Zirakpur : Open, uncontrolled sewage water, overflowing sewerage pipes in the satellite town is incredible, nevertheless it has been true for the past over two and half year since the main sewerage treatment plant went for urgent periodic treatment and massive repair due to clogging of blocked sewage lines and heavy storage in the midst of pipe lines reported the sewerage staff during 2023. At the formation of Municipal Nagar Panchayat of the town in 1999, Singhpura only had 17.3 ml meagre capacity Sewerage Treatment Plant. Thereafter, the town population grew meteorically up and no Executive Officer ever contemplated over the potential



threat of sewage overflow as the storage, treatment capacity could blow out of proportion as has happened now. There was no deficiency of funds at the hands of Municipal authorities but persistent neglects were attributed space and the revenue from the registration kept pouring in and illegal discharge by the colonisers, unauthorised annexation continued

unchecked by the local authorities. Such type of worst accumulation has taken about two decades time to pose a formidable threat before the entire populace of the town. Along the National highway, hundreds showrooms, hotels, colonisers office have sprung up by making no treatment plant against the laid down municipal rules. All this can be said to

have taken place in comprehensive understanding between authorities and property sharks. Drainage system along the national highway has been designed solely to handle the surface storm waterflow which could salvage protect the road erosion and hydroplaning hazards. It might be recalled here other media too had published that Mr Rahul Sokhal NHA1 had raised the issue of 29 illegal sewer connections which indulged in eroding drainage system along the National Highway. Despite notifying the local Municipal Authorities, no action has been initiated till date. The time, Commissioner newspaper intended to derive the latest progressive score from the local

Rs 150 Crore worth land grab deal : Balbir Sidhu

Mohali : Under Rule 6 (3A) (3) of the Punjab Land Registry Act 1961 , the former Congress Health Minister noticed that land rates fixed by the district valuation committee were only valid for six months . " Using the 2017 valuation today is illegal and unfair . The land's market value has shot up to Rs 150 Crore , yet efforts are on to transfer it to JLPL for just Rs 18 Crore . This is nothing short of looting public property , " said the ex-minister He demanded an independent inquiry into the entire matter . Balbir Singh Sidhu has levelled serious allegations against sitting Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) MLA and JLPL managing director

Kulwant Singh accusing him of attempting to grab prime panchayat land in Papri village worth Rs 150 Crore at a grossly undervalued rate of Rs 18 Crore with the alleged connivance of Panchayat officials . Mr Sidhu claimed that Kulwant Singh's company JLPL had originally acquired approval in February 2017 to purchase around six acres (approximately 15 kanal 8 marla) of village panchayat land at the rate of Rs 3 Crore per acre . However , he alleged that the company took possession after paying only Rs 50 Lakh violating provisions of the Panchayati Raj Act , which mandate full payment and registration prior to possession . " JLPL began illegal development



on the land , laying roads , sewer lines , and electric poles despite villagers raising objections and legal proceedings stalling registration . Now , eight years later , efforts are being made to formally register the land at outdated rates , defying all norms of the land , Sidhu alleged .

Preamble is the soul of constitution of our country : Vice President Dhankhar

New Delhi : The 'socialism' , 'secularism' to Preamble of Constitution is sacrilege to spirit of 'Sanatana' remarked on the controversial comments by senior Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) leader Dattatreya Hosabale that 'secularism' and 'socialism' were not a part of the Preamble of the Constitution drafted by B.R. Ambedkar, Vice President of India Jagdeep Dhankhar said here on Saturday that the words were added to the Preamble during the Emergency as an "ulcer", and were a sacrilege to the spirit of "Sanatana". Speaking at an event to release Ambedkar's Messages, a book compiled by former Karnataka MLC D.S. Veeraiah, Mr. Dhankhar said the Preamble of any Constitution was its soul. "The Preamble of the Indian Constitution is unique. Except Bharat, [no other] Constitution's



Preamble has undergone change, and why? Preamble is not changeable. Preamble is not alterable. Preamble is the basis on which the Constitution has grown. Preamble is the seed of the Constitution. It is soul of the Constitution, but this Preamble for Bharat was changed by 42nd Constitutional Amendment of 1976, adding the words 'socialist', 'secular', and 'integrity,' Mr. Dhankhar said.

