India 5th" largest economy, summoned in G7 summit

PM Modi accepted the G7 invite and assured that India and Canada would ' work together with renewed vigour , guided by mutual respect and shared interests . Look forward to our meeting at the Summit ".

because he's very disrespectful. You could not disrespect the office of the President,” he said. On the question of whether he would speak with the Tesla CEO anytime soon, Trump told the American network that he is too busy doing other things. “I'm too busy doing other things,” he said, adding, “I have no intention of speaking to him.” Trump's remarks come days after a heated public dispute in which the president and the world's richest man exchanged personal insults over a significant tax proposal that Musk contests.

Sonam in husband's murder case surrenders before Gazipur UP police

Gazipur -- Sonam Wife of Raja Raghuvanshi Surrendered on Sunday mid night . After husband's murder, Indore Couple had gone missing in Meghalaya Honeymoon murder case.

Raghuvanshi, wife of the Indore man, Raja Raghuvanshi, who was found dead in Meghalaya during their honeymoon, has surrendered to the Police in Uttar Pradesh, in connection to the murder of her husband. Sonam had reportedly gone missing after her husband's body was discovered in a gorge beneath the Weisawdong Falls parking lot in East Khasi Hills on June 2.

After days of search, Sonam was located and taken into custody



from Ghazipur district in Uttar Pradesh. She surrendered at the Nandganj police station late Sunday night.

Sonam Raghuvanshi, who has reportedly surrendered in the murder of her husband Raja Raghuvanshi, after the two went missing during their honeymoon in Meghalaya, called her family late last night from a local dhaba (roadside eatery) in Uttar Pradesh.

Sahil Yadav, owner of Kashi Dhaba said, Sonam started crying on calling her family. She was not mentally well, Mr Yadav claimed. Speaking to the newsmen ,Mr Yadav recalled the episode and said, "Sonam came here around 1am and asked the customers for help. Then she walked to me and asked for my phone to call her family. I gave her my mobile. She started crying while talking to her family. I spoke to the family and informed them about her location. The call disconnected." Mr Yadav offered Sonam water, he said. "After a while, her brother called me and asked to inform the local police about Sonam's whereabouts. Around 2:2:30 am, Police took Sonam," he added.

Pvt coaching centres instructed not to teach in school hours

Chandigarh : The metropolitan town has been turning into a coaching destination . n The recent JEE and NEET results brought dominating changes in the mind-set of the students of Classes XI and XII Many students enrolled at these centers are already registered in schools but they rarely attend classes , instead are seen focusing full time on coaching . The practice of dummy admissions students remaining on school's rolls in name only - is thriving as a result . " Coaching centres cannot



hold classes during school hours, as here is no business or commerce

"These centers have assured the education department of their compliance . However , to those coaching centers violating the rule , let this be a last stern warning . Any further violations will lead to action against the centers," said the Director of

school education , Harsuhinder Pal Singh Brar. An urgent meeting was held on April 11 between the Director Brar and Coaching Centres' representatives in which they were clearly instructed to refrain from operating classes during school hours . However , little seems to have changed on the ground .

Pakistan implores India with 4 letters seeking reinstatement of Indus Water Treaty

Commissioner news service New Delhi : Expressing concerns over the suspension of Indus Water Treaty (IWT) — a step that was undertaken post the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack, revealed the sources .

Pakistan has urged India to re-evaluate the decision of suspending the treaty which has been historic in the annals of international agreements . The treaty was signed by the two countries in 1960 to address the water dispute between them and to share the waters of the six main rivers of the Indus basin. Debashree Mukherjee, India's Secretary of the Ministry of Jal Shakti, in a letter to her Pakistani counterpart, Syed Ali Murtaza, stated after the suspension of the treaty



that India remains a victim of cross-border terrorism emanating from Pakistan. The resulting security uncertainties have directly impeded India's full utilisation of its rights under the Treaty, the letter said. The first appeal was sent in early May, ahead of Operation Sindoor's launch. Since then, Murtaza has issued three more appeals. All correspondence has been direct-

ed through the Ministry of Jal Shakti to the Ministry of External Affairs. The suspension of the treaty is likely to hit Pakistan's Rabi crops hard, sources said, though the Kharif season is expected to remain largely unaffected. The move could also disrupt everyday life and escalate into a water availability crisis. Pakistan has reportedly reached out to World Bank to intervene in the matter, however, it has refused to step in so far, the report corroborated. Post the Pahalgam terror attack, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has mentioned a number of times that trade and terror can't go together and water and blood can't flow together.

