The bureaucrats ' visits to different places include deemed official trips to the national capital have purposefully burnt a hole into the pocket of the state exchequer. The said bureaucrats seem to have preferred disproportionate costly stay vis -a- vis availability of government



guest houses but deliberately preferred to enjoy stay in luxury hotels. The cumulative expense on official tours of Mr Dharam Pal , UT Adviser to The Administrator and Mr Ntin Yadav ,Home

Secretary have been running into several lakhs of rupees. The RTI act used by an UT resident , discloses the lavish expenses of. Adviser amounting to Rs 16 Lakh within 121 days of travel and the Home Secretary ,s bill, mentions approximately Rs ,6 lakh on a small number of visits to Delhi. It is pertinent to mention here at this juncture that the Delhi based Panjab Bhavan has 66 rooms in its kitty with pocket friendly tariffs beginning with Rs 100 for class I officers . And only Rs 35 is charged

from an official arriving for an official visit and Rs 100 for non official trips as per the data collected by the media group of Indian Express. The Haryana Bhavan in Delhi also has 75 rooms, offering accommodation just atRs 130 per day on nominal charges. An unbiased and independent enquiry has become the need of the hour in order to prevent the future , potential lavish expenditure where the hard earned money of the tax payers might be checked.

Development of town derails, need urgent enquiry, groans Sukhdev Choudhry

ZIRAKPUR : No one is talking about the problems, daily headaches of the city, bemoans Sukhdev Chowdhary, President of the local Resident Welfare Association & Joint Action Committee. He wonders on seeing the illegal activities on banned construction on PR-7 and equally other areas too due to which the promising continual development of the Zirakpur satellite town has come to a standstill.

Whereas it is the duty of the elected councilors to raise their voice against the ongoing prohibited activities. The population of Zirakpur city has multiplied manifold, and the residents of the city are not getting basic facilities. Mr Chowdhry lamented that there is no Molly heir of Zirakpur who can take the issues of the city to the government level.



In every society, locality, street, colony of Zirakpur city, sewerage water is overflowing and getting accumulated in people's homes. He said that according to the population of the city, sewerage and water supply lines should have been changed after long haul of 22 years. Mr Choudhary added that the Municipal Council is passing architectural drawings indiscriminately, but no special attention is being paid to the problems like sewage, drinking water, roads, cleanliness, garbage dumping of the city. The situation in the city has today become tormenting that

water and sewage connections of illegal colonies are being allowed due to surmounting collusion with the builders. Mr Chowdhry groaned saying there is a big problem of drinking water for the residents of the city, not a single house is getting safe and chlorinated water in govt supply and this month is being considered as the month of water related diseases. The elected councilors of the city should get the city welfare, reforms and work done from the council. On the campaign of "Swachhta Abhiyan", no word is suffice, as no ward finds regular sweeping, it takes 2, 3 months to see any safai karmi, in the ward streets, curse the innocent residents of Dashmesh colony. In 2021, ever since the Congress President took charge of the Municipal Council, Zirakpur, not a single brick had been laid in the name of devel-

opment. In the year 2021-22, 117 crore rupees, people's tax money was wasted by Zirakpur Municipal Council. Despite this lapse, so far no initiative is being attributed toward solving the combustible issue. The president, Sukhdev Chaudhary has demanded from the Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann that a vigilance inquiry should be ordered into the embezzlement of the budget money for the year 2021-22 by the Zirakpur Municipal Council. As was done in the Girish Verma's times. On Sunday 6 Aug, when no civic authority addressed the problem in Dhakoli the members of the Zirakpur Welfare Association themselves had to fill in the potholes, repaired the side berms to make the link road accessible for all commuters of the Dhakoli, said Sanjay Verma.

Sewerage , drainage system necessitates overhauling : Mayor

Mohali: The dilapidated condition of the drainage and sewerage system has necessitated the Municipal Corporation to go for complete overhauling as the laid down pipes have worn out ,bemoaned the Mayor Amarjit Singh Sidhu.

