In Rio de Janeiro (Brazil), beside Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Chinese President Xi Jinping and his US counterpart Joe Biden participated in G 20 summit. Sanyukt Kissan Morcha to march for Delhi on Dec 6

It is over 9 months gone, now still waiting for their unfulfilled demand. The farmers brethren are contemplating over another push to move for sympathy of Central power in Delhi. The augmentation in the ongoing campaign reaches here after the confrontation with the Haryana police. The Feb 21 encounter had emerged caustic and tragic when young Subhakaran Singh died on the Khanauri border of the Punjab and Haryana border sustaining several farmers injuries in the clashes. Farmer unionist Jagjit Singh Dallewal declared on Monday his plan to go on a hunger strike on Nov 26, fourth anniversary of



the Delhi Chalo movement against the now-repealed three agrimarketing laws. Alongside fellow farmer unionist Sarvan Singh Pandher, he vowed to push forward despite anticipated roadblocks, including concrete barriers that Haryana Police have raised at the interstate Shambhu and Khanauri borders. "We will move forward on foot if needed," Dallewal said, reiterating their call for a designated protest space in

capital. Tejveer Singh of the Bharatiya Kisan Union (Shaheed Bhagat Singh) said they had been camping at the two border points for 280 days now without any talks with the Centre since Feb 18 when they had rejected the Centre's offer placed through Piyush Goyal, Nityanand Rai and Arjun Munda, of buying pulses, maize and cotton crops for the MSP for five years.

Doctor neglects patient's diagnosis, son stabs him 7 times

Chennai : Mother patient defended son who stabbed Chennai doctor Dr Balaji of oncology department multiple times in his consultation room. The accused's mother further claimed she had been misinformed about her own diagnosis, insisting she was told she had Stage 2 cancer rather than the Stage 5 cancer diagnosis reportedly circulating in Kalaignar Centenary Super Speciality hospital. Vignesh's mother says her son attacked doctor over alleged neglect. Claims her son is a heart patient, suffers from epilepsy. Says she was misinformed by the doctor about her diagnosis. A day after a doctor at the Kalaignar Centenary Super Speciality Hospital in Chennai was stabbed seven times by the son of a former patient, the accused's mother spoke in defence of her



son. The woman, who is a cancer patient, claimed that her son Vignesh had attacked the doctor because she was not given proper medical treatment. She alleged that the doctor's neglect provoked the attack. Dr. Balaji, who was severely wounded in the attack, is currently undergoing treatment. The incident sparked a political uproar in the state, with Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin ordering a thorough probe. The accused allegedly attacked Dr. Balaji out of

frustration over what he perceived as improper treatment of his mother, who was previously under the doctor's care. "Dr. Balaji didn't even look at me during the consultation," she alleged, adding, "My son has too much love for me. He is also a heart patient and suffers from epilepsy. He acted because he thought I wasn't being treated properly." The attack triggered protests by doctors and paramedics at the hospital and other medical facilities.

Droupadi Murmu nominates Justice Gaval as Executive Chairman NALSA

Chandigarh: Another Justice Bhusan Ramkrishna Goyal of Supreme Court has been nominated by the President as Executive Chairman of National Legal Services Authority (NALSA).

The nomination has been announced by the President of India and is effective from Nov 11, 2024. A notification to that effect was published by the ministry of law and justice, Government of India, in the official gazette on Nov 8, 2024.

Justice Sanjiv Khanna, Hon'ble the Chief Justice of India was the previous Executive Chairman of NALSA. As per convention, the post is occupied by the second seniormost judge of the Supreme Court of India.



Prior to his nomination as the NALSA executive chairman Justice Gaval was the chairman of the Supreme Court Legal Services Committee (SCLSC). As the executive chairman, Justice Gaval will lead NALSA's mission to provide accessible and free legal aid to all citizens, particularly those from marginalized and economically weaker sections of society pan India.

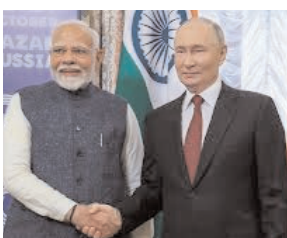

NEW DELHI: Russian President Vladimir Putin is set to visit India in the near future, announced Kremlin press secretary Dmitry Peskov on Tuesday.