Astounding Chenab Railway bridge remains highest

Katra : One cannot erect a great building on a weak foundation. And definitely not, when it's the world's highest railway bridge — now a distinction given to the Chenab Railway Bridge — inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday. The Chenab bridge remains one of the highest points in the career of Madhavi Latha G a professor of civil engineering at Indian Institute of Science (IISc), Bengaluru. Latha worked on the project for 17 years — from 2005, shortly after joining IISc, to 2022, when she took her family to the site to have a look at the almost-completed bridge. A civil engineering graduate from Jawaharlal Nehru



Technological University in Kakinada, Latha went on to pursue her MTech from NIT Warangal and a PhD from IIT Madras, before landing a job as assistant professor at IIT Guwahati in 2003. The Chenab Railway Bridge is a steel-and-concrete structure extending 1,315 m across the river gorge. It consists of a 530-metre-long approach bridge and a 785-metre-long deck arch bridge (the part on which vehicles ply). The steel structure can endure extreme weather conditions, including temperatures as low as -20 degrees Celsius.

Jhampur to Tira becomes a challenge to trudge

Mohali : Lack of connecting metalled roads is taking a toll on the commuters . The absence of roads on either side of the elevated structure has already claimed a life - a young tractor trolley driver was killed recently when his vehicle overturned on the uneven path near the bridge , claimed aggrieved villagers.

The connecting roads remain kutcha (unpaved) , muddy and riddled with danger , especially during monsoon

months . The sharp elevation difference between the bridge and the surrounding terrain makes it difficult for vehicles to navigate , posing a daily risk commuters . The situation is particularly alarming for the students from Jhampur , who must travel to the senior secondary school in Tira . With no proper road connectivity , children are forced to trudge through dusty and muddy tracks making their commute unsafe especially during rains . Farmers and traders also suffer



as the route serves as a key corridor for transporting agriculture produce , dairy and vegetables . Frequent usage by tractors and trucks has further deteriorated the already poor condition of the path , increasing the chances of accidents .

Inadequate supply line adversely affects air power

In the absentia of accountability, the harsh fact remain the IAF’s declining numbers of combat and support platforms have created an ever-increasing inventory gap due to the inadequate future ‘fill rate’ and is already in an irrecoverable downward spiral. Subsequent inductions will no longer be able to replenish the gap unless the industry achieves a substantial production capacity. Slippages snowball further into delays in induction, operationalisation, training and development of employment tactics. The capacity shortcoming is an equally serious challenge in the industry’s maintenance, repair and overhaul, as this means that a significant number of platforms are always waiting in long queues, and therefore there are lesser platforms available on the flight line. Whether it is the homemade Integrated Air Command and Control System, the backbone of the Indian air defence, the Akash surface-to-air missile or the BrahMos cruise missile — the star of the show — credit must go to the Indian industry. But, amidst the heady feel-good factor of success, the refreshingly frank and justified concerns of Chief of Air Staff Air Marshal AP Singh on the industry’s failed promises and missed deadlines are a sobering reality check. The irony is that despite being the primary customer of the Hindustan Aeronautics Limited, one of the oldest and largest aviation industries in the world, the IAF has long been struggling with the downstream effects of decades of sloth in our

aircraft production capability. The Air Chief’s anxiety reflects years of over-promise, under-delivery, slippage of timelines, less-than-acceptable product quality and inadequate product performance follow-up, which the IAF has been a victim of despite decades of hand-holding and support. There is a serious need for the industry to introspect on the slippages in every indigenous platform — the Light Combat Aircraft, Advanced Light Helicopter, Light Combat Helicopter, the Netra Airborne Early Warning & Control System etc and weapon systems. The reduced numbers are weakening India’s conventional deterrence, especially in view of the unique twin-adversary multi-front threat. Post-Op Sindoor, with the widened space for conventional employment of kinetic force, the possibility of a future conflict has gone up. The recent conflict has shown that the China-Pakistan relationship, especially between the two air forces, is no longer a collusive affair. Instead, it is a bold display of open support between two ironclad strategic friends. Since there is no doubt about the role air power will play in any future conflict, the technology differential, the increasing disparity in numbers and the strategic synergy between the China-Pak aviation industry and the air forces are red flags for India’s future security paradigm. The joint air power advantage will alter the continental security dynamics and impact India’s force application

