Modi exhorts Putin, Zelensky, to talk directly

NEW DELHI : Russia on Monday announced a ceasefire in Sumy and three other cities Kyiv, Kharkiv, and Mariupol, igniting hopes for an early evacuation of Indian students and others but leading only to an abortive bid to evacuate some of them. "This is financial nuclear war and the largest sanctions event in history. Russia went from being part of the global economy to the

single largest target of global sanctions and a financial pariah in less than two weeks," Russia faced 2,778 new sanctions, bringing the total to 5,530, after actions led by the US and European nations, according to Castellum.ai, a global sanctions-tracking database, Bloomberg reported. With 700 students still in Sumy, Modi spoke to Vladimir Putin and also Ukraine president



Volodymyr Zelensky for their quick and safe evacuation. Our Prime Minister also suggested to Putin, according to an Indian readout, that the Russian president

have a "direct conversation" with Zelensky to assist the ongoing peace efforts. Mr Modi also said India was ready to provide, according to a Russian

statement, any possible assistance to resolve the conflict was to happen very soon. During his conversation with Modi, Putin informed the PM about

Moscow's decision to impose ceasefire in the four cities but also said Ukraine "nationalists, using force and different kinds of provocations, continue to prevent the evacuation of civilians, including foreign citizens, from battle zones". Reports from Ukraine said Kyiv had not agreed to the ceasefire because it wanted civilians to be taken to a safe zone in Ukraine and not evacuated to Russian territory.

A fourth-year medicine student in Sumy State University, Mohamed Mahtab Raza said that some students had left in buses arranged by Indian officials in the morning but they returned to their hostel campus after a short while, apparently because of ceasefire violations. The Indian embassy had asked students on Sunday evening to prepare for evacuation on a short

notice saying a team of Indian officials was camping in Poltava in central Ukraine to coordinate evacuation from Sumy. Officials are awaiting confirmation from both sides that the ceasefire will hold while students are being transported. Raza expressed hope that all students will be evacuated as soon as possible, adding that water supply on his floor had been restored and food was available for now.

Zelensky condemns NATO's decision on 'no-fly' zone

KYIV : President Volodymyr Zelensky of Ukraine criticized NATO over its rejection of a no-fly zone, hours after the alliance announced it would not intervene by air or land for fear of creating a conflict with Russia that could spill into other parts of Europe. Leaders of the alliance met on Sunday in Brussels, after which NATO's secretary general, Jens Stoltenberg, said its members

had rejected any possibility of intervening against Russian forces. "We have a responsibility as NATO allies to prevent this war from escalating beyond Ukraine," Stoltenberg said.

Zelensky criticized that decision, calling the summit "weak" and "lost". He said that Russian troops were shelling civilians, residential areas and schools, and the decisions not to create a no-fly zone "gave a green light" to more bombardment. Later, Zelensky spoke with over 300 members of the US congress, imploring them to ban the importation of Russian oil and to spend more jets to Ukraine, as per lawmakers.

UN Security Council raises alarm of nuclear risks

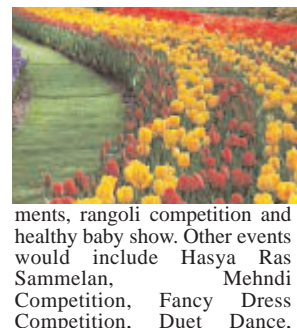

NEW YORK : Smoke billowed from a building at the entrance to the Zaporizhzhia nuclear power plant, after attacks by invading Russian forces, in Enerhodar, Ukraine on March 6, 2022. Several western countries, including the U.S., U.K., slammed Russia for endangering nuclear facilities. The UNSC members expressed alarm at the prospect of a nuclear incident in Ukraine, convened hours after a training building at Ukraine's Zaporizhzhia nuclear power plant caught fire, as Russians moved in on the facility and seized control of it. The International Atomic Energy (IAEA) chief told the Council that no reactors had been damaged.



directly from the power plant. Mr. Grossi, who joined the Council meeting via video link, from onboard a flight to Tehran, reactors were hit by the projectile. He expressed his willingness to travel to Chernobyl to establish a "stable framework" for the governance of the nuclear power plant. The plan was taken over by Russian forces last week — although it is still being run by Ukrainians. During his remarks, India's Permanent Representative to the United Nations (UNPR) T.S. Tirumurti warned of the danger a nuclear incident. Mr. Tirumurti emphasised that a humanitarian crisis was confronting Ukraine. India has been concerned about the lives of several thousand of its nationals caught in the conflict.