Overcrowded Kennels crammed into small spaces

Chandigarh : Many large dogs are forced to stay in smaller kennels and several healthy dogs are not being released . "This will inevitably lead to the development of undesirable , aggressive behaviours , which will become a menace to public safety when these animals are released back to the place from where they were picked , " said Nikki Gill , Director of Sehjevi NGO. The NGO also claimed that kennel blocks in Raipur Kalan have become breeding grounds for diseases ,

including canine distemper , thick fiver skin infections . "This also poses a public health hazard when these animals are released back to the streets , " Gill added . The paralyzed dogs are almost left to die , with nobody to take care of them . It was a " ill - planned and inhumane practice emphasizing that the ABC centre was never designed to function as full - time shelter . The animals are suffering . The relocation has turned a temporary neutering facility into a prison for innocent souls , " added Ms Gill .



Sindoor 'Hero' Parag Jain to Head RAW:

New Delhi : Senior IPS officer Parag Jain, credited with key intelligence operations during Operation Sindoor, has been appointed as the new head of the country's external intelligence agency, the Research and Analysis Wing (RAW), sources disclosed. After a deadly attack on tourists in picturesque Pahalagam in Jammu and Kashmir on April 22, New Delhi launched strikes deep into

Pakistan's territory as part of what it named Operation Sindoor. India blamed Pakistan for backing the attackers who killed 26 civilians. Islamabad denied it and called for an independent probe. A ceasefire was reached on May 10 after four days of fighting. Mr Jain is currently the second senior-most officer in the RAW, after outgoing chief Ravi Sinha. He will serve a two-year tenure after taking over from Mr Sinha,



who retires on June 30, the officials said. Mr Jain currently heads RAW's Aviation Research Centre (ARC), which deals with aerial surveillance, among others.

Article 370 was against Ambedkar's ideology of one Constitution for united India: CJI Gavai

News Delhi B.R. Ambedkar envisioned one Constitution for the country to keep it united and never favoured the idea of a separate constitution for a state, said BR Gavai ,chief Justice of India on Saturday , June 28 , 2025. Narrating at the inauguration of the Constitution Preamble Park, the CJI said " Supreme Court drew inspiration from Dr. Ambedkar's vision of a united India under a single constitution while upholding the Centre's decision to abrogate Article 370 that granted special status to Jammu and Kashmir. Justice Gavai was part of a five-judge Constitution bench, headed by then Chief Justice D.Y.

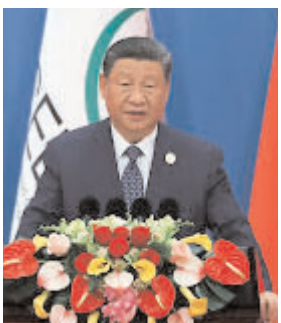


Chandrachud, that unanimously upheld the Centre's decision to abrogate Article 370, which bestowed special status to the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir. "When Article 370 was challenged,

it came before us, and when the hearing was underway, I recalled Dr. Babasaheb's words that one Constitution is suited for a country... If we want to keep the country united, we need only one Constitution," he said, while addressing the gathering in Marathi. Whenever our country faces challenges, it has remained united," Justice Gavai said.Dhanetre decided to strip Jammu and Kashmir of special status and divide it into two Union Territories. Justice Gavai said Dr. Ambedkar had been criticised, saying the Constitution provides for too much federalism, and in times of war, the country may not remain united.

Expired life vehicles to go at scrapping in Delhi

New Delhi : Vehicles with life expiry date would be denied fuel in Delhi from July 1 , said the authoritative traffic officials . Not only that such vehicles would be impounded on the spot and taken for scrapping . They had identified hotspots where most EOOL vehicles still operated between June 1 and 23 , almost 1.4 lakh vehicles were identified as EOOL , while overall 8.1 lakh vehicles had been identified as such . They added that automatic number plate recognition cameras have been installed at 498 fuel stations, of which 382 serve petrol and

diesel vehicles and 116 , CNG . The ANPR tech-



nology enables real time recording and tracking of vehchile data through a centralised database and access all information , including the age , of the vehicle in microseconds . "We have finally decided to resolve the longstanding

ing problem of taking EOOL vehicles off the streets , " said Virinder Sharma , member , technical , CAQM . Sharma pointed out that EOOL vehicles emit pollutants . Research studies have shown that BS4 vehicle emits 5.5 times more emissions than a BS6 vehicle . As per the guidelines , petrol vehicles that are 15 years or older and diesel vehicles older than 10 years have reached the end of their lives . Delhi has over 80 lakh registered vehicles , and CAQM said that of this , around 62 lakh vehicles were EOOL, of which 41 lakh were two wheelers.

