## US to refund 4 Arab dollar tariff penalty from 27 Aug to 06 Feb 26

### Panel of Commerce, Finance & Foreign secretaries to monitor import of Russian crude oil

Washington : In case transgression of pact by India is found resumed by the US task force comprising Commerce Secretary, Treasury Secretary, and the the US secretary of state, in the violation, the Secretary of state could revive back the 25% penalty tariff on India if deemed fit. As the US pleads their version that

India has committed to stopping Russian federation oil and will purchase energy products from the United States and also potentially from Venezuela while getting revoked 25 % of additional tariff on India, the version has not been denied or confirmed by India. The refund of charged tariff from 27 August 2025 to 06 Feb 2026. The refund would be made in

accordance with the existing customs and border protection law, In line with the market conditions and evolving international dynamics, all minutes have been contemplated . The ministry of External affairs adds that it was open to exploring the possibility of crude oil supplies from the Venezuela. It further added that Venezuela had been a long



standing partner of India in the energy sector, encompassing trade and investments. Consistent with India's approach to energy security, India

remains open to exploring the commercial merits of any new crude supply options, including from Venezuela said MES spokesman Randhir Jaiswal.

At times, our government had publicly stated that ensuring the energy security of 1.4 billion Indians had been the supreme priority of the present regime. "Made in India" products will now be exported to US at the reduced tariff of 18%. The trade agreement will give a major boost to India export, labour intensive industries, job creation growth

and bring prosperity to our people. Shiv Raj Singh Chouhan Union Agriculture Minister, however said peel less onion, potatoes, beans, peas, mushroom, orange lemons, grapes caned vegetables will not be accepted under existing tariff rules in India including cereals and atta. Other products like condensed and powder milk, cream,

curd, butter, lassi , liquid and other items, Dry and green chilly, pepper, coriander, cinnamon, turmeric, asafoetida, ginger, cumin, fenugreek, carom seeds, and mustard. No tariff would be leviable on kabli chana, moong, tilhan, mutton, poultry, dairy, soyabeen, rice, macca, wheat sugar, strawberry, cherry, fruits and bananas.

## Trump team left Pakistan with Indian map showing no POK

Washington/ Islamabad : New Delhi and Washington announced the framework for an interim trade agreement on Saturday, a map of India shared by the Trump administration quietly took centre stage and garnered attention on social media. While releasing the trade deal details, the US trade representative's office released a map of India showing the entire Jammu and Kashmir, including Pakistan-occupied Kashmir



(POK), as part of the country. The Indian map also included Aksai Chin, which China claims to be part of its territory. However, it's not that the validation of India's territo-

rial sovereignty required US approval. India has always maintained that Kashmir was an inalienable part of our country. Nevertheless, it marks a departure from the US's earlier stance. Whether deliberate or incidental, it has sent a strong diplomatic signal to Pakistan -- that the US leadership is in line with India's map flagging no POK telling to India to stay with US, and we will explain why.

## Night hrs driving becomes hazardous, Human Rights Commission approached

P'kula : Panchkula Metropolitan Development Authority would be required to explain frailling infra, asked by Haryana Human Rights Commission

In the satellite town, road signage, lane markings, zebra crossings and reflective studs have virtually disappeared, making night-time driving hazardous. Mandatory signboards such as speed-limit indicators, warning signs at accident-prone zones, slip roads and pedestrian crossings are either missing or poorly maintained, significantly increasing accident risks. The Haryana Human Rights Commission (HHRC) has been approached by the Citizens' Welfare Association (CWA), Panchkula, regarding the poor, collapsing civic infrastructure besides the discernible plight of recarpeted roads.

