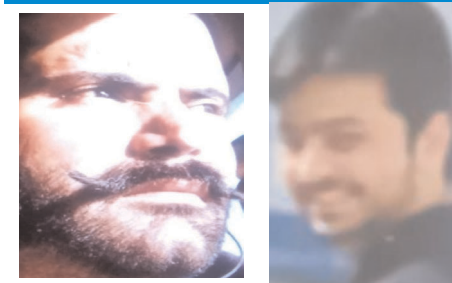

### Closure of Ethanol, Distillery factory demanded Environmental fabric, water ,air being massively damaged

Sanjha Morcha Zira unit,has

closure of the distillery  
,ethanol. factory engaged in  
manufacturing the  
alcohol.The chemical indus-  
trial unit doesn't treat the  
effluents and the very base  
of the ground water is vitiat-  
ed depriving the inhabitants  
of the clean , portable  
water.The morcha near the  
Mansoorwal village remind-  
ed their demand of removing  
this ethnol , distillery fac-  
tory.A borewell was dug out  
at Gurudwara of Mahiyawala  
,at the 600 feet deep, the  
water was smelling chemi-  
cally pungent and alcoholic  
odour was seen in the pollut-  
ed water,said Fateh Singh  
Dhillon.Now, the politicos



expect the voters living in  
these affected villages to  
cast their votes and oblige.  
And there was no mention  
of environmental safety in  
their manifestoes .The water  
quality has deteriorated to  
the extent as it can't be  
digested and the threat of  
several common diseases  
like joint pain , diarrhoea,

pigmentary disorder, asthma  
keep looming over the  
inhabitants bemoaned  
Raman Brar. Only closure of  
the ethanol and distillery  
projects would solve their  
irreparable compuncions  
and political parties have not

EDITORIAL –

Varied glitches in saffron horizons to scan

Modi is trying to improve the quality of life of India’s citizens (of course, those disqualified for citizenship by the CAA and the NRC will be excluded). For this to happen, he says he has to win a third term. To do so, he is intent on neutralising Opposition leaders like Arvind Kejriwal. Third-rung leaders are summoned to New Delhi by the Enforcement Directorate to answer questions in a bid to stop them from canvassing during the Lok Sabha polls. Modi’s assertion has hit the bull’s eye with a section of voters that has traditionally supported the saffron party. But it has also caused a flutter in the Congress doves. The Opposition does not have to worry that much. Despite what some experts prophesy, the truth is that there is ‘no wave’ this time. Modi’s charisma is fraying at the edges. He is struggling to stay in power. The very fact that he needs to hit his opponents below the belt is a clear indication that even retaining the 303 seats his party won in the 2019 Lok Sabha polls will be difficult. Modi is using every weapon in his armour (and he is adept at finding new weapons almost every day) to achieve the difficult task of winning 400 seats (370 for the BJP and the rest for its allies). He is bound to win, but with a reduced margin. Today’s voter is not the ‘docile’ individual that we knew. He hears many voices, even contrarian ones, and his aspirations have risen

exponentially. Modi’s oratory used to sway the masses. It sparked a ray of hope in their hearts. Not any longer. The reported promise of transferring Rs 15 lakh into each Indian’s bank account has wafted with the wind. Instead, 5 kg of rice or wheat, free of cost, to every ration card holder every month is what 60 per cent of the population gets. For the poorest of the poor, this barely enables them to keep body and soul together. For those willing to live at the subsistence level, oil, lentils and cooking gas are also required. The tribal women of Palghar in Maharashtra made this clear to the BJP’s workers who distributed saris and shopping bags with Modi’s picture on them. They returned the goodies and asked for employment instead! They want to eat like their intended benefactors — nothing fancy but with sufficient calories. These below-the-belt tactics have not gone down well with the common man. In my city of Mumbai, even the unlettered have got the hang of such moves. The chatteratti, which had veered towards Modi in a big way, has also shown signs of disagreeing with his methods. Of late, Modi has been overplaying his hand. The aura that was built around him by his image consultants is slipping. The inauguration of the Ram Mandir in Ayodhya by him is being commented upon negatively by many. The gesture lacked any trace of humility. The dive into the sea off Dwarka was

