In AAP regime, Centre's RERA act not enforced in Zirakpur

ZIRAKPUR : Illegal hundreds of colonies, structures have sprung up bereft of any clearance/approval, nor are the law enforcers seen anywhere to check its mandated legitimate clearance into pragmatic reality. Is merely registering the housing plan suffice or its compliance too mandatory? In fact the central law came into being during 2016, keeping the regulation enforced and thwart the ugly designs of unscrupulous builders.

The necessity of law is however not being looked into and being baffled in day light on road sides. Since own clauses of RERA are nowhere found enforced and yet RERA aims to reduce property fraud and unnecessary prolonged delays. Although RERA registration is done on papers but in field situation remains paralysing and frustrating. No facility for transparency in the home buying process is seen but RERA has been subdivided into smaller regulatory



bodies promising wider Real Estate Development.

RERA rules apply to both residential and commercial properties.

The standardisation envisaged by RERA has failed and collapsed in

the satellite town of the Zirakpur. The interests of buyers and developers alike are falling flat due to congested roads and space for parking missing giving woes to the masses. The homebuyers are required to pay for the property on the basis of the carpet area but nothing like carpet area is existing and builders are charging for whole of the land like lifts, balconies, stairs, and lobbies. Builders are also seen thwarting the issue of 70% safe money and no

completion certificate as per law is being procured. To the much agony of the homebuyers rules are being put into ashray as :-
(a) Where are, as per RERA law, details of builder's past projects being scrutinized ??
(b) Certificate by RERA for launching the approved project being followed ??
(c) Clarification and adoption on carpet area within of external walls ?
(d) Lay down clearly, manifest addresses of architect, structural engi-

neer, CA and contractor with their mobile numbers ?
(e) Get construction certificate from landlord followed by completion certificate alike ?
(f) Legal status of land in whose name registration done, along with environmental/landscape clearance ?
(g) Submission of affidavit under RERA ambit?
(h) 70% of safe deposit (ESCROW) in a account for construction expenses?
(i) Affidavit to land free of all encumbrances ?

Discharged effluents contaminate water, Rs 59 Cr penalty imposed

PANCHKULA : The chief secretary directed the officers at Faridabad that complete rehabilitation of these two nullahs should be done before May 2023. He said that officers should explore possibilities to set up STPs and CETPs according to the effluent generation and processing thereof. The Haryana Government has imposed a penalty of Rs 60 crore on the polluting units. Out of these Rs 44 crore has been recovered by Haryana State Pollution Control Board and Rs 15 crore by State Level Environment Impact Assessment Authority Haryana. This information was given in a meeting chaired by chief secretary, Sanjeev Kaushal for constituting a high powered committee to utilize these funds. He also reviewed the status report about the remediation of pollution in Yamuna and Ghaggar River. Kaushal directed the deputy commissioner, Faridabad to identify spots where industrial effluents

are being discharged which is causing water contamination. He in stern tone directed the concerned officer to regularly monitor such activities. The state government is taking concrete steps to strengthen the sewerage system of cities and towns. It was apprised during the meeting that Faridabad area is divided into three zones namely Badshahpur, Partapgarh and Mirzapur which include two major drains Buriya Nallah and Gaunchi Drain in Faridabad and Palwal districts. He further directed that installation of mesh fencing should be done on these nullahs. No laxity in this work will be tolerated, he added. It was apprised in the meeting that in Yamuna catchment 71.3 MLD effluents have been diverted at 123 locations against the target of 99.3 MLD of effluents. In ghaggar catchment 38 MLD effluents have been diverted at 45 locations against the target of 41.55 MLD effluent.