Israel evolving into an aggressive entity

Israel is now heading down the same path as Russia and Turkey, capitalising on vast disparities in military and intelligence capabilities among regional powers to its advantage, disregarding international norms, undermining diplomacy and preferring transactional alliances instead of long-term peace processes. The US has facilitated this transformation. Then President Joe Biden and now Trump have made very little effort to constrain Netanyahu. Trump's "Gaza Riviera" plan, along with his isolationist rhetoric, have effectively left regional decision making to Israel while he continues to underwrite Israeli military dominance and its use of overwhelming force to reshape its regional environment. Netanyahu's reluctance to accept the current ceasefire as a definitive end to hostilities with Iran reveals his and his cabinet's regional revisionist reflexes. Broader regional destabilisation lies ahead as Israel seeks to destroy threats with immense military power without any strategic foresight. But Netanyahu's ambitions appear to extend beyond his immediate political survival. He seems to be striving for a legacy-defining "1967 moment" a transformative

reordering of the regional landscape in the Middle East that sidelines the Palestinian issue and entrenches Israeli supremacy. This dual imperative domestic domestic survival and amassing power in the region-likely shapes Netanyahu's recent actions, including the strike on Iran, the expanded occupation of Syrian territory, the October 2024 attack on Lebanon and the ongoing assaults on Gaza and the West Bank. By describing each military campaign as a reluctant necessity-forced upon him by Iran, Hamas or even his coalition hardliners, Netanyahu maintains public support as he consolidates power. His government has used wartime conditions to suppress public protest, push forward its radical constitutional agenda and advance his geopolitical vision. The result is a Vilatile calculated strateg likely to mark Net but that is tenure, though win Wahu's significant cant repercussions for regional stability. While Netanyahu's actions could serve his immediate political ends, they also reflect a longer term shift in Israeli grand strategy. Following the October 7, 2023, Hamas attacks, Israel intensified a longstanding pattern of preemptive strikes and campaigns to neutralise its adversaries. This strategy has been

pursued at an unprecedented scale in Gaza, but often without a clearly articulated political endgame. A 'regional policy doctrine Netanyahu laid out in his 1993 book A Place Among the Nations when he asserted that "the only peace that will endure in the region is the peace of deterrence." This policy advocates the projection of overwhelming Israeli power, the emasculation of regional challengers and efforts to radically reorder the Middle East. Netanyahu's doctrine, a more aggressive revision of Israel's earlier pre-emptive security traditions, stands in sharp contrast to the approach pursued by the Oslo Accordsera leadership of the 1990s and 2000s figures such as Yitzhak Rabin, Shimon Peres, and later Ehud Barak. Early leaders emphasised diplomacy over coercive leverage and perpetual confrontation. They sought genuine political settlements and a negoti-ated co-existence with Palestinians and neighbouring Arab states. This strategy rooted in compromise and limited reconciliation has now been decisively eclipsed by Netanyahu's highly militarised approach and his vision for achieving strategic power in the Middle East.

Cash strapped Punjab to borrow Rs 8,500 cr captial amount during July-Sept

CHANDIGARH : The planned borrowings are within the permissible limit set by the RBI. We are raising loans at the lowest rate of interest prevailing in the market till March 2024, the state's total outstanding debt stood at Rs 3.82 lakh crore, which is over 44 per cent of the Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) disclosed an official from Finance Department on anonymity. The Punjab Government is set raise a loan of Rs 8,500 crore in the second quarter of the ongoing fiscal year (July to September). The market borrowings to be undertaken by the state government have been approved by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). According to information available with the cash-strapped government would raise a loan of Rs 2,000 crore in July, Rs 3,000 crore in August and Rs 3,500 crore in September. After these borrowings, the total loan raised by state government during this fiscal year will go up to Rs 14,741.92 crore. In April and May, the government had raised Rs 6,241.92-crore loans.



