He adds saying this pure cow ghee is preferred by those who prioritise natural and organic options. During 2021, the claim of high purity was made and in October 2022, sample BKD 2458 was taken for purity test and won clientele applause and wide acceptance. For the quality emergence, conventional Ayurvedic Bolona procedure is adopted by the dairy engineers. Cow



pure milk is manufactured from white Butter /Curd. The quantum of cow milk is put on mild flame for specific span of time until it got melted for pure ghee. It is widely claimed that cow milk is sacred substance, often used in religious rituals besides Ayurvedic treatments. Cow ghee must be used before 9 months from manufacturing



date. Milk fat is inherently expensive. Its current ex dairy price of Rs 460.-- 470 / is way above Rs 125 -- 130 , wholesale range for refined palmolein ,soyabeen or sunflower oil. Yet, it is not incredible that if the ghee or melted milk fat is prone to adulteration by foreign. fats ,both of vegetable and animal fats.

Librate bedevilled terms to shoot economies

Neither PM Modi nor President Xi is in a position at home to sell a new map of their country to their own people. Till dawn breaks on that day, peace and tranquillity have to be maintained. The 2020 incursion across the LAC by the Chinese People's Liberation Army was the consequence of short-sightedness and hubris on the part of President Xi. It may also have been prompted by excessive posturing by PM Modi during the three summit meetings he held with the Chinese leader between 2014-19. Optimistically, both have learnt their lessons. The meeting in Kazan suggests that there has been a greater injection of realism into the assessment both leaders have made about each other's country. The two leaders have affirmed their commitment to stable, predictable and amicable relations and hope they would contribute to the building of a "multipolar Asia and a multipolar world". They emphasised the need for a long-term and strategic perspective to the relationship, with a focus on development. The world has changed dramatically in the five years since Modi and Xi met at Mahabalipuram. India would want a return to the relative stability of the pre-Xi era, but the clock cannot be fully turned back. The power equation that defined the famous Rajiv Gandhi-Deng Xiaoping understanding, and even the dialogue during PM Manmohan Singh's tenure, on the management of the border issue, has been disrupted by China's meteoric rise over the past two decades. Xi has sought to impress this on India and the world.

Indian political and strategic leadership has resisted coming to terms with this altered power equation and tried aligning with the United States in order to exert pressure on China. However, such Western support comes at a price that the Modi government seems not prepared to pay. Rather than risk an anti-China alliance, Modi has opted to improve relations with China and Russia while retaining a strong bond with the US and Europe. This is what multi-alignment is all about, in practice. One form in which some sort of normalcy in the relationship can be projected would be to allow Chinese investment in India. China is a capital-surplus economy that is slowing down. India is a growing economy that needs a massive injection of capital, especially in manufacturing. Increased Chinese investment could also help rectify in part the trade imbalance that favours China. Earlier this year, in the Government of India's annual Economic Survey, published by the Ministry of Finance, an important question was posed about the nature of economic interaction India should have with China, given the global and regional geopolitical and geo-economic context. "Will 'China plus one' result in a total movement of trading relations away from China," the Survey asked. "This may not be the case. Take, for example, nations like Mexico, Vietnam, Taiwan and Korea, which were direct beneficiaries of the US trade diversion from China. Even while these nations increased their share of exports to the US, they also displayed a concomitant rise in

Chinese FDI. Therefore, the world cannot completely look past China, even as it pursues 'China plus one'." At a time when many developed economies are trying to 'derisk' from China, reduce their economic dependence on China and adopt new 'China plus one' strategies, what opportunities exist for India, the Survey asked. It correctly noted that most economies around the world were not decoupling from China but merely derisking. It is this assessment that defined the Survey's further thinking. Is it possible to plug India into the global supply chain without plugging itself into the China supply chain, the Survey asked. What is the right balance between importing goods and importing capital from China? The Survey then suggested that "to boost Indian manufacturing and plug India into the global supply chain, it is inevitable that India plugs itself into China's supply chain. Whether we do so by relying solely on imports or partially through Chinese investments is a choice that India has to make." "Choosing foreign direct investment as a strategy to benefit from the 'China plus one' approach appears more advantageous than relying on trade. This is because China is India's top import partner, and the trade deficit with China has been growing. As the US and Europe shift their immediate sourcing away from China, it is more effective to have Chinese companies invest in India and then export the products to these markets rather than importing from China, adding minimal value, and then re-exporting them."

