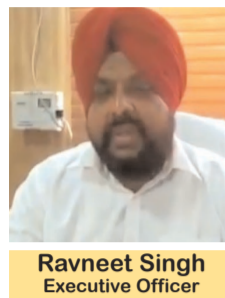

Mushrooming of unapproved Ananta colonies continues unchecked by MC



Commissioner News Service ZIRAKPUR : Despite blanket ban by Supreme court on construction activities along PR 7 and particularly on the land procured from Pearl Group, no attention is being attributed by the local civic body explicitly under its own jurisdictional control.

Eyebrows are being raised as to mushrooming of colonies perhaps due to intimate settlement as was earlier executed by Girish Verma former Executive Officer of Zirakpur who amassed huge unknown money disproportionate to his known sources.

The nexus of real estate builder and incumbent executive officer continues to bamboozle the potential innocent home buyers. Several settled colonies in Zirakpur are not even having proper sewage lines for ultimate treatment and disposal, no sanitation, no garbage disposal, limited civic amenities are provided. The illegal colonies under Ananta brand like Ananta Apartment, Ananta Homes, Ananta Lifestyle in the town have been mushrooming as no heed by the municipal authorities is being attributed. The media stationed at Zirakpur is now tired of raising the voice of public constituents, talking about the Civic amenities like drinking water, sanitation, poor roads have been worsening in the strength and the Executive Officer of the Civic body is hardly available in this office perhaps he is living for away in Patiala town then who would address the Civic problem, countered daily by the electorates of Zirakpur. The town has now emerged to become a hub of all illegal constructions with poor sewerage maintenance.

The spate of illegal colonies have germinated poor stinking lines which and become instrumental in turning the town into slum habitation. In view of the recent ban imposed by Punjab government on sale purchase, registries and NOC has hit the working of property consultants and common buyers says a panic stricken property consultant on anonymity. Despite many efforts to contact EO Ravneet Singh his comments could not be ascertained for the public scrutiny and general enlightenment.

Reuse, recycle waste becomes mission of Civic body

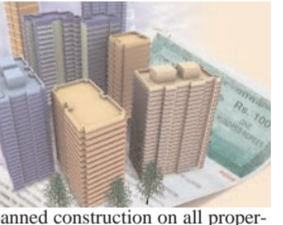
Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : Public events pose a challenge for the Municipal Corporation in terms of generating substantial quantities of waste and their subsequent disposal. Anindita Mitra, Municipal commissioner. She added there is a need to ensure before going forward, all public events should be conducted on "zero - waste" principles, said the Municipal commissioner. She said to minimising waste generation and need for their safe disposal are the major components of the zero waste events. This would be possible through use of environment friendly products, easy access to toilets and waste disposal facilities at such events, she added. Spearheading the mission to make Chandigarh number one in the country in waste minimisation at source, reuse and recycle of waste, municipal corporation (MC) Chandigarh organised a 'zero - waste wedding' of Manjeet Kaur, daughter of Jasbir Singh, resident of Khuda Ali Sher, Ward No 1, where 100% scientific processing of waste was achieved. At the wedding, no plastic, including flex posters, was used. Event details were printed on eco - friendly material and in



case of the conclave, digital medium was used, added Ms Mitra. "Flowers used for decoration were composted. At the wedding, water and food were served in stainless steel cutlery and crockery procured from MC bartan bhandar. Other than that, only biodegradable environment friendly cups were used for coffee and soft drinks." Near the food counter, guests were gently nudged by strategically placed "use blue dustbin for dry waste and green dustbin for wet waste" displays. The bins were made easily accessible in the venue. All the waste collected were periodically transported in waste collection vehicle in segregated manner.

