Connecting with Pastor Matt

1 Thessalonians 5: 14-18

"And we urge you, brothers, admonish the idle, encourage the fainthearted, help the weak, be patient with them all, See to it that no one repays evil for evil, but always seek to do good to one another and to everyone. Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, giving thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

I love the exhortations in the verses above. They are instructive both on a personal and corporate level. By addressing them as brothers it is clear Paul is writing to a corporate group. He is realistic about the varying experiences of their group discipleship. The exhortations are personal and specific toward those in different places. There were some who were on the sidelines watching but not engaged. They probably always had a reason as to why they were not doing anything. I can hear them "I am too busy or "I don't need to be involved to be a Christian". I still hear the idle today. Then there are those engaged but discouraged. Maybe they don't see the fruit from their efforts, or they are battling temptations and feeling defeated. To them Paul tells us " encourage them! Build them up!" Then Paul points out that among the church there are some who are simply worn out, weak. These struggles happen on multiple levels. Physically, emotionally maybe even spiritually. Paul asks the church to be patient with them. It may take awhile for them to work things through. You might hear some in the body share over and over their struggles to the point it is irritating. Be patient. Yes instruct, when necessary, listen to and pray for them, also be patient for God is working by His Spirit that indwells them.

He then states that which is opposite of the cultural mindset and that is don't react and get back at those who wronged you. The mindset of the believer is to do good to everyone, which includes those who wronged you. This is the way of Christ. All the above are actions each of us are to take. Don't wait for others to do them – you reach out and extend concern, patience, and encouragement. A church who does these things will stand out. A church that does these things will help all move forward in their discipleship. Let's be a Church that does these things!

Paul is not finished. He calls the church to action. To rejoice, pray and give thanks. Notice the positive aspect of these exhortations. We are not to whine about circumstances but pray in them and give thanks that God is in it all. This is not Paul's idea-but he states this is the will of God. Each of these exhortations is a deliberate choice. A choice only you can make. The question is will you make it. I say these next things lovingly and understanding this may be hard for some reading this. But if you find you have not been engaged with the body it's time to do away with the excuses and assimilate once again. If you find you have been drowning in circumstances it is time to choose to believe God's Word and rejoice, pray and give thanks. The great news is we have God's Spirit and His power within us to take these actions. When we do, we know we are in God's will! So, let's be a Church that intentionally chooses to follow the call from 1 Thessalonians 5.

I receive a list from the hospital of your admission and will see you when I'm there. Many people still put down "Christian" for their religious affiliation. Unfortunately, I won't see you on my list. Please feel free to contact me directly by phone call, text, or e-mail and I would be honored to see you or a loved one. It has been my privilege to lead many to the throne of grace at End of Life visits. The beauty of the Gospel message is that God Loves You and sent his Son, Jesus Christ to die in our place, taking our punishment and giving us the forgiveness of sin and the hope of eternal life with him in Heaven for those who repent and turn to Christ for his mercy. God is so good and loving that even at the hour of our death He reaches out to us who believe and receive His gift of everlasting life. I believe our time on earth is short and yet much work is still to be done in leading the lost to a saving knowledge of Jesus. Thank you for your prayers and financial support of this ministry. I am your representative in visiting the sick traumatized, suffering, and dying.

"Marriage Rocks"

The Marriage Rocks Banquet, where 26 couples attended, was focused on each couple Celebrating their unique marriage. It was held at Faith E. Free Church here in Stanley, October 23, 2021. The banquet was a great time of food, fun, fellowship and encouragement.

The Speakers were from Northern Wisconsin, Rick and Lori Goff. Rick and Lori have been married for 36 years, have 4 children and 4 grandchildren. Rick has been a pastor for over 30 years working with families and teenagers specifically for over 20 years. Rick is an author. The most recent book <u>"Before I Say I don't".</u> <u>There is a blog, https://www.beforeisayno.com.</u>

Rick stated these truths: Strong nations fall when marriages fail. Marriages are under attack. Marriage was God's idea! The couples were encouraged to do something special with their unique marriage. To revive marriage, they spoke of two of God's important covenants: 1) Salvation, attained when we believe on



the Lord Jesus Christ and His work on the cross so that we could have our sins forgiven and become right with God. 2) Marriage as it is vital to God. God hates divorce – it causes hurt and pain for all involved.

Some Rocks to build upon: Resist divorce. Ask God to help, find good counsel with a pastor. Don't let the enemy hurt you or your children.

Lori named her 3 specific Rocks to build on:

- 1. Forgive Be willing to forgive; God gave us forgiveness. When you don't forgive it hurts yourself.
- 2. Repent to spouse, say you're sorry and turn from it.

3. Work at it – don't try harder, work at giving it to God continuously. There is an Enneagram personality test you can take to help you to understand each other, it's a piece of the puzzle.

Rick named these specific Rocks to build on:

1. Intentionally spend time together. There are seasons of life and marriage changes. Kids keep us busy – make sure you take time for each other.

2. He concurred with Lori on the importance of forgiving each other. We often think "poor me"...we can be very selfish. It's a choice you need to make every day to forgive.

3. Find your identity in Christ. It needs to be in Christ. Our identity is not our job, being a friend, a mom or dad, husband or wife. It needs to be in Christ. God helps thoughts, gives understanding of who you are in Christ.

Neil Anderson's book "Identity Crisis" is a good resource.

Your spouse will let you down. All identities will fail except the identity in Christ. You cannot change your spouse, that's God's job. Spending time praying for your spouse and allowing God to change you is the way to go. Neil Anderson has a book "Life as God created it to be." Neil also has a Freedom in Christ website.

By way of a Next Step, cards were given to the couples to personalize so that they could thank each other and let each other know what they really appreciate about them.
