Connecting with Pastor Matt

Holding to what is true

If anyone teaches a different doctrine and does not agree with the sound[a] words of our Lord Jesus Christ and the teaching that accords with godliness, 4 he is puffed up with conceit and understands nothing. (1Timothy 6:3-4a)

The state of the union address the president gave this past week was most grievous. I watched only a snippet but read much later. To be blunt what became very clear was there were certain times he spoke words that stood in direct contradiction to God and His Word. He spoke lies from satan especially in regard to murdering babies in the womb and devaluing life of the disabled. Some from the leadership of the nation have spread the lie that gender can be changed and even affirmed the mutilation of children when they seek to change genders. The president and many around him have also sought to bypass parental authority when they object.

When God's Word is contradicted and teachings of satan are promoted this is not a political issue but a spiritual one. Because of this the Church must address these lies. We are at a very dark time in our nation. But there is hope because the answer isn't found in the white house. Our hope is in God and His Word. His word speaks to us truth and is always true for all people in all places and at all times. The Church must hold firm to true doctrine- (which the Bible also calls sound doctrine), especially in the midst of all the error and false teachings.

Paul wrote to Timothy

For the time will come when people will not put up with sound doctrine. Instead, to suit their own desires, they will gather around them a great number of teachers to say what their itching ears want to hear. (2Timothy 4:3)

Paul charges Titus, "You must teach what is in accord with sound doctrine" (Titus 2:1).

Such a mandate makes it obvious that sound doctrine is important. But what is doctrine? Doctrine is simply a set of accepted beliefs held by a particular group. Biblical doctrine defines the parameters of Christian teaching on a given topic, such as God, sin, salvation, etc. But why is it important? Does it really make a difference what we believe?

Sound doctrine is important because our faith is based on a specific message. Sound doctrine re-tells the single story that sweeps through all of Scripture.

From creation, through our fall into sin, to Jesus's saving work on the cross and the eventual restoration of God's rule over all creation, the Bible tells a single epic narrative that spans Genesis to Revelation. Sound doctrine traces the contours of this story and repeats it in simple, memorable forms.

The overall teaching of the Bible contains many elements, but the primary message is explicitly defined: "Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures [and] . . . he was raised on the third day

according to the Scriptures" (1 Corinthians 15:3-4). This is the unambiguous good news, and it is "of first importance." Change that message, and the basis of faith shifts from Christ to something else.

Sound doctrine is also important because what we believe affects what we do. Behavior is an extension of theology, and there is a direct correlation between what we think and how we act.

Sound doctrine is important because we must ascertain truth in a world of falsehood. "Many false prophets have gone out into the world" (1 John 4:1). The best way to distinguish truth from falsehood is to know what the truth is.

Sound doctrine is important because the end of sound doctrine is life. "Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers" (1 Timothy 4:16). Conversely, the end of unsound doctrine is destruction. "Certain men whose condemnation was written about long ago have secretly slipped in among you. They are godless men, who change the grace of our God into a license for immorality and deny Jesus Christ our only Sovereign and Lord" (Jude 1:4). Changing God's message of grace is a "godless" thing to do, and the condemnation for such a deed is severe. Preaching another gospel ("which is really no gospel at all") carries an anathema: "let him be eternally condemned!" (see Galatians 1:6-9).

Sound doctrine is a guide and guard for reading and teaching the Bible.

Sound doctrine is an important guard for interpreting Scripture. It helps ensure that we confess and delight in all that Scripture teaches, rather than setting one passage against another or drawing conclusions from one passage that contradict another.

Finally, sound doctrine is important because it encourages believers. A pastor "must hold firmly to the trustworthy message as it has been taught, so that he can encourage others by sound doctrine and refute those who oppose it" (Titus 1:9).

Be assured at Faith EFC we stand unapologetically on the eternal truths of God! Lets stand firm together on Sound Doctrine of truth.


Car kits will be available at the workshops for a small fee of \$5. If you, your kids and/or friends would like to participate, please let us know and have them register by APRIL 6th.