The Welfare Association has flagged the deteriorating state of civic infrastructure in the city, prompting the HHRC to seek a report from the Chief Engineer of the Panchkula Metropolitan Development Authority (PMDA). The CWA alleged that roads recarpeted barely a year ago have developed deep potholes across several sectors, causing distractions to commuters. The association blamed multiple government agencies, including the



Municipal Corporation, HSPV, PMDA, HSIIDC, the Urban Local Bodies Department, the police and the PWD, for failing to maintain roads, medians, footpaths, drainage systems and traffic infrastructure. The lack of regular tree pruning, particularly in residential areas has blocked sunlight during winter and rendered recently installed reflective guide maps ineffective. Overgrown branches have encroached onto carriageways, posing a danger to heavy vehicles. Damaged footpaths force pedestrians to walk on busy roads. The association further drew attention to the collapse of the drainage system in sectors 8, 9, 10, 15 and 19, resulting in rain-water entering homes during the monsoon, damaging property and disrupting traffic. Frequent damage to central business district (CBD) ducts at major junctions has led to prolonged road closures and traffic diversions. The Commission's intervention has raised hopes among residents for urgent corrective action and accountability.

## Allot farmers' interest a top priority in Trade Negotiation : Jayan Mehta Amul Chief

New Delhi : The India-US trade deal has sparked huge concern among the country's farmers, who feel that cheaper American products coming into the country will add to the challenges they face. The dairy sector, however, feels that those concerns might be misplaced.

Managing Director Jayan Mehta said the agreement strongly protects the farmers and the agriculture sector and give them invaluable access to the US market. "Market access is a very important part and a trade negotiation is always a two-way thing," echoed Mr Mehta with farmers concern. "The negotiations were necessary to get larger market



access and that was done with this deal. As has been negotiated, tariffs also coming down from 50 to 18 per cent, will bring in the Indian products, getting better access to those markets and paving a way for the brighter future for all those associated with this sector," he added. Cattle feed remain stark aspect of the dairy industry and the livestock sector" said Mr Mehta citing the example of Amul which works with 36

lakh farmers across 18,600 villages of Gujarat and collect and handle about 350 lakh litres of milk every day. Amul needs good quality cattle feed, which has a "combination of variety of agricultural-based ingredients like de-oiled rice bran, which comes after the extraction of oil from the husk of the paddy, to maize, rapeseed extractions and molasses". We have, at Amul , about 8 plants manufacturing close to 12,000 tonnes of cattle feed every day." But even here, India is not importing items for which there is little use, he said, giving the example of DDGS (Distillers Dried Grains with Solubles), a little of which is used in cattle feed.

FTA to help EU & India sans any glitches ?

The FTA deal is being concluded now, not because differences between the two sides have vanished, but because geopolitics has forced pragmatism. Recent tariff shocks under Trump, combined with rising dependence on China, have pushed both sides to narrower ambitions, and an executable deal. India and EU together account for 23% of global GDP and 25% of global population (nearly \$25tn and 2bn people), making this one of the world's largest trade deals, serving around 1bn middle- and high-income consumers. Plus, with bilateral goods and services trade already close to \$220bn, it starts from a strong base for expansion. The FTA helps both sides. Because India and Europe sell different kinds of products, they do not compete directly with each other. India mainly exports labour-intensive goods such as garments, footwear and auto parts, along with downstream products like smartphones, generic pharmaceuticals and cut and polished diamonds, and processed fuels including diesel and aviation turbine fuel. EU, by contrast, supplies capital- and tech-intensive products (machinery and aircraft), advanced goods such as electronic components and medical devices, and essential industrial inputs like rough diamonds and metal scrap. Because both operate at different stages of the value chain, tariff cuts will reduce costs and expand trade without hurting domestic industries. This FTA spans 24 chapters covering goods, services, intellectual property, digital trade, govt procurement, environment, labour

