On behalf of the North Andrew Board of Education and all of us who work with and support your children, I want to welcome you back for another exciting school year!!

The North Andrew school district is planning on in person learning again in 2021-22. The following mitigation measures will be in place in order to keep everyone as safe as possible throughout the school year.

- 1) Universal and correct wearing of masks: Masks will not be required to be worn in-building or at school events, unless deemed necessary and communicated by North Andrew Administration and Board of Education. Masks are allowed and encouraged in places that we will not be able to social distance. Posters throughout the building remind students and staff of correct mask wearing procedures. The school district will continue to keep abreast and work to remain consistent with current CDC guidelines.
- 2) Physical distancing: Our smaller class sizes, number of Elementary and JH/HS classrooms, allow for physical distance when necessary. Classrooms will be designed with as much physical distancing between desks as possible, especially when seated together for more than 15 minutes. Efforts will continue in ensuring large groups of students are not present in hallways together for more than 15 minutes. The school district will continue to keep abreast and work to remain consistent with current CDC guidelines. Our buses will continue to operate as they did during the 2020-21 school year. There will be assigned seating, with efforts to only sit family members in the same seat. Seating will be assigned so that physical distancing is maintained for as long as possible. Our cafeteria seating arrangements will continue to promote physical distancing. Food sharing between students will be prohibited.
- 3) Hand sanitizer will continue to be available, both in the dispensers attached to the wall throughout the building, as well as in individual bottles available in classrooms and high traffic areas. Elementary classrooms will continue to introduce and reinforce proper handwashing techniques. On both ends of the building, multiple opportunities for students to wash their hands daily are provided.
- 4) In efforts to keep our district healthy, we encourage limited outside visitors during the school day. Items can be dropped off at the front entrance of the building without the need to enter the main building. Our school district will continue with increased cleaning strategies throughout the building in an effort to reduce the spread of anything to our students.

- 5) At this point, eligible members of the school community are encouraged to get vaccinated if they feel it serves their best interest. The school district will continue to keep abreast and work to remain consistent with current CDC guidelines.

With the spike in COVID cases once again, changes to the way North Andrew operates can take place daily. We will update you when changes occur. Our goal is to have students get the best education possible, and that is by having them in-person with our outstanding teachers and staff.

It has been a busy summer here in the district. The district is currently replacing all the HVAC units in the building. The units were 27 years old and in constant need of repair. This will be a nice upgrade! The elementary, middle school and commons area got new epoxy flooring this summer. It looks really sharp and will be a lot easier to clean. Between now and the start of school you should be seeing the district installing new front doors and also the outdoor basketball courts/tennis courts will be getting resurfaced.

The school year will begin on Monday, August 23rd with an early dismissal that day at 12:46pm. School lunches and breakfast will remain free for all K-12 students for the 2021-22 school year. Extra entrée's, milk and la carte offerings will be charged at the same rate.

Welcome to the North Andrew Elementary 2021-22 school year, “Where We Strive For Excellence” every day. I am very excited to open the doors and welcome our students back for a new and exciting year. The 2020-21 school year was unlike any we have experienced before. As a building leader, I am still amazed at the creativity, hard work, and partnership that went into the 2020-21 school year to make the experience as close to normal as possible for our students. As an elementary school, we will continue to focus on building a passion for literature in all our students. Last year our elementary set a new district AR record by earning over 11,500 points. - NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

A public hearing will be held **Wednesday, August 18 at 5:45pm, prior to the regular Board of Education meeting**, at the North Andrew R-VI School in the ITV room. At this time citizens may be heard on the property tax rates proposed to be set by North Andrew R-VI School, a political subdivision. The tax rates shall be set to produce the revenues, which the budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020 show, to be required from the property tax. Each tax rate is determined by dividing the amount of revenue required by the current assessed valuation. The result is multiplied by 100 so the tax rate will be expressed in cents per \$100 valuation.