So we were only the organisers of that summit... Of course, being friends of New Delhi and Beijing, we are ready to contribute in every possible way to normalising relations between our two friends."

ICC asks PCB to cancel Champions Trophy tour in PoK

NEW DELHI: In a significant setback to the Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB), the International Cricket Council (ICC) has cancelled the Champions Trophy trophy tour in the cities of Skardu, Hunza, and Muzaffarabad, located in the region of Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK). It is presumable the ICC is yet to formalise the plan for the trophy tour but PCB seemed to have jumped the gun by announcing the schedule. Reacting to the development, BCCI secretary Jay Shah has raised strong



objection with the ICC on PCB's plans to promote the Champions Trophy in the country. "Jay Shah has objected to that tweet, criticised and condemned PCB's plan to take the trophy to PoK cities. Additionally, PCB has no business sharing the

schedule because it has to come from the ICC. Things need to be done appropriately, via appropriate channels. The PCB announced on Thursday the schedule for the ICC Champions Trophy 2025 trophy tour, which was initially set to commence on November 16 in Islamabad. "Get ready, Pakistan! The ICC Champions Trophy 2025 trophy tour kicks off in Islamabad on 16 November, also visiting scenic travel destinations like Skardu, Murree, Hunza and Muzaffarabad.

Global warming, health, climate policies must undergo change

The World Meteorological Organisation, in its annual assessment, reports that 2024 is well on its way to become the warmest year on record, with the global average temperature between January and September hovering around 1.54°C above pre-industrial levels. It is a dire warning because the rise is above the threshold of 1.5°C that scientists had fixed and the world community had agreed to achieve through emission reduction. The Paris Agreement envisaged the long-term global average surface temperature increase below 2°C compared to pre-industrial levels and pursue efforts to limit the warming to 1.5°C. While the warming this year may be due to the La Nina phase, there is no getting away from the fact that there is a continued rise in the carbon dioxide concentration in the atmosphere that causes temperatures to rise. Besides catastrophic consequences like extreme rainfall and flooding, intense tropical cyclones, deadly heat, droughts and wildfires, the temperature rise is causing deeper impacts. As United Nations Secretary-General António Guterres has articulated, the climate catastrophe is “hammering health, widening inequalities, harming sustainable development and rocking the foundations of peace”. This is the real danger facing the world, irrespective of the outcome of climate talks on finance, adaptation and mitigation. The health impacts of climate change are wide-ranging. In its recent report, The Lancet Countdown on health and climate change pointed out that “people in every country now face threats to their health and survival as climate hazards increase”.

Among the major health impacts are those related to increasing exposure to heat. In 2023, people were exposed, on average, to 50 more days of health-threatening heat than expected without climate change. This resulted in 167 per cent more annual deaths of adults older than 65 years than in the 1990s. The survey found that 31 countries experienced at least 100 more days of health-threatening heat than would have been expected with no climate change. Heat exposure is adversely affecting physical activity and sleep quality, in turn affecting physical and mental health. Workers who work outdoors or in non-cooled indoor environments face health risks and their productivity is affected. This is a huge loss because an estimated 1.6 billion people or 25.9 per cent of the working-age population work outdoors globally. This includes agricultural workers, people working on construction and infrastructure projects as well as those engaged in the informal sector. Climate change on health is the increasing risk of water-borne, vector-borne, food-borne and air-borne disease transmission. Increased heat, extreme rainfall and droughts, along with changes in land use and human movement, are adding to this risk. For example, the world is witnessing more cases of dengue. In the past 20 years, the global burden of dengue has risen rapidly due to more suitable climatic conditions (for vectors) and rising human mobility and urbanisation. In 2023, some five million cases of dengue were reported globally, driven by the changing distribution of mosquito vectors like Aedes aegypti. We can’t wait indefinitely for political

