

Tokyo : Japan's top trade negotiator Ryosei Akazawa canceled a trip to the United States on Thursday over issues related to the U.S.-Japan trade deal. Hayashi said Tokyo will urge the U.S. to amend its presidential order on reciprocal tariffs as soon as possible, and ask Washington to issue a presidential order to lower tariffs on automobiles and auto parts. The White House has an executive order setting the baseline tariff rate for Japan at 15%, but there has not been a written confirmation cutting the tariff rate for automobiles to 15% from 25%. Separately, Bank of Japan board member Junko Nakagawa said on Thursday that although tariff negotiations between the two sides have resulted in an agreement, many uncertainties remain.



He warned that exports and industry production are projected to be negatively affected in Japan "for the time being," saying that there will be a "reactionary decline" in light of front-loading from U.S. tariffs. Corporate profits are also expected to decline, mainly in manufacturing sector, Nakagawa said, "reflecting the effects of the deterioration in export profitability due to the increase in U.S. tariffs and of slowdown in overseas economies."

US federal court strikes down Trump's tariff as illegal

Washington : Donald Trump audaciously claimed unlimited power to bypass Congress and impose sweeping taxes on foreign products. The US court of appeals for the Federal Circuit ruled on Friday (29 Aug) that Mr Trump went too far when he declared "National Emergency " to justify imposing sweeping import taxes on almost every country on earth. The ruling has been a big set back for Mr Trump whose erratic trade policies have rocked financial markets , paralysed business with uncertainty raised fear of higher prices and slower economic growth. The court's decision centres on the tariffs Mr Trump slapped in April on almost all U.S. trading partners and levies he imposed before that on China, Mexico and Canada. Mr. Trump on April 2 — Liberation Day, he called it — imposed so-called reciprocal



tariffs of up to 50% on countries with which the United States runs a trade deficit and 10 per cent baseline tariffs on almost everybody else. The President later suspended the reciprocal tariffs for 90 days to give countries time to negotiate trade agreements with the United States — and reduce their barriers to American exports. Some of them did — including the United Kingdom, Japan and the European Union — and agreed to lopsided deals with Mr. Trump to avoid even bigger tariffs.

China is fair weather friend, caution stays

India has made substantive concessions to China on the border to deter a two-front situation. Turning a blind eye to Beijing's open-ended military and operational assistance to Rawalpindi during Operation Sindoor, which is widely acknowledged by the international community; subsequently compared to what Pakistan has said and what it will do as a lower riparian of the Indus river, India has been relatively reticent about China's Medog mega project on the Brahmaputra river. China has helped in creating two inimical trilaterals on India's eastern and western frontiers: China, Pakistan and Bangladesh; and China, Pakistan and Afghanistan. The collateral of Operation Sindoor is the dent in India US relations and the assault on its strategic sovereignty. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has rescheduled indefinitely his trip to the US to sign the new 10-year Defence Framework Agreement with his US counterpart Pete Hegseth. The India-US 2 plus 2 (foreign and defence ministers) and the QUAD summit in Delhi planned in November are under a cloud. Modi has decided not to attend the United Nations General Assembly next month. In this, Jaishankar calling the changed geopolitical context a tactical reset with Beijing was not surprising. Jaishankar's back-to-back meetings with Wang and his Russian counterpart Sergei Lavrov have not gone unnoticed in Washington. Instead, then Army Chief, Gen Mukund