Lift the existing ban on sale, purchase, registries - Association

Installation of High tech CCTV cameras for Zirakpur, Baltana

Commissioner News Service ZIRAKPUR : In view of Zirakpur facing major escape routes for criminals, Mohali police have sent a proposal for installation of CCTV cameras. Soon, Zirakpur, Baltana and Dhakauli will get high - tech cameras along with a centralised control room. The proposal has been sent for approval. Police have identified 21 strategic points where such cameras will be installed. The department had asked him to notify strategic points where cameras could be install. SHO Insp Rajpal



Gill said, ""We have marked 21 such points and have notified the police department. We are waiting for approval of the proposal. Fixing of such high resolution cameras will be of great help in tracking, tracing and identifying criminals escaping the district, said Insp Rajpal Gill. A few of the key points

where cameras may come up are McDonald crossing, Patiala crossing, Panchkula - Zirakpur borders, towards Sector 19 Panchkula, near Dhakoli police station turning, near Dominoes Pizza point, towards high grounds turning and other places. Mohali Municipal Corporation has also decided to secure markets with high definition CCTV cameras to instill confidence among women and girls. MC will install 100 CCTV cameras at such markets under the Central Government funded Nirbhaya Scheme, said mayor Amarjit Singh alias Jeeti Sidhu.

10% reservation for economically weaker section to continue

Commissioner News Service NEW DELHI : For government jobs and admission in educational institutions Supreme Court upheld validity of 103rd constitutional amendment to provide legal section to the government's decision to carve out 10% reservation for EWS quota from open general category. A five judge bench of Chief



Justice U U Lalit Justice Dinesh Maheshwari, Ravindra Bhat, Bala, Mr Trivedi and JB Pardiwala, approved the amendment by majority support. The judgement expands the grounds for affirmative action beyond social and educational backwardness to include economic backwardness.

'5G' fifth generation connectivity from new year

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : "We are expecting the 5G services to be started from January 1. Two companies Bharti Airtel and Reliance Jio, will start the services. We are pushing for an earlier start of the services, and are streamlining the approval process. In another week, shortly we will be reviewing the progress," said Mr Dharampal, UT adviser. City residents can expect to have 5G fifth generation connectivity from New Year. The UT administration is working on speeding up process that will facilitate the roll out of the 5G services in the city in terms of the policy framework and the permissions required. The administration had earlier also held meetings with service



providers and shared different issues. The service providers have already conducted surveys. On Thursday, a review meeting was held under the chairmanship of Nitin Kumar Yadav, UT home secretary, on creating a single window portal, under the aegis of the central government's Gati Shakti Sanchar platform, for granting approval to service providers to start the 5G services. "The web portal, created by the National Informatics Centre

(NIC), is ready, and testing is going on. It will be made fully operational with in a couple of weeks. This will allow the service providers to apply for all necessary approvals from different departments through a single window. All the departments will be integrated on the portal itself. It will speed up the approval process," said a UT official. The centre has mandated that all the approvals be done in integration with the Gati Sakti portal. Gati Sakti Sanchar Portal was launched by DoT in May. In August this year, the central government released amendment in the Indian Telegraph Right of Way (RoW) Rules, 2016 to facilitate faster and easier deployment of Telecom Infrastructure.

Deepak Tinu in police custody till today

Commissioner News Service BATHINDA : A Mansa court remanded gangster Deepak Tinu in police custody for eight days. A Punjab Police team brought him from Patiala House Court in Delhi on Monday night, after he was sent into transit remand. Tinu was taken to civil hospital for medical examination before being produced in the court of chief judicial magistrate at Mansa on Tuesday morning. Tinu was arrested from Ajmer in Rajasthan on October 19 by the special cell of Delhi Police. It was only after Delhi Police interrogated him that Tinu was handed over to Punjab Police on



Monday. He is an accused in the murder case of singer Shubdeep Singh Sidhu aka Sidhu Moose Wala. Tinu had escaped from police custody on October 1 night, when sacked CIA incharge sub - inspector Pritpal Singh had taken the gangster to his official residence in Mansa.

