The estate officer, Haryana Shehri Vikas Pradhikaran Panchkula said , plot owners were warned about the deterio- rating condition of their vacant land . It stated , " The vacant plot has become the breeding ground for mosquitos , insects , snakes and other nuisances , which are cre- ating problems for the adjacent residents ." The

presence of congress grass , stagnant water, and over- grown bushes was cited as contributing to poor sanitation and increased health risks . HSVP officials directed plot owners to immediately clear the overgrowth , remove stagnant water , and main maintain cleanli- ness in and around their properties . The notice warned that failure to com- ply would lead to action under HSVP bye - laws , which may include penal- ties or other legal conse- quences .The HSVP urged all plot owners , especially those living outside the city



, to ensure their properties are regularly maintained or appoint someone locally for upkeep . The department also encouraged residents to report any such neglected plots to unable swift action.

Non racial deterrence helps in curbing potential mishaps

Prime Minister Modi had already set the parameters of the new normal in dealing with terror attacks. This was the hasty new normal. Home Minister Amit Shah, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and Foreign Minister S Jaishanker have all endorsed PM Modi's celebration of Op Sindoor. But what outcome is being celebrated ? It would be better if a Strategic Defence Review (SDR) is conducted on new age warefare - the non-contact, beyond-visual-range conflict fought by nuclear armed India and Pakistan for the first time. While the Indian Air Force (IAF) as well as air defence systems have excelled, little is known about what the Army, Navy and paramilitary forces achieved. Strategic Defence Review (SDR) should evaluate clinically the 'outcome'. India's diplomatic delegations travelled across the world, elaborating on terrorism emanating from Pakistan. New Delhi went to great pains to explain that its retribution was only against terrorist hubs, not the Pakistan military, and that the attacks were proportionate, preventive, responsible and non-escalatory. India will require a credible deterrence to prevent a Pahalgam-like terrorist attack as well as a two-front situation. The armed forces are

woefully deficient in equipment to flight a conventional war. To bridge the technology and inventory gaps, private-public partnership will need to perform miracles in catching up with the magnitude of the collusive challenge. The government will have to make available substan-tial funding for defence spending, especially on modernisation. The current allocation - less than 2 per cent of the GDP-should be increased promptly to 2.5 per cent, and to 3 per cent by 2029. If there is a will, ways can be found either by rais-ing the limit on fiscal deficit and/or through, additional tax. While public sentiment will support the additional burden, the ruling party may risk losing votes. The latest warning by the Chief of the Air Staff, Air Chief Marshal AP Singh, about slippages on orders involving time and cost over-runs ought to be taken seriously. Four decades ago, the IAF had arrived at the notional limit of having 45 combat squadrons. The geo-strategic environment has altered phenomenally. Leave alone meeting the elusive target of 45 squadrons, the strength has 45 gone down to 31 squadrons and is stagnating at that level. The government should take an urgent call on fast-tracking the acquisition of 114 fourth-generation fight-ers or sign

another government-equipment-to-government-contract with a Western country to buy off the shelf. Finally, while R&AW's long arm might be over-reaching abroad, intelli-gence lapses have been mounting at home. Galwan and Pahalgam are two colossal failures that have resulted in operational deficiencies of high magni-tude. On the LAC in Ladakh, the Chinese PLA has planted itself along its 1959 elaim line. In Kashmir, despite the revocation of Article 370, alienation among its people has not subsided. A comprehensive security review of Op Sindoor and 11 years of NDA rule should address Kashmir and other issues, along with the outcomes, and review ad hoc decisions taken by the government to lay down the new normal. If India will no longer differentiate between terrorists and their sponsors under the new normal, future the new normal, future military responses will not be bound by restraint and proportionali-ty? Will Delhi then wage a non-contact engagement that could escalate into a hot war? In Op Sindoor, only Chinese hi-tech equipment and ISR (intelligence, surveillance, and reconnais sance) systems deployed, but the round could likely be a lusive hot war.