Human health risks triggered by burning of fossil fuels

In India, climate change is relatively hazardous with specific regard to nutrition and infectious diseases. There are also great risks around access to water and exposure to heat waves. Communities that are already vulnerable, like low wealth groups and the marginalized, could bear the greatest brunt of climate impacts on food, water and shelter in addition to heatstroke, etc.

There are climate implications in terms of the spread of infectious diseases as well cycles of flood and drought increased by climate change can enhance diseases transmitted through water. Changing temperatures and rain fall patterns can alter diseases transmitted by mosquitoes like malaria.

We know that the root cause of climate change, the burning of fossil fuels, by using the renewable energy over fossil fuels, we can improve our own health and the environment's causes air pollution this is responsible for a huge toll of disease. Increased exposure to air pollution, caused in India by vehicular emissions, construction, brick kilns, burning agricultural residues, etc., can even increase the risks of loss of life to Covid 19.

By reducing our dependence on fossil fuels, we can both decrease climate change and lower the burgeoning of respiratory and other diseases.

In the US, the risks come from the destruction of homes and properties from extreme weather we've had a substantial increase in destructive wild fires. We've also

experienced huge air pollution which is enormously damaging. In the US, heatwaves are now responsible for more losses of life than all other natural disasters combined with climate change, the frequency and severity of extreme heat will only grow.

People again already on the margins, struggling to pay rent or get food for their families, one storm can set their life course in a much harsher direction than it would have been.

Given current emissions of greenhouse gases, well before the end of this century, one in three people could be living in places that are too hot to sustain human survival you simply couldn't be outside for any significant time before your body overheats.

Access to water and nutrition will also be impacted in such places. Without the commitments called for through the UN process, we'll be living in a world where large numbers of people, many in already hot places, will find it very hard to stay there because of the absence of basic resources and climate challenges making these places unsuitable for human existence.

Climate shocks, extraordinary events, from heatwaves to cyclones, that would not have happened without the atmospheric accumulation of greenhouse gases disproportionately affect children. This can begin even before birth with exposure to extreme heat. Air pollution also reduces a child's prospects of well being even before they are born or infancy onwards. Further, the absence of

vital nutrition can damage a child's development for life. Climate change reduces the nutrient content of foods like rice, wheat, corn and soy. These nutrient losses have a large effect on children's health.

It is very important to note that we adults were born into a world which was much better for us than the one we will leave for our children. If we don't address this, we will be committing the greatest moral transgression in human history if we fail to take our responsibility seriously now, we will be the generation that forsook our children's welfare in irretrievable ways.

It is quite understandable to think, how can one action by one individual matter in a problem that is so big in scale? But the antidote to helplessness is action. The biggest challenge we face is not finding new technologies - it is developing community understanding that we can change things.

Consider how the price of solar power in India is among the lowest in the world. That doesn't even count is huge health benefits we did a study asking, if you could put renewable energy anywhere in the world, where would you save the most lives? The answer was India. So, every time an individual or organization in India choose to source energy from renewables, it will help people live healthier lives and also show that we can be economically productive without relying on fossil fuels.

Parking related issues prompt fee to continue in Panchkula for 15 days

PANCHKULA : A resolution was passed in a General House meeting, the Panchkula Municipal Corporation to suspend the collection of parking fee for 15 days in all five sectors where it is currently operational. The paid parking is currently functional in Sector 8, 9, 10, 14 and 20.

While the parking in Sector 8, 9 and 10 is managed by the Child Welfare Committee, the other two parking lots in Sector 14 and 20 are managed by contractors. A three-member committee of councillors, led by the Joint Commissioner, will examine parking-related issues forwarded by various councillors. While some alleged non-fulfilment of the terms and conditions of the contract, others raised behavioural issues of the staff deployed at the parking lots.