an unmitigated disaster. In view of such publicity and mainly because of the persistent assault on the Opposition leaders in the run-up to the elections, Modi seems to be losing some of the goodwill he acquired over the past decade. He had eliminated the middlemen by making direct bank transfers of LPG subsidy and other welfare payments to below-poverty-line citizens and building homes for the poor under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana. The security scenario has improved under his reign, though China continues its bullying tactics because of its economic and military superiority. Prime Minister Modi, will squeak through at the final count. He has worked very hard to make inroads in the South. He seems to have succeeded in Andhra Pradesh, where his party’s tie-up with Chandrababu Naidu’s Telugu Desam Party is showing signs of paying dividends. The friction between YS Jagan Mohan Reddy and his sister YS Sharmila, who has cast in her lot with the Congress, is helping the BJP. In the Tamil heartland, the BJP has lured my old service mate, K Annamalai, to spearhead the party’s entry into perennially hostile territory. That, too, looks to be paying. The BJP has left its pariah status in Tamil Nadu behind and become a party of interest. It may even open its account there, which will be quite an achievement.

Free power, 43K govt job provided by AAP govt claims CM

PM Modi to address a rally in mid-May

CHANDIGARH : Prime Minister (PM) Narendra Modi will be addressing a rally at the Sector 34 ground in the middle of May for the third consecutive time in the Lok Sabha elections. Preparations in this regard are already underway as his team from the Centre inspected the Sector 34 ground two days ago and held talks with those concerned, said sources. City BJP president Jatinder Pal Malhotra confirmed that the PM would address a rally here, but the date was yet to be finalised. “The Modi factor will definitely have an impact here. Notably, Chandigarh has always voted for the party that has ruled at the Centre,” said a BJP leader. Even in the 2019 Lok Sabha polls, it was felt in the local political circles that Modi’s rally had turned the tide in favour of the party candidate MP Kirron Kher at the time when Congress candidate Pawan Kumar Bansal was going strong during the campaigning in Chandigarh.



The sources said as per tentative plans, Modi could be in the city between May 16 and 18. Significantly, Modi’s May 14, 2019, election pitch was more for “Phir ek baar, Modi sarkar”, rather than the party candidate. During his nearly 40-minute-long address, he had not mentioned Kher’s name even once. Modi had not even asked people to vote for the BJP candidate. All he said was, “Your vote on Kamal will go to Modi’s account.” In the last Lok Sabha elections, sitting MP Kirron Kher had retained the Chandigarh seat by garnering 2,30,967 votes. While Bansal got 1,84,218 votes, AAP candidate Harmohan Dhawan, who passed away recently, polled only 13,781 votes. In the 2014 elections, Kher had secured 1,91,362 votes, while Bansal and AAP’s Gul Panag had got 1,21,720 and 1,08,362 votes, respectively.

8th round of auction of liquor vends to be held on May 10

CHANDIGARH : Only 11 liquor vends are now, but their reserve price has come down as compared to the first auction held in March. This is the money that the excise department gets as licensing fees. Last year, the department had to auction the remaining liquor vends 20 times, but even then there were 18 liquor vends which were not sold and their quota of liquor had to be further distributed among the allotted liquor vends. Although, the numbers of liquor vends have been sold more than last year, the department has had to reduce the reserve price of the liquor vends that have still not been sold compared to the first auction. This year, a total of 97 liquor vends were to be allotted in the Excise Policy 2024-25, out of which 86 liquor vends have been sold so far. But still liquor vends in some the big markets have remained unsold. This includes markets in Sector 9 and



Sector 42 and Attawa. The liquor vends in both the markets had earlier earned a good revenue for the administration, but this time, no one has bought the liquor vends. In fact, this time, the liquor vends in both the markets have been clubbed such as two liquor vends have to be opened in the market of Sector 9, but only one license has to be given for both of them, due to which the reserve price is still more than Rs 10 crore, while for Sector 42 and Attawa, three liquor vends have been clubbed and a license will be given, for which the reserve price is now more than Rs 11.61 crore. In its first round of auction held on March 7 for the allotment of