Policy with specific area for small eateries framed

CHANDIGARH : The policy was existing previously too, but there was no specific area identified to put chairs and tables, following which the shopkeepers were putting them up blatantly everywhere outside the shops, causing major hindrances to the public. Therefore, the new policy will mark specific areas for each shops and booths as per their size and availability. However, this time, the penalties is heavy in case of violations", sources revealed. While giving the permissions to such shops, the concerned Junior Engineer (JE) rank officer and enforcement inspector or sub-inspector will physically inspect the area and earmark the site for temporary putting up chair and



table. The report will be submitted to senior authority and based on the that, the charges will be decided. "There are a lot of grievances from the public at large that eating joints are placing tables and chairs in front of their booths, which leads to inconvenience. The earlier policy did not take into account the area to be utilized by the permission holder, and also had no clarity on the number of chairs and tables to be placed," the agenda

reads. Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh, is coming up with a new policy to give permission for putting up temporary table and chairs in front of shops, booth, shop-cum-office, shop-cum-flat and bay shops operating as eating points across the city. The key motive behind this new policy is to specify a particular area to put chairs and tables, so that there is no inconvenience to the general public. The agenda items in this regard is coming for detailed discussion and its subsequent approval before the members of the general house, scheduled on Monday. Since the policy has multiple aspects, everything has been covered in a detailed manner.

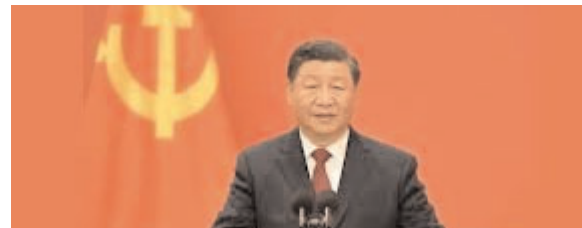

China orders schools to oppose Western flawed views in legal education

BEIJING : Closer adherence to the dictates of the ruling Communist Party has been ordered and leader Xi Jinping in legal education, demanding that schools "oppose and resist Western erroneous views" such as constitutional government, separation of powers, and judicial independence. The order was dated Sunday, a week before China's ceremonial parliament begins its annual session and reinforces the leading role on ideology assumed by Xi, who is named no less than 25 times in the document. Similar directives have been issued in past, with students encouraged to report on professors who speak positively about Western concepts of governance. Despite the intertwining of the Chinese and global economies, Xi has sought to purge liberal Western concepts from the education system, ordered that foreign religions be "sinicized" in order to

operate in China. He has also attempted, with limited success, to reorganise popular culture along more conservative lines, going so far as to ban "effeminate" men from the state broadcaster. The legal profession has been a particular target, and in the early hours of July 9, 2015, three years into Xi's first term as party general secretary, a series of raids nationwide resulted in the detention of some 300 human rights lawyers and associated activists. Such approaches are in line with Xi's more muscular foreign policy that seeks to challenge and possibly supplant the American-led international order that advocates for multiparty democracy, civil society and human rights. The directive from the party's general office said teachers and students of law and legal theory workers must be guided to have a "clear-cut position and take a firm stance in the face of issues of principle and right and wrong".

EDITORIAL –

Poor's misery turning into rich's bonanza

The Ukraine's most significant consequence has been an extraordinary increase in food and fuel prices. As a result, most of the world's population has paid through its nose to procure basic food and energy for the country. The war in Ukraine has killed thousands, displaced millions and damaged the region's economy. But the cost of this war is being borne worldwide, especially by the poor.

This war has doubled household energy costs globally. In poorer parts such as sub-Saharan Africa, household energy costs increased by up to three times the global average, pushing millions back into energy poverty. Prices of fuels were so high that the world's total energy bill touched \$10 trillion in 2022 for the first time ever.

The combined impact of higher fuel and food costs has pushed millions into absolute poverty. The increase in fuel price alone is estimated to have driven 78 million to 141 million people below the World Bank's extreme poverty line.

Yet, the misery of the poor has been a bonanza for the rich. The Russian invasion of Ukraine has turned out to be the biggest profiteering opportunity, especially for the fossil fuel industry.

At about \$4 trillion the global oil and gas industry in 2022 made its highest ever net income. For comparison, India's GDP in 2022 was approximately \$3.5 trillion. So, a handful of companies and their shareholders made more money than the value of all goods and services produced by a country of 1.35 billion people.

