## Toilet cleaning in Sacrilege case assigned to Sukhbir Badal by Akal Takht

Chandigarh : The sentence by Akal Takhat came after Mr Badal had tendered an unconditional apology to the Akal Takht admitting his mistakes.

Akal Takht, the highest temporal body of Sikhs, has sentenced former Punjab Deputy Chief Minister Sukhbir Badal the toilet cleaning duty besides kitchen and bathrooms of several Gurdwaras including Amritsar's Golden Temple, for favouring Dera Sacha Sauda chief Gurmeet Ram Rahim in the 2015 sacrilege of Guru Granth Sahib. His father, the late Parkash Singh Badal, the former Chief Minister of Punjab,



has been stripped of the Fakhr-e-Qaum (pride of the Sikh community) honour, bestowed on him in 2011 for services to the community. Sukhbir Badal, who is wheelchair-bound, and the core committee members and the leaders of the Akali Dal, who were cabinet members in 2015, will clean the bathrooms at Amritsar's

Golden Temple on December 3 from 12 noon to 1 pm. After this, they will take a bath and serve langar. On Monday, the five high priests of the Sikhs -- led by Akal Takht jathedar Giani Raghbir Singh -- announced the quantum of 'tankhah (religious punishment for misconduct)'.

Advisory on social media use in adolescence stage would be proven problematic and could impair the capability on daily role in under developed age.

They step on banning of social media in India may be welcome step yet there would need for promotion of its healthy use, said Dr

Rajesh Sagar, professor of psychiatry at AIIMS Delhi. The ban proposal would capture the reality that children whose minds are developed enough in heavy access to regulate screen-time are being given these devices sans any checks and balances in places remarked Dr Paramjit Rastogi, child and adolescent psychiatrist at STEPS centre for Mental Health.

EDITORIAL –

## Handshake with Dragon to remain unpragmatic

In the kind of strategic setting, India has to keep its leverages well-honed. Surprisingly, we have not optimised these aspects in the past and followed a path of appeasement against a wily and shrewd adversary like China. First and foremost is the Tibet issue, which seems to have increasingly lost salience internationally. The fact that the spiritual and political head of Tibet was given sanctuary in India was seen as a hostile act by the Chinese. That the Central Tibetan Administration (CTA), also labelled as the Tibetan Government-in-Exile, was allowed to be set up in Dharamsala has always irked the Chinese Communist Party. The much construed government policy regarding the bilateral engagement with China is predicated on restoring peace and tranquillity along the Line of Actual Control (LAC); this includes de-escalation and disengagement in east Ladakh. Overemphasis on this aspect can well be interpreted as a strident stance reflective of a strong political will, but not pragmatism. China is not only our biggest neighbour but also a major international power with whom it would be prudent to remain engaged on a variety of issues of mutual interest and at various forums. Despite the tensions on the borders, India and China continue to be important members of international groupings like the Shanghai C o o p e r a t i o n Organisation and BRICS. In fact, the latter is expanding in a big way, with several nations around the globe seeking its membership. India and China have been on the same page at various fora, like the IMF and the WTO, and have expressed their solidarity against the position adopted by developed countries. Both nations also share a long history of cooperation and coordination on

environmental issues at global platforms. Despite China's deep concerns about the Quad grouping, it would understand that India is strategically autonomous. The economic engagement in terms of India-China trade ties has been on the rise and it has been one of our largest sources of imports for the past 15 years despite efforts to reduce this dependency through import substitution and free trade agreements with ASEAN countries. This has resulted in an increasing trade deficit, skewed in favour of China. However, these commonalities, the tense and inimical situation on the LAC is likely to continue, with the possibility of unpleasant face-offs between the Indian Army and the PLA. The military commander-level talks in east Ladakh have meandered on and become an exercise in filibustering by the Chinese. The Indian Army has responded strongly and built up its capabilities with enhanced deployment of troops and equipment. In short, for us, it's a policy of containment on the northern borders and calibrated engagement on other issues. In 1959, it was a bold move, but over the years, the Chinese hysteria about Tibet and 'splittist' Tibetans has seen India go overboard in trying to downplay this card. This attitude towards a country that makes no attempt to hide its views about J&K, disregarding Indian sensitivities, is puzzling. China has no compunction in obstructing Indian efforts at the UNO to include Pakistani perpetrators of terrorism on the list of designated terrorists. That a permanent member of the Security Council behaves in such an egregious fashion only shows that it places the narrow interests of its close ally — Pakistan — over international obligations.