The committee will submit its report within 15 days. The further course of action on the parking lots will be decided on the basis of the report, said Mayor Kulbhushan Goyal. At the General House



meeting, several councillors said parking charges should be discontinued forever, saying that the civic body could increase its revenue through other means, but a financial burden should not be put on city residents. One of them was JJP councillor from ward number 14 Sushil Garg. He has been opposing the paid parking in Sector 20 ever since its introduction.

Garg said the parking contractor had failed to ensure the terms and conditions of the contract. "It has come to my notice that the staff deployed at the entry/exit points misbehave with young women and girls who come to coaching centres," he said. At the last General House meeting, the JJP councillor had entered into an argument with Deputy Municipal Commissioner Deepak Sura over the same issue.

Bouncers injure two lawyers among four in attack at resort

PANCHKULA : "Around midnight, attendants of the resort shifted all guests to a hall. Two hours later, my friends Inder and Chetan tried to re-enter the hall after coming back from the washroom. However, the bouncers didn't allow them despite repeated requests and subsequently pushed them. Inder and Chetan fell on the ground," a lawyer Gaurav Sikri alleged.

Meanwhile, Abhinav, the owner of the resort, came there and threatened to teach both of them a lesson. Bouncers then started pushing the duo. "On hearing a noise, my two advocate friends Tarun Sharma and Lavish Arora and I rushed to the spot. However, they kept thrashing our friends. Tarun intervened but they charged at him and subsequently attacked me and other guests too. They punched Tarun in the face, which left his upper teeth broken. The accused hit an iron rod on my left arm due to which I suffered a fracture in the elbow," the complainant said.

Four persons, including two lawyers, were allegedly attacked with sticks and iron rods by 10-12 bouncers and the owner of a resort on the Morni road near Nada village on the intervening night of Saturday and Sunday.



The complainant, Gaurav Sikri, a lawyer and resident of Sector 11, told the police that it was his birthday and he was hosting a party for his colleagues and friends at a resort, Marina Bay, last evening. "Later, they dragged Tarun outside the resort to the roadside. Somehow, all four of us managed to run away and hide in bushes to save our lives," he added.

The police were called up and a PCR vehicle reached the spot around 2:30 am. Meanwhile, Gaurav and Tarun were taken to the Civil Hospital for treatment. The complainant alleged that the suspects also snatched a gold chain Tarun was wearing during the attack.

A case has been registered against the resort owner and Harpal, a bouncer, under Sections 148, 149, 323, 325, 341, 379-B, and 506 of the Indian Penal Code at the Chandimandir police station. Inspector Lalit Kumar, SHO, Chandimandir police station, said they were yet to make an arrest in the case.

India evacuates 2,000 students in Ukraine conflict

NEW DELHI : Among the special civilian flights on Sunday, nine landed in New Delhi while two in Mumbai.

India brought back 2,135 citizens on Sunday under 'Operation Ganga' through 11 special civilian flights from Ukraine's neighbouring countries as fighting intensifies in several Ukrainian cities.

There were six flights from Budapest, two from Bucharest, two from Rzeszow and one from Kosice.

With Sunday's evacuation, nearly 16,000 Indians have been evacuated since the



special flights began on February 22.

"The number of Indians airlifted by 66 special civilian flights goes up to 13,852. Till date, the IAF has flown 10 sorties to bring back 2,056 passengers while taking 26 tonnes of relief load to these countries as part of Operation Ganga," Union

Ministry of Civil Aviation Jyotiraditya Scindia said in a statement on Sunday.

On Monday, eight special flights are expected to operate from Budapest (5), Suceva (2), and Bucharest (1), evacuating more than 1,500 Indians back home.

Despite reminders to 11,000 rent defaulters, yet no payment to Chandigarh Housing Board

CHANDIGARH : The occupants of small flats in eight rehabilitation colonies have failed to pay their outstanding rent. They were allotted small flats at Dhanas, Sector 38 (West), Sector 49, Sector 56, Ram Darbar, Mauli Jagran, Maloya and Industrial Area, Phase II, several years ago. Similarly, a large number of occupants of small flats under the Affordable Rental Housing Scheme (ARHS) at Maloya have also failed to pay their rent.

The CHB had time and again sent recovery notices to the defaulters. In 2019, the CHB had cancelled the allotment of nearly 250 allottees for the violation.