Several booths locked, no revenue generation for MC

EDITORIAL -

Likelihood of Modi to triumph again in ballot war

Modi has done a lot of positive things that deserves him gigantic accolades. He virtually began by stopping the series of attacks on Christian churches in Delhi. In the months after he took over the reins of the government at the Centre, these attacks had become a constant affair. His direct transfer of government money to the bank accounts of the poor and needy was a brilliant initiative against corruption. The construction or renovation of houses of the poor in the villages was another step. Incidentally, it also won him new supporters for his party, which till then, had only the 'forward' castes in its kitty. The innocent were locked up for years along with the guilty, awaiting trials which never started. This disturbed the just man's sense of justice. Just like that sense of justice is disturbed when those convicted for mass murder and rapes are treated like heroes! It warmed the cockles of many hearts to learn that the CBI had opposed the premature release of the Bilkis convicts. That piece of information - obtained by the Supreme Court while hearing a PIL against the release reinforced the common belief that the CBI Director is not as eager to enter the proverbial parrot's cage prepared by the rulers. However the tenure as the Police Commissioner of Mumbai and the DGP of Maharashtra remained devoid of controversies. The Enforcement Directorate had surpassed the CBI in its willingness to play along with the government's political calculations. Public servants should

politely refuse to cooperate in requests that prick their conscience. A polite refusal always won the day. The leader involved will extract his revenge at some later date, but that is a small price to pay for the protection of one's conscience and self-esteem. Modi is very conscious of his image in the eyes of the common man. He is always immaculately dressed and groomed and he carries himself with dignity and grace. His rhetoric is programmed to carry listeners away with the power of the spoken word. But despite all these positives in his favour, he should not forget the lessons of history. As Shakespeare pontificates in Julius Caesar, "The evil that men do lives after them, the good is oft interred with their bones. 'It is not possible in these days of social media to give a contrarian spin to every evil deed conceived and implemented. If this spin is attempted, in each and every deliberate piece of wrongdoing, the credibility of the leader is soon shredded. In the eyes of the astute, such Shenanigans are exposed sooner than later. The truth is 'you cannot fool all the people all the time'. Modi had loudly proclaimed to the minorities, mainly the Muslims, that he wanted 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas. To it, he later added 'Sabka Vishwas' after he sensed that trust in him was slipping. Similarly, he had loudly proclaimed that women were the pride and joy of our existence and that they deserved the highest respect in the conduct of our daily affairs. Alas, in

both these promises to the country, Modi has not been able to maintain what he preached. There were 11 convicts and each convict's case should have not have been separately considered and argued. Instead, a blanket permission was given for their release. It is almost as if there was an understanding between the state and the Central governments that the miscreants would be honoured for killing women and children who belonged to the other community. All thoughts of 'Sabka Vishwas' and women's special place in our culture were abandoned. Those who took the decisions in the state government and the ministry were sure that their decisions would be welcomed by the citizens of a state where hate for the 'other' has eclipsed morality and common decency. Dispensing justice and ensuring that the rule of law prevails uniformly for every citizen is the responsibility of the rulers. There is no worse commentary on the regime's failure on this front than the recent premature release of the convicts sentenced to jail in the Bilkis Bano case. Narendra Modi remains the apple of peoples' eye and should win the next Lok Sabha elections easily. What would citizens, like this writer, expect of him in the five years from 2024 so that the life of the common man becomes more bearable? Lower prices of essentials and more jobs, of course, but at times the remedy for economic ills may not rest solely in the hands of the rulers.

40 intra e-buses, 20 for long route flagged off by Administrator



Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The new HVAC buses pressed for public service would be equipped with electronically controlled diesel engines conforming to latest BS-VI emission standards. For convenience of travellers, 40 intra-city electric buses and 20 long-route HVAC buses were flagged off by UT Administrator Banwarilal Purohit. The 20 HVAC buses are proposed to ply from Inter-State Bus Terminus (ISBTs) in Sectors 43 and 17 to Pathankot, Batala, Fatehabad, Amritsar, Abohar, Katra, Manali, Ludhiana, Shimla, Jaipur, Jhajar and Haridwar. As for the 40 electric buses, an agreement was signed with M/s Volvo Eicher in February. The first lot of five buses was flagged off by Union Home Minister Amit Shah on July 30

