Clients' fate in Royal Apartment Premium hangs in balance

"Submission of false affidavits took place" alleges Civic Body

Zirakpur : In an approved colony in 2007 "Royal Empire," a group housing project was passed and spreaded on 8520 sq yds, by the coloniser Jeevan Kumar, who initially got only 6 storeyed flats sanctioned but the builder got 8 storeyed tower illegally constructed till 2012. The wrong construction was objected to by the local

Municipal authorities. The ban on sale, purchase was clamped by the authorities. The flats were originally booked by the home seekers as per the approved architectural plan which authorised only 6 storeyed but the sanctioned was violated and no consent of the buyers was ever sought which amounted to serious breach of faith aswell established



municipal law. The land was purchased by M/s Garg

Reality Infra Promoters vide Wasika no 13209 : dated 8 Feb 2022

Certain allotment letters were served but the affidavits by Robin

Mangla denied having issued any allotment letter. Another affi-

davit stated there were no differences, quarrel between two (Robin and Lalit Gupta). All had been sorted within the two. Even the Snr Town Planner vide his directorate letter no. TP/SS/ 2023/781 objected to non receipt of consent from the flat owners/clients. Mr Lalit Gupta denied any rapprochement between them, and another false affidavits

stated that there was no illegal deal, and court case pending but Lalt Gupta argued his claim that a case no 925 of 2019 in supreme court was in pendency as yet. From all these issues its become apparent that all is not going well and in consonence with the prevalent municipal law.

Glitch in "Verka" milk supply affects brand name

It is pertinent to mention here that real milk however is nowhere available in the market but found pasteurised .The best milk is "Amul ", that beats other in terms of punctual supply and high class purity, said Ramesh Dutt ,whose brother is working in a famous

dairy at Karnal in Haryana. Due to the frequent breakdowns in the plant,the supply could not be regulated, however , in future it would be rectified, claimed Parminder Singh Deputy General Manager Marketing of the Verka, brand of Milkfed .

Mohali: Zirakpur has been grappling with numerous challenges due to the lack of development, and the residents are facing the consequences of the burning issues. The no-confidence motion was viewed as an important step towards addressing these problems. On Thursday ,the Pb and Hary High Court deferred the hearing of the no-confidence motion against president Udayvir Dhillon. In June, 21 out of the 31 councillors submitted a no-confidence motion against Dhillon to executive officer Ashok Pathria. The resolution was supported by 13



councillors, including eight from the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD). Following this, Dhillon moved the HC. During the first hearing, Mohali DC was appointed the administrator of the council. The councillors who initiated the no-confidence motion allege that Dhillon, who was elected as the president of

the MC in 2021 with the support of 23 Congress councillors during the Congress government's tenure, has not fulfilled his responsibilities towards the city's development. They also claim a lack of transparency in decision making and inadequate involvement of councillors in the processes.

Kamala Harris secures enough votes to clinch Democratic presidential candidature

Washington : Kamala Harris has secured enough votes from Democratic delegates to win the party's nomination for president. The announcement was made by Democratic National Committee Chair Jamie Harrison during a call with supporters. The vice president, is a Harris for President campaign call, stated: "I am honored to be the presumptive Democratic nominee for President of the United States." The online voting process



was scheduled to end on Monday, but Harris broke the threshold to receive the majority of the delegates' votes. Confirming that she "will officially accept the nomination next week", the US VP asserted: "This campaign is about people com-

ing together, fueled by love of country, to fight for the best of who we are." Harris thanked Harrison for the announcement, stating that she was "excited" for the future. She further emphasised that the party has got "a lot of work to get there". Calling her campaign "people-powered campaign", she admitted that it would not have been possible for her to reach this point without her party's support and trust. She added that she was "deeply grateful" to her party and supporters.

