Narendra Modi calls meeting of state leaders for discussion on G20 summit

NEW DELHI : Among the attendees all political leaders, who made their presence included like former Prime Minister H D Deve Gowda, West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, Odisha CM Naveen Patnaik, Delhi CM Arvind Kejriwal, Andhra Pradesh CM Y S Jagan Mohan Reddy, CPM leader Sitaram Yechury, former Andhra CM Chandrababu Naidu, Tamil Nadu CM M K Stalin, Tamil Nadu CM MK Stalin met PM Modi during the all-party meeting and said that Tamil Nadu will offer its full support and cooperation to Union Govt in conducting the G20 meetings dealing with



various sectors. After the meeting, Yechury said on Twitter that he has raised some issues that needed serious consideration. India's G20 presidency comes at a time when the war in Ukraine has roiled Europe and disrupted food and supply lines. India has been vocal in calls for an early end to the conflict. Prime Minister Narendra Modi was seen greeting CPI National General Secretary D

Raja. At the meeting, PM Modi emphasised the importance of teamwork. He sought the cooperation of all leaders. TMC supreme Mamata Banerjee, who is also the West Bengal Chief Minister, said at the meeting that the G-20 presidency was not about one party's agenda but of the entire country, India officially assumed the G20 presidency on December 1. G-20 comprises Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Mexico, Russia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, Turkey, the UK, the US.

Replace interlocking tiles with perforated tiles, directs NGT

MOHALI : Strong note of the concretization of open space, pedestrian paths, and strangulating trees has been taken by the authorities of National Green Tribunal, and ordered the use of perforated tiles permitting percolation of water instead of interlocking tiles. A Joint Committee comprising principal secretary, ministry of urban development, Punjab, principal chief conservator of forests, state PCB and deputy commissioner of Mohali to monitor the protect the environment would be constituted as per the order of NGT. NGT further ordered that the committee should meet within four week, undertake site visits, look into the grievances of the applicant and take requisite action to restore the environment protection and recharge of ground water with due process of law. The joint committee besides taking into consideration judge-



ment or directions of the Supreme Court and NGT may, also consider the aspects while submitting the factual and action taken report. Joint committee will act to use perforated tiles permitting percolating of water. Committee will also ensure landscaping of open spaces and roadside and developing greenbelt along the roadside with avenue plantation of native species. De-concretion of standing trees with proper space for proper rooting and growth of the tree on pretext of parking area requirement and roadsides, in the name of pedestrian path, right up to the neck of existing trees will be also monitored by the joint committee, ordered by the NGT principal bench.

Face lift for Airport, Mohali Roads

China cracks down on dissidents

BEIJING : "We must resolutely crack down on infiltration and sabotage activities by hostile forces in accordance with the law, resolutely crack down on illegal and criminal acts that disrupt social order and effectively maintain overall social stability," the statement said. Most protesters focused their ire on the "zero-Covid" policy. Many mocked the government's reasoning and claims that "hostile outside foreign forces" were stirring the wave of anger. Police appeared to be trying to keep their crackdown out of sight, possibly to avoid encouraging others by drawing attention to the scale of the protests. Economists and health experts warn that Beijing can't relax controls that keep most travelers out of China until tens of millions of older people are vaccinated. They say that means "zero-Covid" might not end for as much as another year. US ambassador to China Nicholas Burns said curbs were making it impossible for US diplomats to meet US prisoners being held in China.



The statement from the Centre Political and Legal Affairs Commission released late, come amid a massive show of force by security service to deter recurrence of the protests that broke out over the weekend in Beijing, Shanghai Guangzhou and several other cities. While it did not directly address the protests, the statement serves as reminder of the party's determination to enforce its rule. Hundreds of SUVs, vans and armoured vehicles were parked along city streets while police and paramilitary forces conducted random ID checks and searched people's mobile phones for photos, banned apps or other potential evidence that they had taken part in the demonstration. The number of people who have been detained is not known.

