Untreated sewage has posed significant risks/hazards to human health and to environment, equally causing water pollution spreading diseases and depleting oxygen level in water bodies.

A wide range of unseen diseases like diarrhoea, cholera, typhoid fever, hepatitis A and dysentery by contacting with contaminated water from untreated sewage lead to water body illnesses particularly when people bathe swim or consumes

contaminated seafood. Besides, sewage may contain industrial chemical, heavy metals, pharmaceutical and other pollutants which can further contaminate water bodies and cause health risks. Untreated sewage

can make water unsafe for human use, aquatic life and of a culture. The decomposition of organic matter in sewage by bacteria consumes large amount of oxygen leads to low oxygen level in water bodies. The discharge of

untreated water can disrupt natural ecosystem by altering the balance of nutrients and harmonizing the aquatic biodiversity. Builders are not permitted to discharge the sewage water under the water pollution act, section 25, 26 act ,

1974 over the metalled road.. Sewage water by SBP project is persistently being discharged in the ambience of towering residential building, also in the vicinity of Nabha Sahib, where daily commuters are being plagued..

The residents of the village Nabha Sahib have deplored the mechanism of laying the temporary pipeline for sewage discharge which has been germinating foul stench and a chain of maladies. They have demanded a proper

drainage system by replacing the pipe line. Despite repeated calls to District pollution control centre Mohali, there was no reply from the Snr Environmental Engineer Rantez Sharma.

EDITORIAL

US beggaring the rest of world

What Trump is trying to do is to revive US manufacturing by raising tariff walls. The logic is that if US consumers have to pay more for imported goods, they will switch to goods produced at home. On the other hand, if foreign exporters are willing to reduce prices, then the US government will earn from duties while American consumers will continue to pay the same prices. Again, if foreign governments reduce tariffs to match what the US charged till now on imported goods, it will increase the sale of US-made goods in foreign markets, such as India. In each case, the US gains by beggaring the rest of the world. In the past few years, Indian pharma companies have increased their share of retail drug sales in the US, making India the third largest pharmaceuticals exporter to the US, behind Ireland and Switzerland. When Trump's reciprocal tariffs come into play, Indian drug companies might have to reduce their prices by 6-8 per cent to ensure the US consumer doesn't pay more. Otherwise, they might switch back to Irish and Swiss drug manufacturers, who have been losing market share to Indian companies. In fact, Trump has indicated that he will announce higher tariffs on

pharmaceuticals very soon, which might well go beyond reciprocal rates. In that case, Indian drug companies might find their market share shrinking and their profits getting squeezed. Another big export is diamond and gold jewellery. In 2024, we exported \$12 billion worth of gems and jewellery to the US. We also export textiles and clothing. Last year, we sold \$11 billion worth of readymade garments, yarn and textiles to America. India also exports a wide variety of seafood to the US. We also sell different kinds of rice to American consumers. In all, we sold more than \$6 billion worth of agricultural products, seafood, fish and processed foods in the US market, in 2024. India's exports to the US are worth \$45 billion more than what we import from there. Trump believes that a big reason for this gap is that India imposes much higher tariffs on imports from the US, which makes US-made goods more expensive in India. On an average, India levies 12 per cent as tariff on goods coming into our domestic economy from outside. That is more than five times what the US imposes. The gap is even more stark when we take specific items. On agricultural products, India imposes a 37.8

per cent average tariff — the US levies just 5.4 per cent. Our tariff on US-made automobiles and auto parts is more than 24 per cent. Till recently, the US charged just 1 per cent on our auto exports. The gap between India's tariffs and that of the US, till now, was 32.4 per cent on agricultural products, 23.1 per cent on auto parts, 13.3 per cent for diamond and gold jewellery, 8.6 per cent on pharmaceuticals and 7.2 per cent on electronic, electrical and telecom products. Our exports to the US stood at \$78 billion in 2023-24, and in the first six months of this fiscal, it already crossed \$60 billion. The most important of these were medicines — our pharmaceutical companies export cheaper versions of important drugs to the US and earn big bucks. Then came telecom products, like reassembled iPhones, and other electronic and electrical gadgets and machines. Although we don't sell too many cars to American consumers, we do export a lot of auto parts. The US market accounts for 27 per cent of our automobile exports. We also export auto parts to other countries, which are then used in finished automobiles that are shipped to the US.