and was put on commercial operations. The second lot of 40 buses flagged off today will cover routes from New Maloya Colony to Ram Darbar and Mani Majra, ISBT-43 to Mani Majra and Behlana, Maloya to Mansa Devi. The Department of Heavy Industries, under the Ministry of Heavy Industries and Public Enterprises, Government of India, had sanctioned 80 electric buses for the UT under the Phase-II FAME India Scheme. The first lot of 40 buses has been under operation since November 2021, while the second lot of 40 was flagged off. UT Adviser Dharam Pal, Home Secretary Nitin Kumar Yadav, DGP Praveer Ranjan and Transport Director Pradhuman Singh were also present at the ceremony.

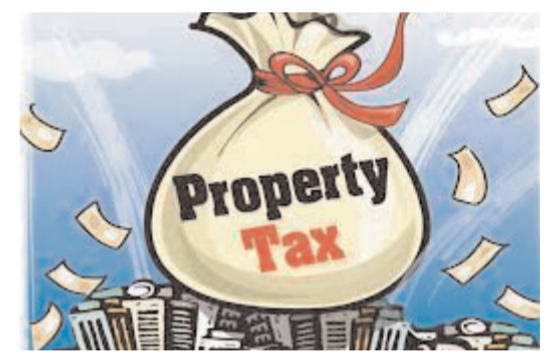
Panchkula power body to address grievances consumers on November 9

Civic body to instal 2 air purifiers near dumping site



Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA : Besides the dumping ground, the MC will also instal air purifier in the industrial areas here. Initially, it has been decided to install two air purifiers on a trial basis near the dumping ground and the Industrial Area. In view of a huge quantity of garbage at the dumping ground, air pollution remains high in the surrounding areas. Concerned over continuous opposition to the solid waste dumping ground in Jheuriwala, the Panchkula Municipal Corporation has decided to install an air purifier near the dumping ground to clean the area, which would also reduce the foul smell. The MC brought a proposal in its last General House meeting, which was unanimously passed by all councillors. After the installation of the air purifier, air quality index around the dumping ground will improve, besides reducing the foul smell emanating from the garbage. It will provide relief to people living in sectors across the Ghaggar. Another air purifier to be installed in the Industrial Area will help in cleaning the air, which is contaminated by smoke emanating from factories in Phase I and II. It will help people breathe clean air. The UT Administration had also installed an air purifier at the Transport Chowk in Sector 26. It helped in improving the air

quality around the area. Keeping this in mind, the Panchkula MC also took the decision to install two purifiers. Ward No. 8 councillor Harinder Malik said there were several factories in the Industrial Area, Phase 1 and 2. These factories emit smoke, causing contamination of air, which further results in breathing problems to people living in colonies nearby. He said if the air purifier was installed in the area, people would get immediate relief. Jasveer Singh Goyal, a resident of Sector 26, said it had become difficult for them to live due to the stench emanating from the dumping grounds in Sector 23 and Jheuriwala village. Their relatives avoid visiting them and it was difficult to cross the area due to the foul smell. Panchkula Mayor Kulbhushan Goyal said he was concerned about the health of people residing near dumping grounds and the Industrial Areas. He said a proposal to install air purifiers was passed by the Municipal Corporation in the last meeting, adding that it was their endeavour that air purifiers should be first installed near the dumping grounds and the Industrial Areas where the stench level was high and the air quality was not good. He said if they get better results from the air purifiers, then more such air purifiers would be installed at other places also.

Curtail cash spending limit to Rs 2,000, Election Commission exhorts govt

NEW DELHI : The poll panel has recommended that the Conduct of Election Rules should be amended to ensure that all cash payments in excess of Rs 2,000 made to a person or entity for election-related expenses are made either through account payee cheques or online and digital means, said the sources.

Aiming to ensure greater transparency in the electoral process, the Election Commission has written to the government suggesting to reduce the amount a candidate contesting polls can pay in cash for campaign-related expenditure from the existing Rs 10,000 to Rs 2,000.