options. India’s already delayed Advanced Medium Combat Aircraft (AMCA) project, which has been recently opened to the private sector, is expected to take over a decade before the platforms can be inducted into service. By that time, China would have altered the air power balance and infrastructure in Tibet in its favour with sixth-generation platforms, and Pakistan would have operationally inducted the fifth-generation J35 as well. Of equal concern is that in this period, the IAF’s mainstay fourth-generation fleet would have also become a decade older, despite their upgraded capabilities. The pace of technological advancements can only increase if the IAF and the industry short-circuit the synapses between the development of future operational concepts, identifying operational requirements, industrial research, development and production and finally operational testing and evaluation. These need to be addressed on the highest priority, given the long distance and lead times between the drawing board and the field. A much-needed and most critical transformational change is for the industry to assume responsibility as a vital stakeholder of national security, and to be held accountable for it. The erstwhile silo-based design-development-testing-production process needs to be made inclusive, with much greater symbiotic institutional embrace between the industry and the customer.

With minimum 20 workers Amendment to Shop & Establishment Act must materialise

CHANDIGARH : Sanjeev Chadha, president the Chandigarh Beopar Mandal, along with over 15 representatives from various markets, held a meeting with the Labour Department, Chandigarh. The meeting was organised by Assistant Labour Commissioner Akshay Mital. A Chandigarh Beopar Mandal (CBM) delegation has given a suggestion to the Chandigarh Administration to exempt all establishments having up to 20 workers from the provisions of the Shop and Establishment Act. The Labour Department, Chandigarh Administration, had invited traders for their suggestions on the proposal mooted by the Government of

India for amending the Act. The Mandal advocated for exemption from the Shop Act for all shops employing less than 20 employees, a move expected to provide significant relief to traders burdened by complex laws and regulations. They said that the exemption was likely to generate more employment and revenue in city markets and promote better employer-employee relationships. They emphasised that this move would encourage businesses to grow, create more jobs and foster a more positive work environment. The officers assured that the suggestions would be sent to the government for amendment in the said Act.

AI-powered tools scouted by Hry Police to check cybercrime

PANCHKULA : Officers from various departments in a meeting were briefed on Saturday by DCP Crime Amit Dahiya on the strategic use of digital tools in policing. To modernise policing and strengthen cyber vigilance, the Panchkula police have determined to adopt AI-powered mobile applications. Among the digital tools introduced were the Sanchar Saathi app, which helps block lost or stolen mobile phones, and the Telecom Analytics for Fraud Management and Consumer Protection (TAFMCP) portal, which allows individuals to check and report unauthorised SIM cards registered in their name. The DCP shed light on the Chakshu portal, designed for reporting frauds and scams, especially those carried out via phone calls and messaging apps. The Bhashini app, capable of translating text and speech across languages, was also demonstrated. The cop said this tool could prove valuable not only for the



police but also for the general public, especially in multilingual scenarios. A live demonstration of these tools was conducted for officers. The DCP said similar workshops will be held regularly and their outcomes reviewed to ensure improvement. DCP Dahiya highlighted that technological advancement was not just an option but a necessity for effective policing in the digital age. Using a video presentation, he demonstrated how the integration of smart applications could significantly reduce response time, enhance transparency, and help in tracking criminals more swiftly. He emphasised that keeping pace with evolving cyber threats was crucial.

100 CTU diesel buses on expiry of operational lifespan to go off tricity roads in November

CHANDIGARH : After reaching their operational lifespan, the buses will no longer be roadworthy and have to be removed from the local routes, said officials of the UT Transport Department. Commuters in the tricity would have to face inconvenience as nearly 100 diesel buses of the Chandigarh Transport Undertaking (CTU) operating on local routes will be condemned in November this year. These 100 aging diesel buses, currently operating from Depot No. 4, are to be replaced by electric buses. The existing fleet, which includes non-AC green and AC red automatic diesel buses, was allotted to the city under a special scheme during the 2010 Commonwealth Games in Delhi. The department had submitted a proposal to the Union Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) for the procurement of environment-friendly buses under the Central government’s PM e-Bus Sewa scheme so that the Administration can process the tender at its level and buy 100 electric buses as