Ward-wise draft list for panchayat poll to be released from April 11

Every resident of the district who has completed 18 years of age should be included on the list. by April 25, and such appeals will be resolved by May 6. The final voter list will be published on May 13. She further informed that byelections for the post of panch will be held in all four blocks of Panchkula district. Additionally, the byelections for the post of sarpanch will be held in Sabilpur village of Morni block and Mirapur village of Raipur Rani block. The byelections for panch's posts will also be held in Batour, Kami, Shyamtu, Tapria (Barwala block); Baldwala (Morni block); and Bahbalpur, Banwali, Bhood, Debar, Mandpa, Masumpur, Mauli, Natwal, Rampur Thado, Shahjanpur, Sultanpur, Tharwa, and Dandlawad (Raipur Rani block).

Demand for upgradation of better facilities at Kharar railway station : MP Satnam Singh

End to end digitisation of services planned under Right to Service Act

CHANDIGARH : In order to improve the implementation of RTS Act, auto appeal system, E-services portal, service plus portal, e-Sampark portal and any other portal may be integrated and brought under a single platform. Regarding end-to-end digitisation and auto appeal system, the state information officer, National Informatics Centre (NIC), was directed to develop a single unified online platform in a time-bound manner. Ramesh Gupta, State Information Officer (SIO), National Informatics Centre (NIC), apprised about the current status of services digitised in Chandigarh and also discussed the action plan for digitisation of the remaining services. To provide time-bound services, the UT Administration may bring all e-services provided by different departments under the

Right to Service (RTS) Act. A meeting was held here recently to review the progress of services provided under the RTS Act and discuss the way forward. The meeting was co-chaired by Dr Mahavir Singh, Chief Commissioner, Chandigarh RTS Commission, and Rajeev Verma, Chief Secretary. The Chief Commissioner said that apart from seven states, Chandigarh was the only UT where RTS Commission had been established and 441 public services of 31 departments had been notified under the Chandigarh RTS Act till now. He further said that the basic objective of RTS was to provide time-bound services to the people and ultimately improve their living conditions,

especially the poor and the middle class. Singh outlined the duties of designated officers and the administrative departments. The departments will identify the services to be added/modified under the purview of the Act. They will monitor and track the status of service to an applicant and get the feedback of the services provided. During the meeting, 'end-to-end digitisation' of services was stressed upon, wherein all e-services provided by different departments might be brought under the RTS Act. Verma directed all department to complete the remaining process of digitisation and notification of public services under the RTS Act within the stipulated time period. He also directed the officers to send the monthly progress report with respect to applications received by the designated officer to the commission in the prescribed pro forma.

20% reservation earmarked for Agniveers in state police recruitment : CM Saini

CHANDIGARH : In July 2024, months ahead of state Assembly polls, the BJP government in the state had announced a 10 per cent reservation for Agniveers in the recruitment of constables, forest guards and jail wardens, along with quotas in other posts.



The Haryana Cabinet has already provided security cover to the Agniveers by implementing the Haryana Agniveer Policy-2024. Saini said Agniveers will be able to get jobs in Haryana after their service period in the Army and for this, a separate portal will be created for them on which they can register themselves. After this, they will be given preference in jobs on the basis of educational qualification, he added. During the meeting, officials informed Saini that 2,893

Agniveers were recruited in the Army, Navy and Air Force from Haryana during 2023-24 and 2,227 were recruited in 2022-23. Those Agniveers from Haryana who want to adopt self-employment or entrepreneurship will be provided loans at affordable rates. Apart from this, if the industries employ Agniveers on a monthly salary of more than Rs 30,000, the government will provide an annual subsidy of Rs 60,000 to those industries, the statement said. Those Agniveers who want to serve as private security personnel will be given priority in providing gun licences. For this, they will have to apply on the portal, it said.