Vulnerable site of STP, construction plan stalled in Dhakoli

Mohali: The planned installation of "Sewerage Treatment Plant" fell under the 'red category', which meant it had the potential to cause significant pollution and environmental damage. The STP had been planned to be installed very near to a cluster of thickly populated resi dental area, posing a serious threat to the life and health of the inhabitants, grugged the Lakeview Complex Residents Welfare Association. The installation of the sewage treatment plant (STP) in Dhakoli has been stalled due to poor site selec-



tion by the authorities. The lake view association has filed a civil suit against the setting up of the STP. The court of civil judge Parveen Kumar, Derabassi, issued orders of ad-interim exparte injunction, staying the installation of the treatment plant. The counsel for the Residents Welfare Association ,

S K Jain, said the court stayed the installation of the STP at Dhakoli based on the evidence presented. The RWA approached the court arguing that the civic body had planned to set up the STP at a site that was surrounded by various residential societies where thousands of people reside.

Drinking water samples fails its purity test

Mohali: In order to counter the challenge, two specific responsibilities have been assigned to different departments. The department of water supply and sanitation has been tasked with ensuring the chlorination of drinking water and routine sampling. The post drinking water samples from 100 government schools in Mohali district failed it's purity test, additional deputy commissioner (development) Sonam Chaudhary directed the officials concerned to ensure periodic sampling from all government schools. Ms Chaudhary also directed the officials to submit reports at the DC office



every time a sampling is done. While reviewing the monthly progress of schools and health departments, Ms Chaudhary instructed that pure drinking water in schools and anganwadis should be ensured without any negligence. She asked the respective district heads to ensure that water samples from all these places are tested and any defects found should be rectified.

New admission rules challenged by PU pharmacy students

Chandigarh: From the pharmacy department of the Panjab University Students Union (PUSU) member students staged a dharna outside the vice-chancellor's office. In response to challenges faced by the aspirants due to a last-minute change in the admission criteria for the admissions to the master's courses by the university.

The National Board of Examination in Medical Sciences(NBEMS), New Delhi, has no role whatsoever in the conduct of counselling for admission to M Pharm/PhD courses utilising the GPAT score. Candidates must apply separately to the desired GPAT-2024 participating institutions.



Thereafter, each participating institute will release their respective cut-off GPAT scores, which a candidate date should meet to be eligible for admission," read an early circular. On July 29, the NBEMS released another circular, stating that 10% of all the GPAT-2024 candidates would be declared qualified for admission and scholarships, totaling 3,934 candidate with a list of category wise cut-off percentile.

Against defacement , PU panel to draft rules

Chandigarh : Every year, as the PUCSC (Panjab University Campus Students Council elections draw closer, the campus walls and other areas are littered with party stickers despite the poll code being enforced. Besides polls, even during protests, posters are placed on university gates and Chowks. Panjab University has formed a committee to frame rules against defacement practices in anticipation of the upcoming Panjab University Campus Students Council (PUCSC) elections in 2024 and future protests.



This move would aim to address the issue of campus defacement, which has been a recur ring problem. Candidates cannot use printed pamphlets or materials for campaigning. They are only permitted to employ handcrafted materials within a total expenditure limit of Rs 5,000, but parties still

flout these rules. At other times, there are no such rules as stipulated in Lyngdoh Committee . Police action can be initiated under Section 3 of the Delhin Prevention of Defacement Act, 2007, which is followed in the Union Territory.

EDITORIAL -

Age surely induces sense of ‘forgetfulness’

It will show the prowess of Kamala Harris as a former prosecutor when she is on the stump. Harris, who is Biden’s p r e s u m p t i v e replacement as the Democratic Party’s candidate, is not yet 60 and can legitimately argue that Trump will soon be too old to govern if he is elected President. After all, her party replaced its candidate entirely on that ground. A majority of the Americans agreed with that decision, polls showed. Growing old is an inevitable fact of life, but everyone recognises this handicap, except the aged Heads of State or Government themselves. Partly, this is because these leaders tend to be in a bubble, surrounded by loyalists — with the usual sprinkling of sycophants — who will never tell their bosses uncomfortable truths about the seriousness of their cognitive decline. Biden’s is the most recent and widely publicised example. But there have been many before him. In India, then External Affairs Minister SM Krishna read the Portuguese Foreign Minister’s speech at the United Nations Security Council in 2011. He was as old as Trump when he made the faux pas. Indian officials did not blame the gaffe on Krishna’s reflexes or his agility. They said the UN staff routinely placed an English translation of a Portuguese minister’s speech on top of Krishna’s papers after

