NGT penalises Nector Life Sciences with Rs 5 Cr for propagating ashes

Dera Bassi : A pharmaceu- tical company "Nector LifeNcEiejkkiiiiicr Sciences was penalised by the National Green Tribunal against the dissemination of toxic carbon gases . The pharmaceutical unit was habitually disposing of harmful effluents into the fields.As the Punjab Pollution Control Board was seen failing to dis- charge its statutory function . The fine was required to be depositing with in 2 weeks. The Nector Life Sciences was found to be using rice



husk, wood chips ,sarkanda, and other material as fuel. The company was also found to be dumping fresh boiler ash within its prem- ise.

Property tax defaulters sent notice by Panchkula MC

Panchkula: The Panchkula municipal corporation has identified 43 govt depart- ments that have over Rs 2 lakh dues, and about 30 pri- vate offices with pending dues of over Rs 5 lakh. The MC has now planned to write demi- official letter to these govt departments and issue second notice to the private commercial property tax defaulters. Defence department's sec- tors 29 and 30 property owes Rs 5.23 crore in tax, Indian Institute of Soil Water Conservation in Mansa Devi complex too Rs 2.12 crore, p'lice colony Rs 1.11 crore, department of school education, Sector 5, CBSE board, Rs 46.83 lakh, and other different buildings of Haryana Shahari Vikas

Pradhikaran (HSVP) owe Rs 1.42 crore in property tax. These are among 43 departments, which have huge pending amount pending. "We have been follow- ing up with them. Some had cleared some amount earli- er, and we have updated those figures. With revised estimates, we are going to write fresh DOs," disclosed an official. As far as defaulting private commercial spaces are concerned, the MC has sealed several properties for non payment despite repeated notices. Now, 30 of such buildings will be issued second notices to clear their dues. If the same is not done, then the process of the sealing the premises will start.

Press Clubs unregistered with bonafide district functioning in town

Simultaneous elections
may boost national
economy

For BJP government, all this election-related uncertainties has gone too far. Mr Modi wants India to establish a fixed election schedule, with the Lok Sabha (lower house of Parliament), state Assemblies, and local bodies all being elected on the same date every five years. A high-level committee, headed by former President Ram Nath Kovind, recently produced a voluminous report backing this approach, which Modi calls “One Nation, One Election”.

The frequency of elections can indeed be a challenge for the national government. For one thing, while state/local elections largely concern local issues, these are often seen as a sort of rolling referendum on the national government. For another, governance comes to a halt during elections since the independent Election Commission’s Model Code of Conduct prohibits incumbents from making policy announcements that might induce electorate to vote for them. National leaders get busy in campaigning in the states holding elections, each of which has its own political history and, often, its own parties. Modi and his Home Minister Amit Shah have been fixtures on this endless campaign trail throughout their decade in office, leaving them with little time for their official duties. Modi argues that frequent elections waste both money and time. It may have also occurred to him that simultaneous elections might give national

parties and issues a boost in state elections, which may be less likely to turn the focus onto local leaders and problems amid a national election campaign. The Opposition rejects the proposed reform, pointing out that whatever trivial cost savings might be gained by holding all elections simultaneously would be dwarfed by the losses associated with depriving the economy of the frequent stimulus that free-spending campaigns provide. More important, the proposal betrays a sinister intent to ride roughshod over India’s federalism and diversity, reflecting Modi’s fondness for unitarianism dressed up as efficiency. The most glaring problem with “One Nation, One Election,” is impractical, which we know from experience. After Independence, India established a single Election Day. But that arrangement lasted just fifteen years, from 1952 to 1967. The reason lies at the root of India’s parliamentary system: governments must maintain a legislative majority. If a government loses its majority before its term is up, fresh elections must be held. A government might also call early elections in the hope of increasing its majority. This has happened at different times in different states, and several times at the national level. And it will continue to happen, particularly given the coalition rule in many states. Indian states move to their own