and data protection. Here's how both sides stand to gain in the key areas. EU will cut or eliminate tariffs on 98% of Indian goods, though many duties are already low. Real gains lie in garments (around 12%) and footwear (8-15%), where tariff cuts would boost India's competitiveness against Vietnam and Bangladesh. Tariff cuts will also benefit marine products, gems and jewellery, handicrafts, chemicals and machinery. India will reduce or remove tariffs on about 97% of EU exports. Wine duties will fall from 150% to 20-30%, spirits to 40%, beer to 50%, and car tariffs from 100-125% to 10% for up to 250,000 vehicles. India will also move to zero tariffs on many agri-food products and most processed foods, chemicals, machinery, electronics and aircraft. India has secured EU commitments in IT and IT-enabled services, professional services, education, finance, tourism, construction and other business sectors. This FTA also creates a framework, to ease short-term and temporary business travel for professionals. However, the final outcome will be clear only once the text is released. Despite EU being India's second-largest IT market, exports remain below potential. EU rules often require Indian firms to set up local offices even for remote work and impose high minimum salary thresholds for Indian professionals. India is seeking EU recognition as a "data-secure" country to cut compliance costs and compete on equal terms with Japan and South Korea. Overall, India's gains in services will depend on

outcome of data security status, adequate number of short-term visas, social-security totalisation, and mutual recognition of qualifications. Both sides have agreed on facilitative frameworks on above themes, but we have to wait for the legal text for details. India has offered EU its most ambitious commitments on financial services in any trade agreement so far. However, India and EU differ critically on govt procurement, intellectual property, labour, environment and sustainability. We will know the details once FTA texts are released. EU's Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM) began taxing imports based on their carbon emissions from Jan 1. Post FTA implementation, EU goods could enter India duty-free, while Indian exports will continue to face carbon taxes in Europe. Worse, although CBAM currently covers only six products, including steel and aluminium, it is designed to expand to all industrial goods in the next few years, potentially wiping out much of the FTA's tariff gains. The agreement does little to fix this imbalance. EU has agreed to extend to India any flexibility it offers other countries, like recognising carbon prices or verifiers. But this provides no relief to exporters already paying the tax. Also, a proposed cooperation platform in early 2026 and possible EU funding of ₹500mn for India's green transition are broad measures that do not address exporters' immediate; product-level, carbon-tax costs, leaving CBAM largely unresolved. India may consider an equal value retaliation.

New villages under Mohali Municipal Corporation under focus

**MOHALI :** Under the watch of GMADA, major issues related to water supply, sewerage, storm water drainage, ponds and STPs in various villages and colonies were reviewed. Time-bound decisions were taken to ensure completion of works before formal handover and onset of the monsoon season. A review meeting by the Mohali administration, GMADA, the Municipal Corporation (MC) was held to assess the issues/problems of the civic infrastructure in the newly included areas in the extended limits of the civic body. The meeting was attended by Municipal Commissioner



Parminder Pal Singh, officials of the engineer wing of the MC, GMADA, and Water Supply and Sewerage Board. During the meeting the waterlogging issues in Green Enclave were addressed through a dedicated project funded by GMADA, the tenders for which had already been floated by the Municipal Corporation. Cleaning of rainwater drains at Ballomajra and provision of two-three feet diameter pipe at Patiala Ki Rao, estimated cost of which was Rs 30 lakh, were discussed.

During the meeting senior officials were informed that the STP at TDI was functioning satisfactorily. Directions were given to officials concerned for conducting a survey as well as clean and desilt ponds and sewer lines under the Amrit Yojana in villages including Balongi, Landran, Nanu Majra, Sambalki, Mauli Baidwan, Kambali, Lakhnaur and Bilali, Storm water management issues in Gateway City and TDI City were reviewed, and GMADA was directed to submit a comprehensive plan. Officials were asked to urgently address infrastructure concerns in Phase 11, including street lighting and road works.

MC monthly one parking pass attracts 3000 applicants in 10 days

Such practice would make on-the-spot registration quick and hassle-free. The Municipal Corporation's flagship initiative, "MC One Pass", has crossed 3,000 registrations within just 10 days of its launch.