Chandigarh Housing Board (CHB) has issued notices to nearly 11,000



allottees of small flats and Affordable Rental Housing Scheme (ARHC) to clear their pending rent of nearly Rs 40 crore at the earliest to avoid eviction.

Despite several notices issued to the defaulters, they have failed to pay their rent, said Yashpal Garg, Chief Executive Officer, CHB. He said cancellation proceedings would be initiated against the defaulters if they failed to clear their dues within 15 days and their allotment would be cancelled. In view of the Covid-19 pandemic, strict

action against the rent defaulters was kept on hold, he added. He said the notices were issued to the allottees whose pending rent was more than Rs10,000.

To make the city slum-free, the UT Administration had allotted small flats to slum dwellers under the slum rehabilitation scheme in the city. The allottees of the one-room EWS flats are charged ground rent from Rs800 to Rs1,000 per month which is increased by 20 per cent after five years of allotment.

Dubai flight to resume on March 28 as Covid cases drop

MOHALI : The Sharjah flight at present is only operational from the local airport. The Dubai flight will resume twice-a-week on March 28, when the summer flight schedule will start.

Rakesh Dembla, CEO, Chandigarh International Airport Limited (CHIAL), said apart from resuming the

Dubai flight, there was a plan to increase domestic flights from 56 to 76 (both arrivals and departures). Dembla said there was also a proposal for a flight from the city airport to Heathrow Airport in London, which was likely to start in October, when the winter schedule would be implemented. This would provide a huge



relief to the Punjabi diaspora from the tricity as at present, they have to board a flight either from Delhi or Amritsar. The CEO said recently the authorities had a

meeting with the British High Commission for starting the flight to London and the proposal was being pushed by Chandigarh MP Kirron Kher. He said the direct flight would most likely be to Heathrow Airport in London or the Birmingham airport, which was around 170 km from London. Meanwhile, with a dip

in Covid cases, the airport has started recording more business as over the past week, the footfall has increased to 10,000 with more people resuming air travel. The airport had seen a drop of 40 per cent in footfall between January and mid-February, which was down to 6,000 a day.

Ajay Chuatala to intensify membership drive from March 13

The core committees of both the parties will take the final call regarding the forthcoming MC election and the seat-sharing arrangements."

Govt launches scheme to bring drop out girls back to education stream

NEW DELHI : At present only four lakh drop out adolescent girls are visiting the anganwadis for nutrition education and skilling, said Indevdar Pandey Women and Child Development Secretary. The Union government on Monday launched Kanya Shiksha Pravesh Utsav to bring out-of-school girls back to the education system, a senior official said. Addressing an event, Pandey said the Kanya Shiksha Pravesh Utsav is being launched by the Women and Child Development Ministry in partnership with the Education Ministry. Bringing out-of-school girls back to the education system has been the target since the Right to Education Act was promulgated, he said. The officer expressed hope of "reaching a position within a short time where we will be able to put out-of-school girls into formal schooling system."

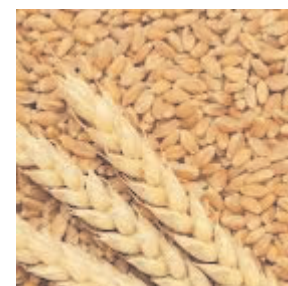


"The focus is all boys and girls get quality education. We are making constant efforts to ensure no child, especially girls, are deprived of their right to education," he said. "We are drawing a programme for out-of-school adolescent girls which will be driven by the Anganwadi system in close partnerships with education officers at district and block levels. "The need has arisen because the Scheme For Adolescent Girls (SAG), which initially took care of out-of-school girls, was getting less traction," he said. Pandey said in 2018-19 there were 11.88 lakh girls which were beneficiaries under the SAG scheme and the number drastically came down to 5.03 lakh in 2021.

