Guidelines for Protecting Purity

Resource for 7/20/21 Sermon

If you are a Christian, date only Christians (see 2 Corinthians 6:14).

If you are a committed disciple, date only committed disciples.

Christ is with you all evening – wherever you go and whatever you do.

Remember your date is your brother or sister, not your "lover" (see 1 Timothy 5:1-2).

Go out in groups, not alone.

Focus on talk, not touch; conversations, not contact.

Avoid fast-moving relationships or instant intimacy.

Avoid setups – never be alone: on the couch, in a car late at night, in a house or bedroom.

Be accountable to someone about your purity.

Write out your own standards and enforce them yourself – never depend on someone

else.

Don't do anything with your date you wouldn't want someone else doing with your

future mate.

Beware of the "moral wear down" of long dating relationships and long engagements.

Once young people and parents agree on marriage, it's dangerous to wait longer than

necessary (see 1 Corinthians 7:8-9).
