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'Should Intruders With Aadhaar Be Made Voters': Supreme Court

New Delhi : Raising concerns over intruders who managed to get Aadhaar cards, the Supreme Court has asked whether a non-citizen with an Aadhaar card should be given voting rights too the court said, aadhaar is to ensure social welfare benefits reach everyone, and this document must not automatically confer the right to vote.

The bench of Chief Justice of India Surya Kant and Justice Bagchi is hearing petitions challenging the validity of the Election Commission's move to conduct Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of voter lists in several states.

The bench reiterated that an Aadhaar card does not "confer absolute proof of citizenship". "That is why



we said it will be one of the documents on the list of documents. If anyone is deleted, they will have to be given a notice of deletion," it said.

The Aadhaar Act makes it clear that it does not confer citizenship or domicile.

"Aadhaar is a creation of statute for availing benefits. Just because a person was granted Aadhaar for ration, should he be made a voter also? Suppose someone belongs to a neighbouring country and works as a labourer," the



Chief Justice asked. The court also said that the Election Commission has the jurisdiction to determine the correctness of documents submitted with a Form 6 application seeking inclusion in a voter list. The poll body, it said, is not a "post office".

The Supreme Court also fixed the schedule to hear petitions specifically challenging SIR in Tamil Nadu, Kerala and West Bengal. The bench has asked the Election Commission to file

responses by December 1. The petitioners can then file their rejoinders and the matters will be taken up soon after. Earlier, appearing for some petitioners, Senior Advocate Kapil Sibal said the SIR raised fundamental concerns about democratic participation. He said SIR places an unconstitutional burden on ordinary voters, many of whom are illiterate. "Filling up the forms is not the responsibility of the elector. So many are illiterate and do not know how to read and write. If they cannot fill forms, they will be ousted from electoral rolls he said, urging the court to focus on constitutional safeguards rather than procedural justifications.

PATIALA : In the National Green Tribunal, a case of contaminated water in the stretch of Zirakpur - Banur was filed by Advocate Sunaina, highlighting that residents were forced to drink polluted, contaminated water. These residents, consequently, were suffering from serious waterborne diseases as such cholera, Jaundice, typhoid, diarrhoea, vomiting, abdominal pain, dehydration and skin ailment.

Taking timely action, a high level committee, was constituted by the Tribunal comprising members from Punjab Pollution Control Board, Health deptt, Water and Sewerage Board and ADCs of Patiala and Mohali districts to ascer-



tain the factual proceedings and suit report over the failure of authorities to provide safe drinking water. The constituted committee collected water samples from across the Zirakpur, Banur, reported that water at several places including Jawaharpur, Gholumajra villages failed to meet the prescribed drinking water specification and standards under IS:10500:2012.

The committee recom-



mended replacing of leaking pipelines, ensuring proper chlorination and water, treatment. In the National Green Tribunal, the Principal bench heard the matter and finding no initiative, the Tribunal expressed strong resentment, dismal improvement. After considerable lapse of time, residents are forced to continue consuming highly contaminated water with recurring outbreaks of diarrhoea and other stomach related illnesses

reported from parts of Zirakpur, Banur and nearby villages.

The Tribunal bench comprised chairperson Justice Prakash Shrivastava and expert member Dr Senthil Vel on Nov 18, passed a series of strict directions including supply of safe drinking waters and proper chlorination with water treatment. The Chief Secretary Punjab has been asked to file a personal affidavit along with action taken report within 8 weeks exhibiting remedial steps taken on the Tribunal's directions. The director Punjab Water Supply & Sewerage Board, Executive officer were directed to appear before the Tribunal on the next hearing date fixed on Feb 02, 2026 to explain status on the initiative compliance.

UN warns against no rule of law, fake constitutional amendment sans discussions

NEWYORK : "Hastily adopted 26th constitutional amendment threateningly undermine judicial freedom", said Volker Turk High Commissioner for Human Rights, on Friday.

On the United Nation's SNS platform, Turk said that the latest constitutional amendment, like the 26th Amendment, has been adopted without discussions with the legal community and the Pakistani people.