An Alert from the School Nurse's Office

Dear Parents/Guardians,

We welcome you and your students back while we look forward to a much-improved new year! As you all are quite aware, we are still dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic and continued discoveries of impending variants of concern. We want to thank you for your incredible efforts last year to keep our students monitored and safe and we thank you as you continue monitoring your students in the coming new year. The monitoring criteria remains the same as last year. Time moves on and we adapt the best we can as research continues. We will update and share that information as it pertains to our school district, staff and students. Like before, as our knowledge and understanding of COVID-19 evolves, guidance may change. We are working hard in the health office and as a district to continue a reasonable approach to safety and prevention and learn all we can to keep our students and staff safe. We are working under CDC guidelines and in conjunction with our local health department. As stated in our return to school plan, masks will not be required to be worn in-building or at school events, unless deemed necessary and communicated by North Andrew Administration and Board of Education. Masks are allowed and encouraged in places that we will not be able to social distance. Posters throughout the building remind students and staff of correct mask wearing procedures. The school district will continue to keep abreast and work to remain consistent with current CDC guidelines.

The Covid-19 vaccine is encouraged by the CDC and local health authorities and is highly recommended if you feel it serves your best interest. As an important reminder....COVID-19 can cause illness ranging from mild to severe and, in many cases, can be fatal. Symptoms typically include fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. Some people infected with the virus have reported experiencing other non-respiratory symptoms other people, referred to as *asymptomatic* cases, have experienced no symptoms at all.

There is not a single symptom that is uniquely predictive of a COVID-19 diagnosis. A COVID-19 viral test is needed to confirm if someone has a current infection. The following continue to be illness management criteria for daily school admittance; this is an opportunity to review the criteria again below. We may consider recommending stricter adherence to illness management criteria if necessary.

Although CDC does not currently recommend conducting universal symptom screening at school, simply put.... students should not attend school when they are sick. "**Home Symptom Screenings**" rely on students and their parents, guardians, or caregivers initially identifying when the student may have signs and symptoms of illness and to take action (such as staying home). This process can also be followed by school staff by monitoring children for overt symptoms of any infectious illness that may develop during the school day and helping the student and family take needed actions.

It is essential to reinforce to all students, parents/caregivers, and staff the importance of students staying home when sick or with ANY symptoms listed previously of COVID-19 for the recommended time(72hours) AND until at least 24 hours after they no longer have symptoms and fever (temperature of 100.4 or higher) or signs of a fever (chills, feeling very warm, flushed appearance, or sweating) without the use of fever-reducing medicine (e.g., Tylenol). If symptoms persist, it will be strongly recommended to follow up with a doctor.

If students are sent home from school, they will be asked to observe for worsening symptoms for 72hrs/3days. Staying home when sick will help prevent the transmission of SARS-CoV-2 (and other illnesses including flu) and help keep school open.

Symptom screening at home can be helpful to determine if a student:

1. currently has an infectious illness that could impair their ability to learn, or
2. is at risk of transmitting an infectious illness to other students or to school staff.

Refer to the attached form below. Please continue to complete this short checklist from home each morning for each of your children. If your child has any of the following symptoms, this indicates a possible illness that may decrease the student's ability to learn and also puts them at risk for spreading illness to others. Please do your part, call us to report their symptoms and your concerns and keep them home if symptoms are present! As a community you all did an awesome job last year and we feel confident the same will remain this year and we thank you!!!

PUBLIC NOTICE OF SCHOOL DIRECTORY INFORMATION

North Andrew School District is providing public notice to parents or eligible students (18 years or older), in the district regarding the releasing of "directory information".

Directory information will be released as deemed necessary by school officials. The North Andrew School District designates the following items as Directory Information:

student's name, parent's name, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, most recent previous school attended and photograph.

Parents or eligible students will have ten (10) school days after the annual public notice to view student's directory information and to provide notice in writing to the school district that they choose to not have this information released. Unless notified to the contrary in writing within the ten (10) school day period, the school district may disclose any of those items designated as directory information without prior written consent.

VISITORS POLICY BOARD POLICY FILE: KK

Parents/Guardians and patrons of the district are welcome to visit district schools and attend district events; however, all visitors during business hours, including Board members, must sign or check in at the building office prior to proceeding elsewhere in the building. The district discourages parents/guardians or others from using district property or events as places for visiting students and may refuse the use of district property for that purpose.

The Board and administration will not tolerate any person whose presence disturbs classes or district activities or hinders the instructional process. Visitors to district property may not possess weapons, including concealed weapons, on district property, on district transportation or at any district function or activity sponsored or sanctioned by the district unless the visitor is an authorized law enforcement official or is otherwise authorized by Board policy.