EDITORIAL –

Covid protests in China, thereafter intra party

The protests in at least 10 cities across China have quickly been joined by students, citizens and workers and surfaced earlier than anticipated, suggesting that leadership elements opposed to Xi could be stirring up things. China's economy has also been slowing down. The cost of living has been steadily rising, urban and rural unemployment is burgeoning, and graduate unemployment has touched 20 per cent. People are feeling the pain more directly too, with those lucky to find employment getting half the salaries than before, salaries of central and provincial government employees being slashed by 30 per cent and bonuses already paid being recovered. Despite this, Xi has shown no inclination towards taking economic reform initiatives and assisting China's private entrepreneurs, who provide 80 per cent of the jobs and 90 per cent of the revenues. On the contrary, the Work Report approved by the 20th Party Congress spoke of 'common prosperity'.

The protests began on November 23, when workers angry over unpaid wages and Covid-19 lockdowns clashed with hazmat-clad riot police. The violence followed disturbances that resulted in thousands of workers fleeing the facility after a Covid outbreak and a failed attempt at keeping workers isolated from the outside world.

The immediate provocation was the failure of plant administrators to deliver adequate food and water to 2,00,000 Foxconn workers. Matters were aggravated when the company also failed to fulfil promises of higher wages to workers. Apple announced that customers would face delays for iPhone 14 deliveries as it was committed to "ensuring the health and safety of every worker."

China's official media has blanked out news of these protests and till November 28 the China Daily and Global Times published no reports of the protests, but social media has been peppered with reports from citizens of protests in different places and the movement of People's Liberation Army (PLA) troops, tanks and trucks. Students, including those from Beijing's prestigious Tsinghua University, have participated in the protests. Protests have broken out in Beijing's Tsinghua University, Wuhan, Urumqi, Korla, Chengdu, Nanjing, Zhengzhou, Chongqing, Guangzhou and Shanghai, with crowds shouting "Down with Xi Jinping", "Get off CCP", and having stand-offs with the police as late as 1.30 am on November 27 in Beijing's Haidian district.

The Hong Kong-based Initiative estimated that students from 79 tertiary educational institutions across China have participated in the protests. The authorities have now begun to swing into action. Public security personnel began arresting protesters on the night of November 27. PLA tanks, heavy vehicles and ambulances were seen being deployed on November 29 outside Tsinghua University and in Zhengzhou.

The 'election' of Xi for a third term — for the first time since the death of Deng Xiaoping — has upset a large number of Chinese Communist Party (CCP) cadres. There has additionally been muted criticism that Xi has packed the Politburo Standing Committee (PBSC) and the Central Military Commission (CMC) with loyalists. Official media reports during the Party Congress stated that in a break from past practice, none of the senior veteran cadres had been consulted while selecting candidates for the Politburo or PBSC.

This has enlarged the number of dissatisfied, retired, yet influential, cadres who are unhappy with Xi. The removal of Hu Jintao, Xi's mentor and former Chinese President, from the 20th Party Congress on its final day prior to voting was reflective of this practice. Xi also ignored the decades-old convention regarding the age-eligibility criterion for cadres to be elevated to the Politburo and cadres eligible to continue in the Politburo. Prominent examples are the continuance of 72-year-old General Zhang Youxia as a Politburo member, the removal of Hu Chunhua from the Politburo — though he had not reached retirement age — and 'helicoptering' into the Politburo of General He Weidong.

Jiang Zemin's supporters are adding to intra-party discontent. Xi has been systematically targeting them since 2013, but now they are without their leader and can coalesce into a sizeable and influential anti-Xi group in the CCP. The decision not to have a formal funeral for Jiang Zemin — a break from past practice — indicates that Xi is very worried that it could be a trigger for the protests to widen, like what happened after the death of party General Secretary Hu Yaobang in 1989.

The protests have the potential to gain momentum and threaten the political leadership. Recognising this, the authoritative official Xinhua news agency reported that the CCP's apex security outfit, the Central Political and Legal Affairs Commission, had decided to "resolutely crack down on infiltration and sabotage activities by [foreign] hostile forces... resolutely crack down on illegal and criminal acts that disrupt social order, and effectively maintain overall social stability."

Transformation of 2 more village ponds for sarovars in pipeline

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The progression mission is aimed at developing and rejuvenating 75 water bodies in each district of India. In pursuit two more ponds are set to be converted into "sarovars" soon at the villages of Khuda Ali Sher and Dadu Majra.