The military move raises grave concerns about its accountability and respect for the rule of law. These changes, taken together, risk subjugating the judiciary to political interference and executive control.

He addressed that these



amendments "risk far-reaching consequences for the principles of democracy and rule of law which the Pakistani people hold dear". Pakistan adopted changes on November 13 that grant powers over constitutional cases to a new Federal Constitutional Court. This takes away power from the Supreme Court, as it will now only deal with civil and criminal cases. The Pakistani military has now entered its most powerful

era, with army chief Asim Munir now acting as the country's first Chief of Defence Forces (CDF) on Thursday. This places the overall control of the CDF in the hands of the president and the cabinet.

Pakistani President Asif Ali Zardari signed the 27th Constitutional Amendment Bill on November 13, following its approval by both houses of Parliament. With his assent, the bill has now become part of Pakistan's Constitution.

The amendment grants life-long immunity to the President, Field Marshal, Marshal of the Air Force and Admiral of the Fleet from criminal proceedings and arrest.

Are pvt universities business centres, audit to disclose : SC

Asim Munir becomes dictator, controls all 3 defence deptt, Nukes

Islamabad : Pakistan's military is entering one of its most powerful eras, and that too without directly seizing power, with army chief Asim Munir taking charge as the country's first Chief of Defence Forces (CDF) on Thursday.

The exclusive post, created through the contentious 27th Amendment to the Pakistani Constitution, places Syed Asim Munir at the helm of all three services - the army, air force and navy - for a fixed 5-year term. The amendments, which were passed by the Senate on November 1, abolished the post of Chairman, Joint Chiefs of Staff Committee (CJCS), the senior-most tri-services role. It was created in 1976 by former Prime Minister Zulfikar Ali Bhutto following Pakistan's loss in the 1971 war with India. With the incumbent CJCS,



General Sahir Shamshad Mirza, retiring today, the position's decades-long presence in Pakistan's defence framework has ended.

A nuclear power of 240 million people, Pakistan has ebbed and flowed between civilian and military rule since its creation in 1947. The last military leader to openly govern the country was Pervez Musharraf, who seized power through a coup in 1999 and served as president until 2008.

Mouth watering 'Freebies' signal frustration

The opposition Mahagathbandhan was quick to up the ante, promising Rs 30,000 to every woman and a govt job for every household in the state. The recent Bihar election was, if anything, a masterclass in competitive populism. The governing NDA govt transferred Rs 10,000 to roughly 1.2cr women even as the campaign was on. There was an air of unreality about these promises, as though the political class had collectively suspended all fiscal arithmetic. In the end, the extravagant assurances of the opposition simply lacked credibility; voters appear to have concluded that there are limits to what even the most generous govt can deliver.

Freebies cancel each other out. When every competing party is distributing money or promising larger and larger handouts, the effect on the voter tends to diminish. The governing party's last-minute cash transfer may still have swayed some votes, but broader competitive promises tend to neutralise each other. And when promises stretch credulity, people simply stop believing them. That may well be the fate that befell Mahagathbandhan. Get the problem with

freebies runs much deeper. Govts that have come to power riding on a wave of generous guarantees now find themselves struggling to deliver on them. Andhra Pradesh is discovering that implementing its elaborate welfare architecture is far costlier than imagined. Telangana, after years of high-octane handouts, is wrestling with a fiscal hangover: Maharashtra and Karnataka are belatedly realising that ramping up social transfers has left little room for other discretionary expenditure. PM had once decried the revdi culture in politics and warned of the economic perils of excessive handouts. Yet, having witnessed their electoral potency, he now seems to have embraced them enthusiastically. This is not a partisan failing, it is a structural political problem. No party wants to be left behind in the freebie race. When electoral incentives are misaligned with fiscal prudence invariably loses.

The politics of freebies thus reflects a collapse of ambition. We are no longer debating how to create jobs, improve productivity, or build human capital. Instead, we are debating whether ₹10,000 is good enough when ₹30,000 can be promised. What makes this more worrisome is that neither the Centre nor the states are financing these giveaways out of surplus revenues. They are funding them through borrowing. That means pushing today's consumption onto tomorrow's taxpayers. The legislature, especially the

opposition, should be the first line of defence. But no opposition party dares criticise freebies for fear of appearing anti-poor or conceding political ground. In fact, the opposition often goads govt into announcing even more generous transfers so as to garner some credit for itself.