replacement of diesel buses. However, the proposal is yet to be approved. Officials stated that it was now certain that even if the approval was received, there would be a shortage of buses on the local route by the end of this year, as it would take at least two to three months to finalise the tender process and select the company. Even if the process was completed by August or September, the selected company would not be able to deliver 100 buses till November, they added. The shortage of buses would affect routes of Chandigarh as well as Mohali and Panchkula as only CTU buses run for public transportation in the tricity. Officials said buses could be diverted from the long routes to the local routes, but it would affect the long routes, from which the CTU gets more revenue. About 350 buses of CTU run on local routes while about 230 run on long routes.

Manish Tewari advocates for 5-year term of Chandigarh Mayor, will sustain matter in Parliament

CHANDIGARH : The present one-year tenure of Mayor is a totally collapsed and defunct system. The elected mayors are not to blame but the system is a structurally failed model. The one-year term gives little time to a Mayor to work on his or her ideas. Manish Tewari, Chandigarh MP has strongly supported five-year tenure for Mayor in the city. Mr Tewari said he would incorporate the proposal in the Private Bill, which he would be introducing in parliament in near future. The city has witnessed around 30 mayors since the formation of the Municipal Corporation. There is a need for a consensus over the issue, he said. “With due respect to the competence, efficiency and

intelligence of all mayors who have served Chandigarh, their ability was also constrained by the structurally unsound model,” said Tewari. When the first election of the corporation were held in 1996, one big mistake was committed knowingly or unknowingly regarding fixing the tenure of the Mayor for one year. Due to this decision, the power and rights of the Mayor compared to administrative powers are becoming unequal. This has created an insidious power play

situation, he said. The MP said as councillors are elected for five years, there is no justification in fixing the Mayor’s tenure at one year. He said he was also in favour of electing Mayor directly as well as putting in place the provision for his removal by councillors with two-thirds majority. Tewari said the Central Government was giving Rs 5,800 crore to the Chandigarh Administration. Out of this amount, Rs 1,800 crore must be allocated to the Municipal Corporation. Meanwhile, Jasbir Singh Bunty Senior Deputy Mayor, supported Tewari’s views on a five-year term of the Mayor and direct election. He said it would ensure unhindered development of the city.

Civic body negates disclosing names of property tax defaulters under RTI

CHANDIGARH : RK Garg, a social activist and president. Second Innings Association, had sought a list of government departments which had not paid property tax for years. Mr Garg has sought the list along with pending amounts against these departments from the tax department of the Civic body. He said the department refused to provide the information. Even as the defaulters of property tax are bleeding the civic body financially, the municipal corporation has refused to provide the list of defaulters under the Right to Information (RTI) Act. He said that the department had disposed of his application filed under the RTI Act while observing that the information in question form could not be provided under the Act. He said that the reply of

the MC was shocking. He said that no specific reason had been given for not providing the information, which he had sought in public interest. He said that while the MC had enhanced the rates of the property tax and burdened the common man, it was not taking any action against the defaulters, due to which people of the city were suffering. Mr Garg said that instead of concealing the names of the defaulters, the MC must name and shame them. The civic body MC must publish the names of the defaulters in newspapers and put

the list on its official website. He said that while the MC was not providing the names of the defaulters, it was not sparing the common man and imposing a penalty in case of delay. The MC has refused the information at the time when the outstanding amount of property tax has crossed over Rs 200 crore. While the residents are paying the property tax regularly, big defaulters like PGI and Panjab University and other departments are not doing the same. Many departments of Punjab, Haryana and UT are also not paying the tax for different reasons. The MC is presently grappling with a severe financial crunch. All development projects have come to a standstill and no new project is launched. Even road carpeting projects have been put on hold due to a lack of funds.

