**Lesson 1**- What is an Entrepreneur (60 mins)

**Objective:** Students will determine what it takes to be an

effective entrepreneur

#### Words to Know:

entrepreneur-an individual that owns a business

enterprise-a type of business

**business-owner**-one who has interest in a business.



<u>Introduce the Concept: (10 mins.) - Allow the students to watch a video on starting a business and discuss it with the class.</u>

#### **Student Tasks** (55 mins.)

- 1. **Define** entrepreneur in your own words. What makes a good entrepreneurial idea?
- 2. **Complete** a talent inventory- Students complete a survey on skills and talents that they have. The results are shared with the class.
- 3. **Strategize:**-Students work on comparing business owners to entrepreneurs.
- 4. **Group Work**: Students work in smaller groups to begin comparing their work.

<u>Conclusions/Assignments/Take Away (5 mins.)</u> - Students will determine what qualities they have that will make them a good entrepreneur.

#### **Lesson 2- Do you have what it takes? (60 mins)**

<u>Objective</u>: Students will determine what it takes to be an effective entrepreneur.

#### Words to Know:

entrepreneur-an individual that owns a business

enterprise-a type of business

**business-owner**-one who has interest in a business.



#### **Daily Motivation: (10 mins.):**

1. Opening question of the day-Name something you would love to do, even if you won't get paid for it.

#### Student Tasks (55 mins.)

- 1. **Introduction of the objective:** What qualities make an excellent entrepreneur?
- 2. <u>Talent List</u>- Students make a list of activities they love to do or that they are good at.
- 3. <u>Discussion</u>: Students discuss the qualities of an entrepreneur. Students review and examine statements from entrepreneurs. Students take a glimpse into the mindset of an entrepreneur.
- 4. **Group Work:** Students work in smaller groups to begin comparing their work.

<u>Conclusions/Assignments/Take Away</u> (5mins): Students will determine what qualities they have that will make them a good entrepreneur.

### **Lesson 3- Do you know any entrepreneurs? (60 mins)**

<u>Objective</u>: Students will identify entrepreneurs in their own lives.

#### Words to Know:

entrepreneur-an individual that owns a business

enterprise-a type of business

**business-owner**-one who has interest in a business.



<u>Daily Motivation (10 mins.)</u> Brainstorming Question of the Day-Students will state an entrepreneur they know. List the qualities they exhibit that makes them a great entrepreneur.

#### Student Tasks (55 mins.)

- 1. <u>Introduction of the Objective</u>: (5 mins): What qualities make an excellent entrepreneur?
- 2. <u>Strategy Session</u>: Students use magazines to create a collage of images of the entrepreneur spirit. (See Rubric)
- 3. **Group Work**: Students work in smaller groups to present their work to the class.

<u>Conclusions/Assignments/Take Away (5mins)</u>: Students will examine what qualities are needed to become a great entrepreneur. Students begin working on their business plan.

### **Lesson 4**- Famous Entpreneurs (60 mins)

<u>Objective</u>: Students will identify high profile entrepreneurs in the media.

#### Words to Know:

entrepreneur-an individual that owns a business

enterprise-a type of business

**business-owner**-one who has interest in a business.



<u>Daily Motivation</u> (10 mins.): Brainstorming Question of the Day-Name a celebrity entrepreneur. Explain why you chose this person.

#### **Student Tasks (55 mins.)**

- 1. <u>Introduction of the Objective</u>: Review the concept of entrepreneur. Students review information on celebrity entrepreneurs such as Beyoncé, Jay-Z, Steve Harvey, etc.
- 2. <u>Student Activity</u>-students compare their celebrity entrepreneur choice to themselves. Students make mention of the things they have in common.
- 3. <u>Strategy Session</u>: Students work in pairs to research a celebrity and complete a 1- page report on their entrepreneurial endeavors.
- 4. **Group Work**: Students continue to work in pairs to complete their research.

<u>Conclusions/Assignments/Take Away (5mins)</u>: Students will present their work to the class. Students will also think about what qualities they need to be successful.