CAG, which can legitimately comment otsustainability of state finances, is hobbled by the inherent lag in audit reports. Long after the freebie of has been distributed and the political dividend reaped, the audit findings become irrelevant.

The market, which should price the risks of excessive borrowing, fails to do so because investors assume that the Centre will not allow states to default. This implicit sovereign guarantee distorts risk and removes an important disciplining mechanism.

Election Commission has been suggested as a possible referee, but this is neither desirable nor feasible EC can regulate campaign behaviour, not governance. And as an institution whose credibility depends on political neutrality, it should not be dragged into the political economy of welfare schemes.

We are therefore left with a peculiar situation: the political class has every incentive to overspend, and the institutional architecture has little capacity to restrain it. To be clear, some welfare spending is essential. In a country where millions struggle for daily livelihood sustainably; education, health, physical infra and job creation.

Prove Haryana's claim through documents : Panjab University

Grant for players, associations escalated by Chandigarh Sports Department

CHANDIGARH : The hike in the travelling allowance and diet money for local players representing the city at outstation events, has been incurred. Another step of two-fold hike in the allocation of grants to the local sports associations for conducting various championships and hosting national/international tournaments.

The executive committee of the UT Sports Department recently has enhanced financial assistance was approved during the meeting Players will now get Rs 100 refreshment each for tournaments and competitions, while the diet money has been increased to Rs 750 per player/official.

The budget for kits has been increased to Rs 2,500 per player/official. The local teams will now be eligible to travel in the 3rd AC (economy)/AC chair car/AC bus for outstation tournaments.

The local associations will now get a grant of Rs 60,000 each for conducting sub-junior state, junior state and senior state championships. In case of north



zone meet, the grant will be Rs 2 lakh. The sports body will get Rs 4 lakh for hosting a national championship, and Rs 5 lakh for an international meet.

“There was a need for enhancement in grants. The issue was raised by associations and also by other stakeholders. Besides revising the grants, the allowances for players and their budget for purchasing kits have also been increased,” said Sorabh Kumar Arora, Director Sports.

The grant will be released to the associations affiliated with Chandigarh Olympic Association or the Chandigarh Sports Council as per constitution, and as per the association's national body affiliation with the Indian Olympic Association (IOA) and the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports.

Civic body to formalise new MC limits by December end

MOHALI : Residents of TDI City, Balongi, Badhmajra, Balyali, Green Enclave have resented the decision to exclude the villages from the new civic body Limits and have even threatened to approach the court if their villages are not included in the new limits.

The expansion of the Municipal Corporation (MC) limits is set to be formalised before December 31, Local Bodies Department sources have disclosed.

After the deadline for suggestions and objections regarding the draft notification finished on November 6, the department has intensified the process to formalise the new MC limits as the government is keen to complete the process after much delay.

Mohali MLA Kulwant Singh said, “The government has taken the decision after much deliberation keeping in mind the pros and cons of the move. However, after the residents expressed their desire to include their villages in the notification, government is considering their demand sympathetically and the decision will be taken in the benefit of all concerned.”

Mayor Amarjit Singh Sidhu, meanwhile, “The House had resolved to include these villages in the new limits in 2021. But now the government



has taken a decision arbitrarily. We will support the residents of these village and will knock on the doors of the court if AAP government does not reconsider its decision.”

Significantly, the government will have to complete the entire process before December 31 as the Registrar General of India and Census Commissioner Mrityunjay Kumar Narayan in a letter to Chief Secretaries of states and UTs has stated that the administrative boundaries will be frozen on December 31, disallowing the states and Union Territories to change the boundaries of its municipalities, panchayats, police stations, sub-districts and districts from January 1 2025 to March 31, 2027.

The first phase of the Census 2026 will begin from April 1. The house-listing operation will begin on April 1, 2026 whereas population enumeration will start on February 1, 2027.