The state government targets to raise Rs 34,201.11-crore loans this year. By the end of March 2026, the state's total debt is likely to touch Rs 4 lakh crore. This means that each Punjabi (considering the state population to be 3 crore) will have an average debt of Rs 1.33 lakh by the end of this fiscal year. Earlier this year, a report on debt-stressed states in the country, tabled in Parliament by Union Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary, had expressed concern that Punjab's debt-to-GSDP ratio was the second highest in the country. During the first two months of this fiscal year (April and May), the state's revenue deficit was Rs 5,513.65 crore. The state received Rs 12,903.04 crore in revenue receipts, while the revenue expenditure stood at Rs 18,416.69 crore.

70 yrs aged or more can apply for special Ayushman cards

PANCHKULA : The Deputy Commissioner (DC) Monika Gupta, is a joint effort between the Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) and district administration has been over seeing the arrangements for issuing Special Ayushman cards. Senior citizens aged 70 years and above are eligible to apply for special Ayushman cards, which will entitle them to free medical treatment worth up to Rs 5 lakh. So far, more than 70 senior citizens have been issued the cards. All citizens aged 70 and above are eligible to apply for the cards, which are being generated through an Aadhaar-based e-KYC process said Dr Mukta Kumar, Civil Surgeon. Ayushman Mitras have been appointed at block-and district-level government hospitals to assist with the generation of these cards. With these cards, beneficiaries will be able to



access cashless treatment at government as well as empanelled private hospitals. A statement issued by the District Health Department described this initiative as an important step towards providing senior citizens with quality and accessible healthcare services. The Panchkula district administration reaffirms that it is committed to ensuring that no eligible citizen is deprived of this benefit. To apply for the cards, eligible individuals can visit their nearest government hospital, Common Services Centres, or special camp with their Aadhaar card and mobile number to get their card made. Assistance is available from Ayushman Mitras at the centres.

Ambala division upgrades railway signal system

Admissions for 270 BEd seats across the colleges of education affiliated with the PU will be based on merit determined through the Common Entrance Test scheduled for July 13. The prospectus, including the application form, detailed schedule, admission criteria, exam scheme and reservation policy, is available on the official website: <https://chandigarhbed.pu.chd.ac.in>. The last date to submit online applications is July 4 and the result of



the entrance test will be declared on July 24. The minimum eligibility requirement for the BEd programme is graduation with at least 50 per cent marks. No separate advertisement will be issued in newspapers, and candidates are advised to regularly check the website for all updates. Admissions will be conducted through centralised physical counselling based strictly on CET merit. The first round of counselling is tentatively scheduled for the second week of August 2025.

Streamline operation theatre besides other infra upgrade at animal centre : Administrator

CHANDIGARH : UT Administrator Gulab Chand Kataria during his visit, expressed his dissatisfaction with the existing infrastructure and facilities available for the care of animals. Mr Kataria paid a surprise visit to the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA), located in Sector 38 (West). He directed the officials concerned to take immediate steps to upgrade the veterinary services and overall infrastructure. The Administrator observed that there were inadequate facilities, particularly for the treatment of



large animals. He stressed the urgency for upgrading essential areas such as the operation theatre and medical units to ensure comprehensive treatment for all types of animals. Mr Kataria directed the officials to prepare a comprehensive plan for upgrading the existing veterinary hospital to provide better care and shelter for animals. Municipal Commissioner Amit Kumar and UT Chief

Engineer CB Ojha were also present during the visit. Sehjeevi an NGO had flagged appalling conditions. Notably, a couple of days earlier, the NGO, a charitable trust working for animal welfare, deplored the appalling conditions and mismanagement at the SPCA. Sehjeevi's executive director Nikki Latta Gill also raised the issue of the recent shifting of animals from the SPCA to Raipur Kalan Animal Birth Control Centre, due to renovation at the former. She informed about the terrible conditions of animals, mainly dogs, in Raipur Kalan, too.