No violation of Pollution Act proved, court acquits unit owner

CHANDIGARH : The CPCC in the complaint filed before the court said that Ashok Kumar, proprietor, M/s Electrical Control and Switch Gears, had been running a manufacturing unit of electrical panels at Makhn Majra village, UT, without getting the consent of a competent authority. The Chief Judicial Magistrate, Chandigarh, has acquitted an industry owner in a complaint registered for violation of the pollution norms after the Chandigarh Pollution Control Committee (CPCC) has failed to prove the charges. It further said the accused did not obtain prior consent of the CPCC to operate the unit in terms of Section 21 of the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, and Section 25 and 26 of Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974. It said the accused had



applied for consent to operate vide application dated February 1, 2016, wherein, it was admitted that he was running the said unit w.e.f. March, 2015. After hearing the arguments the court said that the complaint had been filed only on the basis of an application moved by the accused seeking permission to establish and operate the unit. It said there was nothing on record to prove that the accused had actually established the unit and it also remained unproven that any visit was conducted on the premises of the accused by the complainant. As such, the complaint was liable to be dismissed and the accused acquitted, it added.

Voter list revision in Mohali from October 29

CHB cancels allotment of 20 small flats over pending dues

CHANDIGARH : Action would be taken against the allottees of the remaining small flats scheme who had not paid licence fee and other dues. Chandigarh Housing Board (CHB) has cancelled the allotment of more 20 small flats over non-payment of licence fee. Earlier, the allotment of 20 such flats located in Sectors 49 and 56 was cancelled. Another cancellation has been incurred on the allotment of six small flats in Sector 49, three in the Industrial Area, seven in Ram Darbar and four such flats in Sector 38 (West) over dues to the tune of more than Rs 42

lakh. The allottees have been asked to hand over the possession of their respective flats in 30 days failing which the board would start the process of vacating the houses. The allotment was cancelled as neither the allottees cleared the fee dues nor did they respond to repeated show-cause notices. The flats were allotted under the Small Flats Scheme, for which the necessary licence fee has to be paid every month. Recently, the audit report had highlighted that the CHB had failed to recover licence fee/rent of Rs 44.26 crore from 13,464 defaulters.

Panjab University researchers develop tech to bleach fabric without chemicals

CHANDIGARH : Innovative method for textile industry, especially for fabric bleaching. Continuing its efforts in research to achieve better results at developing environment-friendly technologies, Panjab University has come up with a unique The breakthrough invention offers an alternative to the traditional denim bleaching process, known as stone washing. A patent, titled "A Process for Bleaching of Fabric Using Laccase" (Grant No. 552415), has been awarded to Panjab University. Prof Naveen Gupta, Prof Prince Sharma from Department of Microbiology and Prof Rajat Sandhir from the Department of Biochemistry, led the research, which was a part of



Dr Sonica Sondhi's Ph.D work. Research scholars Sunena Jassal, Anupama Sharma, Dr Deepak Kumar, Dr Aditya Kumar and Rahul Wormoota have also been credited as inventors of the environment-friendly technology. According to the researchers, textile manufacturing employs numerous processes to create fabric for various applications, with bleaching being the crucial step, which removes natural colour, impurities and other undesired characteristics to improve fabric quality.

For cotton, an oxidative bleaching agent such as dilute sodium hypochlorite or hydrogen peroxide is often used. However, these chemicals require substantial amount of water for processing, leading to pollution and environmental concerns. The newly developed biobleaching process uses enzymes — isolated from an environment-friendly bacterium — that can bleach fabric without the use of chemicals. To improve cost efficiency, enzyme production has been optimised and unlike prior methods, the process does not require enzymatic mediators, making it economical for large-scale industrial use. Research is ongoing to allow multiple cycles of enzyme use, further enhancing cost efficiency.