Administraction hikes threefold in property tax on residential units

CHANDIGARH : The new tax will be applicable from April 1 for 2025-26 on the property tax. The Administration has notified a threefold increase in property tax on residential properties and two-time hike on commercial ones. All government properties are exempt from the hike. The Municipal Corporation (MC) had introduced the property tax at the rate of 3% of the annual rateable value on commercial, industrial and institutional land and buildings in 2004. The residential land and buildings were brought within the tax ambit in 2015. The levy had not been revised since it was first introduced. According to the notification issued by the UT Local Government and Urban Development Department, "For the assessment year 2025-26, the property tax on residential sites and buildings shall be



increased by three times the rates already specified by the administration (9% of the annual rateable value). The property tax on commercial and industrial lands and buildings shall be charged at 6% of the annual rateable value." The notification further stated that properties that fall in the category of service charges shall continue to be charged at currently applicable 3% of the annual rateable value. In February this year, the MC wanted to increase the property tax across all categories by four times to enhance its annual

revenue by nearly Rs 200 crore. Also, the MC had proposed a 1% annual hike on commercial properties (until reaching the limit of 15%) and 5% annual hike on residential properties. However, the proposal was rejected by all councillors cutting across party lines, but MC Commissioner Amit Kumar wrote a dissent note, stating that it was the need of the hour to improve MC's financial conditions. The proposal was sent to the UT Administration, which approved the increase in the tax.

Worth Rs 35 Lakh medical equipments donated by Shubman Gill

MOHALI : Among the donated equipment were a ventilator, bedside monitors, a multi-parameter monitor, minor OT tables, OT lights, and an X-Ray system. Kaur is posted as District Immunisation Officer in Patiala.

His family had shifted from Fazilka to Mohali when Shubman was a budding cricketer in search of better facilities to train at. He honed his skills in Mohali and has since gone on to become a regular feature in the national team. Recently, he was back in the city for the IPL encounter between Gujarat Titans and Punjab Kings at the PCA stadium in Mullanpur.

Pilot project to generate access fard, mutation documents online in Mohali

CHD/MOHALI : "The state on an average generates 40 lakh fards in a year. We hope after the formal launch of the digitally signed fard system, there will be no need to visit the Fard Kendras. It will be helpful to speed up the work of farad generation," said Additional Chief Secretary-cum-Financial Commissioner (Revenue) Anurag Verma. Mr Verma, added to facilitate registration of deeds and other revenue-related works and eradicate the corruption in revenue offices, the district administration will soon initiate a pilot project to generate digitally signed fard online. A beta version of the



application has been launched on website where one can apply for the document digitally after paying an online fee. The documents will then be handed out on WhatsApp. The digitally signed fard will carry a QR Code to ascertain its authenticity. Visiting the Sub-Registrar Office at the District Administrative Complex, Verma said the project was being initiated on pilot basis in the district before being launched statewide. Besides, an online module for entering Mutation and

Revenue Rapat (Report) is also in testing mode on the website of Revenue Department. He appealed to the general public to visit the website and use the beta versions to access the documents. Verma said his visit was aimed to assess the requirements for making necessary changes on ground. During his visit to the Kharar Sub-Registrar Office, the Additional Chief Secretary interacted with the visitors who had come in to access their deed registration and asked about the functioning at the office. He also visited Zirakpur and Dera Bassi Sub-Registrar Offices and interacted with the locals.

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"India's would gain in US tariff" campaign : Piyush Goyal

MUMBAI : "Every sector has a different sentiment. I am in communication with each one of them. The industries of India see opportunities in this turmoil. We are confident that India's gain is in this vicissitude," said Piyush Goyal Union Minister for Commerce and Industry.

On Monday Piyush expressed confidence that India's industries will benefit from the recent tariff announcements made by US President Donald Trump amid the turmoil in global markets following its recent announcement.

Speaking to reporters during the FICCI's 98th Foundation Day celebrations, Goyal acknowledged the different sentiments expressed by the different sectors upon the tariff announcement and that India sees this as an opportunity.

Goyal also highlighted the growth of India's startup ecosystem, noting that under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership, the "Start-Up India" initiative, launched nine years ago, has resulted in the rise of over 170,000 startups, up from



just 400. "PM Modi launched start-up India movement 9 years ago. From 400 startups, we are now more than 170,000-plus startups. The country is proud of it," he added. Meanwhile, Congress leader Shashi Tharoor expressed concerns over the impact of US tariffs on India's economy and emphasised the need for effective bilateral trade agreements and called the situation "quite negative". "It is a very concerning issue. You know that there is a lot of hope that the bilateral talks with the United States will bring some assurances and relief, but as of now, in the short term, the situation is quite negative," he

stated.