State-of-the-art trauma centre set to open in August at GMCH-32

CHANDIGARH : The state-of-the-art facility, with a capacity of 259 beds, is expected to bolster the city's burdened emergency services. The Government Medical College and Hospital (GMCH), Sector 32, has finalised scheduled for opening its newly built trauma centre this August. According to GMCH Medical Superintendent Dr GP Thami, while construction has been completed, the installation of medical equipment is still underway. He said a proposal to hold the trauma centre's inauguration on the same day as the institute's 11th convocation has been submitted to the UT Administration. The name of the chief guest for the event is still under discussion. Originally sanctioned in 2019 with an expected completion timeline of a year and a half, the trauma centre project faced significant delays during the Covid-19 pandemic. The project again gained urgency as the existing emergency block began operating beyond capacity. Authorities are optimistic that the new facility will ease



overcrowding and allow the reallocation of the old emergency space for other departments. With this, the city will also house two dedicated trauma centres — the other being at PGIMER — enhancing the region's preparedness to handle critical emergencies. The trauma centre is part of GMCH's larger effort to bolster its emergency healthcare infrastructure. Currently, the hospital operates around 150 emergency and trauma beds combined, which often proves inadequate during peak hours. The existing emergency wing has long been unable to accommodate the growing patient load, leading to situations where patients were

managed on stretchers in crowded corridors. The new wing is expected to significantly improve patient care and response times. The late Dr BS Chavan, the former director of GMCH, had secured funding of Rs 52 crore for the expansion, aiming to separate trauma care from general emergency services. GMCH's 11th convocation, previously postponed due to regional tensions at the Indo-Pak border, has been rescheduled for August 2. Initially it was supposed to happen on May 2 and Union Health Minister JP Nadra was expected to preside, but Minister of State Anupriya Patel had later been finalised as the guest of honour. Degrees in medicine, nursing, paramedical sciences and allied disciplines will be awarded during the ceremony. In addition to the trauma centre launch, the hospital administration is also exploring options to utilise the vacated space in the main building for expanding the gynaecology department, which is facing persistent bed shortages.

Compounding regime of synthetic milk

Brazil intends to procure Akash missiles from India

NEW DELHI : Brazil is keen to have Indian-made Akash missiles, artillery guns, coastal radars and secure communication used in the battlefield. The Akash missile proved its mettle during the skirmish with Pakistan from May 7-10. India and Brazil are eyeing each other's defence manufacturing capabilities for joint production and mutual procurement of military equipment. India is keen on having a joint collaboration to develop an Airborne Warning and Control System (AWACS) systems that would be based on a Brazilian-made plane Embraer. Separately, Embraer and Indian firm Mahindra signed an MoU to collaborate on making the C-390 multi-mission transport aircraft. India is looking at planes of this class to replace the Soviet-origin AN 32 planes.



Some of these issues will come up for bilateral discussion when Prime Minister Narendra Modi meets Brazil President Lula da Silva on the sidelines of the BRICS summit. Modi will visit Brazil from July 5 to 8, to attend the 17th BRICS summit, followed by a state visit. Secretary East in the Ministry of External Affairs P Kumaran today said: "The two countries are looking at joint ventures, joint research and co-development. The Embraer is being looked at for a reconnaissance platform. There is a lot of potential to work with Brazil."

Kumaran said Brazil has shown interest in Indian secure communication system, off shore patrol vessels, Akash missiles, coastal radars and artillery guns. Also, Brazil uses the French origin Scorpene class submarine — the same used by India — and is looking at having joint maintenance. The two countries have a joint defence committee (JDC) established under a 2003 agreement. This committee has facilitated 14 high-level exchanges between defence chiefs of both nations. Since 2007, 134 defence officers (70 from India, 64 from Brazil) have undergone training in each other's institutions. In 2024, the two countries launched the 2+2 Political-Military Dialogue. Both countries are strategic partners in multilateral forums like BRICS, the G20, and India Brazil South Africa (ISBA) platform.

US visa screening procedure must make social media accounts public

Washington (US) : "Every visa adjudication is a national security decision. Effective immediately, all individuals applying for an F, M, or J non-immigrant visa are requested to adjust the privacy settings on all of their personal social media accounts to 'public' to facilitate vetting necessary to establish their identity and admissibility to the United States," shared the announced statement on X In a post on X, US handle.