Mohali CCTV surveillance project gets new deadline

MOHALI : The September-end deadline for the installation of CCTV cameras under the City Surveillance and Traffic Management System project has now been reset to mid-November following certain delays at the end of GMADA in executing the project. The Punjab Police Housing Corporation had planned to install over 400 CCTV cameras in the city at the cost of Rs 17.70 crore. The project is aimed at curbing traffic violations, hooliganism and illegal activities by monitoring 18 busy junctions in the city with CCTV cameras. Besides, two speed detectors will be installed on the Airport Road. Reviewing the progress of work during a meeting of the



District Road Safety Committee, Deputy Commissioner Aashika Jain asked the project officials to speed up the project. She was apprised that 80% of the project had been completed. She asked the project incharge to integrate the project with the VAHAN app so that challans could be automatically issued to the offenders. The DC directed various agencies responsible for fixing the black spots, including the National Highway Authority of India, GMADA, the Municipal Corporation, the PWD and the Zirakpur civic body, to

complete the work by November 12 to ensure the safety of commuters. She also asked NHAI officials to immediately repair the non-functional lights at Zirakpur and install new ones at Dairi (Banur) T-point. The DC directed Mohali MC officials to make all defunct traffic light signals functional, especially the ones on the Phase 9/10 and 10/11 roads and the Fortis light point. Jain also directed GMADA officials to expedite the construction of eight roundabouts in the city. It was informed during the meeting that a non-official member of the committee, Harpreet Singh, has started an audit of the schools having entry gates facing towards roads to take appropriate steps for the safety of students.

New DC office building in Sector 17 to cost Chandigarh Rs 125 cr

CHANDIGARH : "The construction of the building housing Deputy Commissioner will begin in the next financial year once the budget Rs 125 crore is approved by the centre. The interior layouts have also been finalised," disclosed the authorities. The UT Engineering Department has prepared a detailed estimate of Rs 125 crore for the construction of a new building of the Deputy Commissioner (DC) office next to Hotel Shivalikview in Sector 17 here. The construction was initially scheduled to begin in April this year, but got postponed as budget was not allocated for the project. However, sources said the estimate was now prepared and sent to the Government of India for approval. In addition, the complex will incorporate environmental sustainability measures with a sewage treatment plant and a rooftop solar power plant to generate tertiary treated water and electricity.



The existing DC Office building in Sector 17 will be repurposed into a modern art gallery. An amphitheatre is also proposed to be constructed in front of it, adding cultural value to the area. The idea of relocating the DC office within Sector 17 has been under consideration since 2018. The officials said the soil testing report had cleared the proposed site, ensuring it could withstand the structural load. It was conducted to assess the chemical and physical composition of the soil, factoring in weather conditions, climate changes, and historical land usage. The project is expected to be completed within two years. The seven-storey building

will conform to a 5-star GRIHA (Green Rating for Integrated Habitat Assessment) rating, with a focus on reducing carbon emissions. The structure will have a basement parking facility for nearly 600 cars. The building will house several key departments, including Registering and Licensing Authority, Registrar Co-operative Societies, Excise and Taxation Department, Census Department, Election Department, Revenue Department, Tehsildar's Office, Food and Supplies Department, Labour Department, Industries Department, Colony Rehabilitation Wing, Building Branch, and Red Cross Society.

Positive development in India-China ties: Denis Alipov

NEW DELHI : "BRICS is not anti-West but non-West," said Denis Alipov, Russian envoy to India during an interaction with reporters Denis Alipov on Monday termed the meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping on the sidelines of the BRICS Summit in Kazan as a positive development in bilateral ties between India and China.