rhythms, very different from that of the Union drummers in Delhi. A national coalition government, such as the one Modi currently heads, could also fall apart. What then? It would, surely, be undemocratic for a government to remain in power without a renewed electoral mandate. The “One Nation, One Election” approach would make sense only if chief executives were directly elected, so that their mandate is not based on a legislative majority — in other words, a presidential system. And, in fact, a case could be made for such a system in India, at the state and even the federal level, but Modi is not making it. India’s democrats have long convinced themselves that a presidential system would enable dictatorship, and so must be resisted. But the parliamentary system has brought its own kind of tyranny, as overweening executives have wielded their legislative majorities like weapons. In a presidential system, the executive would be accountable to an independent legislature; it could not use the legislature as a notice board and a rubber stamp, as the BJP has done for a decade. In any case, the last thing the Indian democracy needs is fewer elections, which are the only mechanism whereby we, the Indian public, can assert ourselves against government overreach. This makes “One Nation, One Election” a fundamentally undemocratic proposal.

45 acres land orchestrated
by Punjab for Metro depot
in New Chandigarh

MOHALI : Forest Department, the Punjab Government has now confirmed that the land was ready to be released, pending final approval of the Chief Minister. In a boost to the long-awaited Tricity Metro project, the Punjab Government has finally agreed to allocate 45 acres (18 hectares) in New Chandigarh for the construction of a Metro depot. The depot will be crucial for inspection and maintenance works related to the upcoming Metro lines. The issue of land allotment for the depot had been a persistent hurdle in the project’s progress. The UT Administration had sent multiple reminders to the Punjab Government, urging them to clarify their stance on the matter. A senior official said it had been decided to release 45 acres in New Chandigarh for the construction of the depot. The file has been sent to the Chief Minister for final approval, which is expected within a week. Once approved, the land will be handed over to the UT Administration, he



added. The matter was a key agenda item during the Unified Metro Transportation Authority (UMTA) meeting held on September 2. While this marks a positive step for the New Chandigarh depot, the Punjab Government has declined to provide land for another proposed depot in Zirakpur. In its place, an alternative depot will now be constructed in Sector 27, Panchkula, with approval already secured from the Haryana Government. The depot allotments are part of the larger Metro development plan for the Tricity, which will see construction beginning in 2027 as part of the first phase, with completion expected by 2034. Phase 2 of the project will commence post-2037, further expanding the city’s metro connectivity.

Haryana raises property
registratgion rates from December 1

CHANDIGARH : With the state government issuing orders to the divisional commissioners and the deputy commissioners to register property on new collector rates from December 1 to March 31, 2025, the property prices are set to increase substantially across Haryana. Buyers will have to shell more for the registration of property across Haryana from December 1. A hike of up to 20 per cent in the collector rates is in the offing in the districts of Gurugram, Faridabad, Palwal, Sonapat, Rohtak, Panipat, Karnal, Jhajjar and Nuh falling in the National Capital Region (NCR). A similar hike is expected in Panchkula district on the periphery of Chandigarh. The increase will be modest in the other districts. New collector rates were



set to be implemented from April 1, 2024, but due to the enforcement of the model code of conduct for the Lok Sabha poll, the decision was put on hold by Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini. Subsequently, the BJP government decided not to implement the decision in the run-up to the October 5 Assembly elections. Sources said now Saini had given his nod, paving the way for the registration of property on new collector rates. The decision would help net more revenue for the state exchequer as buyers would have to register their property at new

collector rates. More revenue in the exchequer would mean more funds for development works, he said. During the tenure of former Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar, it was decided that the collector rates should reflect the market rates. The administration of various districts had even carried out an exercise to hike the collector rates and had submitted their recommendations to the state government. However, the twin parliamentary and state Assembly elections delayed the implementation of the decision.

Commericalised new technologies
presented by 60 scientists at
Panjab varsity

CHANDIGARH : In total, 67 technologies were showcased, including 19 in medical devices, 15 in pharmaceuticals, 16 in environment and energy, and 17 in engineering and related fields. Three significant memorandums of understanding (MoUs) were also signed. The conference was organised by the Technology

Enabling Centre (TEC) of PU in collaboration with the Punjab State Council for Science & Technology (PSCST). As many as 60 scientists from 32 institutes across India presented their innovations to industry representatives interested in adopting and commercialising new technologies during the Transfer of Technology Conference, which concluded at Panjab

University. The conference focused on transferring technologies developed in academia to industry. During the conference, the scientists were given 10 minutes each to explain their inventions, which covered diverse domains such as medical devices, pharmaceuticals, environment and energy, artificial intelligence, Internet of Things, and general engineering.