Naravane, was left in the lurch during the critical phase of the operation, bound by the highest authority's restriction, "not to be the first to open fire." India should have done a Sum-dorong Chu on Kailash; instead, it surrendered the advantage. Since then, Delhi has been Dep-driven to follow Beijing's play-(book on qualified disengagement. This has locked Indian troops, mostly on Indian territory in No-Patrolling Buffer Zones, with India forfeiting access to several patrolling points and herdsman losing grazing rights. During his August 18 meeting with Chinese Foreign Minister and Special Representative Wang Yi, Jaishankar said: "It is essential that the de-escalation process should move forward." The Chinese do not use the term de-escalation. The first India-China agreement after Galwan on September 10, 2020 refers only to disengagement. India began reading the tea leaves soon after the Trump 2.0 inauguration, and began to subtly reset ties with China without simultaneously strengthening deterrence. Chinese envoy to India Xu Feihong lambasted the US for bullying India and called for a renewed partnership with it. The strategic guidance provided by President Xi Jinping and Modi at their summit meetings has failed to infuse trust into the three Mutuals: Mutual Respect, Mutual Sensitivity, Mutual Interest. China has a habit of carrying out incremental incursions: Chumar (2013), sang (2014), Doklam (2017), East Ladakh (2020). India's only kinetic initiative,

Operation Snow Leopard, in August 2020, was a brilliant enveloping operation on both shoulders of the Pangong Tso Lake - Indian troops occupied the dominating strategic Kailash heights, which they should not have vacated but retained as negotiating leverage. Fools rush in where angels fear to tread -- this is the epigram that the Ministry of External Affairs will challenge over the speed at which India is normalising ties with China despite Beijing's gross violations of agreements and protocols on keeping the LAC peaceful and tranquil. Foreign Minister S. Jaishankar has repeatedly questioned China's "inscrutable" behaviour in 2020 when it amassed troops on the border and attempted transgressions which were thwarted. In fact, the PLA occupied its proclaimed 1959 claim line, which Delhi has not admitted it did. Last week, Jaishankar was in Moscow, meeting Russian leaders after "the complex geopolitical situation" that emerged following Operation Sindoor and the imposition of US President Trump's tariffs, which implied a pause in the Comprehensive Global Strategic India-US Partnership. Prime Minister Narendra Modi is visiting China for the SCO summit this weekend. On August 17, White House Trade Adviser, Peter Navarro, said that Delhi was now "cosying up to both Russia and China" and should "act as a strategic partner (of the US) to be treated as one." Before this, no US government official had publicly questioned the vitality of India-US ties.

Opposition brands Rs 125-crore grant a meagre, Mayor thanks all contributors

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The thanks giving meeting for all who contributed is being planned amid the Opposition attack. The opposition have demanded a white paper on the MC's financial health over the past 10 years. Accusing the BJP-led MC of not improving the financial condition of the civic body and terming the grant meagre. Politics over Rs 125-crore grant given to the Municipal Corporation (MC) has intensified with Mayor Harpreet Kaur Babla considering convening a special meeting of the MC House to pass a resolution on thanking Union Home Minister Amit Shah and Punjab Governor and UT Administrator Gulab Chand Kataria for approving the amount. The Mayor has criticised the members of the Congress-AAP alliance for their stand over the grant. The grant is a significant step toward improving the city infrastructure, she said, adding that she expected all Opposition councillors to attend the special meeting



and thank the Central Government and the Administrator for their support to the civic body. She said both the AAP and the Congress were not interested in the city's development and the politics over everything. Vijay Pal Singh, president of city AAP, described the claims by the Mayor and the BJP over the grant as "misleading and an attempt to confuse the public". He said the Rs 125-crore package released to the Municipal Corporation was not a BJP achievement, rather, it is taxpayers' money re-appropriated by the UT Administration from the Electricity Department's 'Material and Supplies' head under 'Grant-in-Aid'. Misrepresenting this as a political accomplishment to mislead citizens is wrong, he claimed.

Nine illegal structures razed in Panchkula



Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA : During the pulverizing action, nine damp-proof structures were demolished in two colonies situated in Kona and Gorakhnath villages, Kalka. The operation was carried under the guidance of Deputy Commissioner Monika Gupta and the leadership of District Town Planner Babita Gupta. The District Town Planning team carried out the operation in the Urban Area to remove illegal building.