In a move aimed at strengthening visa screening procedures, the United States has announced that effective immediately, all individuals applying for an F, M, or J non-immigrant visa are required to adjust the privacy settings on all of their social media accounts to 'public' to facilitate vetting necessary to establish their identity and admissibility to the United States under U.S. law. It also reiterated that since 2019, the United States has required visa applicants to provide social media



identifiers on immigrant and non-immigrant visa application forms. "We use all available information in our visa screening and vetting to identify visa applicants who are inadmissible to the United States, including those who pose a threat to U.S. national security." Meanwhile, the U.S. government has also unveiled a sweeping new 2025 travel ban, barring nationals from 12 countries entirely and partially limiting visa access from seven others. The move prioritizes national security and focuses on countries deemed high-risk for security loopholes and terrorism concerns. Most affected

countries are reportedly in the Middle East and Africa. Citizens from these nations now face a total ban on immigrant and non-immigrant visas, including those for tourism, education, and employment. Simultaneously, seven other countries face partial restrictions, involving tighter screening or limited visa categories. Amid growing concern in South Asia, the U.S. has clarified that India is not on the list. The U.S. is continuing to process applications for Indian nationals across all categories, including B1/B2 tourist visas, H1B work permits, and F1 student visas. However, visa applicants from India still face long delays due to high demand and administrative backlog. Most U.S. consulates in India are booking interview slots up to 10-12 months in advance. So while India remains unaffected by the new travel ban, long processing times may still impact travel plans, education, and employment opportunities for many.

Gurugram holistically aims zero emission by 2050

GURUGRAM : As Gurugram features among the top polluted cities in the country, the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA) has drawn a holistic plan to reduce emissions in the city. The authority has drafted a 'net zero 2050' document, contouring the goals for urban policy-making to make Gurugram a zero emission city. Net-zero refers to the point at which a specific area or city is able to remove from the atmosphere all green house gases (GHGs) it is emitting. Effectively, it ensures that no additional carbon or other GHGs are being added into the atmosphere.



The document elaborates on the way forward to implement sustainable development strategies like construction of green buildings, setting up of centralised cooling plants in housing societies, adoption of cleaner technologies and increasing the share of electric vehicles over the next 25 years. The plan deals in four major arenas — energy, waste, transport and greenery.

Dubai urban transport conducts first aerial taxi test flight

Dubai : The aerial taxi is designed to offer fast and zero-emission travel within cities, operating with minimal noise and requiring only a small landing footprint. Dubai has successfully completed the first test flight of an aerial taxi, a fully electric vertical take-off and landing (eVTOL) aircraft, marking a major step in its efforts to introduce sustainable and next-generation urban transport. Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Crown Prince of Dubai, Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of Defence, and Chairman of the Executive Council of Dubai, said the achievement reflects the city's commitment to placing the UAE at the forefront of transformative technologies that drive global progress. "Further, the successful aerial taxi test flight demonstrates our determination to transform breakthrough technologies into practical solutions that enhance



quality of life and set new benchmarks for urban development," he said. Conducted by Dubai's Roads and Transport Authority (RTA) in partnership with Joby Aviation, the Joby Aerial Taxi flight took place at a designated site in the Dubai desert. Mattar Al Tayer, director general, chairman of the board of executive directors of RTA, said the launch underscored Dubai's commitment to keeping pace with rapid global transformations and developing future-ready solutions to emerging mobility challenges. The aircraft has a range of up to 160 kilometres and a top speed of 320 kilometres per hour, with

flights such as Dubai International Airport to Palm Jumeirah expected to take just 12 minutes, compared to 45 minutes by car. The first commercial aerial taxi flights are scheduled for 2026, with station operations launching near Dubai International Airport. The project is part of a broader strategy under the Dubai Economic Agenda D33 to integrate advanced transport solutions and enhance quality of life. "Dubai serves as a launchpad for a global revolution in mobility, and flying our aircraft here represents a pivotal step towards integrating Aerial Taxi services into the fabric of daily life around the world," said Joe Ben Bevirt, founder and CEO of Joby Aviation. Dubai is the first city in the world that has committed to offering urban air mobility services through an advanced vertical take-off and landing infrastructure network for aerial taxis.