Chandigarh to have its Rooftop solar
panels on all govt houses by December

CHANDIGARH : TC Nautiyal, Secretary, Science & Technology and Renewable Energy, chaired a review meeting with Chandigarh Renewable Energy and Science & Technology Promotion Society (CREST) to assess the progress of key initiatives, including rooftop solar power plant installations, EV charging infrastructure, and citizen compliance with renewable energy mandates. Contributing to the city’s green energy goals, the UT Administration has planned to achieve 80 MWp of rooftop solar capacity by the end of 2024. “Chandigarh has achieved 69 MWp of installed rooftop solar power plant capacity. Officials reaffirmed that the targets set by the Centre for full rooftop

solar saturation at government buildings in the city were to be achieved by December this year and in the private sector by December next year” said Navneet Kumar Sivastava, Director, Science & Technology and Renewable Energy-cum-CEO, CREST. In terms of sustainable transport, it was informed that 20 EV charging stations are already energised and fully operational across Chandigarh. An additional four to five charging stations will be energised by the next

week, significantly enhancing the city’s electric vehicle infrastructure. The city’s leadership in electric vehicle adoption, which is 14.8% from April to October 2024, the highest among all states and UTs, was also highlighted during the meeting. Concerns related to delay in meter installations, solar user charges being levied on occupants of government houses and rectification of solar projects where theft had occurred previously were also discussed.

Worth Rs 20 crore fuel saved by
e-buses within 2 years

CHANDIGARH : About 25.28 lakh litres of diesel worth Rs 20.80 crore has been saved within two and a half years by plying electric buses on local routes. Procured in November 2021, 80 electric buses are in service in the tricity at present, said a spokesman of the UT Transport Department. The electric buses had covered 1.26 crore km till August 16 on intra-city routes, thus saving over 25.28 lakh litres of diesel besides preserving environment. These buses have helped prevent 6674.91 tonne of CO2 emission. The e-bus fleet of the department included vehicles of Ashok Leyland and Eicher. In order to provide eco-friendly transportation in the city, the department plans to procure 100 more e-buses this year. The administration has plans to replace the entire fleet of 350



diesel buses of the Chandigarh Transport Undertaking (CTU), running both on local as well as suburban routes, with electric ones by 2027-28. Each bus covers a distance of nearly 130 km on a single charge. It takes nearly two hours to fully charge a vehicle. With a seating capacity of 36, a bus can carry a maximum of 54 people at a time. On an average, each bus covers 200-300 km a day. The State-Level Steering Committee (SLSC) has decided to replace 100 diesel buses with e-vehicles sanctioned by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs to Chandigarh under the Centre-sponsored PM

e-Bus Sewa Scheme. The ministry will be requested to allocate 80 more buses to the city under this scheme. Apart from public transport, the share of private electric vehicles (EVs) is also increasing. Since the implementation of the EV Policy in September 2022, as many as 3,281 electric two-wheelers and 1,785 four-wheelers have been registered in the city till July 15. According to the data provided by the Registration and Licensing Authority (RLA), 352 electric two-wheelers and 114 four-wheelers were registered from September to December in 2022. The highest number of 2,103 electric two-wheelers and 1,013 four-wheelers had been registered in 2023 and 826 two-wheelers and 658 four-wheelers till July 15 this year in the city.

ULFA engaged in extortion, violence, again banned for 5 years by Centre

NEW DELHI : The Home Ministry in a notification said the ULFA had declared its objective to secede Assam from India, continued intimidation and extortion of funds for their organisation, and maintained links with insurgent groups for extortion and violence. The ULFA, along with all its factions, wings and front organisations, had been involved in such activities

which were prejudicial to the sovereignty and integrity of India. The Centre on Monday extended the ban on the United Liberation Front of Asom (ULFA) for five years for continuing to work with the objective to secede Assam from India and maintaining links with other insurgent groups for extortion and violence. The ULFA was first declared a banned organisation in 1990 and

since then the ban has been extended periodically. The outfit has possessed illegal arms and ammunition, indulged in 16 criminal cases, including several cases of explosions or planting of explosives in Assam during the period from November 27, 2019 to July 1, 2024 and planted several improvised explosive devices or explosives in the run-up to Independence Day, 2024 across Assam, the notification said.