Clarify the role of French agency in Manimajra water supply : AFD

CHANDIGARH : In the Manimajra pilot project of 24x7 water supply. Agence Francaise de Developpment (AFD), the French agency which is going to provide Rs 413 crore loan.

Under the 24x7 water supply project for pan city Chandigarh, has asked the MC to issue a press release, clarifying that there is no role of the AFD and the EU.

In a letter written by Lise Breuil, AFD India Country Director, to Amit Kumar, Commissioner, MC dated October 24, it has been stated that, “Pursuant to our discussion on October 9 regarding the temporary suspension of project activities of the AFD-supported Chandigarh 24x7 water supply project, I recall the consequent actions to be taken by the MC team at the earliest on priority, as mutually agreed and directed by yourself during the said meeting: Firstly, clearing of dues of the LTTA



consultant by the MC, covering costs incurred till September 30, as it involves significant reputational risk to both AFD and the EU and secondly, a press release by the MC to clarify that there was no role of AFD and the EU in the Manimajra project.

The letter further said that “We remain available for any further discussion regarding the project implementation, including intended additional field studies to be concluded by the MC within the next 6 months.

The credit facility agreement was signed with AFD in New Delhi on September 15, 2022, for

implementation of the project. As per the agreement, the AFD was going to provide Rs 413 crore for the project in the form of a loan, to be repaid in 15 years.

In addition to it, the EU promised to give a grant of Rs 98 crore.

The project has a financial outlay of Rs 591 crore and is expected to be completed by 2027. It was claimed during the signing of the agreement that once the 24x7 water supply project is completed the consumers will get round-the-clock water supply without any interruption. But after signing of the project no significant progress has been made.

State Election Commission suspends Mohali zila parishad, panchayat samiti polls

CHANDIGARH : On the recommendation of the Department of Rural Development and Panchayats, elections for electing members of Zila Parishad Panchayat Samiti Mohali have been adjourned by the State Election Commission. Mohali were adjourned by State Election Commissioner Raj Kamal Chaudhari.

These elections were due on December 14. “The State Election Commission has been informed by Department of Rural Development and Panchayats that in view of the notification dated November 28, 2025, issued by Department of Local Government, 15 villages adjoining Municipal



Corporation, Mohali, have now been merged into the boundaries of Municipal Corporation, Mohali. The Department of Rural Development and Panchayats has clarified that due to this notification, the 15 Gram Panchayats of Panchayat Samiti, Mohali, are now excluded from the jurisdiction of the concerned Panchayat Samiti/Zila Parishad Mohali area. As there is now a significant

change in the boundaries of Panchayat Samiti Mohali as well as Zila Parishad area, the Department of Rural Development and Panchayats is required to carry out the fresh reorganisation of the same,” he said, clarifying the reason for the adjournment of the election.

These elections will remain adjourned till such time as fresh reorganisation of these zones is not carried out by the Department of Rural Development and Panchayats. To clarify further, the election to elect members of Panchayat Samiti Dera Bassi, Panchayat Samiti Kharar and Panchayat Samiti Majri will proceed as scheduled he said.

Rs 1.18-cr relief awarded to kin of road accident victim

The opposing parties would pay the amount with an interest at the rate of 9 per cent per annum added the MACT.

The victim, Sunil Kumar, was heading to Aligarh from Chandigarh in a car.



when he reached near a PVR cinema in Panipat, a truck suddenly applied brakes without any indication. As a result, the car rammed into the vehicle and Kumar suffered severe injuries and later died. He is survived by his wife, Shitala, and a minor daughter. In the claim petition filed through advocate Thakur Kartar Singh under

Section 166 of the Motor Vehicle Act, 1988, Shitala, a resident of Himachal Pradesh, had said her husband was a manager in a private company and the sole breadwinner of the family.

The driver and owner of the truck opposed the claim petition. However, after hearing the arguments, the Tribunal directed the respondents to pay a total compensation of Rs 1,18,33,150 at an interest rate of nine per cent per annum.