In 2022, government subsidies worldwide for fossil fuel consumption skyrocketed to more than

\$1.5 trillion, again the highest in history. The largest increase in subsidy was in the developed world, especially Europe, which never tires of preaching the virtue of ending fossil fuel subsidies in the developing world to combat the climate crisis. The most critical piece of this high price-profit-subsidy story is that some of the money the fossil fuel companies made is currently invested in exploring, producing and selling more coal, oil and gas in the name of "energy security". In 2022, an estimated \$560 billion was invested by the Exxon Mobiles and Chevrons of the world to produce enough oil and gas to blow up the 1.5°C target of the Paris Agreement.

These oil and gas projects, called "climate bombs", will result in emissions of at least 125 billion tonnes of CO2, equivalent to a third of the remaining carbon budget for the 1.5°C target. So, the fossil fuel industry has exploited energy security anxieties the war unleashed to further its business goals and fast forward the world towards a catastrophic climate crisis.

But the war has also shown an alternate vision of energy security, achievable in a much greener way if governments decide to do so. Take the case of Europe.

Europe's most remarkable response to the war has been the unprecedented speed with which it has eliminated its dependence on Russian gas. Just before the war, nearly half of EU's natural gas came from Russia. Today, it is about 10%. Europe achieved this by importing expensive LNG, burning more coal, and making

the highest-ever investments in green energy - solar, wind, battery and electric vehicles.

According to a recent estimate these actions may have advanced the EU's transition to green energy by a few years. The EU and UK shelled out an additional half a trillion dollars to make this transition in 2022.

That suggests rich countries who dilly dally on providing tens of billions to developing countries as climate finance suddenly found hundreds of billions to diversify their energy supply. Thus, if developed countries so desire, they can mobilise enough resources to accelerate climate actions and support developing countries to mitigate and adapt to climate crisis.

The EU was not the only region to make record investments in green energy. According to Bloomberg NEF, for the first time investment in green energy technologies exceeded \$1.1 trillion globally and was equal to money spent on fossil fuels. The highest investments were made in China and the US; the EU was in third position. While total investments are still way short of what is required to meet climate goals, it is an important milestone. And this milestone too has been achieved following energy-security considerations.

So, the war has given us a glimpse of both the worst and best scenarios for energy transition and climate crisis. It is for us to choose which one we will pursue, climate bombs or green energy. It is also for the world to decide whether it wants death, poverty and profiteering, or a peaceful solution to end this war.

Kanwardeep Kaur a 2013-batch Punjab cadre IPS officer, has been appointed the new SSP of Chandigarh. She is presently posted as SSP Ferozepur.

The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet, Department or Personnel and Training, Government of India, has approved the proposal of the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) for inter-cadre deputation of Kanwardeep Kaur from Punjab to AGMUT cadre (Chandigarh) for a period of three years or until further orders, whichever is earlier. Kaur has done her schooling from Chandigarh and Mohali. She had graduated from Punjab Engineering College (PEC). The Punjab Government had earlier sent a panel of three IPS officers to Chandigarh, which was further sent to the MHA.

Those on the panel were Bhagirath Singh Meena of 2013 batch, Dr Akhil Chaudhary of 2012 batch



and Dr Sandeep Kumar Garg, also of 2012 batch. However, the MHA had rejected one name out of the three, following which Kanwardeep's name was sent to the Centre. Manisha Chaudhary, SSP (Traffic and Security), is currently holding the officiating charge, after Kuldeep Singh Chahal, a 2009-batch Punjab cadre IPS officer, was repatriated prematurely in December 2022, following allegations of misconduct. The CBI had recently registered a preliminary enquiry against Chahal, presently posted as Jalandhar Police Commissioner, for alleged corruption and misconduct during his tenure as UT SSP. An inquiry was conducted by the CBI on a reference from Punjab Governor and UT Administrator Banwarilal Purohit.

particular, besides other radical activities.