Hold immediate ceasefire as per humanitarian law international solution : Jaishankar

ROME : "India regards large-scale civilian casualties in military operations to be unacceptable and added that international humanitarian law cannot be disregarded" said External Affairs Minister Mr Jaishankar at the 10th edition of the MED Mediterranean Dialogue in Rome.



two-state solution," he said. Voicing concerns over the widening of the conflict in West Asia, Jaishankar said that India had been in regular touch with both Israel and Iran at the highest levels to advocate restraint and enhance communication. Indian naval ships have been deployed in the Gulf of Aden and the northern Arabian Sea since last year to protect commercial shipping. United Nations Interim Force in South Lebanon (UNIFIL) has around 10,500 peacekeepers drawn from 50 troop-contributing countries.

India has more than 900 people as part of UNIFIL in Lebanon. "Given our capacity to engage various parties, we are always willing to contribute meaningfully to any international diplomatic endeavours," he said. On the Ukraine-Russia war, he said the continuation of this conflict has serious, destabilising consequences, including for the Mediterranean. "What is clear is that no solution is going to emerge from the battlefield. India has consistently held the view that disputes in this era cannot be settled by war. There must be a return to dialogue and diplomacy. The sooner, the better. This is a widespread sentiment in the world today, especially in the Global South," he said.

BJP govt diverts attention from electoral malpractice, Sambhal violence : Akhilesh

LUCKNOW : In Sambhal Tensions flared during a second survey of the Mughal-era mosque, which is claimed to be built on the site of an ancient Hindu temple. Akhilesh Yadav Chief Samajwadi Party on Sunday accused the BJP of orchestrating the violence in Uttar Pradesh's Sambhal district over the survey of a mosque, alleging it was part of a larger strategy to divert attention from electoral malpractice. The police had to use tear gas and "minor force" after locals began pelting stones in protest. According to officials, ten people have been detained and a probe has been launched into the violence.



The unrest in Sambhal follows a survey of the Jama Masjid last Tuesday, ordered by a local court after a petition claimed the mosque was built on the site of a Hindu temple. Tensions escalated further after the Uttar Pradesh bypoll results, in which Samajwadi Party secured only two seats while the BJP and its ally RLD won seven. Yadav, in his response to the developments, leveled serious accusations against the police and the

administration. He claimed the survey was deliberately conducted in the morning to disrupt any meaningful discussion about the elections. "A serious incident occurred in Sambhal. A survey team was deliberately sent in the morning to create chaos and divert attention away from election issues," Yadav said. Yadav alleged the violence in Sambhal was orchestrated by the BJP, the government and the administration to shift focus away from what he called the electoral malpractices of the recent bypolls. "What happened in Sambhal was a deliberate move to divert attention from electoral irregularities," he said.

President Murmu celebrated 75 years of Constitution

NEW DELHI : At the Central Hall of the old Parliament, complex on November 26 President Droupadi Murmu led the celebrations to mark 75 years of India's Constitution. Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla also took part in the celebrations. A special website has also been created to mark the year-long celebrations, Union Culture Secretary Arunish Chawla told reporters during a briefing at the National Media Centre here. The commemorative portal urges people to



read the Preamble of the Constitution, record a video and upload it on the website to get a certificate. Mass readings of the Preamble were also held at schools across the country, Chawla said. To mark the occasion, the government released the commemorative coin and stamp.

Gurugram holistically aims zero emission by 2050

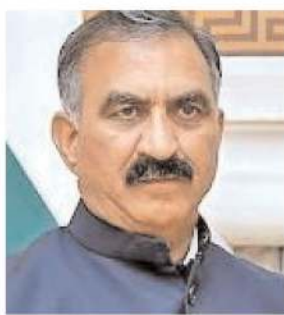

GURUGRAM : As Gurugram features among the top polluted cities in the country, the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA) has drawn a holistic plan to reduce emissions in the city. The authority has drafted a 'net zero 2050' document, contouring the goals for urban policy-making to make Gurugram a zero emission city. Net-zero refers to the point at which a specific area or city is able to remove from the atmosphere all green house gases (GHGs) it is emitting. Effectively, it ensures that no additional carbon or other GHGs are being added into the atmosphere.