leaders and policymakers to come to a consensus on taking decisive steps to cut greenhouse emissions and slow down climate change. The annual climate change talks have been reduced to efforts to safeguard national and regional economic interests and devise ways to delay action rather than expedite it. Therefore, the way out is to develop climate-resilient health systems and adapt. This, too, is a challenging task. For instance, increasing the adaption of air-conditioning is not a sustainable solution to rising heat stress. It is expensive, energy-intensive and contributes to emissions. In urban areas, greater use of air-conditioners in commercial and residential buildings contributes to the ‘heat island’ effect. Therefore, we need air-conditioning powered by renewable energy as well as innovative low-energy cooling technologies. For challenges like dengue, we need to implement interventions to reduce vulnerability, integrated vector control measures and greater response capacity within health systems. In addition, the health sector will also have to cut its emissions — currently, the global healthcare sector accounts for 5 per cent of the greenhouse emissions. The World Health Organisation (WHO), in a report released ahead of COP29, has pointed out that focusing on cities is necessary to mitigate climate change impacts on health. Urban policies directly influence public health through their effects on air quality, transport, energy use, urban design, green spaces, housing and food access. The delay in the transition to low-carbon and clean energy systems, therefore, will harm human health in significant ways.

No land for Haryana Assembly in Chandigarh yet allotted

CHANDIGARH : “No land has been allotted yet. Their (Haryana’s) proposal is pending for a long time. But nothing can be said until a decision is made in this matter,” Kataria said while responding to a query on the sidelines of an event here. Amid strong protests by different political outfits against the Centre over land allotment to Haryana government for constructing a new Assembly building in Chandigarh, Punjab Governor Gulab Chand Kataria on Sunday said that no land has been allocated for the purpose yet. The statement of Kataria, who is also the administrator of Chandigarh, assumes significance after Punjab’s ruling Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and the opposition outfits took umbrage over the Centre’s reported move to clear the allotment of 10 acres of land in Chandigarh to Haryana for the construction of its Assembly building. The Union Ministry of



Environment, Forest and Climate Change has reportedly granted environmental clearance for the land offered by the Haryana government to the Chandigarh administration in exchange for the land to build its second Assembly building here. The Haryana government offered 12 acres of land in Panchkula in exchange for 10 acres of land near IT Park Road in Chandigarh. Punjab and Haryana’s separate Assembly premises are at present located in the common building complex next to the Punjab and Haryana Civil Secretariat in Chandigarh, which is the joint capital of the two states.

45 acres land orchestrated by Punjab for Metro depot in New Chandigarh

MOHALI : Forest Department, the Punjab Government has now confirmed that the land was ready to be released, pending final approval of the Chief Minister. In a boost to the long-awaited Tricity Metro project, the Punjab Government has finally agreed to allocate 45 acres (18 hectares) in New Chandigarh for the construction of a Metro depot. The depot will be crucial for inspection and maintenance works related to the upcoming Metro lines. The issue of land allotment for the depot had been a persistent hurdle in the project’s progress. The UT Administration had sent multiple reminders to the Punjab Government, urging them to clarify their stance on the matter. A senior official said it had been decided to release 45 acres in New Chandigarh for the construction of the depot. The file has been sent to the Chief Minister for final approval, which is expected within a week. Once approved, the land will be handed over to the UT Administration, he



added. The matter was a key agenda item during the Unified Metro Transportation Authority (UMTA) meeting held on September 2. While this marks a positive step for the New Chandigarh depot, the Punjab Government has declined to provide land for another proposed depot in Zirakpur. In its place, an alternative depot will now be constructed in Sector 27, Panchkula, with approval already secured from the Haryana Government. The depot allotments are part of the larger Metro development plan for the Tricity, which will see construction beginning in 2027 as part of the first phase, with completion expected by 2034. Phase 2 of the project will commence post-2037, further expanding the city’s metro connectivity.

Chandigarh to have its Rooftop solar panels on all govt houses by December

CHANDIGARH : TC Nautiyal, Secretary, Science & Technology and Renewable Energy, chaired a review meeting with Chandigarh Renewable Energy and Science & Technology Promotion Society (CREST) to assess the progress of key initiatives, including rooftop solar power plant installations, EV charging infrastructure, and citizen compliance with renewable energy mandates. Contributing to the city’s green energy goals, the UT Administration has planned to achieve 80 MWP of rooftop solar capacity by the end of 2024. “Chandigarh has achieved 69 MWP of installed rooftop solar power plant capacity. Officials reaffirmed that the targets set by the Centre for full rooftop



solar saturation at government buildings in the city were to be achieved by December this year and in the private sector by December next year” said Navneet Kumar Srivastava, Director, Science & Technology and Renewable Energy-cum-CEO, CREST. In terms of sustainable transport, it was informed that 20 EV charging stations are already energised and fully operational across Chandigarh. An additional four to five charging stations will be energised by the next

week, significantly enhancing the city’s electric vehicle infrastructure. The city’s leadership in electric vehicle adoption, which is 14.8% from April to October 2024, the highest among all states and UTs, was also highlighted during the meeting. Concerns related to delay in meter installations, solar user charges being levied on occupants of government houses and rectification of solar projects where theft had occurred previously were also discussed.