He emphasised that the global market has been severely affected, saying, "The global market is bad, not just in India but across the world. As you said, prices are also rising, and nobody understands Trump's tariffs and what they mean." Moreover, according to a research report by the Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI), India could see a decline of USD 5.76 billion or 6.41 per cent, in exports to the US because of the tariffs in 2025.

The research highlights sectors where India may gain or lose ground, offering a nuanced picture of the challenges and opportunities emerging from the new US tariff regime. The tariffs are likely to give a mild blow to India's merchandise exports to the US. In 2024, India exported USD 89.81 billion worth of goods to the U.S, but this could decline by approximately USD 5.76 billion, a drop of 6.41 per cent, as a result of the new trade measures in 2025.

India to launch 52 surveillance satellites for intelligence : Chief of Defence Staff

NEW DELHI : "With space emerging as a new domain that will dominate warfare, the tri-services need to have their own space warfare school for training in the near future," he said. Stepping up its efforts to harness the outer space for military use, India is set to launch 52 dedicated satellites for gathering intelligence and surveillance.

In addition, a military space doctrine, which would serve as a policy for the armed forces, was expected to be finalised within the next three months. Chief of Defence Staff General Anil Chauhan said in his address at the Indian DefSpace Symposium here.

"We are looking at launching 52 satellites for the purpose of intelligence gathering, reconnaissance and surveillance. This will be done by the Indian Space Research Organisation in association with the private industry," he said. The symposium was organised by the Indian Space



Association at the Manohar Parrikar Institute for Defence Studies and Analyses here.

Apart from the military space doctrine, the government was also working on a national military space policy, said General Chauhan. The doctrine, he said, would define space for the military in terms of low and medium earth orbit constellations. The General listed how militaries were using space for observation, communication and targeting. "This will form the basic building block for future wars," he said. The CDS said the nation needed to have a space culture that fostered new ideas and capabilities in

warfare. "This culture should include seminal research, original doctrines and strategies. It's not just about creating startups, but we also need to have journals and institutes to ideate on the subject," he said.

Former Air Force Chief Air Chief Marshal VR Chaudhari (ret'd) said, "Satellites are shrinking in size but growing in capability. We are witnessing a strategic shift from large satellites to proliferated and resilient constellations across multiple orbits." On the private sector's emergence in the space sector, Indian Space Association Chairman Jayant Patil said, "The Indian industry has already delivered technologies such as surveillance and communication satellites, jammers and tracking radars". The symposium was aimed at exploring the latest trends, opportunities and challenges in the defence and space sectors, said Patil.

OPD suffers against no Medicine Specialist in Civil Hospital

LUDHIANA : The OPD (Out Door Patients) is currently being run with the help of two doctors who visit it on days assigned to them as here is no medicine specialist in the hospital.

The Civil Hospital, Ludhiana, has been eagerly awaiting for the medicine specialist but the wait seems to be getting longer. Even after thirteen days of the allotment of the station, the doctor has not joined the duty so far.

The state government last month allotted stations/postings to 255 doctors as part of the bonded government service across various public healthcare institutions of the state, post-completion of their PG courses. Of the 255 doctors, the district got 13, of which one was allotted to the Civil Hospital.

In Punjab, MD/MS graduates are required to sign an indemnity bond, committing to serve the state government for a period of two years after completing their postgraduate



courses, with a bond amount of Rs 15 lakh. Failure to serve the government for the stipulated period will result in the recovery of the bond amount. "The doctor allotted the station has not joined the duty. The Civil Hospital is facing a tough situation amid the post of Medicine Specialist lying vacant. The post had fallen vacant last month after the lone specialist, Dr Amanpreet Kaur, was promoted as Health and Family Welfare Officer," said Dr Harpreet Singh, Senior Medical Officer, Civil Hospital. Sushma, a patient at the OPD, said "Two days ago, I was unable to meet the doctor as

there was a huge rush and my turn was late. I could not stay away from home for long, hence, I returned the next day," she said outside the Medicine OPD.