NOTICE TO PARENTS AND STUDENTS

The Safe School Act became effective August 28, 1996. This law requires that pupils and their parents/guardians are to be provided a copy of the school's discipline policy. As in the past, all NA middle and high school students this year will be given student handbooks which included the major points of our district's discipline policy. An open meeting will be held to go over the handbook. Also we ask that all parents read and discuss the handbook with his/her student(s) and sign a letter to that effect.

The major change requires that school administrators report to appropriate law enforcement officials when assaults occur on school property, at school activities, or on school buses. The law enforcement officials requested that administrators report these incidents when physical contact occurs which may result in physical injury. In certain circumstances even verbal assaults may be reported. Continued verbal assaults between individuals or threats may necessitate a report by a school administrator. Law enforcement personnel and school officials agreed that it is the responsibility of the law enforcement personnel to determine whether criminal activity has occurred. However, it still remains the responsibility of school personnel to discipline misbehavior at school or school functions.

The new law also requires that the juvenile office notify the school district if a juvenile is charged with any one of 18 serious offenses listed in the law. That information will then be passed on the school staff with a "need to know." The school is required to report to the juvenile office the names of any youngsters under the court jurisdiction who are suspended for over 10 days.

The North Andrew School District considers unacceptable, and a serious violation of this policy, any conduct which is prejudicial to good order and discipline in the schools or which tends to impair the morale or good conduct of students. As the result of such conduct, students may be subjected to more severe disciplinary action, including suspension or expulsion from school and /or school activities.

- Unacceptable conduct includes, but is not limited to the following:
- Sexual harassment and sexual violence;
- Racial/ethnic harassment;
- Possession, consumption, being under the influence or sale of alcoholic beverages including malt beverages

- Possession, transfer, use, being under the influence, dispensing or sale of narcotics, drugs, controlled substances including inhalants or drug paraphernalia.
- Extortion;
- Possession, distribution, use or sale of a weapon;
- Possession, use or sale of any dangerous explosive or incendiary device;
- Failure to obey instructions of a school official;
- Tardiness;
- Truancy;
- Excessive absences;
- Fighting, assault and battery;
- Obscenity;
- Open defiance;
- Profanity;
- Acts of violence;*
- Threats by word or deed;
- Unruly conduct that disrupts school;
- Theft and vandalism;
- Lying to a school official;
- Cheating;
- Any conduct which could subject a student to criminal prosecution.

This policy extends to conduct that aids, abets, counsels, procures or causes any act which, if done by the student, would be punishable under this policy. This policy also extends to conduct which assists an offender in preventing the student's punishment under this policy, the act of conspiring with any person to perform acts punishable under this policy, or soliciting the performance of acts punishable under this policy.

ACTS OF VIOLENCE

Acts of violence are defined as the exertion of physical force by a student with the intent to do serious bodily harm to another person while on school property, including a school bus in service on behalf of the District, or while involved in school activities.

MANDATORY DISCIPLINE FOR CERTAIN WEAPONS VIOLATIONS

In order to maintain the safety of the educational community, the District will strictly enforce the necessary disciplinary consequences resulting from the use or possession of weapons on school grounds, buses or at school activities.

1. A firearm as defined in 18 U.S.C. 921.
2. Any device defined in 571.010, RSMo, including: a blackjack, a concealable firearm, a firearm, a firearm silencer, an explosive weapon including but not limited to a firecracker, a gas gun, a knife, knuckles, a machine gun, a projectile weapon, a rifle, a shotgun, a spring gun, a switchblade knife, or a razor.
3. Any instrument or device customarily used for attack or defense against an opponent, adversary or victim; or any instrument or device used to inflict physical injury or harm to another person.

In accordance with federal and state law, any student who brings or possesses a firearm as defined in 18 U.S.C. 921 or a device as defined in 571.010, RSMo on school property or at any school activity will be suspended from school for at least one (1) calendar year or expelled and will be referred to the appropriate legal authorities. The suspension or expulsion may be modified on a case-by-case basis upon recommendation by the superintendent to the Board of Education. Student who use or possess other weapons defined in this policy will be subject to suspension and or expulsion from school and may be referred to the appropriate legal authorities.

The Board of Education also updated policies in order to conform to the Safe School Act on school admissions, student record keeping, discipline procedures, administering medications, searches by school personnel and/or law enforcement officials, and abuse investigations. 