Rs 25 lakh penalty levied on Olive Greens for injuring 23 yrs girl during training

CHANDIGARH : Ms Anchal Jain was taken to the training field for physical tasks where she was instructed to jump from a platform. Before jumping, she requested the instructor that the height of board is quite high and she has no basic training of jumping from such height, but to no avail. After jumping from the platform, she suffered serious injuries on her right ankle and was taken to Government Hospital, Sector 16, Chandigarh, where steel plates and nails were inserted in her fractured ankle. The State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission, Chandigarh, has directed M/S Olive Greens Institute, Mani Majra, Chandigarh, to pay Rs 25 lakh as compensation to a 23-year-old girl who suffered injuries during training allegedly due to improper safety measures and insufficient training protocols at the institute. The commission passed the order in an appeal filed by Anchal Jain of New Chandigarh through advocate, Ranjit Jain. The appellant had sought modification of the order dated



February 14, 2024, passed by the District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission-I, Chandigarh, whereby the institute was directed to refund Rs 13,500 and pay Rs 60,000 to the complainant as compensation for causing mental agony and physical harassment to her. The appellant claimed that she had qualified for an interview for Combined Defence Services (CDS) 2018. In order to prepare herself well for physical test, she joined the institute as a trainee candidate on September 21, 2018, on making payment of Rs 13,500. Refuting the allegations, the counsel of the institute claimed that she was not forced to climb up or jump down by anyone. The ground was prepared, the earth was loosened and mattresses were also put in place. She was also given a bruise tablet with her consent to prevent any pain. After hearing of the arguments the commission observed that

the loss of this opportunity, coupled with the pain and suffering endured, warrants fair and adequate compensation. Apart from it, the parents of the appellant also have suffered emotional distress due to the nature and severity of their daughter’s injuries and have experienced significant emotional suffering. In view of this, the compensation to the tune of Rs 50,000 awarded by the District Commission is on the lower side. The institute is directed to pay Rs 5 lakh as compensation on account of emotional distress, including anxiety and Rs 20 lakh, as compensation for her physical injuries, medical expenses and loss of future career prospects. The commission has also directed the institute to reimburse to the appellant and complainant all medical expenses incurred by her due to the injury, including future medical treatment if necessary, and to pay Rs 50,000 as cost of litigation to the institute is further directed to refund Rs 13,500 paid by her as fee towards the training, along with interest @9% per annum.

Mohali CCTV surveillance project gets new deadline

MOHALI : The September-end deadline for the installation of CCTV cameras under the City Surveillance and Traffic Management System project has now been reset to mid-November following certain delays at the end of GMADA in executing the project. The Punjab Police Housing Corporation had planned to install over 400 CCTV cameras in the city at the cost of Rs 17.70 crore. The project is aimed at curbing traffic violations, hooliganism and illegal activities by monitoring 18 busy junctions in the city with CCTV cameras. Besides, two speed detectors will be installed on the Airport Road. Reviewing the progress of work during a meeting of the



District Road Safety Committee, Deputy Commissioner Aashika Jain asked the project officials to speed up the project. She was apprised that 80% of the project had been completed. She asked the project incharge to integrate the project with the VAHAN app so that challans could be automatically issued to the offenders. The DC directed various agencies responsible for fixing the black spots, including the National Highway Authority of India, GMADA, the Municipal Corporation, the PWD and the Zirakpur civic body, to

complete the work by November 12 to ensure the safety of commuters. She also asked NHAI officials to immediately repair the non-functional lights at Zirakpur and install new ones at Dairi (Banur) T-point. The DC directed Mohali MC officials to make all defunct traffic light signals functional, especially the ones on the Phase 9/10 and 10/11 roads and the Fortis light point. Jain also directed GMADA officials to expedite the construction of eight roundabouts in the city. It was informed during the meeting that a non-official member of the committee, Harpreet Singh, has started an audit of the schools having entry gates facing towards roads to take appropriate steps for the safety of students.