Asked about the recent meeting between Modi and Xi, and if Russia had any role in it, Alipov said, "We have not played any role in it, but we are happy that it took place in Kazan... We wholeheartedly welcome the meeting." On October 23,



Prime Minister Modi and the Chinese president had endorsed the agreement on patrolling and disengagement along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in eastern Ladakh during their bilateral meeting on the sidelines of the BRICS Summit. They had also issued direction to revive various bilateral dialogue mechanisms, signalling attempts to normalise ties that were hit by a deadly military clash in 2020. In the nearly 50-minute meeting held on the sidelines of the summit in Kazan, Modi

underscored the importance of properly handling differences and disputes and not allowing them to disturb peace and tranquility in the border areas. He reiterated that mutual trust, mutual respect and mutual sensitivity should remain the bases of the relations. In their first structured talks in nearly five years, Modi and Xi also instructed the revival of the stalled Special Representatives' dialogue mechanism on the boundary question at an early date, holding that it can play a critical role in the maintenance of peace and tranquillity along the frontier. Following the talks, Modi had said in a post on X, "India-China relations are important for the people of our countries, and for regional and global peace and stability. Mutual trust, mutual respect and mutual sensitivity will guide bilateral relations."

North Korea sent troops to help Russia in Ukraine war: NATO confirms

BRUSSELS : North Korean troops have been sent to Russia, and that North Korean military units have been deployed to the Kursk region," NATO Secretary-General Mark Rutte told reporters. NATO on Monday confirmed that North Korean troops have been sent to Russia to aid in its war against Ukraine and that some have already been deployed in Russia's Kursk region, where Russia is fighting a Ukrainian

incursion. Rutte said that the move represents "a significant escalation" in North Korea's involvement in the conflict and marks "a dangerous expansion of Russia's war." His remarks came after a high-level South Korean delegation including top intelligence and military officials as well as senior diplomats briefed the alliance's 32 national ambassadors at NATO headquarters in Brussels. 'Bihar MP threatened by Bishnoi gang' writes to Amit Shah

PATNA : Maverick Bihar MP Rajesh Ranjan alias Pappu Yadav has shot off a letter to Union Home Minister Amit Shah, seeking enhanced security in view of a "threatening call from the Lawrence Bishnoi gang". Pappu Yadav Purnea MP shared with the media his two-page letter to Shah, copies of which have been marked to the Chief Minister of Bihar and other top officials in the state. The letter, dated October 21, was made public on Monday when a section of the media also played an audio clip of the call from a purported aide of Bishnoi "made from a Dubai number". Besides seeking upgradation of his 'Y' security cover to



'Z', Yadav also demanded "police escort" at all functions he attends across Bihar, warning "if I get murdered, the blame shall fall upon the Centre as well as the state government". Meanwhile, Purnea SP Kartikeya Sharma said, "We have come to know about the MP's charge through the media. We are looking into it, and also ensuring that arrangements are made for his safety in accordance with

his 'Y plus' security cover". Yadav, a gangster-turned-politician, claimed that the caller was upset over his social media outbursts against Bishnoi, who is lodged in a Gujarat jail. After the assassination of NCP leader Baba Siddiqui in Mumbai, Yadav had declared on X that "if permitted by law", he would "finish off within 24 hours the entire network" of Bishnoi, who is alleged to have been behind the killing. A few days later, he twisted the knife by expressing solidarity with Bollywood actor Salman Khan, who is in the cross hairs of Bishnoi over killing of blackbucks, which are held sacred by the community to which the jailed gangster belongs.

Amritsar NGO demands enforcement of MC bylaws for cleanliness in cities

AMRITSAR : The Amritsar Vikas Manch, along with its office bearers including Manmohan Singh Brar, Principal Kulwant Singh Ankhil, Dr Charanjit Singh Guntala, president Harjap Singh Aujla and general secretary Surinderjit Singh Bittu stated that the Punjab Municipal (Sanitation and Public Health) Bylaws 2003 was enacted by the state government in 2003 on the lines of Singapore to ensure the cleanliness of cities. Social activists have demanded the strict implementation of Punjab Municipal (Sanitation and Public Health) Bylaws 2003 to make all villages and cities of Punjab, including Amritsar, free of pollution. Apart from this, garbage cannot be dumped, nor can anyone dump debris and other dirt on roads, parks and streets. It is prohibited to



wash cars on the roads and axe trees. Even during the cleaning of houses, water can't be used to wash floors as it is prohibited under this law. Several other instructions and guidelines under the Act have not been implemented by the Punjab government even after 21 years. Office-bearers of Amritsar Vikas Manch stated that this law applies to all types of municipal bodies, including villages. Just as challans are issued for traffic rule violations, challans should be issued to those who