LETTER TO PARENTS
FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT FREE AND REDUCED PRICE SCHOOL MEALS

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. North Andrew R-VI School District offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$1.75 K-12; lunch costs \$2.60 Elementary; \$2.70 MS; \$2.80 HS. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Reduced price is \$0.30 for breakfast and \$0.40 for lunch. This packet includes an application for free or reduced price meal benefits, and a set of detailed instructions. Below are some common questions and answers to help you with the application process.

1. WHO CAN GET FREE OR REDUCED PRICE MEALS?

- All children in households receiving benefits from the Food Stamp Program/Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) or Temporary Assistance/Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), are eligible for free meals.
- Foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
- Children participating in their school's Head Start program are eligible for free meals.
- Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
- Children may receive free or reduced price meals if your household's income is within the limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Your children may qualify for free or reduced price meals if your household income falls at or below the limits on this chart.

2. HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILDREN QUALIFY AS HOMELESS, MIGRANT, OR RUNAWAY? Do the members of your household lack a permanent address? Are you staying together in a shelter, hotel, or other temporary housing arrangement? Does your family relocate on a seasonal basis? Are any children living with you who have chosen to leave their prior family or household? If you believe children in your household meet these descriptions and haven't been told your children will get free meals, please call or e-mail **North Andrew Superintendent, Mark McDaniel 816-567-2965 or email mmcdaniel@northandrew.org**.

3. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD? No. Use one Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the completed application to: **North Andrew c/o Valerie Atkins 9120 Hwy 48, Rosendale, MO 64483**.

4. SHOULD I FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF I RECEIVED A LETTER THIS SCHOOL YEAR SAYING MY CHILDREN ARE ALREADY APPROVED FOR FREE MEALS? No, but please read the letter you got carefully and follow the instructions. If any children in your household were missing from your eligibility notification, contact **Valerie Atkins 816-567-2527 or vatkins@northandrew.org** immediately.

5. MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT A NEW ONE? Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year.

6. I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILDREN GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC may be eligible for free or reduced price meals. Please send in an application.

7. WILL THE INFORMATION I GIVE BE CHECKED? Yes. We may also ask you to send written proof of the household income you report.

8. IF I DON'T QUALIFY NOW, MAY I APPLY LATER? Yes, you may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free and reduced price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.

9. WHAT IF I DISAGREE WITH THE SCHOOL'S DECISION ABOUT MY APPLICATION? You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to: MARK McDANIEL NORTH ANDREW 9120 HWY 48, ROSENDALE, MO 64483 OR CALL 816-567-2965.

10. MAY I APPLY IF SOMEONE IN MY HOUSEHOLD IS NOT A U.S. CITIZEN? Yes. You, your children, or other household members do not have to be U.S. citizens to apply for free or reduced price meals.

11. WHAT IF MY INCOME IS NOT ALWAYS THE SAME? List the amount that you normally receive. For example, if you normally make \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only made \$900, put down that you made \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime sometimes. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.

12. WHAT IF SOME HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS HAVE NO INCOME TO REPORT? Household members may not receive some types of income we ask you to report on the application, or may not receive income at all. Whenever this happens, please write a 0 in the field. However, if any income fields are left empty or blank, those will also be counted as zeroes. Please be careful when leaving income fields blank, as we will assume you meant to do so.

13. WE ARE IN THE MILITARY. DO WE REPORT OUR INCOME DIFFERENTLY? Your basic pay and cash bonuses must be reported as income. If you get any cash value allowances for off-base housing, food, or clothing, or receive Family Subsistence Supplemental Allowance payments, it must also be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. Any additional combat pay resulting from deployment is also excluded from income.

14. WHAT IF THERE ISN'T ENOUGH SPACE ON THE APPLICATION FOR MY FAMILY? List any additional household members on a separate piece of paper, and attach it to your application. Contact Valerie Atkins, North Andrew, 816-567-2527 or vatkins@northandrew.org to receive a second application.

- Child is uninsured

MO HealthNet for Kids (SCHIP) Premium

- Family gross income over 150% FPL up to 300% FPL;
- Child is uninsured;
- Children in families with gross income over 150% FPL without access to affordable health insurance (from \$75 to \$189 per month, based on family size and income) and the family must pay a monthly premium. Premium amounts change in July of each year. The premium is based on family size and income to insure that no family pays more than 5% of their income for coverage.