Administrator approves giving free books till Class XII from next session

CHANDIGARH : The UT Administration has decided to provide free textbooks to all students from Class I to XII of government schools from next academic session. Punjab Governor and UT Administrator Gulab Chand Kataria has given approval to the proposal. Earlier, the benefit was limited up to Class VIII. The initiative is aimed at supporting students from economically weaker sections and reducing the dropout rate in higher classes. At present, around 1.5 lakh students are enrolled in 112 government schools across the city. With the Administration focusing on boosting education infrastructure, many parents have opted to shift their children from private to government schools, particularly in Class XI and XII. "Extending free textbooks till Class XII will ensure that no child is deprived of learning due to financial constraints," said a senior official. This administrative step comes alongside other



measures to boost education in the city such as solar-powered buildings to cut down on school bills and campaigns against drug abuse among schoolchildren. UT Administrator Kataria, who is a former educator, is closely monitoring the ongoing changes in the government schools here. In another significant step, the Administration has decided to prepare government school students for the competitive examinations from next session. Under the proposed initiative, students scoring 85 per cent or above in Class XII will be eligible for free coaching and guidance for the civil services examinations. Recognising that many meritorious students are unable to afford costly coaching after school, the Administration has begun

drafting a plan to ensure that talent is not hindered by financial constraints. Kataria has directed officials to design a framework for this initiative, which will include mentorship, study material and possibly partnerships with reputed institutes providing coaching for the UPSC exams. "This effort is not just about academic support but also opening pathways for the underprivileged youth to dream bigger and achieve leadership roles in society," stated the official. Recently, the UT Administrator felicitated 16 students — children of group B, C and D employees of the Raj Bhawan — for their exemplary performance in the Class X and XII board examinations. The Governor also felicitated aspiring NEET/JEE students who were enrolled in professional courses (post Class XII) and postgraduates preparing for competitive exams and gave them cash awards.

70 yrs aged or more can apply for special Ayushman cards

Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA : The Deputy Commissioner (DC) Monika Gupta, is a joint effort between the Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) and district administration has been over seeing the arrangements for issuing Special Ayushman cards. Senior citizens aged 70 years and above are eligible to apply for special Ayushman cards, which will entitle them to free medical treatment worth up to Rs 5 lakh. So far, more than 70 senior citizens have been issued the cards. All citizens aged 70 and above are eligible to apply for the cards, which are being generated through an Aadhaar-based e-KYC process said Dr Mukta Kumar, Civil Surgeon. Ayushman Mitras have been appointed at block-and district-level government hospitals to assist with the generation of these cards. With these cards, beneficiaries will be able to access cashless treatment at



government as well as empanelled private hospitals. A statement issued by the District Health Department described this initiative as an important step towards providing senior citizens with quality and accessible healthcare services. The Panchkula district administration reaffirms that it is committed to ensuring that no eligible citizen is deprived of this benefit. To apply for the cards, eligible individuals can visit their nearest government hospital, Common Services Centres, or special camp with their Aadhaar card and mobile number to get their card made. Assistance is available from Ayushman Mitras at the centres.

For Rs 1.06 cr heritage items sold in Brussels

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : Five heritage items illegally brought in Brussels, Belgium, were auctioned for Rs 1.06 crore on June 18. These items of Chandigarh taken out of the country in an illegal manner would continue to be auctioned in foreign countries. Ajay Jagga, a member of the Heritage Items Protection Cell of the Chandigarh Administration, said the artefacts auctioned included a set of six chairs (Rs 31.90 lakh), one chair (Rs 11.96 lakh), a set of three committee chairs (Rs 24.92 lakh), one sofa (Rs 19.94 lakh) and one dining table (Rs 16.94 lakh). In a letter to Union Minister for External Affairs S Jaishankar and



Minister of Culture and Tourism Gajendra Singh Shekhawat, Jagga stated that in response to his earlier representations on the matter, the Ministry of Culture took action and asked the agencies such as Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) to look into it. However, the MEA is yet to take cognisance of this matter, like alerting the Indian Embassies,

raising the alarm on such auctions and seeking the return of heritage items to India, he added. "This is in continuation of my earlier submissions for the protection of national heritage (Chandigarh heritage articles) from being auctioned all over the world," he said, while adding that in fact, the heritage articles are being auctioned regularly in foreign countries without any resistance from the Government of India. He has requested that the Indian Embassies in foreign countries must be sensitised to our heritage, so that whenever information comes to them, they can at least raise the alarm to save the heritage items.