As per the existing rules, the candidates are required to make all payments in excess of Rs 10,000 through cheque, draft or bank transfer from the bank account opened exclusively for the purpose of election expenditure. According to the EC's instructions, candidates have to open a separate bank account exclusively for election expenditure purposes, at least one day before filing of nomination.

Candidates also have to maintain day-to-day accounts, cash book and bank book from the date of filing of nomination to the date of declaration of results (both dates inclusive). They have to include all expenses incurred on the date of filing of nomination as well. A candidate has to submit the election expenditure account to the District Election Officer within 30 days of the poll results.

Pollution norms violated, 1,281 challans issued in Faridabad

FARIDABAD : A total of 199 vehicles had been penalised in the month of October for violating pollution norms in the district, said the police department.

The traffic police have issued 1,281 challans for violation of pollution norms and a penalty to the tune of Rs 1.28 crore has been imposed on violators in the district till October end. Official said as many as 55 old vehicles, including 45 petrol and 10 diesel vehicles, had been impounded under the ongoing drive in the past 10 months.

A penalty of Rs 10,000 is imposed on a polluting vehicle. Claiming that the department was taking all the measures to



implement the Graded Response Action Plan (GRAP) in order to contain pollution, he said checking of vehicles was underway at various spots in the city.

Besides, impounding old vehicles (petrol-15 years and diesel-10 years) he said a legal action had also been initiated against the violators.

The official said as many as 43 persons had been booked for violating a ban on firecrackers just ahead of the Diwali.

'Shaheed Bhagat Singh International Airport' freshly named against 'Chandigarh International Airport' notification issued

NEW DELHI : On September 25, Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced that the Chandigarh airport will be renamed after Bhagat Singh as a tribute to the freedom fighter. Ministry of Civil Aviation (MoCA) has issued the notification renaming the Chandigarh International Airport as Shaheed Bhagat Singh International Airport.

The 115th birth anniversary of the freedom fighter was celebrated on September 28. On the same day, it was announced that the Chandigarh airport has been renamed after Bhagat Singh.

In a notification dated November 2, MoCA said, "It is notified that the Chandigarh International Airport in Chandigarh is named as 'Shaheed Bhagat Singh International Airport, Chandigarh' with immediate



effect."

An elaborate process is followed in naming and renaming of airports, and the final approval has to come from the Union Cabinet. Generally, airports are known by the name of the city where they are located. In some cases, a specific name is proposed by the respective state government supported by a resolution passed in the state legislative assembly concerned.

The same is then sent to the Union Cabinet for the final

approval.

With the good growth potential of the country's civil aviation sector, the government aims to have a total of 220 airports by 2030.

"Just before the birth anniversary of Bhagat Singh, an important decision has been taken as a tribute to him. It has been decided that the Chandigarh airport will now be named after Shaheed Bhagat Singh. It had been in waiting for a long time," Modi said on September 25.

Option under EPS for increased pension, opens 4-month window for eligible employees

NEW DELHI : Employees who were existing EPS members as on September 1, 2014 can contribute up to 8.33 per cent of their 'actual' salaries -- as against 8.33 per cent of the pensionable salary capped at Rs 15,000 a month -- towards pension.

Eligible employees who had not opted for enhanced pension coverage prior to 2014 can jointly do so with their employers within the next four months after the Supreme Court upheld the Employees' Pension (Amendment) Scheme, 2014.

The court struck down the requirement in the 2014 amendments mandating employee contribution of 1.16 per cent of the salary exceeding Rs 15,000 per month.

This will facilitate the subscribers to contribute higher to the scheme and get enhanced benefits accordingly.

Trade unions have demanded that the government call an extraordinary meeting of the central board of trustees of the retirement fund body EPFO for quick implementation of the apex court order.

The Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 originally did not provide for



any pension scheme. In 1995, through an amendment, a scheme was formulated for employees' pension, wherein the pension fund was to comprise a deposit of 8.33 per cent of the employers' contribution towards provident fund corpus. At that point of time, maximum pensionable salary was Rs 5,000 per month which was later raised to Rs 6,500.