The G-20 Summit that was to be held in Amritsar this month has been cancelled by the Government of India, keeping in view the Ajnala incident and the activities particularly being done by the radical Sikhs,” he said.

3 STPs to be upgraded by Apr 30, Chandigarh Adviser assures Smart City

CHANDIGARH : Speaking about the upgradation projects, Dharam Pal, the advisor to administrator said “Once the STPs are upgraded, these will be compliant with NGT norms of less than 10 biochemical oxygen demand (BOD). One plant at Maloya is already compliant and two other plants at Dhanas and 3 BRD have been upgraded and are under stabilisation,” he said.
 Taking up the matter of liquid waste management seriously, UT Adviser Dharam Pal visited 5 Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs) of the Municipal Corporation at Raipur Kalan, Raipur Khurd, Diggian, 3 BRD and Dhanas.
 Taking a serious view of the delay in the completion of three plants, the Adviser issued directions to Smart City



Chandigarh to ensure that the upgrade work was completed by April 30, failing which the contractor would be heavily penalised. For the upgraded STPs, he directed that flow meters were set up at the inflow and outflow points. He also directed that a detailed plan be prepared for proper utilisation of tertiary treated water being produced.
 All STPs are being upgraded through Smart City Mission funds and would be handed over to the MC for operation and maintenance.
 With the completion of these projects, about 50

MGD of tertiary treated water would be produced. It would be used to water all 1,800 parks and gardens of Chandigarh as well as for industrial purposes. This would not only enhance the sewerage treatment capacity of the city, but also reduce the reliance on groundwater.

Nitin Yadav, Secretary, Local Government; Anindita Mitra, MC Commissioner; Aarul Rajan, member secretary, CPCC; and NP Sharma, Chief Engineer, MC; were also present.

15,584 CCTV cameras to be installed at Pb govt schools - Harjot Singh Bains

FARIDABAD : Only generator sets converted to dual fuel (70 per cent gas and 30 per cent diesel) shall be permitted in the region where gas infrastructure is available, reads the CAQM order dated February 9.
 The Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM) has banned the use of diesel generator sets for the industrial and commercial sector in the National Capital Region (NCR) from May 15. The deadline for generator sets fitted with Retrofit Emission Control Device (RECD) is September 30.
 There is no restriction on the use of 100 per cent gas-based generator sets. Official sources said the uncontrolled use of diesel generator sets had been found to be a major contributor to the deteriorating air quality in the region.
 “Under Section 12 (l) of an Act, the CAQM is vested with powers to take all



measures, issue directions, as it deems necessary or expedient for the purpose of protecting and improving the quality of air in the National Capital Region and adjoining areas,” says the order.
 The CAQM observed that a large number of diesel generator sets had been operating in the region, even when a ban was imposed under the GRAP (Graded Response Action Plan), causing air pollution.
 “Now, with a view to comprehensively prevent and control air pollution, the CAQM directed that use of the diesel generator sets (capacity up to 800KW) shall be permitted in the NCR only subject to their

conversion to dual fuel system from May 15. The CAQM had banned the use of diesel generator sets in NCR after implementing GRAP in October last year. The state pollution control boards have been directed to ensure compliance of the directions.
 However, according to sources in the industry, this may result in additional expenses to the tune of Rs 10 lakh to Rs 50 lakh for industrial units, as no subsidy has been announced. “Diesel gensets with capacity of 82 KW, used for residential purpose, should be exempted,” says Rajiv Chawla, a leading entrepreneur here.

Apex Court reprimands Ministry of Defence, asks to pay OROP arrears by March 15

NEW DELHI : "The MoD has issued necessary instructions to the Controller General of Defence Accounts (CGDA) to pay the arrears by March 15," an official said. This came after the Supreme Court pulled up the MoD over the delay in payment of the OROP arrears and sought an explanation from the secretary concerned for issuing a communication extending the timeline for payments fixed by the court. Noting that the sanctity of the judicial process has to be E maintained, a bench headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud on Monday asked the MOD to "set its house in order" and directed the secretary to file a personal affidavit explaining his position.