State-of-the-art trauma centre set to open in August at GMCH-32

Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH : The state-of-the-art facility, with a capacity of 259 beds, is expected to bolster the city's burdened emergency services. The Government Medical College and Hospital (GMCH), Sector 32, has finalised scheduled for opening its newly built trauma centre this August. According to GMCH Medical Superintendent Dr GP Thami, while construction has been completed, the installation of medical equipment is still underway. He said a proposal to hold the trauma centre's inauguration on the same day as the institute's 11th convocation has been submitted to the UT Administration. The name of the chief guest for the event is still under discussion. Originally sanctioned in 2019 with an expected completion timeline of a year and a half, the trauma centre project faced significant delays during the Covid-19 pandemic. The project again gained urgency as the existing emergency block began operating beyond capacity. Authorities are optimistic that the new facility will ease



overcrowding and allow the reallocation of the old emergency space for other departments. With this, the city will also house two dedicated trauma centres — the other being at PGIMER — enhancing the region's preparedness to handle critical emergencies. The trauma centre is part of GMCH's larger effort to bolster its emergency healthcare infrastructure. Currently, the hospital operates around 150 emergency and trauma beds combined, which often proves inadequate during peak hours. The existing emergency wing has long been unable to accommodate the growing patient load, leading to situations where patients were

managed on stretchers in crowded corridors. The new wing is expected to significantly improve patient care and response times. The late Dr BS Chavan, the former director of GMCH, had secured funding of Rs 52 crore for the expansion, aiming to separate trauma care from general emergency services. GMCH's 11th convocation, previously postponed due to regional tensions at the Indo-Pak border, has been rescheduled for August 2. Initially it was supposed to happen on May 2 and Union Health Minister JP Nadra was expected to preside, but Minister of State Anupriya Patel had later been finalised as the guest of honour. Degrees in medicine, nursing, paramedical sciences and allied disciplines will be awarded during the ceremony. In addition to the trauma centre launch, the hospital administration is also exploring options to utilise the vacated space in the main building for expanding the gynaecology department, which is facing persistent bed shortages.

‘One nation, one poll’ theory rejected by Congress, AAP

Opposed the proposal before the committee. were part of the city Congress delegation. "One Nation, One Election (ONOE)" idea was supported by the majority of city BJP while the Congress and the Aam Aadmi Party opposed the proposal before the Joint Parliamentary Committee, which sought suggestions and opinions of political parties. A delegation of the Aam Aadmi Party also opposed the proposal before the committee. City AAP chief Vijay Pal Singh, general secretary Omkar Singh



Aulakh, disciplinary committee convener PP Ghai, advocate Ferry Soft and media incharge Vikrant A Tanwar participated in the discussion and highlighted the constitutional, political and social risks the proposal came with. Vijay Pal emphasised that while the ONOE might appear attractive at first glance, its deeper impact was toxic and threatened the very core values of the Indian Constitution. He said, "Our current electoral system has functioned smoothly for decades. There is no pressing need to replace it. Implementing the ONOE would require massive resources — EVMs, security forces, staff and infrastructure — which is impractical and

unsustainable." City BJP president Jatinder Pal Malhotra extended strong support to the concept of ONOE, calling it a "visionary step towards a more efficient and stable democracy". Malhotra emphasised that holding simultaneous elections across the country would lead to significant saving of time and resources. "Frequent elections hamper the pace of development and overburden administrative and security machinery. A synchronised electoral system would streamline governance and policy implementation," he said. He urged all political parties to rise above partisan interests and seriously consider the idea of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, which was rooted in national interest and long-term democratic reform.

National interest not negotiable in US trade talks, say government sources

NEW DELHI : India and the United States face mounting challenges in finalising their Bilateral Trade Agreement (BTA) as the 90-day tariff pause period draws to a close, yet two weeks remain critical before the deadline of July 9 reaches its platform. India's national interests will remain paramount in ongoing negotiations, even as both nations work intensively to reach an interim deal before the deadline expires revealed government sources. The negotiations have hit significant roadblocks, with the US maintaining its demands for substantially reduced duties on American agricultural and dairy products, along with market access for genetically modified (GMO) crops. India, however, has firmly rejected these proposals, citing concerns over food security, environmental protection, and the welfare of its domestic farming



sector. "India is unwilling to compromise on GMO crops or provide broad-based access for US agricultural and dairy products," a senior government source said, speaking on the condition of anonymity. "Our position remains clear that any agreement must serve India's strategic and economic interests first." The American side has been particularly insistent on securing lower tariffs for its agricultural exports, viewing India's vast consumer market as crucial for its farming sector. However, Indian negotiators have expressed concerns that unrestricted access could undermine local farmers and food security frameworks.

Despite these fundamental disagreements, both sides remain committed to achieving a breakthrough before the July 9 cutoff. The current tariff pause, implemented 90 days ago, has provided breathing room for negotiations while preventing an escalation of trade tensions. If no agreement is reached by the deadline, tariffs will automatically revert to the levels that existed on April 2, potentially reigniting trade friction between the two nations. However, government sources suggest that even in such a scenario, India would maintain a relative advantage compared to other competing manufacturing economies. As the deadline approaches, all eyes will be on whether diplomatic pragmatism can overcome the current impasse in what has become one of the most closely watched trade negotiations of the year.