Datesheet of CBSE Class 10, 12 released, exams to begin on Feb 17, 2026

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No timeline for discussion on SIR, Opposition walks out of RS

NEW DELHI : The Opposition's demand to discuss Special Intensive Revision exercise and electoral reforms was under consideration of the government but no timelines should be set, said Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju on Monday. Rijiju said "the government is not averse to the matter related to whatever the opposition calls it, special intensive revision or electoral reforms or whatever." "I have stated before the beginning of the winter session that the government is not averse to taking up discussion on anything. Please give us some time while there are other businesses, which are listed, that can be taken up. The demand, which you have put forward, has not been rejected. So, don't presume that the government is not ready to discuss any matter but please do not put a condition of time." Earlier, Leader of Opposition

Mallikarjun Kharge demanded that the discussion should start immediately. Kharge also said the government should stop trying to divide the Opposition. "Don't divide us. If you try to divide us, we will be stronger," Kharge said. TMC's Derek O'Brien also sought a debate on electoral reforms with immediate effect and CPM's John Brittas said the Parliamentary Affairs Minister should honour his word and the House should hold a discussion on electoral reforms. 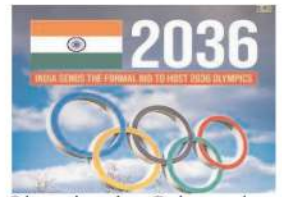

BJP's commitment to make Thiruvananthapuram 2036 Olympics venue generate political uproar

Thiruvananthapuram : BJP Kerala unit urge it would request the Centre to include the city as one of the venues for the 2036 Games. In its manifesto for the Thiruvananthapuram Corporation election. BJP's local body election manifesto promise to develop the state capital into a co-host city for the 2036 Olympics triggered a political row, with leaders of both LDF and UDF on Monday calling it a fake claim. The International Olympic Committee is yet to announce the host for the 2036 edition of the world's biggest sporting event. However, there have been reports that India is bidding for the Games with Ahmedabad as its proposed main host city. Kerala Education Minister V Sivankutty accused BJP of deceiving the people of Thiruvananthapuram. "When the Union Government has bid for the



Olympics in Gujarat, how can BJP here claim that Thiruvananthapuram will be a venue?" He further said as part of the bidding process, BJP is planning for the 2030 Commonwealth Games in Ahmedabad, he claimed. He asked whether BJP state president Rajeev Chandrasekhar considered the people of Thiruvananthapuram "fools". "The proposal submitted to the Olympic body has no mention of Thiruvananthapuram. This is a trick because BJP has nothing to say about development," he said. Senior Congress leader K Muraliedharan also hit out at BJP on its election manifesto,

saying that, fearing defeat, the party had begun making "fake promises". "They know they would not even become the main opposition party this time. Hence, such claims," he said. State Revenue Minister K Rajan echoed a similar view, stating that the host for the 2036 Olympics had yet to be announced, but BJP claimed the event would be held in Thiruvananthapuram. Reacting to the criticism Chandrasekhar said that other political parties would realise the proposal later. "They do not understand how it will happen. We will teach them after we get the opportunity to govern," he said. BJP is currently the main opposition in the CPI(M)-governed Thiruvananthapuram Corporation. The local body election in the state will be held in two phases on December 9 and 11.

7,000 km high-speed rail corridors would be built by 2047: Vaishnaw

NEW DELHI : High-speed routes, designed for maximum speeds of up to 350 km per hour and an operating speed of 320 km per hour, will mark a transformative leap in India's rail infrastructure, said the Union railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw while inaugurating the 16th International Railway Equipment Exhibition (IREE), 2025, at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi. Unveiling an ambitious roadmap for the Railways, on Wednesday announced that the government plans to build 7,000 km of dedicated passenger corridors by 2047 under the Viksit Bharat vision. Vaishnaw said the proposed corridors would be powered by indigenously developed signaling systems and modern operations control centres, ensuring both speed and safety. He also outlined the



government's futuristic vision for Vande Bharat 4.0, Amrit Bharat 4.0, and next-generation railway manufacturing standards. Highlighting the success of the Vande Bharat series, he said the third-generation train already meets global parameters, with acceleration from 0 to 100 kmph in just 52 seconds, faster than many trains in Japan and Europe, while maintaining low noise and vibration levels. "Vande Bharat 4.0 will be a new benchmark in performance and passenger experience," said Vaishnaw, adding that the upcoming