liquor vends under the 2023-24 Excise Policy, the department was able to sell only 51 out of a total 97 vends. On March 7, the department had earned Rs 243.84 crore against the reserve price of Rs 218.66 crore — an increase of 11.53% over the reserve price and 10% over the last year’s licence fee. For the financial year 2024-25, the department has decided to give 84 licences and increase the number of vends from 95 to 97. The total reserve price of all these vends has been fixed at Rs 452.29 crore. For the first time, the UT decided that any liquor vend remaining unsold will be run by Chandigarh Industrial and Tourism Development Corporation Limited (CITCO). Having failed to allot 18 vends, out of a total of 95, despite 20 rounds of auctions under the Excise Policy 2023-24, the department has reduced the reserve prices of certain liquor vends in the 2024-25 policy.

Gas protective suits, splash, chemical procured for firefighters by Chandigarh MC

CHANDIGARH : In the first instance the emergency response department of the civic body has procured innovative equipments to safeguard the life of fire personnel. The Municipal Corporation Chandigarh has procured 28 pyrolene/splash tight suits and 14 chemical/gas tight suits to protect its firefighters from various biochemical threats. The estimated cost for the procurement of these personal protective gear is approximately Rs 51 lakh. The MC has already added 7 Bullet Motor Cycles and 14 Water Mist and CAF High Pressure using special AFFF for



firefighting in narrow lanes, recently. The MC has also purchased inflatable emergency lighting tower. The inflatable emergency lighting tower was used at the time of major disasters like building collapse, fire incident and in rescue operations during night hours. 5 thermal imaging detector have also been purchased for detection in smoke and smog areas having low visibility.

In order to strengthen the department, the MC has appointed 245 firemen and 35 drivers through regular recruitment in 2022. Further, a Fire Safety Audit of all Commercial/Govt establishments of the city has been done and about 6,000 buildings have been issued fire advisories to meet the left out requirements at the earliest. “To create awareness and also to improve fire response among citizens, regular mock drills in hospitals, schools, industries and with RWAs, MWAs etc are being conducted on a regular basis,” said an official.

## NIA probe against Arvind Kejriwal over 'Khalistani funding of AAP' : LG

**NEW DELHI :** An NIA probe against Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal over the allegations that the Aam Aadmi Party received political funding from Sikhs for Justice, a pro-Khalistan terror outfit banned in India, has been recommended by Delhi Lt Governor VK Saxena. Principal Secretary to the L-G, said Saxena had received a complaint alleging AAP had received \$16 million (approx Rs 134 crore) from extremist Khalistani groups for "aiding the release of 1993 Delhi bomb blast convict Devinder Pal Singh Bhullar and espousing pro-Khalistani sentiments". The complaint was sent by World Hindu Federation (India) national general secretary Ashoo Mongia. "The L-G has recommended that since the complaint has been made against a sitting Chief Minister and relates to political funding by a



banned terrorist organisation, electronic evidences adduced by the complainant require investigation, including forensic examination," the L-G's letter to the Union Home Secretary said. The L-G has also referred to a letter written by Kejriwal to one Iqbal Singh in January 2014, mentioning that "the AAP government has already recommended to the President the release of Prof Bhullar and would be working on other issues, including formation of SIT, etc, sympathetically and in a time-bound manner". Iqbal Singh was on a fast at Jantar Mantar, demanding a written assurance for the release of Bhullar and ended

his fast after receiving the letter from Kejriwal. The complaint by Mongia refers to a video released by Khalistani terrorist Gurbatwant Singh Pannun, wherein he alleges that AAP received \$16 million from Khalistani groups between 2014 and 2022. "It has also been alleged that Kejriwal held close-door meetings with Khalistani leaders at Gurdwara Richmond Hills, New York, during his visit in 2014, wherein he promised to facilitate the release of Bhullar in return for substantial financial backing from Khalistani factions to AAP. In a series of posts on social media, a former AAP worker, Dr Munish Kumar Raizada, has shared pictures of Kejriwal's said meeting with Khalistani leaders at Gurdwara Richmond Hills, New York," the communication by LG's principal secretary said.

Notably, 15 serving IRS officers have already been appointed by ECI as Expenditure observers.