the former had spoken immediately before it was India’s turn. Pakistanis at the UN made the most of this mistake. With octogenarian Joe Biden exiting the US presidential contest because of age-related frailties, the tables have been turned on septuagenarian Donald Trump, the Republican candidate in the November election. Trump had not criticised Biden as being too old for the presidency — not in this campaign cycle nor in the one four years ago — despite calling him ‘Sleepy Joe’ and implying that he was not all there at the only debate this year between the two men. Trump, 78, knows he is vulnerable on the issue of his age. He is only three years junior to Biden. Old age had dogged Biden even during the 2020 election season because he has been chronically prone to gaffes and suffered from stutter as a child, which he overcame. Not many people have thought of Trump as a septuagenarian because he has talked in videos, leaked during his 2020 campaign, of groping women. And, strippers have given graphic accounts of sex with the real estate mogul who became President. The popular image of Trump is that of a man full of libido, notwithstanding his age. LK Advani in 2013, then 86, had to be persuaded to not press his claim all the way to be the BJP’s prime-

ministerial candidate and make way for the incumbent, Narendra Modi. Dinesh Singh became External Affairs Minister when he was only 68 in 1993. Tragically, he suffered a stroke shortly after his appointment, but the then Prime Minister PV Narasimha Rao did not relieve him of the very demanding portfolio that involved frequent travel. Singh could not even go to his office in South Block and files had to be sent to his home, where he was mostly bedridden. Delhi’s grapevine was rife with speculation at that time about astrologers advising Rao that Singh’s presence in the Union Cabinet was auspicious. The last straw was Singh’s insistence in March 1994 that he would travel to Tehran as Rao’s Special Envoy to deliver a message from the Prime Minister to Iran’s then President, Ali Akbar Hashemi Rafsanjani. The mission was critical. India was seeking Iran’s intervention at the UN Human Rights Commission to prevent a resolution on Kashmir being passed at the commission’s annual session in Geneva. Shortly after he came back from Tehran, Rao made Pranab Mukherjee External Affairs Minister because Singh simply could not discharge his duties. But Rao retained Singh as minister without portfolio until his death in November 1995.

Traders asso. opposes extra Rs 5 on cash payment at parking lots

He further said, “This clause of charging Rs 5 extra should be taken back as it will definitely affect the market and lead to losses to shopkeepers. JAC PGI contract workers over delayed payment of arrears threaten protest on August 8



Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : “The PGI management has failed to release arrears of security guards, bearers and sanitary attendants from October 9, 2018, to January 12 this year. The Deputy Chief Labour Commissioner had directed the PGI management to resolve the issues before July 22, including the payment of arrears of Rs 30 crore to 1,600 hospital attendants and approval for revised wages from January 13. The PGI management had assured to release the arrears by July 7, but to no avail,” said Sanjeev Kumar, secretary general of the committee. The Joint Action Committee (JAC) of the PGIMER Contract Workers’ Union has now submitted a fresh memorandum to the hospital

authorities and threatened to hold a massive protest from August 8. A representative of the committee alleged that the PGI management failed to honour the written settlements and assurances made before the Deputy Chief Labour Commissioner (Central) during the course of the last conciliation proceedings. “The issue of wrong calculation of arrears of cooks has not been resolved. The accounts branch created an uncalled for controversy with regard to the arrears of the contract staff posted at Sangrur and Una, whereas their dues were part of a Rs 46 crore budget sent for approval. If the arrears were not cleared by August 5, the JAC will resort to holding a protest from August 8,” the JAC stated.