The CTA now increasingly controls political aspects, with the Dalai Lama stepping into the shadows, though it is his charisma that continues to be the principal asset of the Tibetan cause. The future of the institution of the Dalai Lama is somewhat uncertain, with the present incumbent, who is getting on in years, having even mentioned that it may cease after his demise. The Chinese as well as the Indian government may have their own game plans, but the CTA is here to stay and needs to be played up in a manner which becomes a leveraging point for India. Taiwan is the most sensitive issue for China, with the US playing hot and cold in the game of power politics in the South China Sea. India, while recognising the one-China principle, has semi-formal contacts and relations with Taipei. The India-Taipei Association in Taiwan and Taipei Economic and Cultural Centre in India are quasi-missions that recognise the extensive trade relations between India and Taiwan. Visits by retired chiefs of the armed forces, politicians and artistes recognise the fact that Taiwan cannot be wished away. Interestingly, PM Narendra Modi had visited Taiwan in 1999, when he was a BJP functionary. This needs to continue and gather more substance. Communist China has blatantly disregarded Indian sensitivities about Kashmir's territorial inviolability as an integral part of this country by building the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, which runs through Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. To pay back in the same coin and create a pressure point for hard bargaining, India needs to play up the Taiwan issue, creating ambiguity about its status.

## Registration of ferocious canines still hangs in balance

**Commissioner News Service PANCHKULA :** The decision over dog breeds was being taken in a bid to control the population of these ferocious dog breeds, said officials. The MC had banned the breeding and keeping of such ferocious dogs in residences in October 2022 and directed the owners of such dogs to get their pets registered or face a hefty fine. However, the pet owners in continue to ignore MC's directions and have failed to register these canines. Over a year and a half after imposing a complete ban on the breeding of ferocious dog breeds — pitbulls and rottweilers — the Municipal Corporation is mulling the registration of dogs of such breeds only if these have

been sterilised. The MC had recently issued directions for the registration of pets. The MC Commissioner had said teams might take dogs into their custody in case these were found roaming in streets without leash. As per data accessed from the MC, residents have registered 128 pet dogs with the civic body in fiscal 2023-24. MC officials said physical applications were not accepted. "The applications for registration of pets are accepted through the Saral Haryana website," said an official.



## In Punjab single-phase polling on June 1



**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** The state has nine general constituencies, including Gurdaspur, Amritsar, Khadoor Sahib, Anandpur Sahib, Ludhiana, Ferozepur, Bathinda, Sangrur and Patiala. The four reserved seats (SC) include Jalandhar, Hoshiarpur, Fatehgarh Sahib and Faridkot. With the Election Commission announcing seven-phase Lok Sabha poll schedule elections on 13 parliamentary seats in the state will be held on June 1. The General Election will commence on April 19 and the votes will be counted on June 4. As of March 1, the state has 2,12,71,245 voters out of which 1,19,29,959 are men, 1,07,75,543 women and as many as 744 are transgender voters. The state has a total of 24,433 polling stations.

In the 2019 Lok Sabha poll, the Congress recorded victory on eight seats, SAD and the BJP won two seats each and AAP one. So far, only AAP has announced eight candidates—Ministers Gurmeet Singh Meet Hayer (Sangrur), Dr Balbir Singh (Patiala), Kuldeep Singh Dhaliwal (Amritsar), Laljit Singh Bhullar (Khadoor Sahib) and Gurmeet Singh Khuddian (Bathinda). The three others include Sushil Rinku (Jalandhar), Karamjit Anmol (Faridkot) and Gurpreet Singh GP (Fatehgarh Sahib). Meanwhile, three prominent Congress leaders—Rinku, GP and Chabbewal—have switched their loyalty towards AAP. There's a buzz of more leaving shortly incase their "political aspirations were not respected by the party high command".