According to the municipal corporation, work at Khuda Ali Sher village is in progress and the "sarovar" will be completed by December-end. The tender for the rejuvenation of the Dadu Majra pond will be floated this month and work completed by April 30 next year.

Fountains, lighting and adequate seating arrangements will be made at these ponds. Earlier, two ponds at Kaimbwala and Sarangpur villages were converted into



"sarovars" under the Jal Shakti Mission Abhiyan of the Centre. The rejuvenation of ponds in the villages of Khuda Jassu, Dhanas, Maloya and Kaimbwala will be looked after by the engineering wing of the Chandigarh Administration. The ponds are being rejuvenated to promote environment and water conservation. Prime Minister Narendra Modi had launched the Amrit Sarovar Mission as part of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav celebrations to

conserve water and set August 15, 2023, as the deadline. Officials in the MC said these ponds had become polluted due to neglect. Waste from various sources flowed into these ponds. "Waste water of households flows into the ponds. The MC should take care of these ponds even after rejuvenation. It should have a proper maintenance plan for the future. Otherwise, these water bodies will again become polluted," said Harjinder Singh, chairman

Space not allotted, shifting of grain market be delayed

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : During a meeting of the Administrator's Advisory Council, Charanjiv Singh, president, Chandigarh Beopar Mandal, requested the administration to allot sites/shops available at the new mandi to commission agents at a reserve price.

The shifting of the grain, fruit and vegetable market from Sector 26 to the new site in Sector 39 is likely to get delayed further as the UT Administration is still waiting for permission from the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) for the allotment of space at the new site.

In an action taken report on the issues mentioned during the meeting, the UT Administration stated the Centre had been requested by the UT Agriculture Secretary vide a letter dated May 5, 2021, followed by reminders to grant permission for adopting the Punjab State Agricultural Marketing Board (Sale and Transfer of Plots) Rules, 1999, for disposing of sites at the second grain, fruit and vegetable market in Sector 39.

The UT stated that the reply to



the same was still awaited. The last reminder was sent to the Secretary, MHA, on August 26. "Since permission is still awaited from the MHA, a meeting will be held with stakeholders to reach an agreement on auction of sites as per Estate Rules, 2007, by giving preference to the current licence holders of the Sector 26 market," stated the authorities.

Recently, the Mandi Board had invited suggestions from the stakeholders for the allotment of sites at the new mandi. A commission agent said the process to shift the Sector 26 mandi to Sector 39 was started in 2007, but the UT Administration had failed to finalise a policy for allotment of sites at the new mandi to date.

He suggested the administration should allot the sites at reserve prices to be calculated on the basis of the cost of the land and the amount spent on creating the infrastructure, instead of the current market value of the land. He said the administration was waiting for a tragedy to happen. Most buildings in the Sector 26 mandi were no longer safe. There was wild growth and rats had hollowed out the land below. He said other major problems faced by the traders were poor cleanliness and a shortage of space. Fruits and vegetables arrived here from all over the country but sometimes, there was not enough space to unload the vehicles, he added.

Rs 4.93-crore fine collected by railways from offenders



Commissioner News Service AMBALA : Successive earnings by Ambala Division of Northern Railway upto November have been Rs 45.22 crore, which is 11 per cent more than the cumulative target of Rs 40.67 crore. The Northern Railway has collected Rs 4.93 crore in the form of fine in the month of November through ticket-checking squad. The collection is 54 per cent higher than the target of Rs 3.20 crore.

A total of 710 checks were carried out in the division during which 47,391 without-ticket passengers and 31,629 irregular passengers were found. The gross earnings include fine in 373 anti-littering cases, 49 smoking cases and 51 unbooked luggage cases. Mandeep Singh Bhatia, Railway Division Manager, applauded the efforts of the ticket-checking staff as per a press release issued by the Ambala division.

State Consumer Commission penalises for delay in giving possession of flat

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : Against the delayed possession of flat, the directed the builder to pay interest @9 per cent per annum on the amount deposited from November 1, 2022 onwards by the 10th of every month till the actual delivery of physical possession of the unit complete in all respects.