Bihar electoral rolls being revised under Art 326: EC

NEW DELHI : The Election Commission (EC) on Sunday clarified that the revision exercise was being done as mandated by the Constitution under Article 326. Amid criticism and allegations by the Opposition of bringing the NRC through backdoor in the garb of special intensive revision (SIR) of electoral rolls being conducted in the poll-bound Bihar. "The Constitution of India is supreme. All citizens, political parties and the EC follow the Constitution. The SIR has begun in Bihar for verifying the eligibility of each elector with full participation of everyone," said the EC. A source said those questioning the move is akin to questioning Article 326 and anyone opposing SIR is also opposing Article 326 and should therefore clear his or her



stand. The EC sources pointed out that it would strictly implement Article 326 during SIR and political parties and other persons were also supposed to follow Article 326 in letter and spirit. Meanwhile, after the Opposition created a brouhaha, the EC clarified that for those whose names are already in the 2003 electoral rolls held in Bihar, they have to just verify their names in the electoral rolls and fill the enumeration form, without submitting any document

as proof of address or birth. According to the instructions issued by the poll authority, 4.96 crore voters — 60 per cent of the total electors — who were listed in the 2003 special intensive revision need not submit any supporting document to establish their date or place or birth except the relevant portion of the electoral roll brought out after the revision. The other three crore — nearly 40 per cent — will have to provide one of the 11 listed documents to establish their place or date of birth. Here, too, the voters whose parents have been named in the 2003 voters' list, will have to only give documents about their place/date of birth. They will not have to give documents regarding the place/date of birth of their parents as their entry in the 2003 list will be considered as proof, underlined an official.

Indian Woman Missing After Flying To USA , No Family , No English

New Jersey : A 24 - year old Indian woman who arrived in the United States for a reported arranged marriage has gone missing, said the US authorities . Simran Simran was last seen shortly after her arrival from India in New Jersey on June 20. Surveillance footage reviewed by Lindenwold police showed her checking her phone and seemingly waiting for someone. She did not appear to be in distress in the video.Ms Simran was reported missing on Wednesday, five days after her arrival, police confirmed.

Officials investigating her disappearance said a



preliminary probe revealed she travelled to the US for an arranged marriage. Authorities are also exploring the possibility that the marriage was an excuse to obtain free airfare to America, as per The NY Post. Ms Simran has no known relatives in the United States and does not speak English, police said. Her only phone

is an international device that functions solely through Wi-Fi. Authorities have so far been unable to reach any family members in India. At this time there are no known family members in India to contact to obtain information on her possible whereabouts," Lindenwold police said on Thursday, as per Patch News. Ms Simran is described as being five feet, four inches tall, weighing approximately 150 pounds (68 kg), with a small scar on the left side of her forehead. She was last seen wearing gray sweatpants, a white T-shirt, black flip-flops, and small diamond-studded earrings.

Investigators recover black box from fatal Air India aeroplane

Investigators have downloaded flight recorder data from an Air India crash that killed 260 people, India's civil aviation ministry said on Thursday, a long-awaited step towards understanding the world's worst aviation disaster in a decade.

The London-bound Boeing (BA.N), opens new tab 787 Dreamliner crashed moments after takeoff from India's Ahmedabad city on June 12, killing 241 of the 242 people on board and the rest on the ground. The black boxes of the plane - the cockpit voice recorder (CVR) and flight data recorder (FDR) - were recovered in the

days that followed, one Transportation Safety



from the rooftop of a building at the crash site on June 13, and the other from the debris on June 16.

The ministry said data from the front recorder was accessed on Wednesday by a team led by India's Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau (AAIB), with the U.S. National Transportation Safety Board. U.S. National

Board chair Jennifer Homendy said Thursday she hopes the Indian government will be able to share details from the investigation into the crash in short order. She said the NTSB team has been working diligently to provide assistance to India and "we have had excellent cooperation from the Indian government and the Air Craft Accident Bureau .