Sharing details, Town planner said prior notices had been issued by the department, but as the defaulters failed to remove the illegal constructions, the department was compelled to take action. She added that if any construction or colony is developed without prior permission from the Director, Town and Country Planning Department, Haryana, strict legal action will be taken against the violators.

25th lakh tractor from Mohali routed out by Swaraj Mahindra

facility in Mohali. Swaraj's journey began in 1974 with the launch of its first model 'Swaraj 724' in the 20-25 HP category marking the debut of India's first indigenously designed and manufactured tractor. Having marked a 5-lakh production milestone in 2002, it grew fivefold in 23 years.

Tree felling, illegally logs being sold, probe ordered by NGT

Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA : In accordance with an application submitted by Hardik Bhanot, unidentified individuals were cutting trees for commercial purposes on land protected under the Punjab Land Preservation Act, 1900 (PLPA), where such activities are strictly prohibited. The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has taken cognisance of alleged illegal tree felling in a garden located in Bhainsa Tibba village, Sector 3, Mansa Devi Complex. During the hearing held on July 29 before the Principal Bench in New Delhi, a three-member bench comprising chairperson Justice Prakash Shrivastava, Dr A. Senthil Vel, and Dr Afroz Ahmad heard submissions from the applicant's counsel, Siddharth Mittal and Sumit Kumar Sharma. The applicant supported his allegations with specific khasra number details and submitted video footage (Annexure A-4) as evidence of the illegal felling, which he reportedly witnessed on



December 19, 2024. He also claimed to have seen logs being transported for commercial gain. The tribunal has issued notices to the respondents and directed the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (PCCF), Panchkula, to conduct an immediate site inspection. The PCCF has also been asked to prevent any further illegal activity and take action against the responsible individuals if the claims are substantiated. A separate action taken report must be filed by the PCCF at least one week before the next hearing scheduled on October 30. The NGT has also instructed the applicant to serve notice to all respondents and file an affidavit of service accordingly.

Urgent flood relief package for Punjab, clamours opposition leader Warring to PM Modi



Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : In a letter to PM Modi, Amarinder Singh Raja Warring, Punjab Congress president stated that almost the entire state of Punjab has been devastatingly hit by floods, with no immediate reprieve in sight, as more rains are predicted for the next few days. The opposition leader has sought the immediate intervention of the Prime Minister for an "urgent" flood relief package for Punjab, as the floods have caused havoc and devastation across the state. Referring to Inter-Ministerial Committee constituted by the Union Home Ministry to assess flood losses in different states, he noted that these

efforts will take time, while people need relief right away. Seeking an "urgent" flood relief package for Punjab, he mentioned that the estimated loss runs into thousands of crores. Over 1,300 villages have been affected so far, and standing paddy crops, almost ready for harvesting, remain inundated, with little hope of saving or retrieving anything. "We don't seek any special treatment, despite being a frontline border state that has stood guard for the entire nation and

provided food security to the whole country. We only seek our rightful due," he urged the Prime Minister. He added, "The same paddy crops that have filled the stomachs of crores of people across the country are on the verge of destruction. This is a natural calamity with unimaginable devastation. It's time for the country to stand by Punjab and Punjab farmers." Warring also expressed apprehension about the outbreak of diseases in flood-hit areas, as well as the erosion of fertile soil. He demanded that farmers in the affected areas be provided with fertilisers free of cost for at least the next two seasons.

GMADA launches its housing project in 317 acres land



Commissioner News Service MOHALI : The residential project by GMADA has been divided in two parts: Part A covering 322 acres and Part B 398 covering 398 acres. The development authority will be seeking environmental clearances and consent to establish after hiring a consultant for the project. Residential, commercial and institutional properties will be offered in the land of Rasulpur, Salampur, Dhodemajra, Takkipur, Rajgarh, Majra, Kartarpur, Kansala and Hoshiarpur villages, which comprise of upcoming Ecocity-3 in Kharar sub division. The Development Authority has initiated the process to develop a low density and high-end residential apartment in 317 acres of New Chandigarh