The Mayor apprised the officials that a plan for rehabilitation of the drainage and sewerage system had been prepared by Punjab Engineering College. The Mayor gave instructions to prepare a detailed plan to solve these problems immediately. Mayor Singh said that as the condition of water



drainage and sewerage pipes in Mohali has deteriorated, and that pipes made of bricks with old technology had passed their committed period of sustainability . He apprised the officials that a detailed plan should be prepared so that they can take, further action to carry out this work by taking to the Punjab government.

He also told the officials that a plan was prepared and given to the Municipal Corporation by the Punjab Engineering College for the drainage of rainwater. Mayor Jeeti Sidhu asked the officials to restudy that plan so that if it can be implemented, then action can be initiated in this regard.

Global warming melts glaciers

With the warming of the planet, the glaciers in the Himalayas are melting rapidly, leading to the formation of glacial lakes which when breached can sweep away villages after villages downstream. A recent study indicates that the number of glacial lakes is increasing rapidly in India, China and Nepal. They pose a huge threat to Himachal Pradesh, Jam mu and Kashmir, Ladakh, Sikkim, Assam and Arunachal Pradesh. The heatwaves simultaneous prevailing in many countries across North America and Europe have broken records. Earlier in the year, the World Meteorological Organisation had confirmed that the past eight years had been the warmest ever; from mountain peaks to ocean depths climate change had continued its advance. The trends indicate that the global temperatures are likely to continue to surge, leading to a growing concern of an unprecedented increase in extreme weather events attributed to climate change. According to the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) report of 2023, humankind has been responsible for virtually all instances of global heating over the past 200 years. As a global phenomenon, the impact of climate change is all too visible in the form of extreme weather events and natural disasters such as heatwaves, floods, land slides and droughts, which are occurring with greater frequency and intensity. We are witnessing, in particular in the hill state of Himachal Pradesh, unprecedented rainfall, resulting in utter devastation and loss of lives. In Kullu district alone, numerous bridges, roads and parts of the Mandi Manali highway have been swept away by flashfloods and landslides, with the Beas in spate. In Kullu, hundreds of homes and cars have been washed away, rendering thousands of people homeless. The economic losses suffered by the state are estimated to be over Rs 8,000 crore. It is one stark example of climate change and its grave consequences. This trend is also associated with a rise in the sea level, which poses a grave existential danger to small island nations, such as the Maldives, and the coastal regions of India and Bangladesh. Climate change is responsible for the increase in cases of diarrhoea and mosquito-borne diseases, such as malaria and dengue, as well as heat stroke and cardiovascular diseases. By undermining access to essential needs such as water, sanitation and food, climate change threatens health and nutrition, education and the very survival of children. India, in particular, remains vulnerable to the effects of climate change. Heavy rains, cloudbursts, floods and drought conditions in various parts of the country have led to crop failure, economic losses and human suffering. So, how should climate change be addressed? First, all countries must recognise that climate change is a real and present danger and it is the result of greenhouse gas emissions leading to a rise in the atmospheric temperature. Having included it as a priority agenda item of G20, India as its president has a historic opportunity to play a pivotal role in shaping the global agenda on climate change. It can do so by advancing innovative strategies and fast-tracking measures for the reduction of carbon emissions and by calling for an enhancement in national preparedness for climate change. India's focus at the policy level is to reduce greenhouse emissions by transitioning from fossil fuels to renewable energy, such as solar, wind and hydropower, and by ushering in green technology. India has made remarkable progress in this direction and the target for getting 50 per cent of energy from non-fossil sources by 2030 is likely to be achieved by 2027. India is the only G20 country which has delivered on the promise made at COP21 in Paris. This is being achieved by giving a fillip to solar energy through the India-co founded International Solar Alliance, and by taking steps towards making green hydrogen a renewable energy source, building charging infrastructure for electric cars, and manufacturing ethanol from agricultural waste as a biofuel. Citizens and groups can and must contribute by adopting healthy lifestyle practices, planting more trees - thereby enhancing the green cover which functions as a 'carbon sink' and protecting the environment by saving energy and saying no to plastic. Priority must also be accorded to strengthening national capacities and community resilience to cope with the impact of climate change. The government must not only strengthen national health programmes but also take urgent steps to conduct environmental impact assessment, build check dams and explore ways to channelise water flow, protect riverbeds from encroachment and fortify them through barriers and by growing soil-holding plants and trees on riverbanks. India, as the G20 president, has the responsibility and opportunity to demonstrate its leadership by pursuing issues such as protecting poor countries from the adverse impact of climate change by ensuring technology transfer and adequate financing for climate action and strengthening primary healthcare in various countries.