Amit Kumar Municipal Commissioner attributed the success of the initiative to its user-friendly features, simplified processes and extensive awareness efforts. He expressed confidence that the momentum will continue, further strengthening service delivery and reducing procedural delays.

Lok Samadhan Unified online grievance monitoring system launched by administrator

**CHANDIGARH :** Mr Gulab Chand Kataria Punjab Governor and UT Administrator launched the Lok Samadhan - Unified Online Grievance Monitoring System of the Chandigarh Administration. Kataria launched the system at a "Samadhan Shivir" held in Guru Dronacharya Stadium, Dadumajra, for residents of Dhanas and Daddumajra. Chief Secretary H Rajesh Prasad, along with senior UT officers and representatives of various departments, was present at the first-of-its-kind camp organised by the Chandigarh Administration. The portal, available at <https://loksamadhan.chd.gov.in>, enables citizens to register and monitor their grievances online at any time and from anywhere, thereby eliminating the need for repeated visits to government offices. Under the Lok Samadhan system, citizens can submit grievances after mandatory registration using a valid mobile number verified via OTP. Upon submission, an electronic



acknowledgment, along with a unique grievance number is generated and shared with the complainant through SMS, enabling real-time tracking of grievance status and ensuring transparency in the redressal process. The portal provides a centralised digital mechanism for receiving, processing, monitoring and resolving public grievances across departments. The system facilitates structured workflows, defined timelines for disposal, and effective inter-departmental coordination, while significantly reducing manual intervention and paperwork. This initiative is expected to enhance administrative efficiency, strengthen accountability and ensure timely delivery of public services.

Chandigarh Administration seeks Rs 8379.81 crore for FY27 Budget

**CHANDIGARH :** The Central Government for the current financial year, had allocated Rs 6,983.18 crore to the UT. Now for the next fiscal, the Chandigarh Administration has requested an additional Rs 1,396.63 crore, taking the total budget demand to Rs 8,379.81 crore. The Administration has been forwarded proposal to the Union Ministry of Finance. The UT Administration has sought a nearly 20% increase in its annual budget for the financial year 2026-27 to undertake several major development projects across various sectors, including health, education, transport and urban infrastructure. Of the Rs 6,983.18 crore sanctioned for 2025-26, Rs 6,185.18 crore was provided under the revenue head and Rs 798 crore for capital expenditure. Officials said the increased demand reflected the city's growing requirements due to rapid urbanisation and rising pressure on civic amenities. According to sources, the proposed budget for 2026-27 prioritises the health and education sectors. In healthcare,



the Administration plans to construct an Ayush hospital as well as a new hospital in Sector 53 to strengthen medical infrastructure and improve access to services. In the education sector, several government schools are slated for renovation, upgrade and infrastructure improvement to enhance learning facilities. Apart from health and education, the proposed budget also focuses on transportation, housing and urban development projects aimed at easing congestion, improving connectivity and addressing housing needs. Chandigarh had received Rs 6,513.62 crore in the fiscal 2024-25. In 2025-26, the Central Government had increased the allocation by 7.21%. Officials pointed out that while the Administration sought a budget hike of 20-25% every year, the Centre generally approved an increase in the range of 7-10%.

HESMA 1974 law extended in Chandigarh by six months

**CHANDIGARH :** The application of the Haryana Essential Services (Maintenance) Act (HESMA), 1974, in the city has been extended by another six months. The ban on strikes by employees of Chandigarh Power Distribution Limited (CPDL) will continue, said an official of the UT Administration. Power supply is an essential service and any disruption would directly affect the city's residents. To ensure uninterrupted power supply, HESMA has been imposed, prohibiting CPDL employees from going on strike. Any employee who participates in a strike or similar protest during this period will face legal action, in accordance with a notification issued by the UT Administration. Since the employees were reportedly planning a large-scale protest on January 30



in support of their demands, the unequivocal decision was taken to frustrate the designs of the employees union. The HESMA imposed six months back was in force till January 26. Until recently, the Punjab ESMA was applicable in Chandigarh. However, amid ongoing protests against the privatisation of the Electricity Department, the Administration scrapped the Punjab ESMA and invoked the Haryana ESMA, citing its stricter provisions. Officials said that under the earlier rules, only employees directly participating in a strike could face action, but under the Haryana ESMA, even those who plan a strike or provide funds for it could be penalised.