area. Decks are being cleared to carry out the environmental impact assessment study for the project and get a consultant on board for the project. Officials said the environmental clearances from the MOEF of the government of India and consent to establish will be applied for in the coming months. Also on cards is the development of 720 acres in Ecocity-3. Meanwhile, Ecocity-2 (Extension) scheme is up

and running in New Chandigarh. The new township will have residential and commercial plots on 96 acres land. Around 29 acres have been kept for open spaces, green buffer, and roads. 17 acres is earmarked for residential plots, 10 acres for four group housing societies (2.50acre each), four acre for school, and seven acre for a park. A commercial pocket of five acres has also been earmarked in the project. Officials said 153 residential plots of different sizes, with maximum of 110 plots of 500sq yards will be on offer. In commercial area, 68 plots of varying sizes will be on offer with a maximum of 38 plots measuring 3844.46sqm (saleable) total area.

Disaster management funds to procure and modernise fire safety equipments



Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : A meeting of the Fire and Rescue Services Committee was held under the chairmanship of MC councillor Maheshinder Singh Sidhu. More than 105 suggestions were received from the public, which were formally placed before the committee for consideration. The committee has reviewed the proposal for adopting provisions of the Haryana Fire Safety Act for Chandigarh. During detailed deliberations, the committee expressed

concern over the safety and security of the people and showed keen interest in taking robust and prompt decisions on fire safety measures. It was decided to procure and modernise fire safety equipment through the disaster management funds to ensure rapid emergency response. A presentation by

department officers on the existing infrastructure, preparedness and additional requirements for effective coverage was also shown. The committee also charted out a provisional plan of safety measures, which includes upgrading of fire hydrant systems and their regular maintenance, introducing awareness drives in residential, commercial and institutional areas on preventive fire safety practices.

Aadhaar Enable Biometric Attendance System at private colleges ?

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The Department of High Education (DHE) is planning to ask the private colleges to follow suit. Having implemented the Department of Personnel orders for mandatory Aadhaar Enable Biometric Attendance System at local government college the department is considering compliance of biometrics attendance at private colleges. The Department of Personnel had asked, in February, all departments, boards, corporations under the UT Administration to implement the biometric attendance, and in March the government college authorities began the process. As the new session in



local colleges begins this month, the DHE is now considering asking the private colleges to follow the same attendance system. Several private colleges affiliated with Panjab University are not directly under the DHE, but are relevant to higher education in Chandigarh considering receiving aid and technical guidelines besides following the lines of the University Grants Commission. "The discussions are most likely to start next month with the higher officials in the department (DHE). Our office may have already written to the private colleges, but

the department will be involving the private college managements only after discussing the matter with the higher authorities. Since local colleges partially functions under the banner of DHE, the rule shall be ideally extended to all the educational institutions but we cannot just ignore the UGC guidelines as well. We have to wait till next week," said a highly placed official, requesting anonymity. Meanwhile, the plan has received a mixed response from the heads of the private colleges. Though many appreciated the introduction of the programme, they opted to remain tight-lipped when asked about its implementation in their respective colleges.

Presidential reference on deadlines for Governors

New Delhi : The Supreme Court is hearing the Presidential reference case on timelines and procedures for the President and State Governors when considering Bills passed by State legislatures.
A Constitution Bench comprising Chief Justice of India (CJI) BR Gavai, Justice Surya Kant, Justice Vikram Nath, Justice PS Narasimha and Justice Atul S Chandurkar is hearing the case.
The Supreme Court's judgment of April 8 was rendered in a case filed by the State of Tamil Nadu against the Tamil Nadu Governor.
In the judgment, the apex court ruled that the absence of a time limit under Article 200 to decide on bills passed by the State legislature could not be interpreted to allow indefinite delay.
A Bench of Justices JB Pardiwala and R Mahadevan held that the Governor must