Remarks on Operation Sindoor mis represented and out of context'-- Indian embassy

New Delhi :The Indian Embassy in Indonesia on Sunday clarified saying certain remarks made by its defence attaché were blown out of proportion. The statement referred to remarks by a Navy captain on Indian Air Force losses during Operation Sindoor.

On X, the embassy quoted that Navy Captain Shiv Kumar's remarks on Operation Sindoor were "taken out of context" and "misrepresented."

reports regarding a presentation made by the Defence Attache at a Seminar. His remarks are a misrepresentation of the intention and thrust of the presentation made by the speaker," said the embassy.

Fatwa issued against Trump , Netanyahu by Iranian Cleric

Tehran: Iran's top Shiite cleric has issued a 'fatwa' or religious decree against US President Donald Trump and Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, calling them "enemies of God".

The decree from Grand Ayatollah Naser Makarem Shirazi called on Muslims across the world to unite and bring down the American and Israeli leaders for threatening the Islamic republic leadership.

Any person or regime that threatens the Leader or Marja (May God forbid) is considered a 'warlord' or a 'mohareb'," Makarem said in the ruling.

A mohareb is someone who wages war against God, and under Iranian law, those identified as mohareb can



face execution, crucifixion, limb amputation, or exile, according to a report by Fox News.


The fatwa added that "any cooperation or support for that enemy by Muslims or Islamic states is haram or forbidden. It is necessary for all Muslims around the world to make these enemies regret their words and mistakes."

It also said that if a "Muslim who abides by his Muslim duty suffer hardship or loss in their campaign, they will

be rewarded as a fighter in the way of God, God willing."


The religious decree followed a 12-day war that erupted on June 13, when Israel launched a bombing campaign in Iran that killed top military commanders and scientists linked to its nuclear programme. Tehran responded with ballistic missile attacks on Israeli cities. Israel said it aimed to keep the Islamic republic from developing an atomic weapon -- an ambition Tehran has consistently denied.

The fighting culminated after the US joined Israeli forces to attack three of Iran's nuclear facilities, following which Iran bombarded an American military base in Qatar.

Gang-rape accused had demanded death penalty in RG Kar case

Kolkata: The prime accused, Monojit Mishra, in the alleged gang-rape of a 24-year-old student on the south Kolkata law college campus in Kasba, had demanded the death sentence for the guilty in the RG Kar Medical College and Hospital rape and murder case last year.

"Wanted death sentence for the rapist and justice and no drama. Wanted immediate justice. Want death sentence for the guilty," Mishra had written on his social media account on August 16. The body of the 31-year-old second-year postgraduate student, who was raped and murdered inside a seminar hall of the hospital, was found on August 9. The crime occurred late at night in the third-floor seminar hall of the chest department. Police later reported that

multiple lacerations and wounds were found on her body, which triggered a



nationwide uproar. The SealDAH court sentenced the accused, Roy, to life imprisonment on January 20, observing that the case did not qualify as "rarest of the rare," the threshold for a death sentence. Police said the alleged incident on Wednesday took place between 7.30 pm and 10.50 pm, when the woman — allegedly the TMCP's women's wing secretary in the college .

Ukraine F-16 pilot killed repelling massive Russian air attack

Kyiv : Ukraine has lost an F-16 aircraft and its pilot while repelling a Russian missile and drone strike, according to the war-torn country's air force.

After shooting down seven air targets, the plane was damaged and lost altitude overnight, the Ukrainian military said in a statement published on Telegram on Sunday.

"This night, while repelling a massive enemy air attack, a pilot of the 1st class, Lieutenant Colonel Maksym Ustimenko, born in 1993, died on an F-16 aircraft," it said.

In a separate statement, the air force said Russia launched 537 projectiles against Ukraine, including Shahed drones, cruise and ballistic missiles. Ukraine claimed to have



intercepted 475 of them. According to the Kyiv Independent newspaper, the sound of explosions and strikes was reported in multiple areas across the country, including in southern Mykolaiv, southeastern Zaporizhia and western Lviv. Ihor Taburets, the governor of central Ukraine's Cherkasy region, said at least six people were injured and civilian infrastructure was damaged in attacks. Three multistorey buildings and a college were damaged in the attack, he said.