MC Finance & Contract Committee approves projects worth Rs 18.5 crore

**MOHALI :** The Finance and Contract Committee approved various development works across the city. Senior vice president Amrik Singh Somal, MC Commissioner Parminder Pal Singh Sandhu, Chief Engineer Naresh Batta, councillors Jasbir Singh Manku and Anuradha Anand, along with other senior officials, were present at the meeting. During the meeting, work orders worth approximately Rs 18.5 crore were issued.



These include construction of new roads, renovation of government washrooms and toilets, and repair works of the Phase-6 Community Centre, among other important projects. In addition, the committee also approved new estimates

worth around Rs 2.25 crore. MC Commissioner Sandhu, expressed concern that in some cases, despite issuance of work orders, work was not being allowed to commence at the ground level, which he termed unfortunate. He pointed out that in certain areas, officials and contractors were facing pressure, leading to delays in work execution. He stressed that giving a political colour to development works was condemnable, as it ultimately harmed the interests of city residents.

Draft of new excise policy by UT in final stage

**CHANDIGARH :** The process of excise policy formulation had begun in December last year, during which the department had invited suggestions from liquor traders as well as the general public. The UT Excise and Taxation Department is now set to release the 2026-27 excise policy in the first week of March. According to officials, the draft of the policy is in the final stages of approval. Several new provisions are being introduced in the upcoming policy, alongside a significant increase in the revenue target. For the next financial year, the department has planned to set a target of collecting around Rs 1,000 crore through liquor licences, excise duty and value added tax (VAT), said the officials. Despite various challenges in the current financial year, the department has witnessed a rise in excise revenue. The officials said although liquor shop auctions had to be conducted multiple times due to various setbacks, the overall revenue had increased. One of the key focus areas of the new policy



will be to prevent repeated disruptions in the auctioning and operation of liquor shops. In the ongoing financial year, several liquor traders had failed to deposit licence fee within the stipulated time, leading to repeated sealing and unsealing of shops. In many cases, licences were eventually surrendered, forcing the department to re-auction outlets, which caused delays in revenue collection. To address this issue, the department is considering the introduction of stricter provisions in the new policy. The officials indicated that a proposal was under consideration to permanently blacklist liquor traders who repeatedly default on licence fee payment after securing licences in Chandigarh. Under the

proposed provision, traders would be barred from participating in future liquor shop auctions if they failed to deposit fee beyond a specified number of times. The proposed measures will help ensure greater compliance, reduce administrative hurdles and bring stability to the excise system, said the officials. The department had set a target to generate Rs 800 crore in the Excise Policy 2025-26. It had reduced the reserve price for allotment of liquor vends in the current Excise Policy, as 18 units remained unsold in the previous financial year. In the current financial year, the number of liquor vends were increased from 95 to 97. The total reserve price of all these vends was fixed at Rs 452.29 crore. Even after increasing the number of vends by two, the reserve price was reduced by Rs 33.83 crore compared to the previous fiscal year. After several rounds of auctions, five liquor vends remained unsold in the current fiscal year. The officials said efforts were on to meet the revenue target of Rs 800 this financial year.