Mandatory dress code to foster high sense of professionalism in health officials

CHANDIGARH : By enforcing a mandatory dress code, the authorities aim at establishing a sense of self-discipline and foster a professional atmosphere. To maintain professionalism and instil confidence among patients, attendants, and visitors, the health department of the UT Administration have implemented a uniform/formal dress code policy for all officials on duty. The move comes after repeated instances of officers attending their duties in casual or fancy attire, raising concerns about the organisation's image. The administration acknowledged that laxity in enforcing a dress code had led to a perception that responsible officers might not be present, undermining the organisation's reputation. Officials have been advised to adhere to the prescribed uniform while on duty. In cases where no specific uniform is designated or not required at a given time, they are expected to wear formal dress. The administration clarified the intention was not to impose a strict dress code, but to inspire confidence among the public.

370 posts to be filled by September : PGI

CHANDIGARH : The Secretary Health, Government of India, the PGIMER committed to filling 370 posts by September 30 in a recent review meeting. Experiencing the staff crunch, the Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER) here will fill 370 vacant posts of nursing, technician, clerk and sanitary attendant. Kumar Gaurav Dhawan, Deputy Director, PGIMER, said, "The institute will be able to fill 370 posts by September-end. It will relieve the burden on the existing staff, who are already stretched to their limits due to the staff crunch. With more staff, the institute can provide better quality patient care and reduce wait time. With the number of patients increasing daily, the institute needs more staff to ensure that patients receive timely and adequate medical attention." The institute has around 7,300 sanctioned posts, including those of teaching and non-teaching doctor, nurse, paramedic, lab technician and security. However, the institute is unable to fill the vacancies due to various reasons, including court cases, which have resulted in a backlog of over 1,700 vacancies. The hospital provides treatment to an average of 9,000 patients daily, including 8,000 in the Out-Patient Department (OPD) and 300 in the Emergency wing. As many as 155 out of 2,572 nursing positions remain unfilled at the PGI. The situation is no better for teaching staff with 36 posts of professor and 91 of assistant professor remaining vacant against the sanctioned strength of 70 and 652, respectively.

Environment committee to ensure ban on single use plastic in mandis

CHANDIGARH : The meeting of the UT Standing Committee on Environment was presided over by Chairman Satnam Singh Sandhu, who is also the founder of Chandigarh Welfare Trust, deliberated on several urgent environmental issues and made recommendations to address these effectively. Adapting to a citizen-centric approach, the meeting was held at Paryavaran Bhawan to discuss and address the urgent environmental issues faced by the city. Strategies for eco-friendly Chandigarh and better adherence to environmentally friendly practices by government bodies, policymakers, and the general public were discussed. Extensive discussions were held during the meeting on both short-term and long-term strategies to safeguard the environment, as well as



preserve the city's diverse flora and fauna. The strategies that were discussed during the meeting included registration for vendors and taking undertaking from them to comply with single-use plastic ban, improving the cleanliness and sanitation in areas which are not under Municipal Corporation and increasing the green cover of the city. It was also discussed that public awareness drives and campaigns be conducted for single-use plastic, with a focus on alternative materials and enforcement. Sandhu highlighted the primary challenges including the concerns about the rampant use of single-use plastic in the local

mandis, which, he said, should be stopped. The committee observed that despite the ban on single-use plastic, they are being used in vegetable markets rampantly which is a cause of concern. They proposed that the market committee should start registering the vendors in the mandis. They should be asked to submit an undertaking that they will comply with the single-use plastic ban and if found violating the ban, their registration will be cancelled. For this, he said the concerted efforts of the Municipal Corporation, the Environment Committee, the Market Board could address this issue effectively.