## Consumer Commission penalises IRCTC to pay Rs 10,000 for serving dead cockroach in soup in Shatabdi

**Commissioner News Service CHANDIGARH :** Indian Railway Catering and Tourism Corporation Limited (IRCTC) and Northern Railway would pay a compensation of Rs 10,000 to a city resident for causing mental agony and harassment by serving soup with dead cockroach. The District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission, Chandigarh, has directed the railway authorities to implement the order. The commission also ordered payment of Rs 5,000 as cost of litigation to the complainant. In a complaint filed before the commission, Rahil Mahajan said he and his mother were travelling from New Delhi to Chandigarh in Shatabdi on September 3 last year. They were served hot soup and bread on board by catering staff of the OPs (Railway and IRCTC). After taking some soup, he noticed a dead cockroach in the bowl and immediately called the catering staff and informed them about it. Rahil also brought the fact to the notice of co-passengers. He clicked



photographs of the cockroach in bowl and recorded his grievance in the IRCTC complaint booklet. He also informed the train incharge/TC. The complainant had tweeted about it on the official account of the Railway Ministry and was assured that action would be taken as per procedure. The complainant stated that the bread served to him was expired as the package mentioned 'best to use before September 2'. The IRCTC denied the charges and claimed that the complainant had filed the false complaint. amount to deficiency in service and unfair trade practice, the commission stated.

## Nephew of Raksha elderly woman, another 4 held for robbing

**Chandigarh:** Four persons have been arrested by the UT police for robbing an 82-year-old woman, Raksha Sharma, at her home in Sector 27. Among the suspects is her nephew, Jaswant Singh. The other suspects are Virender Kumar, alias Som (39); Jasmeet Singh, alias Sharry (29); and Kaka, alias Golu (43), all residents of Ludhiana. The incident took place in the early hours on November 26. The accused, with their faces covered, broke into the victim's home on the first floor of a shop-cum-flat (SCF) while she was asleep. Armed with sharp weapons, they climbed the grill of a trans- former located next to the house to gain entry in the premises. They held the elderly



woman captive and took away jewellery worth several lakhs and Rs 37,000 in cash. During the investigation, the police apprehended the accused from Ludhiana. During interrogation, they said they hid the stolen jewellery at various locations in the city and handed over some to a co accused, Shetty. The police said Jaswant orchestrated the robbery after learning that his aunt had a substantial amount of gold. He, along with his accomplices, arrived in the city on the morning of

November 25. They decided to wait until the next day to rob the woman and spent the day in Sector 17. According to police record, Jaswant already has three cases registered against him, including those of theft and the Arms Act. Kaka was involved in a theft case in 2021, while Jasmeet also had a criminal past. The police said all accused did drugs. The accused were produced before the court and the Judge sent them to two-day police custody.

## Time period extended for upgradation of Chandigarh railway station until May 31

**CHANDIGARH :** Initially set for April 10, 2024, the project's timeline has been revised to May 31. The railway officers from the headquarters and Ambala division took stock of works being carried out under the Amrit Bharat Stations scheme. Local railway station's transformative upgrade, designed as a prototype for future stations, has encountered an extension in its completion deadline. The station is being upgraded with innovative modular designs and prefabricated components. The contract has been awarded to M/s Ahluwalia Contracts (India) Limited at a cost of Rs 462 crore. Buildings (G+3) of sizes 60m x 42m each are planned on both



sides of the station. The ground floor features essential services such as ticket counters, book stalls, a souvenir shop, a retail shop, railway offices and an executive lounge. The second floor will house enquiry counters, a food court, retail shops, a cloak room and a paid waiting lounge. The third floor will have an exclusive food court. An air-concourse (72m x 80m) will connect the second floors of the two buildings. The platforms will be accessible through lifts, escalators and stairs from the concourse. Two foot overbridges

(each 12 m wide) are strategically positioned on the Kalka and Ambala ends of the station. These will be used by arriving passengers and will also be connected with the station building. A through roof, measuring 180m x 80m, covering the entire area of air-concourse and both the foot overbridges is an important feature. The present parking area on both sides of the station are being developed and is being increased from the existing 13,720 sq m to 24,515 sq m.

## Protesting farmers break police barricades, begin march towards Delhi

NOIDA : The farmers had announced that they will march towards Delhi to demand a discussion on MSP Farmers from Punjab, who announced that they will march towards Delhi to demand a discussion on Minimum Support Price (MSP), broke police barriers near the Dalit Prerna Sthal in Noida and began moving towards Delhi. With the first group of farmers, led by the Bharatiya Kisan Parishad, kickstarting their march on Monday, police put up barricades and issued advisory for commuters travelling from Noida to Delhi.