Challenges, priorities of Global South draw main attention

NEW DELHI : On women empowerment, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said, 300 million women micro entrepreneurs had been linked to banks and given access to credit. Earlier, President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva of Brazil received the heads of government, including PM Modi, for the two-day (November 18-19) meet. For G20, the priority agenda is focused on three fundamental pillars - combating hunger and poverty, sustainable development and reforming global governance. Modi on Monday wanted "the Global Alliance against Hunger and Poverty", launched, to focus on challenges and priorities of the Global South. Modi was speaking during a session of the G20 Summit on "Social Inclusion and the Fight against Hunger and Poverty". "Countries of the Global South are adversely affected by the food, fuel and fertiliser crisis caused by global conflicts. Our discussions can only be successful when we keep in mind the challenges and priorities of the Global South," said Modi. The PM said people-centric



decisions taken at the G20 Summit in New Delhi have been taken forward during Brazil's Presidency. "We (the Delhi Summit) focused on inclusive development, women-led development and youth power. And gave wings to the hopes and aspirations of the Global South," Modi said. Giving the example of India, Modi said: "Over the past 10 years, we have lifted 250 million people out of poverty. Over 800 million people are being given food grains free of cost. Another 550 million people are benefiting from the world's biggest health insurance scheme". Modi is scheduled to hold multiple bilateral meetings with global leaders. Sources said there were at least five slots earmarked for bilateral meetings in the PM's schedule over two days. Modi's bilateral meetings are expected with his UK counterpart Keir Starmer, Italian PM Giorgia Meloni, French President Emmanuel

Macron and Indonesian President Prabowo Subianto. Modi and US President Joe Biden met briefly today. Modi posted a picture of himself with Biden at the G20 Summit in Rio de Janeiro. Always a delight to meet him." Prime Minister Modi is on the second leg of his three-nation visit to Nigeria, Brazil and Guyana. PM Modi reached the South American country after wrapping up a "productive" visit to Nigeria, where he held bilateral talks with President Bola Ahmed Tinubu. Modi's arrival in Brazil, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said in a post on X. "Prime Minister Narendra Modi lands in the vibrant city of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, to attend the G20 Brazil Summit." It also shared pictures of Modi's welcome at the airport. Announcing his arrival, PM Modi said in a post on his official X handle, "Landed in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, to take part in the G20 Summit. I look forward to the summit deliberations and fruitful talks with various world leaders."

Civil Hospital's ICU on priority to be made operational : Health Minister

LUDHIANA : In September 2023, a team from the Health Department, including Dr Hitinder Kaur, Director of Health Services, and experts from Dayanand Medical College and Hospital (DMCH), reviewed the facility at the hospital, but the ICU remains non-functional due to staffing issues. During Health Minister Dr Balbir Singh's visit to Civil Hospital, he reaffirmed his commitment to making the hospital's ICU operational and launching a neonatal intensive care unit by January 2025. These promises echo similar announcements made in 2023, which have yet to materialise. The ICU, which was set up during the Covid-19 pandemic and equipped with ventilators, was staffed at the time but became non-operational as the situation normalised and the employees were sent back to their place of postings. The ventilators remain unused due to a shortage of trained personnel. The Health Minister also addressed the ongoing investigation into a major medicine scam at Aam Aadmi



Clinics, where bills for medicines worth crores were approved without the actual delivery of the supplies. "The investigation is being conducted by the vigilance bureau and strict action would be taken against those responsible once the report is finalised," he said. The Health Minister reported that 98 per cent of patients at Aam Aadmi Clinics have expressed satisfaction with the services, emphasising the government's ongoing efforts to improve healthcare services. He also promised to resolve the shortage of doctors and specialists at Civil Hospital within 15 days, ensuring that patients no longer need to travel to other cities for treatment. By January 2025, he said, the hospital will be fully upgraded with state-of-the-art facilities, and patient feedback will be continuously sought to address any shortcomings.