'Ashirwad Scheme' pleas only through portal of seva kendras

**CHANDIGARH :** The Department of Social Justice, Empowerment and Minority Affairs, Punjab Government, has made an important change in the application process of the Ashirwad Scheme, with the objective of ensuring transparency, uniformity and smooth delivery of services to beneficiaries. Till now, most beneficiaries were applying for the Ashirwad Scheme online through private cyber cafes and personal computers. However, from January 28, the Minister of Social



Justice, Empowerment and Minority Affairs has formally inaugurated the facility of submitting applications on the Ashirwad portal exclusively through seva kendras. With immediate effect, the option of applying for the Ashirwad Scheme through

private cyber cafes or personal computers has been discontinued. Now, applicants wishing to avail of the benefits of the scheme will be able to submit their applications only through authorised seva kendras. District Social Justice and Empowerment Officer Ashish Kathuria has requested all departments concerned and field officers to disseminate this information widely among the people at their respective levels. Applications under this scheme can be made till 60 days after the date of marriage.

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No one can yield impediment in Special Intensive Revision : Supreme Court

NEW DELHI : Amid West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's apprehension of "mass exclusion" of voters in the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in the state, the Supreme Court on Monday said it would not allow anyone to create an impediment in the poll revision exercise. A Bench comprising Chief Justice Surya Kant and Justices Joydalya Bagchi and N V Anjaria said it would issue whatever orders or clarifications are required in the matter. "We will not allow anyone to create any impediment in the SIR exercise. It must be clear to the states," the CJI said while hearing a batch of petitions, including the one filed by Banerjee, related to the ongoing SIR of electoral rolls in West Bengal. The Bench took note of the affidavit filed by the Election Commission (EC)



which alleged burning of its notices by some miscreants. It directed the West Bengal Director General of Police (DGP) to file an affidavit in this regard. The poll panel said that so far, no FIR has been registered against the miscreants. "A message must go that the Constitution of India applies to all states," the CJI said while hearing a batch of petitions, including the one filed by Banerjee, related to the ongoing SIR of electoral rolls in West Bengal. The Bench took note of the affidavit filed by the Election Commission (EC)

7,000 km high-speed rail corridors would be built by 2047: Vaishnav

NEW DELHI : High-speed routes, designed for maximum speeds of up to 350 km per hour and an operating speed of 320 km per hour, will mark a transformative leap in India's rail infrastructure, said the Union railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnav while inaugurating the 16th International Railway Equipment Exhibition (IREE), 2025, at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi. Unveiling an ambitious roadmap for the Railways, on Wednesday announced that the government plans to build 7,000 km of dedicated passenger corridors by 2047 under the Viksit Bharat vision. Vaishnav said the proposed corridors would be powered by indigenously developed signaling systems and modern operations control centres, ensuring both speed and safety. He also outlined the



government's futuristic vision for Vande Bharat 4.0, Amrit Bharat 4.0, and next-generation railway manufacturing standards. Highlighting the success of the Vande Bharat series, he said the third-generation train already meets global parameters, with acceleration from 0 to 100 kmph in just 52 seconds, faster than many trains in Japan and Europe, while maintaining low noise and vibration levels. "Vande Bharat 4.0 will be a new benchmark in performance and passenger experience," said Vaishnav, adding that the upcoming

model will focus on superior seats, enhanced toilets, and refined workmanship. Discussing the Amrit Bharat series, the minister said the 2.0 version is already operational and the 3.0 model, based on push-pull technology, is being developed for long-distance routes. The 4.0 version, he added, will bring in new-generation trainsets and locomotives, expected to be ready for testing within 36 months. Vaishnav credited Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership for what he termed "a decade of modernisation," noting that more than 35,000 km of new rail lines have been laid and 46,000 km of electrification completed in the past 11 years. "Our budget allocation for the Railways has consistently risen, reflecting the government's commitment to a modern, self-reliant network," he said.

AYUSH to become a globally accepted, evidence-based healthcare system : Jadhav

NEW DELHI : "The Government's objective would remain to position AYUSH as an evidence-based, scientifically validated and globally accepted healthcare system" said Prataprao Jadhav Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for AYUSH, on Monday.



