



U.S. Veterans May Now Salute Old Glory

they can or should salute the flag.

U.S. veterans may now salute the flag, thanks to the efforts of U.S. Senator Jim Inhofe (R-Okla.). Inhofe's Senate Bill 1877 passed by unanimous consent, clarifying U.S. law to allow veterans and servicemen not in uniform to salute the flag. Previous law (US Code Title 4, Chapter 1) states that veterans and servicemen not in uniform should place their hand over their heart without clarifying whether



The new legislation removes the confusion and makes it clear that veterans and service members not in uniform may render the military salute. It's my understanding that you may salute the Flag whether you are covered or not.

INCOMING COMMANDER LTC JAMES T. "TOM" SCHUMACHER



LTC Schumacher was born and raised in Fayetteville, NC, and is a 1984 alumnus of Reid Ross High School. He attended the Virginia Military Institute for 1 1/2 years prior to enlisting in the US Army in 1985 as a communications specialist. He then graduated from the Special Forces Medical Qualification Course in 1990 and served on several A-teams until he departed as a Sergeant First Class to attend the Army's Physician Assistant Program at Fort Sam Houston, Texas. After graduating magna cum laude in Physician Assistant Studies from the University of Texas at San Antonio, LTC Schumacher was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the Army Medical Specialist Corps in 1996. He received his Masters Degree with

honors from the University of Nebraska in 2005. He is a graduate of the Command and General Staff College, Military Freefall and Special Forces Combat Diver courses and the US Army Ranger School. His operational medical experience includes four assignments as a Battalion Physician Assistant with the following units: 3d Ranger Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment (Airborne), Fort Benning, GA; 245th Area Support Battalion, Fort Clayton, Panama; 1st Battalion (Airborne), 321st Field Artillery Regiment, Fort Bragg, NC and most recently, the 1st Brigade Special Troops Battalion, 1st Brigade Combat Team, 1st Cavalry Division, Baghdad, Iraq. Additionally, he has served as a special staff officer with the 82nd Airborne Division as the Senior Physician Assistant and Deputy Surgeon for Clinical Operations. Subsequently, he served on the XVIII Airborne Corps staff as the Senior Physician Assistant and culminated that assignment serving as the Task Force Bragg Surgeon. He also commanded both the Bravo and Headquarters Companies of the 261st Area Support Medical Battalion (Airborne) and the Headquarters & Headquarters Company of the 44th Medical Command (Airborne), all at Fort Bragg, NC. His most recent assignment was serving at the Phase II Program Manager for the Interservice Physician Assistant Program at Womack Army Medical Center.

LTC Schumacher has earned the Special Forces and Ranger tabs, the Combat Action Badge, and the Expert Field Medical Badge. Additionally, he has completed the Army Airborne and Flight Surgeon courses. His individual awards include the Bronze Star Medal (1 OLC), the Meritorious Service Medal (3 OLC), the Army Commendation Medal (8 OLC), the Army Achievement Medal (10 OLC), numerous Campaign and Service Medals and the Venezuelan, 42nd Parachutist Brigade, Honor and Merit Badge.

Throughout his 24-year Army career, LTC Schumacher has been assigned to Wurzburg, Germany; Fort Bragg, NC (twice); Fort Clayton, Panama; Fort Benning, GA. He and his wife, Cheryl, have two children. Nadine is a senior at the Virginia Military Institute and Sam is a freshman at Central Carolina Community College and a private in the North Carolina National Guard.