model will focus on superior seats, enhanced toilets, and refined workmanship. Discussing the Amrit Bharat series, the minister said the 2.0 version is already operational and the 3.0 model, based on push-pull technology, is being developed for long-distance routes. The 4.0 version, he added, will bring in new-generation trainsets and locomotives, expected to be ready for testing within 36 months. Vaishnaw credited Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership for what he termed "a decade of modernisation," noting that more than 35,000 km of new rail lines have been laid and 46,000 km of electrification completed in the past 11 years. "Our budget allocation for the Railways has consistently risen, reflecting the government's commitment to a modern, self-reliant network," he said.

23 daily departures to be held by Navi Mumbai International Airport from Dec 25

MUMBAI : In the first month, Navi Mumbai International Airport (NMIA) will operate for 12 hours between 8 am and 8 pm, handling 23 scheduled daily departures. During this period, the airport will manage up to 10 flight movements per hour, a release said on Monday. NMIA will start commercial flight operations from December 25 and initially, there will be 23 scheduled daily departures. The airport has been developed by Navi Mumbai International Airport Pvt Ltd (NMIAL), a special purpose vehicle jointly owned by Adani Group and the City and Industrial Development Corporation of Maharashtra Ltd (CIDCO). NMIA, the second main airport in the Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR), was inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on October 8. In the initial phase, the airport will handle around 120 air traffic movements daily. From February 2026, the airport will transition to round-the-clock operations,



expanding to 34 daily departures. "The inaugural flight to arrive at NMIA will be IndiGo 6E460 from Bengaluru, scheduled to touchdown at 8:00 am. Shortly after, IndiGo 6E882 will depart for Hyderabad at 8:40 am, marking the first outbound service from the new airport. "During the initial launch period, passengers will benefit from services operated by IndiGo, Air India Express, and Akasa Air, connecting Mumbai to 16 major domestic destinations," the release said. The first phase of NMIA has been built at a cost of Rs 19,650 crore. Spread across 1,160 hectares, the airport will have one terminal and one runway in the first phase with an annual passenger handling capacity of 20 million.

PANIPAT : The drain covers approximately 40-km stretch in Panipat district and 10 km in Karnal. In Panipat, drain-1 and drain-2, considered to be the major cause behind the Yamuna pollution, flow through the city and rural areas. To reduce the pollution load in Yamuna, the Irrigation Department would treat the water flow at three places -- Kachroli, Kurar and Khojkipur - before it meets the river. The department has constructed a storage reservoir-cum-match box treatment structure at drain number 2 near Kurar village to treat the water. The process to construct two more structures is underway. The 8-km-long drain-1 flows from Kabri road to Chautala road and after that it meets drain-2, which meets the Yamuna at Khojkipur village. Scores of industrial units, bleaching and dyeing units along drain-2 discharge untreated effluent directly into it. As per the sources, the samples collected by the HSPCB from Khojkipur failed multiple laboratory tests and also revealed severe pollution levels. The biological oxygen demand (BOD), chemical oxygen demand (COD), the total dissolved solids (TDS), oil and grease were found more than permissible limits.



Now, to reduce the pollution load in Yamuna, the Irrigation Department has decided to treat the water of drain-2 in stretches before it meets with Yamuna. Suresh Saini, XEN, Irrigation Department said approximately 80 cusec water, which is badly polluted, flows on an average during the non-rainy season. During the rainy season, the heavy water flows from it due to which the pollution is diluted and the drain gets cleaned, he further said. Now, it has been decided to treat the drain water by making three MBT structures at Kachroli, Kurar and Khojkipur. The structure at Kurar has been constructed at Rs 10 crore, he said. As per the project, the water would be stored in the drain for around 15 days at Kachroli, Kurar and Khojkipur. A total 98 hectare metre water would be stored in the 12 km area at