The document elaborates on the way forward to implement sustainable development strategies like construction of green buildings, setting up of centralised cooling plants in housing societies, adoption of cleaner technologies and increasing the share of electric vehicles over the next 25 years. The plan deals in four major arenas — energy, waste, transport and greenery.

SHIMLA : The initiative taken by The Himachal Government is planning to amend the Land Ceiling Act, 1972, to facilitate the transfer of Radha Soami Satsang hospital land at Bhota in Hamirpur to its sister organisation. The move is aimed at exempting the charitable institution from paying Rs 2 crore in GST. Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu confirmed that a draft was being prepared to bring about an ordinance in this regard. The Bill on amendment would be tabled in the winter session of the Vidhan Sabha in December. "The Radha Soami Satsang Beas (RSSB) wants to transfer the land to its sister organisation. Since there are some hurdles due to the Land Ceiling Act, we are



examining the legal aspects," Sukhu told mediapersons. "They are a charitable institution offering free treatment but have to pay nearly Rs 2 crore in GST, which is not correct. So we are seeing how land can be transferred to the sister organisation to save this amount," he said. The amendment will pave the way for the transfer of land from the RSSB to the Maharaja Jagat Singh Medical Relief Society, the sister organisation running the Bhota Charitable

Hospital. The RSSB, a religious charitable institution, is exempt under the Land Ceiling Act from holding excess land. However, it cannot transfer the land by way of sale, gift, will or mortgage. As such, the Act has to be amended for the hospital land transfer to happen. Sukhu said the government was examining the legal aspects. "The previous BJP regime did not accept this plea and makes statements only to draw mileage," he said. The Congress government would not hesitate to amend the law to help all other organisations engaged in social service, he said. Amending the Land Ceiling Act has remained a contentious issue. The previous BJP government had turned down a plea by the RSSB.

Punjab farmers on December 6 to march to Delhi for MSP, other demands

CHANDIGARH : The protesting farmers have been camping at Shambhu and Khanauri border points between Punjab and Haryana since February 13, when their 'Delhi Chalo' march, spearheaded by the SKM (Non-Political) and the KMM, was stopped by security forces. The Samyukta Kisan Morcha (Non-Political) and the Kisan Mazdoor Morcha on Monday announced that farmers will march towards Delhi on December 6 to press the Centre to accept their various demands, including a legal guarantee of MSP for crops. The decision was taken at a meeting of farmer leaders here. Addressing the media here, KMM leader Sarwan Singh Pandher said after a long wait, they have decided to head towards Delhi.



Pandher slammed the Centre for not holding any talks with the farmers to discuss their demands. "We have been left with no option. We waited peacefully for the government (to reach out) for nine months. But now we will head towards Delhi," he added. The farmers will move towards the national capital in batches from the Shambhu border. Tejveer Singh of the Bharatiya Kisan Union (Shaheed Bhagat Singh) said they have been camping at the two border points for 280

days and the Centre has not held any talks with them since February 18. "We will move towards Delhi on December 6," he said. Last week, the farmers announced that they would intensify their agitation and start a fast unto death from November 26. Farmer leader Jagjit Singh Dallewal will observe the fast. Besides a legal guarantee of minimum support price (MSP) for crops, the farmers are demanding a farm debt waiver, pension for farmers and farm labourers, no hike in electricity tariff, withdrawal of police cases and "justice" for the victims of the 2021 Lakhimpur Kheri violence, reinstatement of the Land Acquisition Act, 2013, and compensation to the families of the farmers who died during a previous agitation in 2020-21.