Governor thanks Modi for massive grant of Rs 5K cr for redevelopment of rly stations

Modi launches revamp of 508 railway stations

NEW DELHI : The month of August had a special significance for Indians, said the Prime Minister. The Quit India Movement began on August 9, 1942, and it gave a decisive push towards attaining India's freedom. After virtually laying the foundation stone for the redevelopment of 508 railway stations across the country, 22 of which are in Punjab, 15 in Haryana and one in Himachal Pradesh, he emphasised the inherent significance of August month. In a veiled attack on the newly formed opposition bloc INDIA, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said, "The Quit India Movement filled new energy in the hearts of Indians for attaining freedom. Inspired by it, the entire country is saying 'Quit India' for all evils."

The redevelopment of 508 stations across 27 states and UTs will cost Rs 24,470 crore. The makeover plan will provide modern passenger amenities along with well-designed traffic circulation and signage for the guidance of passengers. The designs of



station buildings are inspired by local culture, heritage and architecture. "Away from negative politics, we have taken the task of nation's development as a mission. This is the picture of a changing India where development is presenting new opportunities for youth," said PM Modi. "The country is determined to wipe out all evils.... There is just one yearning everywhere — Corruption, Quit India. Dynasty, Quit India. Appeasement, Quit India." "Unfortunately, in our country, there is a section of the Opposition which even today won't do anything itself and won't allow others to do anything either. They are stuck with this attitude. They opposed the construction of the modern Parliament

building. We developed Kartavya Path and they opposed that as well," he said. The PM mentioned the upcoming Partition Horrors Remembrance Day (August 14) and acknowledged the contribution of the people to the development of the country. "This day gives us the responsibility of keeping our unity intact." "Our Independence Day is the time to reiterate our commitment to our Tricolour and the progress of our nation. Like last year, this time also we have to hoist the Tricolour at every house," he said, urging the youth of the country to participate in the Har Ghar Tiranga campaign in the run-up to Independence Day. He also said his government had changed the perception of people on taxes and noted that the number of people paying taxes was increasing. "There was a time when income up to Rs 2 lakh was taxed in the country while now income up to Rs 7 lakh is not taxed."

Uploaded list of 'empanelled architects' on website to facilitate needy clients

Property tax 15% rebate via self-certification

PANCHKULA : Until last year, a rebate on property tax was available until July 31. However, the recent meeting discussed hiking the percentage of rebate to 15% as a measure to alleviate the financial burden on property owners. Haryana Urban Local Bodies Director Admin and Panchkula Municipal Corporation Commissioner Sachin Gupta noted that the generous rebate will be applicable to property owners who engage in self-certification. In a move aimed at providing relief to property owners, the Urban Local Bodies has decided to grant a 15% rebate on property tax for



the current fiscal year, 2023-2024. The decision was conveyed to all Corporation Commissioners by Commissioner and Secretary of Haryana Urban Local Bodies, Vikas Gupta, during a video conference. Gupta emphasised the significance of self-certification and explained that the individuals who self-certify their properties on the NDC (National

Digital Catalog) portal will be eligible for the 15% rebate. The deadline for self-certification has been set for September 30, giving property owners ample time to avail themselves of this benefit. The initiative aims to streamline property ID data and ensure accuracy. During the virtual meeting, the participants were urged to raise objections, if any, within the next ten days.

Teacher Transfer Policy 2023 to be concise, extra incentives for teachers serving in Nuh

CHANDIGARH : The new teachers transfer policy aims to ensure equitable, demand-based distribution of teachers and heads of the schools to protect academic interest of students and optimise job satisfaction among the employees in a fair and transparent manner, an official statement said. The Haryana Cabinet approved the Teacher Transfer Policy, 2023, under which a teacher who chooses to serve in Nuh and Morni areas of the state will get an incentive of an extra salary. The cabinet, which met under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar here, approved the draft of the Teacher Transfer Policy, 2023, by repealing the previous policy issued five years ago. According to the new policy, the teacher has to be willing



to be posted in a school located in Morni educational block of Panchkula district, or Hathin educational block of Palwal district or Nuh district (to be considered as Mewat area) against a vacancy. Provided that they (teachers) have neither declared Panchkula in case of Morni area, and Palwal, Nuh, Faridabad or Gurugram as their home district, nor have completed Class 10 or 12 from a school located in Panchkula district, and