Retail giants for wheat approach Punjab traders

CHANDIGARH : Being the largest wheat producing state in the country, Punjab could benefit from this rise in demand, provided the government reduces taxes on private purchase of wheat. The Russia-Ukraine war has led to an increase in demand for wheat from India in the international market. Commission agents and wheat traders in Punjab have number of enquiries were being received for the past week from global food retail giants and foodgrain exporters like ITC, Cargill, Adani Group and Australian Wheat Board. Teams of some of these exporters are already visiting the state to assess the quantum of wheat they can buy from here. Satish Kumar Arora, a flour mill owner in Khanna, said



the price of wheat had shot up by Rs 100 a quintal since Wednesday. He said exporters were willing to pay up to Rs 2,450 per quintal (at Kandla port, including freight charges), against Rs 2,000 per quintal a week ago. This interest has arisen because the war has choked the global supply of wheat, pushing its price by over \$11 a bushel. Russia and Ukraine account for nearly 40 per cent of the

global wheat supply and the war has reportedly held back shipments, said traders. This has led to many traders and commission agents demanding that the taxes imposed on private purchase of grains from Punjab be reduced so the state's farmers and traders can benefit from the demand. Harbans Singh Rosha, a commission agent in Khanna, said though they expected a good demand from private traders this procurement season (beginning April), the high taxes could prove to be a deterrent. The taxes include three per cent each market fee and rural development fund, 2.5 per cent commission to agents and one per cent service charges.

Rs 157.17-cr draft Budget proposed for 2022-23 fiscal year

PANCHKULA : The local municipal corporation has proposed to incur an expenditure of Rs154 crore in the budget draft for next fiscal. A spending of Rs69.72 crore on development works has been proposed. The local Municipal Corporation (MC) has prepared a draft Budget of Rs157.17 crore for the financial year 2022-23. The proposed Budget will be tabled before the MC House during a special annual Budget meeting to be held at Kisan Bhawan in Sector 14 here on Monday. For the fiscal year 2021-22, the MC had approved a Budget of Rs119.37 crore. Mayor Kulbhushan Goyal said with an increase in annual Budget amount, they seek to spend more on development



works. Meanwhile, an 18-point agenda will be presented in the General House meeting to be held the same day. The key agenda on the table for discussion would be implementation of citizens' charter and departmental action against employees who don't ensure completion of the work in a time-bound manner. It has been planned by the civic body to construct a sports stadium on 4 to 5 acres at Billa village. The construction of new community centres at Toka, Chandimandir and Buddh

Ghagar villages falling in the MC jurisdiction is also on the agenda. A discussion on development of new sectors through land pooling on the lines of Mohali will also be held at the meeting. A proposal has also been made to shift roadside liquor vendors to approved showrooms. According to the proposal, if liquor vendors were not removed or come up again on the roadside, the MC would initiate a strict action against the vendor.

Youth to gain self-employment opportunities : Khattar

AMBALA/KARNAL : Under the scheme, five experienced persons of the society will be appointed as guides for 100 families and will make them aware of the benefits and take them forward. "The guides with the spirit of social work has been known as 'arthis' (mentors). People wishing to serve the society will have to register themselves on the Samarpan portal," said Manohar Lal Khattar, the Chief Minister. He was addressing a gathering at the Mukhyamantri Antyodaya Parivar Uthhan Mela on the premises of the SDM office in Gharaunda. The Chief Minister on Saturday launched the 'Mukhyamantri Shato Udyami Sarathi Yojana' to help youth become self-employed. Accompanied by Gharaunda MLA Harvinder Kalyan, the CM said: "We have launched this scheme to help the needy persons become self-employed by taking loans." Khattar further said no person in the state would live below the monthly income of Rs 15,000 and for this, melas were being organised in all districts. He said 11 lakh such families were identified whose annual income is less than Rs 1.80 lakh and 160 such melas were organised in December last year. So far, 3.5 lakh people had benefitted from



the scheme so far. Now, the second phase of these melas has started from March 2. At least, 250 melas will be organised till March 17. Khattar said the beneficiary should start a business by taking a loan under the self-employment scheme. "Families applying for loans through these melas should use the amount to start a new business or expand the existing one. Such loans being provided at lower interest rates should not be used to buy houses or any luxury items." The CM further said the Parivar Pehchan Patra was being made to identify the families that require economic uplift. "The data of eligible persons have also been linked to the Mukhyamantri Parivar Samridhi Yojana. Under the Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana and Jan Suraksha Bima, the premium amount is being paid by the state only," he said, adding that the melas would prove to be a boon for the future generations. Meanwhile, the CM handed over loan approval letters of Rs 23.88 lakh to five beneficiaries.