Protesting farmers broke through barricades on Monday afternoon as they launched a Delhi Chalo march to press for various demands. Security forces have implemented a 3-tier security plan and deployed around 5000 police personnel and 1,000 PSC workers in various locations



for checking. Officials said that water cannon, TGS squad, fire squad and others have also been deployed for emergency and trafficmanagement. Efforts are underway to manage traffic in and out of Delhi as vehicles found themselves waiting for hours in long queues.

Multi-layered barricades had been put up at the two border points at Shambhu and Khanauri where protesting farmers have been camping. A number of farmers have remained at the Shambhu and Khanauri border points between Punjab and Haryana since their protest

march was stopped by security forces in mid-February. The last round of talks with the Centre was held soon after the incident but failed to elicit results.

Last week, the farmers announced that they would intensify their agitation and start a fast unto death from November 26. The protesters also said that they had opted to march towards Delhi after waiting "peacefully for the government (to reach out) for nine months".

New Delhi : Amid protests by opposition members over the Adani indictment row, recent violence in Uttar Pradesh's Sambhal and other issues,both houses were adjourned on Monday. Quick,there was a breakthrough also (December, 2024) in the more than a week-long Parliament logjam with the Government and Opposition reaching a consensus on holding a discussion on the Constitution,Bangla Desh, Sambhal issues in both the Houses. The ruling side also agreed to allow certain issues like the situation in Bangladesh and violence in Sambhal to be raised during Zero Hour, but did not accede to any discussion on

the Adani indictment matter. Opposition Congress on its part decided not to disrupt the Parliament any further over the Adani issue. The breakthrough on Parliament functioning came at a meeting of floor leaders of all parties called by Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla, where the government conceded to the demand for holding a discussion on the Constitution on December 13-14 in Lok Sabha and December 16-17 in the Rajya Sabha. The demand had been made by Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge as well as Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi in separate letters to Rajya Sabha Chairperson Jagdeep Dhankhar and Mr Birla respectively last week.

## Kwality Ltd, Ice Cream Company, in 1,400 Crore Bank Fraud raided by ED

New Delhi – The Enforcement Directorate (ED) intercepted a series of searches at multiple locations across Delhi and its neighboring regions in connection with a money laundering probe linked to the former promoters of the now-liquidated dairy giant, Kwality Ltd.

Around a dozen premises were being raided under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA). The investigation stems from a 2020 First Information Report (FIR) filed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) against Kwality Ltd. and its directors,revealed the sources.

The company deceived a consortium of 10 banks, led



by the Bank of India, causing financial losses exceeding ₹1,400 crore. dictated the First Information Report. The case involves accusations of inflating financial statements and misappropriating loan funds. ED officials are targeting the residences and offices of the company's former

promoters, directors, and other key individuals as part of the ongoing investigation once a leading name in the dairy industry, began as an ice-cream manufacturing company before expanding into a diversified range of milk-based products. The company's former directors, are under scrutiny in the probe.

## Didi calls for UN peacekeeping force, but dismissed by Dhaka

KOLKATA: CM Mamata Banerjee on Monday urged PM Modi and Centre "to request the United Nations to deploy a peacekeeping force in Bangladesh," and sought the PM's "intervention" to bring back persecuted Indians from the neighbouring country. She also demanded a statement on Bangladesh in the Parliament by the PM, and if he was unavailable, by external affairs minister S Jaishankar.

After the meeting which lasted about an hour, Mahajan said, went to see Shinde to enquire about his health .

"Everything is fine in the Mahayuti. Shinde has a big heart, he is not one of those who gets angry over small

things, he is not upset. From tomorrow everyone will be seen working together. We will run the government strongly for five years," he added .

In another development, NCP chief Ajit Pawar met party colleague Praful Patel at his residence in Delhi. Pawar will arrive in Mumbai tomorrow. According to sources, the BJP leaders, Shinde and Pawar will go to the Azad Maidan to review the preparations for the swearing-in ceremony and will also show their unity.

Earlier in the day, BJP leader Sudhir Mungantiwar declared that Devendra Fadnavis will be the Maharashtra chief minister. "It is my opinion that the decision will be taken in the meeting of the legislative party, BJP will not give any surprise," he asserted.