The State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission has directed Omaxe Chandigarh Extension Developers Private Limited to pay Rs 1 lakh compensation to a consumer for delay in handing over the possession of the flat. The commission has also directed the builder to deliver the actual physical possession of the flat to the complainant complete in all respects within 45 days.

Sangeeta Sood, a resident of Mohali, approached the commission through advocate Savinder Singh Gill after the builder failed to handover the flat in the project, "The Lake", at New Chandigarh, Mullanpur, in the stipulated time.

Sood said an agreement of sale was executed on April 4, 2019. As per the agreement, the builder was to deliver the flat by July 31, 2021. She paid a sum of Rs 86,18,552 out of the total cost of the flat, which is Rs 99,88,760, to the builder. She alleged that the builder was not serious in completing the development and construction work at the project site, which is causing mental agony, harassment and financial loss to her as she was forced to live on rent.

Omaxe said the delay in offering

the possession of the unit took place due to force majeure circumstances faced by them due to the Covid pandemic. The Government of India also issued advisories, giving relief to builders by extending the dates for the completion of the ongoing projects. They took the pleas that as the competent authorities had extended the period for the completion of the project till December 31, 2022, this complaint was premature and the complainant would be compensated for the delay, if any.

After hearing the arguments, the commission held the builder guilty of the deficiency in service. "By not delivering the possession of the flat in the promised date or even with the extended period of nine months due to the Covid-19, the opposite parties are deficient in providing service and guilty of adoption of unfair trade practice," the order reads.

The commission directed Omaxe to deliver the actual physical possession of the flat within a period of 45 days and pay a compensation of Rs 1 lakh for causing mental agony and harassment to the complainant. The commission also directed the builder to pay Rs 35,000 litigation cost to the complainant.

Jat quota stirs, farmer cases may be dropped by Haryana

CHANDIGARH : Anil Vij Haryana Home Minister is learnt to have sought a status report on the cases and a call on withdrawing Jat quota stirs, farmer cases could be taken, said sources.

In case the government decides to drop the cases, it will have to furnish an affidavit in the court concerned. Haryana would withdraw all pending cases registered against protesters during the 2016 Jat reservation agitation as well as the year-long protest against the Centre's farm laws that ended



last December. Sources said Haryana Home Minister Anil Vij had called a related meeting of senior officers of Home and Police departments. Confirming that he had summoned a meeting, Vij said farmer and All India Jat Aarakshan Sangharsh Samiti (AIJASS) leaders had

met him recently. "They took up the issue of pending cases and the commitment given to them by the government on withdrawal," he said. AIJASS national convener Yashpal Malik said 489 cases were registered during the February 2016 agitation. "Several of those named in FIRs were acquitted," he said. Malik said an assurance on dropping the cases was given by CM Manohar Lal Khattar too in February 2020, "but the issue was put on the back burner after Covid outbreak".

Recovery process on environmental damage goes slow

PANIPAT : Until the cases were finalised, in the court of law, the environmental compensation could not be recovered, said P Raghwendra Rao, Chairman, the Haryana State Pollution Control Board. The board has imposed Rs 99 crore environmental compensation on pollution norms violators, including several government departments, builders, industrialists and others in the last three years, but the recovery process is very slow as Rs 61 crore is still pending.

"Besides, a huge amount of environmental compensation is still pending with the government departments — several urban local bodies, HSVP, HSIIDC, sugar mills and others. We have been in communication with them to recover the amount," he said.

The HSPCB was making all efforts to recover the environmental compensation and to spend it on the restoration of the

environment, the Chairman said. Varun Gulati, a Delhi-based environmental activist, sought information from the HSPCB on the imposition of environmental compensation on the pollution norms violations, including the industrial units, brickkiln, builders and developers, stone crushers, mining companies, government offices and others.