Speaking at the Golden Jubilee celebrations of the National Institute of Ayurveda (NIA) in Jaipur, Jadhav said that AYUSH systems have been firmly integrated into the national healthcare framework. He referred to key budgetary announcements, including the establishment of three new "All India Institutes of Ayurveda" and the upgradation of the WHO Global Centre for Traditional Medicine at Jamnagar, as transformative steps for the sector. Chief Minister of Rajasthan, Bhajan Lal Sharma assured full support of the government for the expansion and said that the

state government is working continuously to strengthen AYUSH systems and integrate Ayurveda, Yoga and traditional medicine into the mainstream healthcare framework for citizens to avail. Sharma also flagged the alleged misuse of government facilities by serving and former employees. He said that an incident recently came across to him, wherein 75 boxes of Chyawanprash were sanctioned for a single employee. "Is this appropriate? The government wants to work wholeheartedly for its employees, but such irregularities are deeply disappointing," he added.

Tulip Garden near Palampur opened to public from February 10

PALAMPUR : The garden presents a colourful display of red, yellow, white and multi-coloured tulips, with the CSIR-Institute of Himalayan Bioresource Technology (IHBT) introducing several new flower varieties this year. Tulip Garden developed at the CSIR complex, located about 2 km from Palampur along the Pathankot-Mandi National Highway, will be thrown open to the public on Tuesday, February 10. CSIR-IHBT Director Dr Sanjay Yadav said that the tulip, which originated in Persia (present-day Iran), was introduced to Europe in the 17th century and subsequently developed into numerous varieties. "At present, the Netherlands is the world's largest producer of tulips," he said. Dr Yadav added that tulip is a tuberous cut flower with significant international and domestic demand and ranks third globally in the cut-flower trade. "Under this initiative, the institute has been planting



tulips on its campus for the past three years. This year, nearly 50,000 tulip bulbs of various vibrant varieties have been planted," he said. The garden is expected to attract a large number of visitors from within Himachal and other states, thereby promoting scientific and ecotourism in the region. He noted that the flowers have bloomed earlier than usual this year due to comparatively warmer climatic conditions. Last year, over 1 lakh visitors from across the country visited the tulip garden, and an even higher footfall is anticipated this season. This is the first tulip garden of its kind in Himachal Pradesh. In addition, CSIR-IHBT has

initiated experimental trials on tulip flower and bulb production in the Lahaul valley to promote its commercial cultivation. In the initial phase, farmers from cooperative societies such as Yaani Mahadev Floriculture Society (Madagran), Pattar Valley Floriculture Society Limited (Shansha), and Tinan White Mountain Floriculture Society Limited (Jangla) were trained and empowered to take up tulip cultivation. These farmers are now actively engaged in tulip flower and bulb production and are benefiting economically from the initiative. The institute aims to create new income-generation opportunities for farmers and entrepreneurs while making India self-reliant in tulip bulb production to meet the country's domestic demand over the next seven to eight years.

BJP's commitment to make Thiruvananthapuram 2036 Olympics venue generate political uproar

Thiruvananthapuram : BJP Kerala unit urge it would request the Centre to include the city as one of the venues for the 2036 Games. In its manifesto for the Thiruvananthapuram Corporation election. BJP's local body election manifesto promise to develop the state capital into a co-host city for the 2036 Olympics triggered a political row, with leaders of both LDF and UDF on Monday calling it a fake claim. However, there have been reports that India is bidding for the Games with Ahmedabad as its proposed main host city. Kerala Education Minister V Sivankutty accused BJP of deceiving the people of Thiruvananthapuram. "When the Union Government has bid for the