Bike taxi service from 12 stations launched by DMRC

NEW DELHI : "A custom-tailored initiative designed to meet the needs and preferences of female Metro commuters is intended to solve the trauma triggered by heavy rush. It would empower women to travel independently at their convenience with safety to their destination. It offers women drivers an opportunity to become breadwinners, allowing them to live with dignity and respect, focusing on easing first and last-mile connectivity for Delhiites," the DMRC said in a statement. Delhi Metro passengers can now book bike taxi rides through the DMRC (Delhi Metro Rail Corporation) Momentum application without juggling between multiple platforms, an official statement said on Monday. The service, which was introduced on Monday, includes two options — SHERYDS for women, by women, and RYDR, available to all commuters, according to the (DMRC). DMRC spokesperson said the service was formally launched by Dr Vikas Kumar, Managing Director, DMRC. The bike taxis will be electric to reduce carbon footprint, it added.

The all-women bike taxi fleet will have trained and verified female riders which can be booked from DMRC's official app along with GPS tracking facility. The minimum charge for a ride will be Rs 10, followed by Rs 10 per km for the first two kms, and thereafter Rs 8 per km. Similarly, RYDR will run parallel with SHERYDS focusing on optimising rider routes and ensuring shorter, more efficient travel times, it added. "Unlike traditional models where drivers may travel long distances, RYDR keeps riders within a specified radius, which ensures both safety and reduced travel time," the statement read. The service was introduced by the DMRC in partnership with the First And Last Mile Connectivity India Pvt Ltd and is currently made available from 12 Metro stations — Dwarka Sector 21, Dwarka Sector 10, Dwarka Sector 14, Dwarka Mor, Janakpuri West, Uttam Nagar East, Rajouri Garden, Subhash Nagar, Kirti Nagar, Karol Bagh, Millennium City Centre Gurugram and Palam. A total of 50 SHERYDS and 150 RYDR will be operating from these stations in a radius of around 3-5 km between 8 am and 9 pm.

Punjab farmers on December 6 to march to Delhi for MSP, other demands

CHANDIGARH : The protesting farmers have been camping at Shambhu and Khanauri border points between Punjab and Haryana since February 13, when their 'Delhi Chalo' march, spearheaded by the SKM (Non-Political) and the KMM, was stopped by security forces. The Samyukta Kisan Morcha (Non-Political) and the Kisan Mazdoor Morcha on Monday announced that farmers will march towards Delhi on December 6 to press the Centre to accept their various demands, including a legal guarantee of MSP for crops. The decision was taken at a meeting of farmer leaders here. Addressing the media here, KMM leader Sarwan Singh Pandher said after a long wait, they have decided to head towards Delhi. Pandher slammed the Centre for not holding any talks with the farmers to discuss their demands.



"We have been left with no option. We waited peacefully for the government (to reach out) for nine months. But now we will head towards Delhi," he added. The farmers will move towards the national capital in batches from the Shambhu border. Tejveer Singh of the Bharatiya Kisan Union (Shaheed Bhagat Singh) said they have been camping at the two border points for 280 days and the Centre has not held any talks with them since February 18. "We will move towards Delhi on December 6," he said. Last week, the farmers announced that they would

intensify their agitation and start a fast unto death from November 26. Farmer leader Jagjit Singh Dallewal will observe the fast.

Besides a legal guarantee of minimum support price (MSP) for crops, the farmers are demanding a farm debt waiver, pension for farmers and farm labourers, no hike in electricity tariff, withdrawal of police cases and "justice" for the victims of the 2021 Lakhimpur Kheri violence, reinstatement of the Land Acquisition Act, 2013, and compensation to the families of the farmers who died during a previous agitation in 2020-21.

Naxalism will be wiped out from country by March 2026: Amit Shah

RANCHI : "The menace of Naxalism from the face of the country will be eradicated by March 2026. Attacking the Hemant Soren-led JMM coalition for "fuelling Naxalism", Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Sunday asserted that the Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led Union government will eliminate. Shah expressed confidence that the NDA would form the government in Jharkhand, claiming it would win at least 52 out of 81 assembly seats based on the calculations from the recently held Lok Sabha elections. "It is time to oust the anti-Dalit, anti-tribal, anti-poor, and anti-youth Hemant



government from Jharkhand, which is fuelling Naxalism for petty political gains," he said while addressing a rally in Simaria, Chatra district. "We uprooted the menace from Jharkhand during the last five years, and now the Prime Minister Modi-led Centre will wipe out Naxalism from India by March 2026." Accusing the Soren government of

devouring funds meant for poor and tribals, he said the BJP once voted to power will put all corrupt Jharkhand leaders behind the bars. "NDA will win 52 seats out of 81 in Jharkhand given people cast 47 per cent votes to the alliance in Jharkhand during the recent Lok Sabha elections," Shah said. He said the people of Jharkhand gave nine out of 14 parliamentary seats to the NDA, with a total of 80 lakh votes cast in favour of the alliance. Elections to the 81-member Assembly in the state are set to take place in two phases on November 13 and 20, with the votes to be counted on November 23.