The HSPCB in reply said a total of Rs 99.138 crore environmental compensation was imposed on the violators in the past three years of which only Rs 41.25 crore had been recovered so far while Rs 61.12 crore was yet to be

recovered. As per the data available of some districts with the HSPCB has imposed a total green cost of Rs 19.32 crore on 56 units of which only Rs 5.4 crore has been recovered. As many as 19 units have not deposited any compensation. Similarly, in Yamunanagar, Rs 3.8 crore was imposed on 12 units, of which only Rs 23.8 lakh was recovered from two units while 10 had not deposited any penalty. In Faridabad, Rs 8 crore had been imposed on 42 units, but only Rs 1.9 crore had been recovered. In Palwal, Rs 2.09 crore had been imposed on nine units of which Rs 44.6 lakh had been recovered.

Details of MS/MD admissions required by National Medical Commission

FARIDKOT : The orders for procuring details of MS/MD were issued to ensure fairness and transparency in admissions. The colleges have been asked to provide the course name, sanctioned intake capacity, date of admission and name of the student along with the registration number with state medical council. Details of the category, gender, percentile score in NEET-PG-exam and all-India and state rank of students have also been sought.

The National Medical Commission (NMC) has directed all medical colleges to submit the details of students admitted in postgraduate (MD/MS) courses for the current academic year 2022-2023. Non receipt of the information within the stipulated time will reflect



on the recommendation to be made by the NMC for grant of permission/recognition to the colleges for the current and subsequent academic years, reads the NMC letter to the colleges. Colleges also have to give the name of the teacher under whom the student was admitted. The onus of furnishing authentic information is upon the college concerned and in case of furnishing of any wrong or incorrect information, it shall be open to NMC to initiate action as permissible by law. This information is to be provided within two weeks of the last date of the admissions, which was December 2.

Punjab eases licensing norms despite 5,000 'fake' pharmacists under lens

CHANDIGARH : A registrar of the pharmacy council had sought the cancellation of "fake" registrations and filing of FIRs against 3,000 candidates and some officials, but he was removed from the post. Even as the degrees of more than 5,000 "fake" pharmacists are under the scanner, the Punjab State Pharmacy Council has decided to do away with the process of verifying the basic qualification before registering new pharmacists.

In 2015, information obtained through the RTI revealed that the council had registered unusually high number of pharmacists between 2000 and 2013. Before obtaining a bachelor's degree in pharmacy, one needs to pass Class XII in science subjects. It was found that 40 per cent of the registered pharmacists had obtained Class X and XII certificates from dubious and unrecognised boards located outside the state. Many candidates were above 40 years of age and some even 50 when they obtained pharmacy degrees.

It was alleged pharmacy colleges in connivance with council officials provided licences to unqualified pharmacists in lieu of money. In 2015, an inquiry was ordered by the Directorate of Medical Education and Research. The council was instructed to verify not only the pharmacy degree of the applicant, but also the Class X, XI and XII



certificates. The Punjab Vigilance Bureau had also started an inquiry in the case in 2019. The probe is still underway. However, the council's decision, as mentioned in the minutes of its meeting dated October 18, has opened floodgates for unqualified pharmacists and paved the way for letting off around 5,000 "fake" pharmacists. Swaranjeet Singh, convener, Paramedical and Health Employees Front, and a complainant, said in the past eight years, the council had done nothing to weed out unqualified pharmacists. "Rather it has been working overtime to save them. The decision is against the norms. The accountability of the state drug controller, government analyst and registrar of the council must be fixed," he said. When contacted, Sushil Kumar Bansal, president, Punjab State Pharmacy Council, said the decision was taken following "verbal" instructions from the vigilance officer investigating the matter. He, however, failed to produce any document to substantiate his claim.

Company swindles by mismanaging Rs 300 cr of EPF

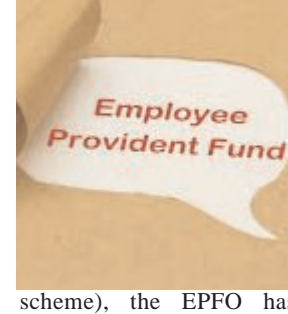

CHANDIGARH : For the smooth functioning of the Ayushman Bharat Sarbat Sehat Bima Yojana, the State Health Agency had hired "arogya mitras" through outsourcing. These arogya mitras were posted in each government hospital and they were responsible for guiding patients to get cashless treatment under the scheme.