Olympics in Gujarat, how can BJP here claim that Thiruvananthapuram will be a venue?" He further said as part of the bidding process, BJP is planning for the 2030 Commonwealth Games in Ahmedabad, he claimed. He asked whether BJP state president Rajeev Chandrasekhar considered the people of Thiruvananthapuram "fools". "The proposal submitted to the Olympic body has no mention of Thiruvananthapuram. This is a trick because BJP has nothing to say about development," he said. Senior Congress leader K Muraliedharan also hit out at BJP on its election manifesto,

saying that, fearing defeat, the party had begun making "fake promises". "They know they would not even become the main opposition party this time. Hence, such claims," he said. State Revenue Minister K Rajan echoed a similar view, stating that the host for the 2036 Olympics had yet to be announced, but BJP claimed the event would be held in Thiruvananthapuram. Reacting to the criticism, Chandrasekhar said that other political parties would realise the proposal later. "They do not understand how it will happen. We will teach them after we get the opportunity to govern," he said. BJP is currently the main opposition in the CPI(M)-governed Thiruvananthapuram Corporation. The local body election in the state will be held in two phases on December 9 and 11.

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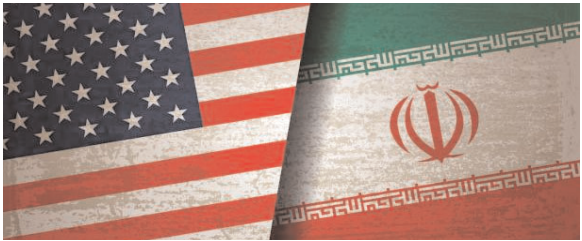
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Iran, US start crucial talks in Oman as confrontation looms

MUSCAT/DUBAI : Iran and the United States started high-stakes negotiations via Omani mediation on Friday to try to overcome sharp differences over Tehran's nuclear programme, but a dispute over widening the agenda risked derailing diplomacy and triggering another Middle East conflict. An Iranian official pronounced the talks had not officially started, although Iran's demands had been conveyed to the U.S. via Oman. The official said indirect negotiations "possibly" would begin after a meeting between the top U.S. negotiator and Oman's foreign minister. Previous Iran-U.S. talks have adopted a shuttle diplomacy approach.



While both sides have indicated readiness to revive diplomacy over Tehran's long-running nuclear row with the West, Washington wants to expand the talks to cover Iran's ballistic missiles, support for armed groups around the region and "treatment of their own people", U.S. Secretary of State Marco Rubio said on Wednesday. Any "presence of CENTCOM (U.S. Central Command) or any regional military officials in the talks can jeopardize the process of indirect nuclear talks between Iran and the United States" in Oman. Iran has said it wants Foreign Minister Abbas Araqchi and U.S. Middle East envoy Steve Witkoff to discuss only the nuclear issue in Oman's capital Muscat. U.S. President Donald Trump's son-in-law Jared Kushner, who helped mediate in Gaza ceasefire talks, is also due to take part in the discussions.

India committed to no longer purchasing Russian oil, \$500 billion of investments goes into U.S. White House

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## Follow up trade deal, Trump lifts 25% tariff on India over Russian federation oil

Washington: India has committed to stop directly or indirectly importing Russian federation oil in accordance with an executive order signed by US President Donald Trump. He moved Friday to lift an additional 25 percent tariff he imposed on goods from India over its purchases of Russian oil -- a step to implement a trade deal announced this week. New Delhi has also said that it will purchase US energy products, and has recently committed to a framework with the United States to expand defense cooperation over the next 10 years," the order said. The additional 25 percent US duty will be removed at 12:01 am



Eastern Time on Saturday. The executive order comes days after Trump announced a trade deal to reduce tariffs on India, saying that Prime Minister Narendra Modi had promised to stop buying Russian oil over the war in Ukraine. The pact would also see Washington cutting so-called "reciprocal" levies on Indian products to 18 percent, down from a 25-percent level. The rollout of this

reduction is still to come. Other terms of the agreement include the removal of tariffs on certain aircraft and parts, according to a separate joint statement released Friday by the White House. The statement added that India intends to purchase \$500 billion of US energy products, aircraft and parts, precious metals, tech products and coking coal over the next five years.

My body will remain my husband's, but my soul will always remain yours," along side an AI-generated image depicting a distraught Field Marshal Asim Munir holding a box of rare minerals before the India Today cover featuring PM Modi and Trump.