The EPS amendment of August 22, 2014 had raised the pensionable salary cap to Rs 15,000 a month from Rs 6,500 a month, and allowed members along with their employers to contribute 8.33 per cent on their actual salaries (if it exceeded the cap) towards the EPS. It gave all EPS members, as on September 1, 2014, six months to opt for the amended scheme.

The amendment, however, required such members to contribute an additional 1.16 per cent of their salary exceeding Rs 15,000 a month towards the pension fund.

While not too many employees had opted to contribute based on

their actual salaries, the Supreme Court order means that EPFO members and employers now have four months to opt for a pension scheme linked to actual salaries. This would essentially imply higher annuity after retirement.

General Secretary, Hind Mazdoor Sabha, Harbhajan Singh Sidhu said, "The apex court has given relief to subscribers of the Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) to opt for pension on higher earnings. Now we demand from the government to immediately call a special meeting of Central Board of Trustees (CBT) headed by the Union Labour Minister to discuss the order in detail and implement the relief given to members." The apex court also held that the EPFO cannot ask subscribers for an additional 1.16 per cent of contribution of salary for opting pension on higher earnings without amending the existing law.

The court has given the option of pension on higher earnings to subscribers of exempted provident fund trusts also.

Another EPFO trustee and All India Vice-President of Bharatiya Mazdoor Sangh (BMS) Sunkari Malleshwar also demanded an extraordinary meeting of the CBT.

Tally of dengue crosses 230 in Amritsar district

AMRITSAR : Although the tally of dengue cases has been climbing the graph yet the authorities stated that no death due to the disease has been reported so far.

With dengue cases continuing to increase, the residents are a worried lot and demand from the administration to arrange for regular fogging in residential areas. The district has reported a total of 230 dengue cases so far.

Apart from dengue, other viral infections are also troubling residents. A resident, Satinder Singh, said: "I have been experiencing symptoms such as fever, fatigue and decrease in platelet count. But my dengue test report is negative."

The district health officials stated that dengue-like symptoms can be experienced in other viral infections too. As per government guidelines, a patient is considered a dengue positive case only if he tests positive in Mac Eliza District Epidemiologist Dr Madan Mohan said people should use mosquito repellents and wear full-sleeved clothes to protect



them from mosquito bites.

"Dengue is an easily preventable disease. We can check mosquito breeding in houses by draining out water from the items which can hold water," he said.

Dr Madan said people should also dedicate a day to inspect their households and surroundings. On the administrative front, the district is also continuing with its inspection of public and private buildings to detect mosquito larvae and issue challans. "We have issued a record number of 2,400 challans, the highest in the state for detection of mosquito larvae," said Dr Madan.

Symptoms of the disease include high grade fever above 102°F, headache, pain in eyes, general body pains, vomiting, skin rashes, which must be monitored for seven to 10 days by medical experts.

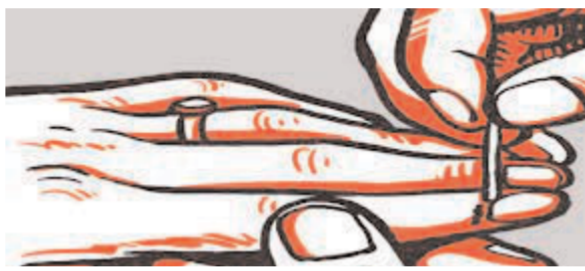

G20 Summit at Amritsar in Sept 2023, Punjab prepares vigorously

Commissioner News Service NEW DELHI : India is set to take over the presidency of G20 for a year from Indonesia, which is set to host the leaders' summit in November. The country will hold the presidency from December 1, 2022 to November 30, 2023. Our country will take over the presidency of the G20 from December and host the summit of leaders of the world's twenty largest economies in New Delhi during September 9-10, 2023. Under its Presidency, India is expected to host more than 200 preparatory and other meetings across the country, beginning in December this year. An exercise is already underway to identify suitable venues in places ranging from Tamil Nadu to the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir for hosting these meetings. India will take over after twice swapping the presidency of the G20, first with Italy in 2021 and then with Indonesia in 2022. "The G20 Leaders' Summit at the level of Heads of State [or] Government is scheduled to be held on 09 and 10 September, 2023, in New Delhi," the external affairs ministry said in a statement on Tuesday. Indonesia has invited both the Russian and Ukrainian presidents to the G20 Summit to