Amit Shah inaugurates 24x7 Manimajra water supply project

NDA to again form govt at centre in 2029

In 2029 also, the NDA will come (to power), (Narendra) Modi ji will come,” Union Home Minister Amit Shah said. Mr Shah while inaugurating the 24 hrs water supply project on Sunday slammed the opposition parties for raising questions about the strength of the NDA government at the Centre, saying the alliance would not only complete its term, but also form the government in 2029. “They (opposition) feel that with some success, they have won elections. They do not know that in three elections, the number of seats the Congress got, the BJP won more than that in this election (2024 Lok Sabha poll). “They do not know it. NDA’s only one member, the



BJP, has more than the total number of seats which their whole alliance has. “These people, who want to create uncertainty, say again and again that this government will not run,” the home minister said. “I want to assure the opposition friends that not only will this government complete its five-year term, the next term will also be of this government. Be ready to sit in the opposition and learn to work effectively in the opposition,” he added. Punjab Governor and Union Territory Chandigarh Administrator Gulab Chand Kataria was also present on the occasion.

Built at a cost of Rs 75 crore, the water supply project will benefit over one lakh residents of Manimajra, including those living in Modern Housing Complex, Shivalik Enclave, Indira Colony and Shastri Nagar. The project, a part of the Smart City mission, is aimed at avoiding wastage of water by minimising storage through continuous high pressure supply. The other objectives of the project include water resource augmentation through leakage reduction, smart metering, limited dependence on groundwater, and monitoring of energy consumption. A total of 22 km water supply pipeline has been laid for this project and two underground water reservoirs, each with capacity of two million gallons per day, have been set up.

Strength of stray cattle in Panchkula city to be surveyed by MC

Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA : The issue of conducting survey of stray cattle was discussed during a meeting of Panchkula development advisory committee. The Municipal Corporation has been sending stray cows to shelters. These shelters have already exhausted their capacity and are not in position to accommodate more animals. MC officials pointed out that they had till date sent 2,721 cows to different cow shelters in and around the city. He said, “But the cow shelters have now stopped accepting more animals citing shortage of space.” The local Municipal Corporation will now carry out a survey to count the number of stray cattle head in the city as well as those being kept at various cow shelters to take a decision regarding the setting up of new cattle pounds and transportation of strays.



Haryana Assembly Speaker Gian Chand Gupta said they should carry out a survey of animals being kept at cow shelters. He said, “Conduct a survey of animals being kept at cow shelters and those roaming around in the city. We will see if we have any space to keep the animals in the existing shelters else requisite land can be provided to interested NGOs to open and run cow shelters.” Officials present at the meeting also discussed the dog bite incidents and sought stringent action in this regard. They said the district had recorded

registration of as many as 5,699 dog bite cases at health institutions in merely six months this year. Gupta pointed out that the district administration had spent Rs 4 crore on the development of a pound at Sukhdarshanpur village for keeping stray dogs, but remained unsuccessful in its initiative. MC Commissioner Sachin Gupta said, “The law provides provisions for sterilisation of dogs. The canines also have to be dropped back to the place from where they were picked for sterilisation.”

Panchkula mayoral polls to fall on September 25 -- Haryana government

The petition was filed by Akshaydeep Chaudhary, a Congress councillor of the Panchkula MC. The petitioner’s counsel argued for urgent poll of Senior Deputy and Deputy Mayor in the Municipal corporation of Panchkula.