act within a reasonable time and that constitutional silence could not be used to stall the democratic process.
With regard to the President's powers under Article 201, the Court held that her decision-making is not beyond judicial scrutiny and must occur within three months. If there is any delay beyond that period, reasons must be recorded and communicated to the concerned State.
Following the ruling, President Murmu referred fourteen questions to the Supreme Court, raising constitutional concerns

about the Court's interpretation of Articles 200 and 201. The reference argued that the Court is not empowered to prescribe deadlines, and that the notion of "deemed assent" in the event of delay is not contemplated by the Constitution.
The reference also underscored that legislative functions are separate from judicial powers, and that directions of the kind issued in the Tamil Nadu Governor's judgment risk upsetting the balance between the three branches of government.
The Kerala and Tamil Nadu governments have opposed the reference as not maintainable.
On the other hand, the Central government has supported the reference, arguing that the power of Governors and the President to act on Bills is a "high prerogative" function which cannot be bound by judicial timelines.

US federal court strikes down Trump's tariff as Illegal

Washington : Donald Trump audaciously claimed unlimited power to bypass Congress and impose sweeping taxes on foreign products.

The US court of appeals for the Federal Circuit ruled on Friday (29 Aug) that Mr Trump went too far when he declared "National Emergency " to justify imposing sweeping import taxes on almost every country on earth.

The ruling has been a big set back for Mr Trump whose erratic trade policies have rocked financial markets , paralysed business with uncertainty raised fear of higher prices and slower economic growth.

The court's decision centres on the tariffs Mr. Trump slapped in April on almost all U.S. trading partners and levies he imposed before that on



China, Mexico and Canada.

Mr. Trump on April 2 — Liberation Day, he called it — imposed so-called reciprocal tariffs of up to 50% on countries with which the United States runs a trade deficit and 10 per cent baseline tariffs on almost everybody else. The President later suspended the reciprocal tariffs for 90 days to give countries time to negotiate trade agreements with the United States — and reduce their barriers to

American exports. Some of them did — including the United Kingdom, Japan and the European Union — and agreed to lopsided deals with Mr. Trump to avoid even bigger tariffs. Those that didn't knuckle under — or otherwise incurred Mr. Trump's wrath — got hit harder earlier this month. Laos got rocked with a 40% tariff, for instance, and Algeria with a 30% levy. Mr. Trump also kept the baseline tariffs in place.

Mayor Harpreet Babla seems overjoyed for approval of just Rs 125 Cr

Chandigarh : Harpreet Babla the Mayor had previously distributed sweets and informed the public through the media about approvals of Rs 92 crore and Rs 238 crore. However, celebrating the receipt of only Rs 125 crore, against an expectation of Rs 330 crore, is baffling. Instead of rejoicing said Prem Lata, the President of Aam Aadmi Party Mahila wing Chandigarh.

The electorates of Chandigarh want to know whether Chandigarh's development is possible with just Rs 125 crore. For a long time, the people of Chandigarh, political parties, and MP Manish Tewari have been demanding adequate funds from the Center. The MP had even raised this issue forcefully in Parliament. In this context, the Mayor's photo-shoot with her party leader and the Administrator to take credit for the mere Rs 125 crore approval is a betrayal of the public and the MP. The Mayor is advised to work with the MP and all political parties to secure the remaining Rs 205 crore, rather than forgetting her responsibility toward the city in the spurt of joy of this partial approval. Moreover,



doesn't the pain of over 600 municipal employees losing their jobs during her tenure weigh on her conscience? These employees' families have been deprived of their livelihood. Additionally, regarding the proposal to transfer V3 roads from the Municipal Corporation to the Administration, despite the opposition's demand for a vote and having a majority, the proposal was passed by having bouncers remove opposition members from the House. The Mayor must answer why a fellow councillor—elected by the public like her—who stood at her seat demanding a vote on transferring V3 roads to the Administration, was allegedly removed by bouncers and thrown out of the House. This is a murder of democracy and reminds people of the Anil Masih vote theft scandal. The people of Chandigarh expect accountability of the Mayor.