be held in Bali during November 15-16. Russia's presence in preparatory meetings this year has already led to some tensions with other member states. The Group of Twenty is an intergovernmental forum of the world's major developed and developing economies. It comprises 19 countries - Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, South Korea, Mexico, Russia, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, Turkey, the UK and the US - and the European Union (EU). Collectively, the G20 accounts for 85% of the global GDP, 75% of international trade and two-thirds of the world population, making it the premier forum for international economic

cooperation. India is currently part of the G20 Troika, which comprises the current, previous and incoming G20 presidencies and includes Indonesia, Italy and India. During its presidency, the troika will include India, Indonesia and Brazil. This will be the first time that the troika will consist of three developing countries and emerging economies, "providing them a greater voice", the statement said. The G20 includes the finance track, with eight work streams - global macroeconomic policies, infrastructure financing, international financial architecture, sustainable finance, financial inclusion, health finance, international taxation and financial sector reforms.

Haryana amends MBBS policy for signing of bonds

CHANDIGARH : The policy provides for signing of bonds for the students doing MBBS courses in the Haryana government run medical colleges in the state. According to the college, the students who will be joining the health department after completion of MBBS degree for seven years need not pay any bond money, announced Manohar Lal Khattar, CM.



Finally, giving into the demands of the students of MBBS (Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery) courses, the department of medical education and research (DMER) Haryana notified the amended MBBS Policy of the state. Students who do not opt to join the state government health services or leave the government job before completion of seven years, will have to pay the bond money on the basis of calculation done at the time of opt-out of bond. The students of medical colleges, especially the PGIMS Rohtak, were on warpath for the last one week as they had been asked to pay the bond money of Rs 10 lakh per annum in addition to the course fee. The intake is likely to go up to 3,000, as the government targets to open a medical college in all districts. The policy was accepted two years ago. During those years students were told to sign the bond but no bond money was

charged. It was during the intake of the current 3 session, the PGIMS, which is the nodal agency for MBBS and BDS admission, has started charging Rs 10 lakh as bond money in addition to the course fee for the first year. The students went on a strike as it intensified, there had been vacancy seats too. This forced Haryana CM Khattar to chip in to announce to waive deposit of fee. "Government never had any intention to ask the students to deposit Rs 10 lakh. Signing of bond was merely to ensure that the MBBS students join the government service in the state. Those who are willing to join will take this as an incentive. While those opting to move out of the signed bond will have to pay it back to the state," said a senior official in chief minister's office (CMO). Government spends around Rs 500 crore per annum on education of MBBS students of the state. The government is increasing seats each year and some students prefer to join corporates, hence the bond system comes into being, the official added.

Celebrate foundation day of Chandigarh each year on 1 Nov

Army asks Punjab to take NOC for mining along Indo Pak border

CHANDIGARH : According to the Army, any mining activity in the hinterland beyond a depth of 5km from the international border anywhere in Punjab, within a radius of 500 metres from any military establishment will only be permitted after an NOC is obtained by the state government from the local military authority, of the rank of a brigadier. The Army has asked Punjab to incorporate this condition into its mining policy. The letter was sent to Krishan Kumar, Punjab principal secretary (department

of water resources, mining and geology), in connection with the pending matter before the Punjab and Haryana high court on illegal mining in Punjab. Any mining activity, as per the letter dated October 19, within the area bound by the international boundary between India and Pakistan in Punjab (BP - 1 to BP - 274) on the western side and up to a depth of the line of defence works of the Army and 500 metres beyond on the Eastern side should not be permitted.