Chd Rly Stn to develop world class Stn -DRM

CHANDIGARH : Gurinder Mohan Singh Ambala division railway manager (DRM) said, "Development of the Chd Rly Station has been handed over to our division as the government had dissolved IRSDC. We will chalk out plans to evolve Chandigarh as a world class Railway Station. We will take over the station from April 1 onwards."
Divisional Rly manager added that as per the decision taken by the Railway Board, on February 25, 2022, Ambala division of Northern Rly signed novation agreement (Replacement of one contract with a new one with mutual agreement of parties concerned) of all contracts with IRSDC and contractors concerned to take over management of Chandigarh Rly Stn from IRSDC.
Hope of making Chandigarh railway station a world class one have been revived with Ambala division all set to take over again. The Station will be taken over by Ambala division from April 1 onwards. The DRM



added that a novation agreement has been signed between Indian Railway Development Corporation (IRSDC) and senior divisional commercial manager (Sr DCM), Ambala division.
Senior DCM Hari Mohan said that the novation agreement would come into effect from April 1, 2022. In the meantime, there will hand holding by Ambala division for smooth takeover of the station. Apart from this, the division has started work on inviting new tenders to exploit the full earning potential of Chandigarh Station, from parking, NFR, catering and other earning contracts.
Senior DCM Hari Mohan said, "The agreement has been signed between IRSDC and Sr DCM

Ambala. It means that one to one agreement by IRSDC for parking, catering, maintenance, upkeep of infrastructure, new contractors. The same process was followed when we handed over stations along with running contracts to them three years ago.
Chandigarh railway station was handed over to IRSDC on March 20, 2019 for facility management and redevelopment. On October 18, 2021, the railway board decided to close IRSDC and hand over management and station redevelopment work to the respective zonal railways. A special purpose vehicle of IRSDC was constituted in 2012, after which IRSDC officially took over Chandigarh Railway Station in 2019. However, since then, no work was done in this respect. IRSDC took over Chandigarh Railway Station by the end of February, 2019. It was to manage passenger amenities and other infrastructure.

e-auction for 12 free hold sites goes up on 14 March

CHANDIGARH : Nursing sites have been vacant for over a decade. As per records, UT earmarked 16 nursing sites across the city way back however, only seven were auctioned while the remaining nine could not be auctioned till date. The UT had given permission for auction of six sites.
According to records of the Chandigarh administration, the nursing home sites are situated at prime locations of southern sectors of Chandigarh. Since these sectors lack the facility of nursing homes, the nursing home sites will provide major benefit to residents of these areas. At present, the estate office has put up only two sites in sector 51 on e-auction.
The UT estate office is holding e-auction of 10 commercial and two nursing home sites on freehold basis. The e-auction of these sites will be held from March 14 to March 16.
The two nursing home sites are in sector 51, whereas 10 commercial sites, including booth and SCO are in sector



33,36,39,42 and 44. Earlier, the estate offices started the process of e-auction of eight residential sites on freehold basis.
The UT estate office had written to the UT finance department to grant permission for e-auction to these sites and to clarify terms and conditions for the same.
Recently, the UT engineering department, MC Chandigarh, BSNL etc issued Non-Encumbrance Certificate (NEC) to the estate office, ensuring that these sites remained completely free of encroachments and the UT could auction these.
Thereafter the estate office wrote to the UT finance department to grant permission for e-auction of these sites to clarify terms and conditions for the same.

Prolonged use of mobile phone harmful, PGI educates

CHANDIGARH : "The electromagnetic radiations get concentrated over the phone and expose people to radiations even during sleep, said Prof Surjit Singh, Director of PGI.
Use of even Bluetooth for music / calls can also affect hearing, say PGI doctors who are planning to spread awareness on this subject.
The department has organised some street plays to spread awareness about prevention of hearing



loss by avoiding noise in the day to day life. It can also be done by avoidance of electromagnetic radiation induced hearing loss by curtailing the excess use of mobile phones and other preventive aspects.
"Almost a decade ago, we had conducted an ICMR sponsored study, which had found that prolonged use of mobile for more than one hour and a year, had frequency hearing loss as seen in elderly people, was seen in the young people," said Prof Naresh K Panda, head of the ENT department in the PGI.