Amritsar NGO demands enforcement of MC bylaws for cleanliness in cities

AMRITSAR : The Amritsar Vikas Manch, alongwith its office bearers including Manmohan Singh Brar, Principal Kulwant Singh Ankhi, Dr Charanjit Singh Gumtala, president Harjap Singh Aujla and general secretary Surinderjit Singh Bittu stated that the Punjab Municipal (Sanitation and Public Health) Bylaws 2003 was enacted by the state government in 2003 on the lines of Singapore to ensure the cleanliness of cities. Social activists have demanded the strict implementation of Punjab Municipal (Sanitation and Public Health) Bylaws 2003 to make all villages and cities of Punjab, including Amritsar, free of pollution. Apart from this, garbage cannot be dumped, nor can anyone dump debris and other dirt on roads, parks and streets. It is prohibited to



wash cars on the roads and axe trees. Even during the cleaning of houses, water can't be used to wash floors as it is prohibited under this law. Several other instructions and guidelines under the Act have not been implemented by the Punjab government even after 21 years. Office-bearers of Amritsar Vikas Manch stated that this law applies to all types of municipal bodies, including villages. Just as challans are issued for traffic rule violations, challans should be issued to those who

violate these municipal bylaws, only then will there be improvement in cleanliness, the activists said. According to this law, a fine of up to Rs 1,000 can be imposed. The Chandigarh Municipal Corporation is issuing challans to those who dump plastic and garbage in the streets, footpaths, parks and create pollution. "The sanitary inspectors have been given body cameras which can make eight hours of video of the respective places. The Punjab government should also provide such body cameras to the sanitary inspectors. Our politicians and officers live in Chandigarh or often come and go to Chandigarh, they should also pay attention to this aspect so that our cities and villages can become clean and tidy," said Charanjit Singh Gumtala, patron of AVM.



Crossing Canada - US border often becomes perilous

Florida : Snuggling into other country may become perilous and fatal also . An indian family froze to death crossing the Canada-U.S. border, a perilous trip are becoming more common. Two men have been accused of helping illegally smuggle Indian nationals across the U.S.-Canada border and into Minnesota, including four members of an Indian family who froze to death in 2022. On the last night of their lives, Jagdish Patel, his wife and their two young children tried to slip into the U.S. across a near-empty stretch of the Canadian border. Unbearable wind chills reached minus 36 Fahrenheit (minus 38 Celsius) that night in January 2022 as the family from India set out on foot to meet a waiting

van. They walked amid vast farm fields and bulky snowdrifts, navigating in the black of an almost-moonless night. The driver, waiting in northern Minnesota, messaged his boss: "Make sure everyone is dressed for the blizzard conditions, please." Coordinating things in Canada, federal prosecutors say, was Harshkumar Patel, an experienced smuggler nicknamed "Dirty Harry." On the U.S. side was Steve Shand, the driver recently recruited by Mr. Patel at a casino near their Florida homes, prosecutors say. The two men, whose trial is scheduled to start Monday, are accused of being part of a sophisticated human smuggling operation feeding a fast-growing population of Indians living illegally in the U.S. Both have pleaded not guilty.

Adopt diverse electives in pharmaceutical education

companies and research institutions to prioritise innovation. The DCGI reaffirmed India's commitment to global public health. Prof Renu Vig PU vice chancellor emphasised pharmacy as a noble profession at the intersection of science and service, innovation and public welfare. "Each year, I see numerous

startups emerging. For example, in 2016, we saw just one unicorn, but by 2021, that number rose to 40. However, the growth rate in the pharmaceutical sector hasn't matched this pace. This is an area that requires research," said Raghuvanshi, at Panjab University (PU).