The prime minister's remarks come in the foreword of a new book titled "370: Undoing the Unjust. A New Future for J&K". The book mentions in detail how Modi managed to achieve the goal that he set out for himself. The publishers said the book, which is scheduled to release this month, "chronicles, what is inarguably the greatest



constitutional feat in India's history and tells the inside story of how Prime Minister Modi managed the seemingly impossible". It "delves into multiple blunders at the time of independence that culminated into the unjust regimen of Article 370. It discusses the social, political and economic ramifications of Article 370 since its inception in 1949", a statement by Penguin said on Monday, which marks five years of revocation of Article 370. "It sheds light on the historical reluctance to challenge this provision and the eventual paradigm shift brought about by its abrogation in 2019. Through careful examination, it discusses how the government resolved legal

complexities and safeguarded against security threats to successfully execute the historic decision," the statement said. Replete with anecdotes, the book recounts the events leading to the abrogation and also chronicles the region's history -- from the ancient to contemporary times. The publishers claimed this is the "first book of its kind on the Modi government where the actual decision-making process has been documented through interactions with top decision makers including Prime Minister Narendra Modi". In advance praise for the book, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said, "An eminently readable account of a crucial decision that has promoted national integration while transforming the development and security landscape of Jammu & Kashmir. It brings out how the political calculations and personal proclivities of an earlier era were finally countered by national sentiment."

Ambala airport to become
operational with maiden flight
to Ayodhya on Aug 15

Army takes over country's reins in
Bangladesh

Seeking safe passage for London

NEW DELHI : It is not immediately clear whether the military transport aircraft see 130-J will take her beyond India or she will travel to London in a different plane. Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, who resigned on Monday following unprecedented anti-government protests, is on her way to London through India, multiple diplomatic sources said. Hasina is learnt to be travelling in a transport aircraft of the Bangladesh Air Force and it is expected to have a stopover in India. India decided to provide a safe passage through the Indian airspace to Hasina's aircraft following a request from Dhaka.



Indian government sources said New Delhi is closely following the fast-paced developments in Dhaka. There is no reaction yet from India on the unfolding developments in Bangladesh. In Dhaka, Bangladesh Army Chief General Waqar-uz-Zaman said Hasina has resigned and an interim government is taking over the responsibilities. "I'm taking all responsibility (of the country). Please

cooperate," he said in a televised address. The Army chief said he had met political leaders and told them the Army would take over responsibility for law and order. More than 100 people have been killed in the protests against the Hasina government over the last two days. The students' protests in Bangladesh started last month against a controversial job quota scheme. The protests now have turned into an anti-government agitation. The controversial quota system provided for 30 per cent reservations in civil services jobs for the families of veterans who fought the 1971 liberation war.

7 new international destinations being
eyed by IndiGo airline in this
fiscal year

NEW DELHI : The largest airline IndiGo carrier operates more than 2,000 flights daily and flies to around 120 destinations, including 33 overseas cities. Earlier this month, IndiGo announced that it will launch flights to Jaffna. The country's largest airline IndiGo will launch flights to seven more international destinations in the current financial year, its CEO Pieter Elbers said on Monday. Elbers, speaking at an event in the national capital to mark the carrier's 18 years of



flying, said there will be more international expansion. He also said that IndiGo will launch flights to seven new international destinations before the end of this financial year. The fiscal ends on March 31, 2025. With the new launches, the airline will be flying to over 40 international

destinations, he added. IndiGo has a domestic market share of nearly 61 per cent and around 975 planes on order. At the end of June, the airline had 382 planes, including 18 aircraft on wet lease. The carrier will be getting A321 XLR planes in 2025 and wide-body A350 aircraft in 2027.

58 hi-tech ambulances flagged off

"It is not my problem that Punjabis have rejected the BJP. Maybe they are giving vent to their frustration of losing all Lok Sabha seats in Punjab by denying us our dues," he said. He said though they were committed to imparting quality health services in the state, the Union Government was hatching conspiracies to deny these to Punjabis. "They have stalled the release of grant under the NHM just to

torpedo pro-people initiatives being taken by the state government, as Punjab has a non-BJP government," he said. The CM said it was strange that despite immense contribution in the freedom struggle, making the country self-reliant in food production and safeguarding the unity, integrity and sovereignty of the country, Punjab has been completely ignored in the Union Budget. He said the Niti Aayog meetings were a futile exercise as states did not even get proper time to flag issues of their concern.