Routing of doctors back to Punjab, decried by SAD

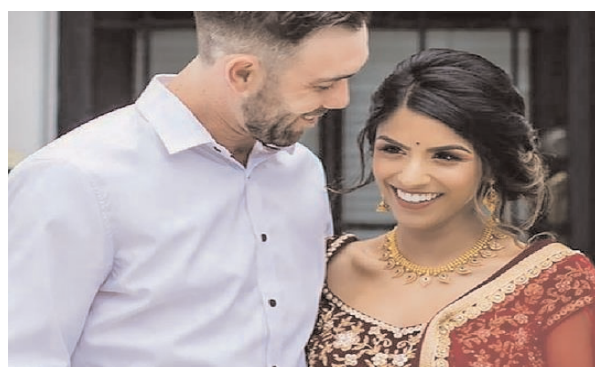

CHANDIGARH : The Shiromani Akali Dal has decried the proposal of sending doctors back to Punjab, as a conspiracy to dilute Punjab's share in Chandigarh administration and announced that a party delegation will meet Amit Shah Union home minister, with taking up the issue.
"He was surprised to see strategy crafted when Punjab leaders were busy in state assembly elections, said Daljit Singh Cheema.
UT Chandigarh officers hatched the conspiracy to send back 112 Punjab doctors to their parent state and gave advertisement to hire doctors from Haryana, Himachal Pradesh,



Central government and other union territories. This was a clear violation of Punjab Reorganisation Act which states that Punjab and Haryana will depute officers on 60:40 ratio in Chandigarh said Cheema.
The SAD leader said that earlier too attempts were made by officials posted in Chandigarh by the central government but when such proposals were opposed tooth and nail by the SAD, they were rolled back but

surprisingly no one was punished for hatching such a conspiracy. Citing examples, Cheema said that in 2018, a proposal was made to recruit 468 JBT teachers for Chandigarh. As per the Punjab Reorganisation Act rule and regulations of Punjab are in force in Chandigarh, but officials not only gave exemption in provision of subject till Class 10, but also allowed test in English and Hindi only, completely ignoring Punjab, he alleged.

NATO nations pour arms into Ukraine, risking conflict with Russia

KVIV : The Czechs are sending machine guns, sniper rifles, pistols and ammunition. Even formerly neutral countries like Sweden and Finland are sending weapons. And Germany, long allergic to spending weapons into conflict zones, is sending stingers as well as other shoulder launched rockets. In all, about 20 countries most members of NATO and the EU, but not all are funneling arms into Ukraine to flight of Russia. NATO is also moving military equipment and as many as 22,000 more troops into member states bordering Russia and Belarus, to reassure them and enhance deterrence.



However, it is a strategy that risks encouraging a wider war and possible retaliation from president Putin. The rush of lethal military aid into Ukraine from Poland, a member of NATO, aims, after all, to kill Russian soldiers. Putin already sees NATO as committed to threaten or even destroy Russia. World wars have started over smaller conflicts, and the proximity of the war to NATO allies carries danger that it could draw in other parties in

unexpected ways. Russian foreign minister Sergei Lavrov said that if a third world war were to take place, it would involve nuclear weapons and will be destructive. Lavrov said the special operation against Ukraine was launched with the aim preventing Kyiv from obtaining nuclear weapons. "The military operation is aimed at disarming the Ukraine. Russia will not let Ukraine obtain nuclear weapons," he said.

Vendors go chaotic near PGI gate

CHANDIGARH : The recalcitrant attitude of the Municipal Corporation (MC) towards the evolving chaos outside the main gate of premier medical institute PGI has become a matter of concern.

There was no vending zone until 2020 outside the PGI, however, after allocation of the site, there are only few licensed vendors, while the others have been 'outsourced' by them, sources said.

A cluster of unauthorised vendors have been hampering free flow of traffic for doctors and ambulances towards the hospital. This happened despite the PGI authorities pursued the matter with the civic body since 2018.



The PGI had conducted survey to see how the road towards PGI's main gate entry could be decongested. "Not only has the road been encroached by vendors, a prepaid auto booth has worsened the traffic flow just outside the PGI," said an official of the PGI.