In February 2020, for providing around 300 arogya mitras, the government gave a contract to a private company, MD India Health Insurance Pvt Ltd.

Another scam has rocked the State Health Agency as the company responsible for providing manpower to run a health insurance scheme has allegedly gobbled up nearly Rs 3 crore of around 300 employees which was to be deposited in their Employees' Provident Fund (EPF) accounts.

In a communication to the government-run State Health Agency (responsible for running the insurance



scheme), the EPFO has termed it cheating.

However, there were serious allegations against the company that it was not paying the minimum wages and was even refusing to deposit the provident fund and pension fund of the contractual employees, which is a statutory requirement under the Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952.

Interestingly, these employees had been working with the company for the past 32 months, but it never opened their EPF accounts.

Some employees submitted a complaint to the

government, which initiated an inquiry in which it was found that the outsourcing company was denying EPF and pension benefits to these employees. "This is nothing but fleecing underpaid workers. The State Health Agency has failed to protect their rights," said Bhagwan Dass, an RTI activist and complainant in the case.

The EPFO has now issued a notice to the State Health Agency and said the company was cheating the state EPFO, the ESIC and the Labour Department. The EPFO has asked the government to provide the EPF code of the company so that action can be initiated against it.

Dinesh Kundu, manager of the company who takes care of its operations in Punjab, said arogya mitras worked as consultants. "We deduct their TDS, but not EPF and ESIC," he said. Contrary to the claims of the company, arogya mitras work as full-time employees who work from 8 am to 6:30 pm six days a week.

From December 9, fly from Shimla to Kullu, Dharamsala

SHIMLA : Even though the Tourism and Civil Aviation Department had planned to launch the flights earlier, the plan could not materialise due to the imposition of the Model Code of Conduct in view of the Assembly elections on November 12.

The much-awaited air services from the state capital to Dharamsala and Kullu is likely to be launched on December 9, after the counting of votes.

However, now the Election Commission of India has given the go-ahead for the launch of the flights on December 9.

Priced at Rs 5,138 for one-way ticket, Alliance Air will operate flights between Shimla and Kullu on four days a week (Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Sunday). Similarly, the flight connecting Shimla with Dharamsala will operate thrice a week on Monday, Friday and Saturday and will have the same fare of Rs 5,138. The flight between Shimla-Delhi has been operating since September 26



this year on all week at a subsidised fare of Rs 3,362.

The launch of the flights to these two popular destinations is likely to give a major impetus to tourism, especially in view of the Christmas and New Year festivities. With the Covid situation being almost under control, it is being hoped that tourists will throng the state in large numbers.

It is for the first time that flights connecting Shimla with Kullu and Dharamsala will operate here. Though efforts have been made to provide heli taxi services between various towns within the state, high fares and weight limit on luggage proved

to be the inhibiting factors.

Hoteliers in the state have been demanding reliable and regular air services as a pre-requisite for tourism promotion. The ailing tourism and hospitality sector has been severely hit by the pandemic and now it is being hoped that the festivities around Christmas and New Year will bring in good business.

People involved in tourism industry said air connectivity between Dharamsala and Kullu should also be initiated so that high-end tourists can complete the Shimla-Kullu-Dharamsala circuit.

They said that some of them took leave on medical grounds when they went to their native places. Later, they submitted their medical certificates and had been discharging official duties regularly for the last three months when they suddenly received the calls. Ketan Bansal, SP operations and assistant commandant, home guards said that no home guard volunteer had been dismissed from duty and the final decision would be taken in the next departmental meeting, which is to be held after 12 days. Till then, they cannot join their duties.

A trail run of two newly-designed panoramic view coaches was held on the Kalka - Shimla railway track here, day after Northern Railway general manager Ashutosh Ganga pulled up the Kalka yard officials over the delay in the exercise. Once a train with all the coaches runs on the heritage track, a



speed test will be conducted. Mr Ashutosh Ganga said the coaches are designed in a manner to stand a speed of 25 kmph. Normally, trains on the Kalka - Shimla track run at a speed of 20 to 22 kmph. The panoramic view coaches have been fabricated at Rail Coach Factory (RCF), Kapurthala. A senior RCF officer said the new coach have

been fitted with latest pneumatic braking system. This pneumatic braking system, whereas old ones have vacuum brake system. This pneumatic braking system enables a coach to stop at a short time interval, which will also help in increasing the speed. The main feature of the coaches is its wider panoramic view through transparent roof and doors.