Fake admission into nursing course, ex registrar apprehended

Chandigarh :A case has been registered at vigilance bureau police station, Jalandhar range, and both the arrested accused will now be produced in court of law. The PNRC (Punjab Nursing Registration Council) was responsible for overseeing nursing colleges in Punjab, including granting recognition, allocating seats, and conducting ANM and GNM courses and examinations. During a probe into a complaint about fraudulent admissions and examinations, it was discovered that KD College of Nursing at Ma hilpur in Hoshiarpur district received recognition from the Indian Nursing Council in New Delhi on Sept 25, 2019 and

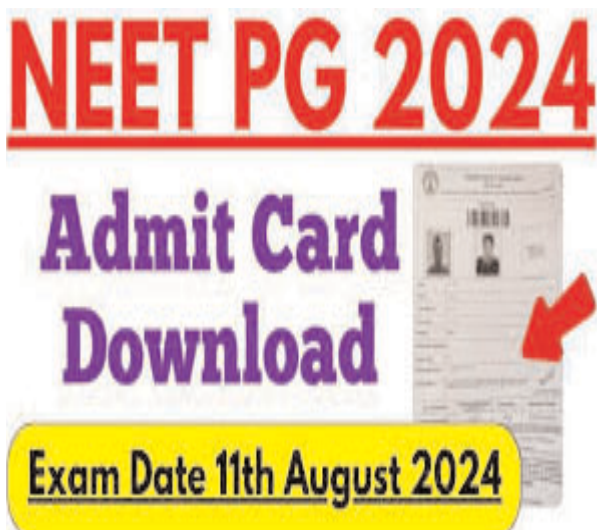


from the PNRC on Nov 29, 2012. However, the PNRC in Mohali had issued admission forms and receipt numbers to the college before its official recognition reached. The PNRC received admission forms for five roll numbers from KD College of Nursing, but these forms and roll numbers were actually issued to Princeton Institute of Nursing in Gurdaspur, said a spokesperson. Charanjit Kaur Cheema, former registrar of the

Punjab Nursing Registration Council (PNRC), and Dr Arvinder veer Singh Gill for irregularities in nursing admissions and examinations have been arrested against their misconduct. A fake admission list for these five students was created prior to the college's recognition in Oct 2012 and based on this fraudulent list, a cut-off list was issued for these roll numbers upon receipt of examination forms and fees.

Double capacity of inmates necessitates ideal strength of staff

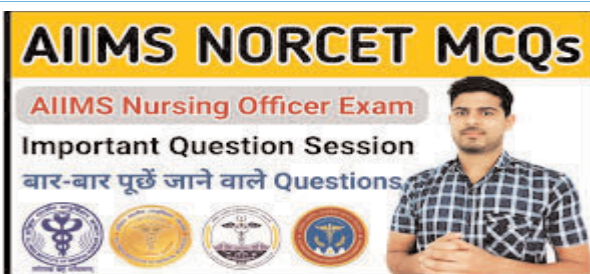

New Delhi: The maximum number of inmates are in the categories of 'severe' and 'profound' mental impairment. So, it's housing double its capacity with inadequate staff and the implications for the patients who are totally dependent on their caregivers can be imagined, said a senior member of the staff who wished to stay anonymous. "The staff crunch not only makes it difficult for the caregivers and medical staff to do their job but also leaves the inmates unattended," said the staffer. The social welfare department, following orders from the LG, had issued a notification on Aug 5



, 2013 for creation of posts which said the home should have around 391 employees, including 10 medical staff (including doctors), 249 nurses and 62 ANMs (auxiliary nurses and midwives). It has today only six medical staff, 17 nurses and 53 ANMs confirmed by the social welfare director - to take care of 1000 inmates!

Asha Kiran, the only Delhi govt run facility for people with mental impairment that's currently on the radar for a surge in the death of inmates in July, has been chronically understaffed. It has double the number of inmates than its actual capacity, but a large number of posts created in 2013 remain vacant.