The institute has written many letters to the Municipal Commissioner, SSP (traffic) and the Chief Architect. " said one of the vendors outside the main entry gate.

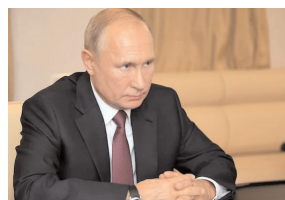
Russia becomes world's most penalised nation

NEW DELHI : After actions led by the US and European nations, Russia faced 2,778 new sanctions, bringing the total to 5,530, according to Castellum.ai, a global sanctions-tracking database, Bloomberg reported.

Within a span of 10 days of invading Ukraine, Russia surpassed Iran and North Korea to become the world's most-sanctioned nation.

Iran, on the other hand, has faced 3,616 sanctions against it over the last decade, mostly for its nuclear program and support of terrorism. While Syria and North Korea have 2,608 and 2,077 sanctions, respectively. Pressure grew on Russia as American Express Co. and Netflix Inc also suspended services in the country, adding to the list of services that stopped operations in Moscow.



"This is financial nuclear war and the largest sanctions event in history. Russia went from being part of the global economy to the single largest target of global sanctions and a financial pariah in less than two weeks," Peter Piatetsky, a former Treasury Department official in the Obama and Trump administrations who co-founded Castellum.ai, told Bloomberg. The majority of sanctions against Russia since February 22 have been imposed on 2,427 compared to 343 entities -- companies or government agencies.

Change in BBMB rules becomes flashpoint between Centre and Punjab

CHANDIGARH : Political parties in Punjab, barring the BJP are up in arms over the Centre's decision to amend the rules regarding appointments in two key positions on the Bhakra Beas Management Board.

The Bhakra and Beas projects form a major part of this plan and were established as a joint venture of the then undivided Punjab and Rajasthan.

Following the reorganisation of Punjab on November 1, 1966, and the creation of the state of Haryana, the Bhakra Beas Management Board was constituted under Section 79 of the Punjab Reorganisation Act, 1966. The administration, maintenance and operation of Bhakra Nangal project was handed over to Bhakra



Management on October 1, 1967. On May 15, 1976, when the Beas Projects Works were completed and handed over, the Bhakra Management Board was renamed as Bhakra Beas Management Board (BBMB).

Since then, BBMB regulates supply of water and power to Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Himachal Pradesh, Delhi and Chandigarh. The BBMB management includes a chairperson and two whole

time members who are from the partner states of Punjab and Haryana. They are designated as Member (Power) and Member (Irrigation) from Punjab and Haryana, respectively. There is representation from each member state including Rajasthan and Himachal Pradesh as nominated by the respective state governments. The total strength of BBMB is about 12000 and out of these 696 are Group A officers and are posted from the partner states.

Submit record of EWS admission - Edu Dept

CHANDIGARH : After receiving complaints, the education department has directed all schools to complete the draw process for the EWS category by March 15.

According to Right to Education Act, every private school is required to reserve 25% seats in its school for admission of children from economically weaker sections. The department of education has taken note of such type of lapse. It has issued letters to private schools regarding the entry class, age of admission, total number of EWS and disadvantaged group seats in the entry level class in the school, reserved seats under right to education and land allotment conditions near the school. Details of how many applications for admissions have been received, how many seats have been filled and the number of vacancies have been requested. Minority schools have been asked if they have admitted



15% poor students under the land allotment scheme and how many seats are currently vacant. Non-minority schools have been asked whether they have admitted 25% poor students and how many seats are vacant.

The education department will examine records of enrollment of economically weaker (EWS) students in private schools under the Right to Education (RTE) Act. On the allegation that schools did not admit eligible students in entry level classes, the department has sought details of EWS students to be submitted by March 17.

Many students belonging to economically weaker sections (EWS) have not been

able to get admission to entry level classes in UT private schools for the 2022-23 session as their parents were unable to get income certificates. The applications were not even verified by tehsildars, due to which income certificates could not be produced. The last date of this category was extended to March 7 from February 28 but a few parents have alleged that many schools have not yet filled vacancies in this category. They claimed that school authorities were sending back parents of this category saying that all seats in their school had been filled. Many schools have not yet conducted draw of lots for this category.