"The orders of the Supreme Court regarding OROP need to be followed. Why was the decision taken to pay the arrears in instalments despite the court order?" the court asked. The Supreme Court had last year directed the government to quickly carry out the OROP refixation exercise upon the expiry of the five-year time frame in July 2019, as was promised when the scheme was implemented with effect from July 2014, and pay the consequent arrears to the veterans and their families. The Union Cabinet had

then in December last year approved the revision of pension for ex-servicemen and their widows under the OROP scheme with effect from July 2019, which it said would benefit an additional 4.5 lakh new beneficiaries to take the total number of pensioners to over 25 lakh. With all ex-servicemen who have retired before June 30, 2019 to be covered under it, officials said the estimated additional annual expenditure for the implementation of the revision will be around Rs 8,450 crore.

Illegal structures removed by CHB in Sector 45,46

Chandigarh : To ensure effective actions against illegal/unauthorized constructions and encroachment on government/public land, the CHB is adopting zero tolerance policy, said Yashpal Garg, CHB CEO. The Chandigarh Housing Board (CHB) demolished a double storey illegal structure constructed in the rear court of a dwelling unit in Sector 461), encroached on government land, and another was removed in a dwelling unit in Sector 45C. The CHB is computing cost of demolitions that will be recovered from

the allottees and in case of its non-payment their allotments are liable to be cancelled. All allottees are again requested not to undertake any fresh building violations otherwise the same is liable to be demolished on their risk and cost. Since these violations may lead to structure safety issues not only for the dwelling units, but also for the particular unit and also for the adjoining unit also, the CHB is adopting zero tolerance policy. Further all encroachments on public land need to be removed immediately without any notice from the CHB."

Calibrated attempts being made to defame Indian judiciary, says Rijju

here, the minister said: "Attempts are being made to tell the story that Indian judiciary is under attack...attempts are being made to speak in forums inside the country and outside the country to tell the world that Indian judiciary is under crisis." No campaign whatsoever with ulterior motives can

succeed in defaming India and its democratic set up. Nobody, no organisation, no political party can question the wisdom of the Indian judiciary. We stand by the spirit of the Indian Constitution," said Rijju. Amid frequent run-ins between the Union government and the judiciary over appointment of judges, the

law minister said differences may come...but that does not mean that the government is disregarding the judiciary and said there are misinterpretations.

We are here with the mandate of people under a provision which is there in the law. We are holding the responsibility which is defined under the Constitution of India," added the minister.

The law minister urged that the "disregard campaign" and the "undesirable or mischievous attempts" made to malign the Indian judiciary and the Indian state as a whole "must be resisted by not only the legal fraternity but every citizen of our country".

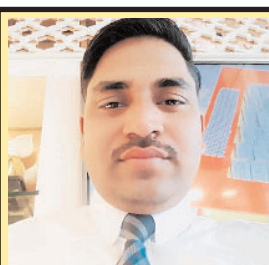
Sisodia was produced before special judge MK Nagpal on the expiry of his seven-day custodial interrogation.

An application to send the accused to judicial custody has been filed. It is submitted that the CBI custody is no longer required and the same may be sought later, if required. In view of submission made, the accused is sent to judicial custody till March 20," the court said.

It allowed Sisodia to carry the Bhagavadgita, spectacles and medicine to jail while directing the Tihar jail authorities to consider his request for being allowed to do the Vipassana meditation.

The CBI had arrested Sisodia last week in connection with the alleged corruption in the formation and implementation of the now-scrapped liquor policy for 2021-22.

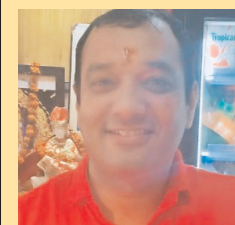