Administrator approves giving free books till Class XII from next session



CHANDIGARH : The UT Administration has decided to provide free textbooks to all students from Class I to XII of government schools from next academic session. Punjab Governor and UT Administrator Gulab Chand Kataria has given approval to the proposal. Earlier, the benefit was limited up to Class VIII. The initiative is aimed at supporting students from economically weaker sections and reducing the dropout rate in higher classes. At present, around 1.5 lakh students are enrolled in 112 government schools across the city. With the Administration focusing on boosting education infrastructure, many parents have opted to shift their children from private to government schools, particularly in Class XI and XII. “Extending free textbooks till Class XII will ensure that no child is deprived of learning due to financial constraints,” said a senior official. This administrative step

comes alongside other measures to boost education in the city such as solar-powered buildings to cut down on school bills and campaigns against drug abuse among schoolchildren. coaching after school, the Administration has begun drafting a plan to ensure that talent is not hindered by financial constraints. Kataria has directed officials to design a framework for this initiative, which will include mentorship, study material and possibly partnerships with reputed institutes providing coaching for the UPSC exams. “This effort is not just about academic support but also opening pathways for the underprivileged youth to dream bigger and achieve leadership roles in society,” stated the official. Recently, the UT Administrator felicitated 16 students — children of group B, C and D employees of the Raj Bhawan — for their exemplary performance in the Class X and XII board examinations. The Governor also felicitated aspiring NEET/JEE students who were enrolled in professional courses (post Class XII) and postgraduates preparing for competitive exams and gave them cash awards.

"Govind kept saying, 'I have left everything to you, please manage the business while I am away in Shillong,'"

He said Govind (Sonam's brother) had no idea his most trusted employee was allegedly involved in the sensational crime.

Raj Kushwaha behaved as if he were the pillar of strength for the family.

Last week, he visited the family and behaved normally.

Protesters pour petrol on head , threaten to set themselves on fire in Manipur

A group of young men in Imphal poured petrol on their heads and threatened to set themselves on fire in Manipur's capital Imphal over the arrest of a key leader of the Arambai Tenggol (AT), a volunteer group of the Meitei community which faces allegations of participating in the Meitei-Kuki ethnic clashes.

One of them was heard saying, "We have given up arms. We have done what you're supposed to do during the floods. Now you're arresting us. We will kill ourselves."

Wednesday. "Operation Sindoor, in case some Americans obviously don't know about this, is a vermilion mark that is applied to the centre of the forehead of married women in the Hindu tradition. It's widely practised. Some non-Hindus do it too, but more for decorative purposes, but strictly speaking, the Sindoor is applied at the time of the marriage ceremony and is worn every day thereafter by married women," Tharoor said when asked why India chose the name 'Operation Sindoor' for its counter-terrorism action.

As many as 26 people were killed and several others injured in the terrorist attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam on 22 April. Indian Armed Forces launched Operation Sindoor on May 7, targeting terror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir.

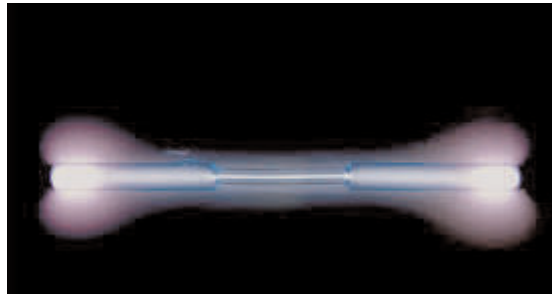
Mountaineering by 4 British climbers has last week turned the adventurous climb into a much easier ordeal.

Vancouver : Canadian investigative journalist Mocha Bezirgan on Sunday said that he was physically assaulted by Khalistanis in Vancouver, where he was “surrounded and threatened”.

Bezirgan said multiple thugs grabbed my phone out of my hand.”

Bezirgan, an independent journalist, was in Vancouver to cover a rally by Khalistanis when the assault took place.

“This was done by an individual who has been harassing me for a long time online using dehumanising language against me. I have been covering Khalistan protests in Canada, UK, US, New Zealand,” Bezirgan added.

“My only goal remains



doing independent journalism and record and report what's going on because I'm editorially independent, this frustrates some people. They want to influence me, they want to buy me. He is not even a Canadian citizen. He is from the UK. I was just there reporting on the event. Khalistanis gathered to honour their so-called martyrs, including the assassins of Indira

Gandhi,” Bezirgan said that the people who surrounded him turned their faces away as soon as he started recording. “One individual came up to me and started asking me questions. He was very close to my face. Then, all of a sudden, I had 2-3 people surrounding me with questions. He was very close to my face. All of a sudden, I had 2-3 people surrounding me with the same physical closeness, like I had nowhere to go.” Sensing that a physical altercation may break out, Bezirgan said he began recording the incident. “I was recording secretly from my main camera because I felt that something physical was about to happen.