ED attaches Rs 83 cr assets of suspended Pooja Singhal IAS officer

Germany advances 10 billion aid for sustainable Green development

NEW DELHI : The German chancellor, during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Germany in May, had announced support of at least 10 billion Euros by 2030 under GSDP.
A large part of the support will be in the form of credit lines from KfW Development Bank with interest rates ranging from 2.7% to 3.2% , he said.
German chancellor Olaf Scholz is likely to visit India twice next year as the two countries look to strengthen bilateral relations with an emphasis on green and sustainable development. "The chancellor is planning a bilateral visit to India next year.....I am very confident he will come for a bilateral visit before the G-20 Summit," German ambassador to India Philipp Ackermann told reporters here.
Ackermann said Germany and India have finalized 22 project



covering transition to renewable energy, climate resilient urban development and sustainable use of natural resources totaling one billion Euros for the next year under the green and sustainable development partnership (GSDP).
"All new joint ventures in India will help cut green house gas emissions or help adapt to climate change. In this way, the focal points of bilateral development continued and further expanded in the coming years," Ackermann said. The projects

finalized with finance ministry are in Meghalaya, Tamil Nadu, Himachal Pradesh and Rajasthan, he said, adding that Germany was keen on covering the whole country.
Asked about India's G-20 Presidency, Ackermann termed the fight against climate change "one of the most urgent problems" on the political agenda and it reflected in the issue listed out by New Delhi for the year ahead.
India formally assumes the G-20 Presidency.

MBBS bonds policy fails, students protest

CHANDIGARH: This is for third time talks have failed. This is the first time when any party has refused to agree with decision taken by the Chief Minister. The meeting was held between students and Khattar at Haryana Niwas here, and lasted for an hour and half.
Khattar informed the media about offers made to students and claimed that students were largely convinced. However, leaders of MBBS students out rightly claimed that they had refused to accepted offers made by the government. Students said the entire discussion, the government and CM were emphasising on the repayment of loan of bond policy. "Keeping in view the demands of students, we have lowered the bond money form

Rs 40 lakh to Rs 30 lakh, minus the course fee. We have also decided to give one-year compulsory, contractual employment to MBBS graduates. Besides, the bond tenure has been reduced from seven years to five years," said Khattar.
Barring for a few, most students agreed. Khattar also announced a rebate for girl students and a relaxation in bond money in case doctors don't get a salary better than that of a government doctor. "Our main demand was that of compulsory service bond by the government. But they just concentrated on issue related to repayment of loan money in terms of tripartite agreements to be executed. Our agitation will be intensified," Dr Pankaj Bittu, a representative of MBBS students, said. "The changes are too less," he said.

180 vacancies declared in UT Engg Deptt

China struggles to crush domestic protests

BEIJING : Beijing: Demonstrations in China sparked by tough anti-Covid policies explode the "myth" of a "harmonious society" and reveal deep discontent with Beijing's rulers, a leader of the Tiananmen Square protests said on Friday . Wang Dan, who was jailed and then exiled after the 1989 Tiananmen pro-democracy movement was crushed, told reporters in Tokyo that the protests also proved that younger Chinese are not politically apathetic.
"In the past 30 years there's a myth that the younger generation or middle class were satisfied about the government, but these protests show us the truth," he said. Wang said he believed the unrest would continue, and could signal a

new "protest era". Wang was a 20-year-old student during the Tiananmen movement. He was placed on the government's most wanted list and was imprisoned before going into exile in the US.
Beijing Chinese police have deployed sophisticated surveillance tools in a push to stamp out a nationwide wave of unrest, using facial recognition software and location data to track down and detain protesters.
Beijing police may have used phone location data either captured from on-site scanners or Covid health codes scanned by people taking taxis to areas where protests took place, she said. Wang has received over 20 calls from protesters or people whose friends and relatives have been detained.