violate these municipal bylaws, only then will there be improvement in cleanliness, the activists said. According to this law, a fine of up to Rs 1,000 can be imposed. The Chandigarh Municipal Corporation is issuing challans to those who dump plastic and garbage in the streets, footpaths, parks and create pollution. "The sanitary inspectors have been given body cameras which can make eight hours of video of the respective places. The Punjab government should also provide such body cameras to the sanitary inspectors. Our politicians and officers live in Chandigarh or often come and go to Chandigarh, they should also pay attention to this aspect so that our cities and villages can become clean and tidy," said Charanjit Singh Guntala, patron of AVM.

Bandicoot 'Robots' to clean manholes in Panipat

PANIPAT : 'Bandicoot', specifically designed by Genrobotic for sewer tank and manhole cleaning, is equipped with advanced features that enable it to navigate and clean sewer lines efficiently. Manholes in the industrial area will now be cleaned with the help of 'Bandicoot', robots. The Haryana Sheshri Vikas Pradhikaran (HSVP) made the robot operational in Sector 29 part-I here. Harpal Dhanda, elder brother of the minister Mahipal Dhanda attended the ceremony. Dhanda also inaugurated two deep tubewells. The introduction of the robot would help end manual scavenging, which poses severe health risks to sanitation workers.

The robot's design encompasses high-definition cameras, robust arms for debris removal and high-tech sensors for navigation, said Gauri Shankar, regional manager, Genrobotic. He said the robot could bear a weight of around 125 kg of garbage and silt. Shree Bhagwan Aggarwal, president, Industrial Estate Association Sector 29 part-I, took up several demands with the minister's brother, including the widening of the main road from NH-44 to Flora Chowk. One side of the road was constructed five years ago but the other side still awaits overhauling. Aggarwal brought up the problem of streetlights, and stormwater drain among others with Dhanda.

GMDA draws infra roadmap for Gurugram 2041

GURUGRAM : The augmentation plan of roads in the metropolitan town has been approved by CM Manohar Lal Khattar. Based on a projection that the city's population is likely to swell to 55 lakh by 2041, the plan put together by the School of Planning and Architecture in New Delhi draws a comprehensive infrastructure augmentation roadmap. Gurugram will be transformed into the city of future by 2041, according to the first ever Social Infrastructure Development Plan prepared by the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA). This roadmap shall help authority in deciding, approving and executing its projects and planning budgets. "The authority's sole purpose is the transformation of Gurugram into millennium city and achieve the target in next two decades. This can be called the blue print of the vision, which will systematically direct the development of the city," said CEO PC Meena. The plan focuses on a roadmap for authorities to follow in five areas education, healthcare, public safety,



recreation and socio-cultural facilities. The plan underlines the need for more schools, daycare centres in residential clusters, multi-purpose campuses of institutes, government healthcare facilities within three kilometres, parks in colonies, police posts and old-age homes. In the education sector, the assessment concluded that the five existing universities and another eight nursing and paramedical training institutes would meet the needs of the residents at the district level by 2041. But the city would need another 750 nursery schools, 430 more primary schools, and 686 secondary and senior secondary schools over the next two decades. Currently, there are 545 nursery schools, 279 primary schools, and 412 secondary and senior secondary schools in the city. On the health front, the city would need two more general hospitals, a civil hospital and

six veterinary hospitals. It currently has two government-run civil hospitals and five veterinary hospitals. About 210 speciality hospitals, diagnostic centres would be needed by 2041, 250 dispensaries and clinics, 25 nursing homes and maternity centres too. On public safety, the plan noted that there are 25 police posts in sectors, which need at least nine more, especially in Old Gurgaon and the new sectors that are now lined with housing societies. For recreation the plan seeks four district parks, 26 community parks and 747 neighbourhood parks in addition to sports complexes and a stadium. On socio-cultural activities, the key takeaway was the need for cultural centres, old-age homes (22), orphanages (16), night shelters (5), hostels for working people (3), and cremation and burial grounds (24) over the next 18 years.