Echoing similar views, another patient said the doctor he used to consult is not available now. "I am waiting for the past two hours and still not able to meet the doctor. There is a massive rush of patients at the hospital and it needs more doctors. A huge rush is witnessed at the OPD of the hospital and the daily footfall at the OPD is around 1,000-1,500 patients. The hospital was expecting more doctors but even the one allotted has failed to turn up

The United States slapped a 26% reciprocal tariff on India, dealing a blow to the South Asian country's hopes of relief under President Donald Trump's global trade policy. "The tariff is higher than expected," Colin Shah, managing director of Kama Jewellery, one of India's leading diamond

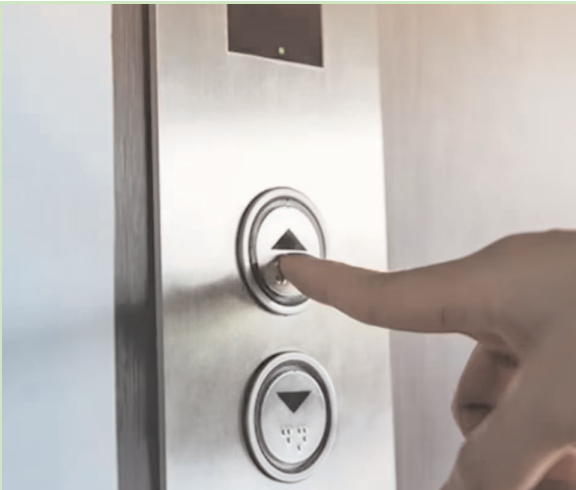
jewellery manufacturers, "It is quite severe and will affect exports." India is the world's largest hub for diamond cutting and polishing, handling nine out of every 10 diamonds processed globally. The United States accounts for nearly \$10 billion or 30.4% of India's annual gems and jewellery exports of \$32 billion. Gems and jewellery are India's third-largest export to the United States, after engineering and electronic goods, and the industry employs millions in the South Asian country.

PGI's non functional lifts drives centre to act

Chandigarh: The ongoing lift crisis created significant challenges for both the public and staff, especially elderly individuals and those with physical disabilities. The sudden shutdown of all four lifts in Research Block A left wheelchair-bound staff struggling to access their duties.

The ministry of health and family welfare, New Delhi, has sought an official report from the PGI after it was revealed that 13 lifts across various buildings in the institute were non-operational last week. This included several older lifts that were shutdown for maintenance without prior notice to the public. An official spokesperson from PGI confirmed the communication from the ministry, stating that the engineering



department had received the inquiry and was compiling the necessary information for a priority submission. According to the earlier statement from the superintendent Hospital engineer in PGI, eight lifts in the institute had been shut down by the agency responsible for their maintenance for inspection and repairs. These lifts, which were out-

dated had been slated for replacement. Two lifts each in research Block A and B, APC and Nehru Hospital were restored a day after the necessary repairs were completed. However, the situation remained problematic as two lifts in Research Block A, one in Research Block B, one in APC, one in Nehru Hospital were still awaiting replacement.

No arrest via video calls: DCP

Panchkula : In the wake of rising 'digital arrest' cases, Monday urged caution, say-police do not make arrests via video calls and that digital arrest is a scam," said Himadri Kaushik DCP. Nowadays, a new and highly dangerous scam called 'digital arrest' is being used by cyber fraudsters to target ordinary citizens. In this cybercrime, the fraudsters impersonate police officers, CBI, narcotics, RBI or other officials and confidently communicate with people, often through video calls. The uniform, background, and manner of speaking of the person on the video call seem so realistic that people get deceived. The vic-



tims are mentally harassed and threatened with being implicated in serious crimes or having their family members involved, demanding large sums of money. DCP warned the public about this scam, describing it as a well-organised cybercrime, in which fake officials deceive people into transferring large sums of money. The scammers make contact

via platforms like Whatsapp and Skype, which are not official govt. communication channels. Victims are made to believe that they are under investigation for a criminal case and are threatened with arrest if they do not cooperate. Out of fear, most individuals fall for this trap and transfer hefty amounts to the fraudsters.

Ayushman Bharat bills remain under dark clouds in PGI

Chandigarh : In order to prevent the malfunctioning of encashing the Ayushman Bharat bills, online indenting system was introduced. The step was initiated due to unreliable mechanism where fraudulent slips were feasible. The manual indenting system had been replaced for Ayushman/ Himcare / CGHS beneficiaries by an online indenting system in Nehru Hospital of PGI and soon would be implemented across the PGI institution, elaborated an official. An disclosure of the probe of 2023 has already been



made, but no action yet had been initiated. Not serving any letter to the law breakers, raised suspicion said Ashwani Munjal, chairman of the Joint Action Committee. A comprehensive list of missing bills is however available with the Central cell, revealed the sources.