The NGT committee had recommended that Zirakpur municipal council and Panchkula municipal corporation should carry out a survey and identify the spot area of the solid waste

dumped into the Sukhna Choe, and 'iron net' will be fitted along with the drain in order to prevent dumping of solid and C&D waste. It has also recommended that MC Zirakpur shall ensure regular operation and maintenance of the existing STP of 17.3 MLD capacity. MC Panchkula was asked to ensure operation of the STPs that leads effluent into Sukhna Choe through drains so as to improve the water quality of the river Ghaggar, the committee has recommended. The committee also went to the Gazipur village (Punjab) area near the school, which is situated on the bank of Sukhna Choe, the place where the complainant had raised the objectionable odour issue.

The ruling alliance, comprising the JMM, the Congress, the CPI(ML)L and the RJD, has improved its 2019 score in the Jharkhand assembly.

The JMM, led by Chief Minister Hemant Soren, has won 34 seats. The Congress won 16 seats, the RJD won four seats and the CPI(ML)L won two seats , according to Election Commission of



India data. The RJD won four seats. In the opposition National Democratic Alliance's (NDA) 24 seats, the BJP won 21 seats, and the AJSU, LJP and JD-U won one seat each. In the 2019 Assembly elections, the JMM emerged as the largest party with 30 seats, while the BJP bagged 25 seats. The Congress won 16

seats. The JMM formed a government with the support of Congress and RJD. Jharkhand has had five assemblies since 2000 when it was bifurcated from Bihar. The new, 6th assembly, has elected highest-ever women MLA's, according to analysis by PRS legislative research (PRS)

Another state-of-the-art hospital for city

Chandigarh : A high-level meeting chaired by Gulab Chand Kataria, Punjab governor and UT administrator was held on Thursday to discuss the proposal for state-of-the-art hospital in the Chandigarh. In the preliminary stages, the proposal envisages a budget of around Rs 500 crore for the 2,000-bed hospital. The health facilities in the UT not only cater to residents of the city, but also to adjoining areas of Punjab, Haryana, Himachal, Jammu & Kashmir, Uttarakhand, and farflung areas of the region. This meeting was held to discuss strengthening of the existing healthcare infrastructure in the UT and to decongest the present government hospitals in the city. The meeting was attended by Dr Vinod K Paul (member, NITI Aayog), Rajeev Verma, adviser to the UT administrator and other senior UT officials. Dr Suman Singh, Director Health gave a brief presentation on Chandigarh's health infrastructure, existing bed strength, and current challenges in healthcare and the proposal to build a new hospital in the city. Kataria said facilities in

satellite hospitals should be at par with the district hospital and population living on Chandigarh's periphery may also be considered while planning the construction of a new hospital. Discussions were also held on suitable sites for the project. He said there is a need to promote Chandigarh as a quality healthcare destination for medical tourism, centre for excellence for training and medical education. Dr Paul, Niti Ayog observed that the need to enhance health care services and the proposal for a new such health facility may also be linked with the vision of Viksit Bharat-2047. Such a new hospital should be built on world class centre of excellence, and it would be an asset to the whole country. Paul also gave a brief presentation regarding the Comprehensive School Health Program in Chandigarh which encompassed the National Health Policy 2017 and National Education Policy 2020. He proposed strengthening of six pillars of school health including curriculum, training, regular check-ups and mental health.

Legalising of village food unit gain momentum

Chandigarh: The issue of legalising village food units was brought before the Punjab and Haryana high court some time back, prompting Chandigarh Beopar Mandal (CBM), an umbrella body of traders, to continuously raise it with senior officers of the administration. Notably, notices for the closure of manufacturing units have been issued in the best. Since the village fall under the jurisdiction of the MC, they will need to take the lead in framing a detailed policy. The policy should address safety hygiene, zoning, fire safety and other related aspects. The Chandigarh administration has written to the municipal corporation to review and streamline the process of issuing licences to food manufacturing units in



the villages within the city premises. Traders have been seeking a legal status for the manufacturing units for some time now. In the state level advisory committee meeting, the matter regarding illegal food manufacturing units was taken up. During the meeting, the president of Chandigarh Beopar Mandal informed that there are cer-

tain units running hygienically and under good sanitary conditions for the last more than 40 years. It is difficult for them to move to the industrial area due to high property rent. He has requested that the NOC may be issued so that the manufacturers can get an FSSAI licence under the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006, sources revealed.

Sanyukt Kissan Morcha to march for Delhi on Dec 6