Kachroli for around 5-6 days. Around 112 hectare metre water would be stored in around 13.5-km area at Kurar and after that around 125 hectare water would be stored at Khojkipur MBT structure in 14.50-km stretch, he said. During the storage at three steps, water would be treated and its BOD and COD level would be reduced with aerator and other equipment, he added. According to the project, approximately 335 hectare metre water would be stored at three places, which would not only increase the ground water level, but also make micro-irrigation in 10,000 acres possible, he said. Recently, Rajesh Khullar, Chief Principal Secretary to Chief Minister visited Kurar village to inquire about the MBT structure and also directed for sampling of the water after storage and after releasing of the water. DC Virender Kumar Dahiya said the tender process for the Kachroli project has begun while the department has prepared estimates for the Khojkipur project. These projects would help farmers in irrigation and fisheries, the groundwater would be recharged and the clean water would be discharged into Yamuna, which would also help in reducing the pollution load, the Deputy Commissioner maintained.

New Delhi : Additional Public Prosecutor (APP) Atul Srivastava appeared for the police and argued that the Magistrate's orders are without reference to any legal provision and possibly a case of judicial over reach.

Three days after the Delhi Police filed an FIR against Rahul Gandhi, Sonia Gandhi and others in the National Herald case, a Magistrate ordered the police to inform the Gandhis and other accused about the development and share a copy of the FIR.

However, a Sessions Court stayed the order two days later after the police filed a revision plea.

Delhi Police's Economic Offences Wing (EOW) filed an FIR on October 3, naming the Gandhis, Sam Pitroda, Suman Dubey, Young Indian and others



as accused for the offences of cheating, dishonest misappropriation of property and criminal breach of trust along with criminal conspiracy. The FIR was based on information provided by the Enforcement Directorate (ED) under Section 66 (2) of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA). The ED is already probing the money laundering angle in the case. Those proceedings are based on a cognisance order of the court on a criminal complaint filed by BJP leader Subramanian Swamy. According to Court records, on October 4, the police filed a copy of the

FIR before the Court of the Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate (ACJM). Two days later, the ACJM directed the police to inform the accused about the said FIR and to supply a copy to them.

However, on October 8, the Police challenged this order. The matter was listed before Special Judge (PC Act) Vishal Gogne of the Rouse Avenue Courts. Special Public Prosecutor (SPP) Zoheb Hossain, also appearing for EOW, stated that the ACJM's directions were in violation of the Supreme Court judgment and that there was no application from any accused for the court to direct the supply of the copy of the FIR. After hearing these arguments, the Sessions Judge stayed the Magistrate's order. The case is now listed for December 15.

his last post on X, which was made 24 days ago, might provide great insight. Posted on Imran Khan's behalf on November 5, after his meeting with his sister in Rawalpindi's Adiala Jail, the remarks might hold clues to the Pakistani leader's present state. It also points to who could be responsible, and why. It's almost a no-brainer who Imran Khan pointed to. In that post, he mentioned just "one man" was responsible, who he said was Asim Munir, the Army Chief and now the powerful head of Pakistan's defence forces. Khan referred to him six

times in the post. Imran Khan's November 5 message from Adiala Jail was explosive. He claimed there is "no rule of the Constitution or the law" in Pakistan, only the rule of "Asim Law".

The former Pakistani PM accused Asim Munir of running the entire country single-handedly, calling him "the most tyrannical dictator in history" who is "capable of doing anything to satisfy his lust for power". Khan said that he and wife Bushra Bibi were facing "every form of cruelty", and vowed that he would "neither bow down nor submit". Khan ended by saying that "all power rests in the hands of one man" and that his party, the PTI, would not negotiate with what he called a "puppet government" of PM Shehbaz Sharif.

The community water purification plants need to be augmented. The control over expansion of fluorsis need to be endemic, sources revealed. The accessibility to safe drinking water has been eloping with the discharge of untreated chemicals, effluents into the ground water, and depletion not halting for a cause. The multiplying cases of cancer are not being contained duo to the surge in bacterial growth. Pathogens like bacteria and viruses are being experienced as a very common hazard with the rural public life. Afflicted several health issues might be arthritis, infertility, hypertension, neurotoxicity and increased risk of skeletal cancer, reveals an official. Additionally prolonged exposure can damage organs like liver, kidneys, lungs and testis. Water contamination has been posing immediate and chronic health threats, needs seriouses contemplation, medication and panacea.