Thai Prime Minister Shinawatra removed from office

Bangkok(Thailand) – Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra has been removed by the Thai Constitutional court from office after finding her guilty of ethical misconduct over a controversial phone call with Cambodia's former leader, Hun Sen.

The ruling on Friday makes Paetongtarn the fifth prime minister to be stripped of office by Thai judges since 2008, and plunges the kingdom into political uncertainty and potentially a snap election.

The nine-judge court, seen as tools of Thailand's royalist military establishment, ruled that the 39-year-old politician had "seriously violated" the ethical standards required of a prime minister when she spoke to Hun Sen during an escalating border conflict between the two countries.

In the leaked conversation, Paetongtarn was heard pandering to Hun Sen and calling him "uncle", while criticising a senior Thai army commander as an "opponent".



The border dispute later spiralled into armed clashes that left dozens dead and tens of thousands displaced on both sides.

The court – which had previously suspended Paetongtarn pending trial – said the politician had put her personal interests over those of the nation during her conversation with Hun Sen, fuelling a loss of public trust and confidence in her leadership.

Paetongtarn insisted that she had tried to safeguard the country's interests and called for political unity. "My intentions were for the benefit of the country, not for personal gain, but for the lives of the people, including civilians and soldiers," she emphasised.

Act of defamation, vulgar abuses by former woman worker

Dhakoli : A woman worker named Minakshi d/o Pardeep Sharma on 30 Aug, Sunday night, exercised her personal liberty but against IPC section 499/500 and BNS section 356 directly defaming and damaging the professional reputation of the Asso Editor of "The Commissioner " newspaper. With the compilation of the primary facie evidence from the whatsapp screen shots , the summed up details of obscene act were sent to the Station House Officer for urgent action .

The defamation act entails IPC section 499/500, involving punishment against offender with 2 years imprisonment . Under recent



framing of BNS section 356, defamation as making an imputation about the offender's intent of harming the reputation having visible representations. The issuance of threat by the offender at night 1048 pm on August, read " abhi aa kr julus kaddati hun, commis-

sioner office ke saamne " besides several vulgar abuses she continued her attacks as guided by her father Pardeep Sharma.

The disruption in the official functioning in surfaced as she continued abusing for 3, 4 hrs and even on noon next day Sunday . The deputed investigating officer Mr Baljit Singh studied the minutes of the screen shots exhibit ed in the complaint of the Asso Editor. He assured the aggrieved party legal action would be taken in pursuance with the appropriate constitutional clauses as the reputational damage was visible in the perceptible WhatsApp conversational emergence.

Why is Trump targeting India with tariffs ? - Ex RBI Governor

New Delhi :Raghuram Rajan , Governor of Reserve Bank of India, has said that US President Donald Trump's decision to impose steep tariffs, including a 50% duty on Indian goods, is part of a wider strategy that goes beyond trade economics.

Apprising Rajdeep Sardesai, Consulting Editor, India Today TV, Rajan explained that tariffs are being used not only as a trade tool but also as a means of exerting political and economic power.

Rajan said there were several reasons behind Trump's



tariff push. "I think certainly he believes that a current account deficit, trade deficit is evidence that other countries are taking advantage of the United States rather than sending goods cheaply to the United States, which the US consumer benefits from," he said.

According to him, Trump has held this view since the 1980s, when he was critical of Japan. Rajan pointed out

that the former US President sees tariffs as a way to "level the playing field."

Another reason, Rajan noted, is Trump's belief that tariffs act as a tax on outsiders rather than on US consumers. "Therefore it's a cheap way of getting revenues, which can then help offset some of the tax cuts that he has made," Rajan said.

He added that tariffs were also increasingly being seen as a tool of force. "It can be a way for the US to essentially use force when it doesn't want to use its military," Rajan said. He cautioned that the outcome is often that "other countries suffer."