Palwal, Nuh, Faridabad or Gurugram districts, respectively, for the said two areas, additional 10 per cent of the basic pay plus the DA will be paid to such regular teachers and Rs 10,000 per month to guest teachers during the posting period, the statement said. The Teacher Transfer Policy was notified in 2016 and was revised in 2017. Certain changes were also made subsequently from time to time. Over the period of time, the department experienced certain challenges in implementing the current policy, it said. "It is considered to repeal the policy and introduce a new policy by amending a few existing provisions, introducing some new provisions and making it concise and precise," the statement said.

Encroachments removed from IDH market by Civic body

AMRITSAR : After getting information about the encroachment, an MC team led by Estate Officer Dharminderjit Singh and Inspector Rajkumar reached the spot and removed encroachments from the IDH market here. The civic body has constructed two toilet booths adjacent to the petrol pump in front of Suraj-Chandara PVR at the IDH market. These toilet booths were occupied by a shopkeeper, who used them as godowns. The MC officials found that a general store owner had closed the toilet booths, reportedly four years ago, and was using these as godowns. The MC team broke open the lock installed by the shopkeeper and seized goods from the booths. The shopkeeper also reached the spot and started an argument with the MC team. Dharminderjit Singh said the



MC staff seized a huge quantity of grocery items stored in the booths. "The toilet booths have been constructed on 60 square yards. The corporation's property worth crores of rupees was encroached upon by the shopkeeper. These booths were lying closed for a long time. We will not tolerate any such encroachment. Further action would be taken on the orders of the MC Commissioner. With the help of the shopkeepers, the toilets would be opened for the convenience of traders and visitors," he said.

32L families benefiting under PDS

CHANDIGARH : "Our government has made effective changes to simplify the Public Distribution System. Now all the work is being done online in a transparent manner, due to which the beneficiaries and depot holders do not have to face any problem in getting the ration," said Khattar while interacting with the ration depot holders through audio-conferencing. Under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana, about 32 lakh families in the state were getting the benefits of the Public Distribution System (PDS) scheme said Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar. However the depot



holders said that earlier people used to come to them repeatedly to enquire when ration would arrive. But as the state government had linked information on the ration with the consumers' mobile numbers, it had brought relief to the consumers and depot holders. Another problem, the CM said, was that miscreants would often get ration in someone else's name, or some

families would get only half the ration meant for them. The government has started the EPDS portal to solve this problem, he added. Khattar added, "Under this, automatic POS machines have been installed at 9,434 fair-price shops and the ration is being made available to consumers through them. Due to this, 100 per cent distribution of essential commodities is being done after biometric authentication." Reiterating the government's commitment to women's empowerment, he said the government had reserved 33 per cent of the ration depots for women.

No functional ac on Indigo flight, passengers offered tissues to wipe sweat

Chandigarh : Right from the take off to landing, the ACs were off and all the passengers were made to 'suffer' throughout the journey. No one addressed the serious concern during the flight. In fact, the air hostess 'generously' distributed tissue papers to the passengers to wipe off their sweat. Punjab Congress Committee President Amarinder Singh Raja Warring on Saturday said that an IndiGo aircraft, travelling from Chandigarh to Jaipur, took off without ACs on and passengers were handed over tissues to wipe off their sweat. Passengers could be seen fanning themselves with tissues and papers in the video. He tagged the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) and Airports Authority of India (AAI) and urged



them to take strict action against the airline. This is the third incident of technical snag on IndiGo flights in a day. An IndiGo flight flying to Delhi was forced to make an emergency landing at Patna airport on Friday after one of its engines malfunctioned. The incident occurred just three minutes after the flight took off. The coggress leader

shared his "one of the most horrifying experiences while traveling from Chandigarh to Jaipur on an IndiGo aircraft 6E7261". It was a horrid 90 minutes for passengers on the flight as they were made to sit inside the aircraft without air-conditioning, he said in a social media post.