20% more output pushes BRICS contribution to 40% for global economy

Moscow [Russia] : President Vladimir Putin, highlighted the rising prominence of BRICS nations, noting their contribution has doubled from 20 per cent at the turn of the century to nearly 40 per cent of global economic output. During, the plenary session of the St. Petersburg International Economic Forum (SPIEF), said the global economy is witnessing its most profound shift in decades. Putin underscored Russia's commitment to a new development model—one rooted in fairness, openness, and national interests. Recalling the 2024 BRICS summit in Kazan, he said 35 countries expressed the need for a global framework aligned with today's multipolar reality. He noted that trade among participating nations has already surpassed USD 1 trillion, with joint projects gaining momentum in sectors like AI, nuclear energy, aviation, and IT, as reported by TV BRICS. "Russia invites its partners to contribute to the formation of a new global growth model, to jointly ensure the prosperity of our countries and the stable development of the whole world for many, many years to come," Putin stated.



South African Deputy President Paul Mashatile called multipolarity a defining theme in global affairs. Hailing Russia as a key partner in BRICS and G20, he stressed the growing strategic importance of Africa in population and industrial potential. "Africa is looking for partnerships based on equality, equal access to capital markets, knowledge and technology," he said. Chinese Vice Premier Ding Xuexiang reaffirmed China's dedication to open cooperation with developing economies, stating, "The civilisations of the world must develop through mutual enrichment, based on equality, dialogue, and respect for diversity." Bahrain's National Security Advisor, Nasser bin Hamad Al Khalifa, lauded Russia's economic vision, particularly in energy and industry, and reiterated Bahrain's intent to deepen economic ties with Moscow.

3 landmark Rs 108-cr sports projects to be inaugurated for Lahaul-Spiti on 28 June

bronze at the National Ice Hockey Championship in Dehradun were from Spiti. This new infrastructure is a game-changer that will prepare our youth for national and international platforms." Executive ADC and SDM Kaza, Shikha, said the new sports infrastructure would be a lasting asset. Vice Admiral to commission stealth frigate 'Tamal' in Russia on July 1

NEW DELHI : 'Tamal' is the eighth in the series of Krivak-class frigates inducted from Russia over the past two decades and is the second ship of the Tushil Class, which are upgraded versions of the Talwar and Teg classes, each comprising three ships. The Indian Navy is set to commission its latest stealth multi-role frigate, INS Tamal, on July 1 at Kaliningrad, Russia. The commissioning ceremony will be presided over by Vice Admiral Sanjay J Singh, Commander of the Western Naval Command. As part of the broader contract for the Tushil class, India is also constructing two similar frigates, known as the Triput class, at Goa Shipyard Limited, with technology transfer and design assistance from



Russia. By the conclusion of this series, the Indian Navy will operate 10 ships with similar capabilities and commonality in equipment, weaponry, and sensor fit across four different classes. The Tamal's construction was closely overseen by an Indian team of specialists from the Warship Overseeing Team stationed at Kaliningrad, under the aegis of the Embassy of India, Moscow. At the Naval Headquarters, the

project was steered by the Directorate of Ship Production under the Controller of Warship Production and Acquisition. The ship features 26 per cent indigenous components, including the BrahMos long-range cruise missile, capable of targeting both sea and land. The Navy has stated that the ship's combat capability is enhanced by a range of Network Centric Warfare capabilities and an advanced Electronic Warfare suite. The Tamal boasts a high tonnage-to-firepower ratio, extended endurance, and a top speed exceeding 30 knots. The crew, comprising over 250 personnel, has undergone rigorous training both ashore and afloat in the challenging winter conditions of St. Petersburg and Kaliningrad.

Hike of 19 lakh members in April brings significant rise in fund

NEW DELHI : This figure depicts a significant increase of 31.31 per cent over March 2025 and 1.17 per cent growth over April 2024. Retirement fund body EPFO added 19.14 lakh members on a net basis in April 2025, according to the payroll data released by the Labour Ministry on Sunday. The Employees' Provident Fund Organization (EPFO) enrolled around 8.49 lakh new subscribers in April 2025, representing a 12.49 per cent increase over March 2025. This increase in new subscribers can be attributed to growing employment opportunities, increased awareness of employee



benefits, and EPFO's successful outreach programmes, it stated. A noticeable aspect is the dominance of the 18-25 age group. EPFO added 4.89 lakh new subscribers in the 18-25 age group, constituting a significant 57.67 per cent of the total new subscribers added in April 2025.