Elaborating on his government's achievements, he said, "We have provided Rs 1,500 to women, Rs 1,200 per month to those rearing cows, Rs 3 lakh to build houses to 1.15 lakh widow women, free treatment to the elderly above 70 years, announced

increase of Rs 60 in the daily wage of MNREGA, minimum support price of milk, 4 per cent DA to employees, five-time increase in diet money of policemen the state government has done all this with this additional revenue" He castigated the BJP and said "During the disaster, BJP leaders turned their backs on the disaster-affected families of the state while I followed Rajdharm" "I requested the BJP leaders to go to Delhi and provide financial help to the disaster-affected people but they did not do so. The state government gave a package of Rs 4,500 crore from its own resources to rehabilitate the disaster affected people while the Shimla MP Suresh Kashyap did not write a single letter to provide financial assistance to the disaster-affected people," he lamented.

## India developed economy for \$30 trillion by 2047 - Think tank

**NEW DELHI :** The draft "Vision India @2047" by Niti Aayog will be ready by December this year and publicly unveiled in the next three months, he said. "Consultations with sectoral groups of secretaries and thought leaders, including industrialists Gautam Adani, Mukesh Ambani and Google CEO Sundar Pichai, will take place in November," CEO Subrahmanyam, the think-tank disclosed on Monday. Busy in preparing, the NITI Aayog a vision document for India to become a developed economy of about \$30 trillion by 2047, said the Central Government's think-tank. The PMO had initiated the preparation of this vision document in 2021 with the formation of 10 sectoral groups of secretaries. In 2023, the NITI Aayog was



asked to consolidate the 10 sectoral thematic visions into a combined vision. In 2019, PM Narendra Modi had forecast that India would become a \$5 trillion economy by 2024-25. However, with a declining growth rate, it is expected to reach only \$4 trillion by 2024-25. Perhaps conscious of this slippage, Subrahmanyam said the vision document it would outline the required institutional and structural changes and reforms to become a developed nation

by 2047. "The whole purpose of the vision document is to avoid the middle-income trap," he told the media. The middle-income trap is a situation where a country reaches a stage of development where it can no longer compete internationally in labour-intensive areas because wages are relatively higher. It also cannot compete in higher value-added activities because productivity is relatively lower. Subrahmanyam did not mention the growth rate required to become a \$10 trillion economy by 2047. Speaking last month, Union Minister Hardeep Puri had forecast that the Indian economy would touch \$10 trillion by 2030. Economists had then calculated that it would require India to grow at 9 per cent for the remaining period.

## GPS-based toll on Dwarka E-way in 2 months to be launched by NHAI



charging motorists for the exact distance travelled on the expressway. As per the plan, an automatic number plate recognition system will be installed to enable automated toll collection without stopping the vehicles. Driver will not have to stop to scan their tags here. Toll will automatically be deducted from the driver's account as soon as the vehicle starts moving. The toll will be levied at a fixed rate per km for the distance travelled. When the driver will enter the expressway, his vehicle number and type will be fed in the recognition system. A control room equipped with modern facilities has been set up near the toll gate across

Bajghera on the Dwarka-Gurgaon border. After entry, when the vehicle completes its journey on the expressway, that location will also be recorded by the intelligence system and the toll will be deducted accordingly. The driver will also receive message on his mobile number regarding the toll amount and number of kilometres travelled. According to the NHAI, during 2018-19, the average waiting time for vehicles at toll plaza was eight minutes. With the introduction of FASTag between 2020 and 2022, the average waiting time for vehicles has come down to 47 seconds and this GPS enabled toll collection will further decrease it to 10 seconds. "This will ensure that there are no lines on toll gates and we will start its implementation in the NCR with the Dwarka Expressway," said an NHAI official.

The solicitor general of India, Tushar Mehta endorsed that the Punjab govt contentions were not to risk the security cover for the head ministerial gun, but must be left with the post of Chief Minister. The Chandigarh police as well Punjab police had expressed serious concerns on the security and road opening. The

Chandigarh SSP had highlighted the threat perception, firstly to Punjab Chief Minister and the issue of rocket propelled grenades in Taran Faran district. The SSP also doubted if any vehicle carrying a large number of explosives could approach the residence of Chief Minister or the enclosed quarters along the road. The police also flagged the threat from drones.