US visa screening procedure must make social media accounts public

Washington (US) : "Every visa adjudication is a national security decision. Effective immediately, all individuals applying for an F, M, or J non-immigrant visa are requested to adjust the privacy settings on all of their personal social media accounts to 'public' to facilitate vetting necessary to establish their identity and admissibility to the United States," shared the announced statement on X In a post on X, US handle. In a move aimed at strengthening visa screening procedures, the United States has announced that effective immediately, all individuals applying for an F, M, or J non-immigrant visa are required to adjust the privacy settings on all of their social media accounts to 'public' to facilitate vetting necessary to establish their identity and admissibility to the United States under U.S. law. It also reiterated that since 2019, the United States has required visa applicants to provide social media



identifiers on immigrant and non-immigrant visa application forms. "We use all available information in our visa screening and vetting to identify visa applicants who are inadmissible to the United States, including those who pose a threat to U.S. national security." Meanwhile, the U.S. government has also unveiled a sweeping new 2025 travel ban, barring nationals from 12 countries entirely and partially limiting visa access from seven others. The move prioritizes national security and focuses on countries deemed high-risk for security loopholes and terrorism concerns. Most affected

countries are reportedly in the Middle East and Africa. Citizens from these nations now face a total ban on immigrant and non-immigrant visas, including those for tourism, education, and employment. Simultaneously, seven other countries face partial restrictions, involving tighter screening or limited visa categories. Amid growing concern in South Asia, the U.S. has clarified that India is not on the list. The U.S. is continuing to process applications for Indian nationals across all categories, including B1/B2 tourist visas, H1B work permits, and F1 student visas. However, visa applicants from India still face long delays due to high demand and administrative backlog. Most U.S. consulates in India are booking interview slots up to 10-12 months in advance. So while India remains unaffected by the new travel ban, long processing times may still impact travel plans, education, and employment opportunities for many.

India's voice and role was important in restoring regional peace and stability, he said.. We discussed in detail about the current situation. Expressed deep concern at the recent escalations. Reiterated our call for immediate de-

escalation, dialogue and diplomacy as the way forward and for early restoration of regional peace, security and stability," PM Modi said in a post on X. Following the strikes, US President Donald Trump addressed the nation and issued a stern warning to Iran. "There will be either peace or there will be tragedy for Iran, far greater than we've witnessed over the last eight days," Mr Trump said from the White House on Saturday night (local time). The Israeli Air Force retaliated with a fresh wave of airstrikes on military targets in western Iran in response to Iranian missile attacks that injured civilians in Israel.

## Chenab bridge design dangerous, Rly Engineer

New Delhi: For decades, it was a national ambition to connect the Kashmir valley with the rest of India by an all-weather railway. That dream appeared to be realised with the inauguration of the Chenab Bridge, the world's highest railway arch. .But a former chief engineer on the project has alleged that this "engineering marvel" has critical safety flaws, was built on a flawed alignment against expert advice, and that his attempts to raise concerns were systematically suppressed. Alok Kumar Verma, a retired Indian Railway Service of Engineers (IRSE) officer, has spent

nearly two decades courts arguing that the project is A 'flawed' alignment



unsafe. In a set of documents shared with Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link (USBRL) is dangerously unstable. From the start, the alignment was ill-conceived," Verma wrote in a recent letter to India's Railway Board. .His account, supported by official records, details a long-running dispute that reached the highest levels of the government and courts.

The core of the dispute lies in the 111-km stretch from Katra to Banihal through the Pir Panjal mountains. When construction began in 2002, the route was chosen based on what Verma calls a "paper alignment without even preliminary ground reconnaissance". This route follows the contours of the mountains to maintain a gentle gradient.erma argues this was a fundamental error.

## Iran attacks US base in Qatar , home to over 8 lakh Indians

May, India launched Operation Sindoore in retaliation, striking terror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir, which was followed by three days of military confrontation between the two countries.Adding that as per the probe, Parvaiz and Bashir knowingly harboured the three armed terrorists at a seasonal dhok (hut) at Hill Park before the attack, the spokesperson said, "The two men had provided food, shelter and logistical support to the terrorists, who had, on the fateful afternoon, selectively killed the tourists on the basis of their religious identity.
