Jeanette Hill is an Audelco award-winning playwright and creative activist. She is the founder of JWHill Productions LLC, and Sight Ain't Seeing Productions theater companies creating stories about real life the way African Americans live it. Jeanette is an advisory board member for the Atlanta Black Theatre Festival, International Centre for

Women Playwrights and Urban Playwrights United. She is an Artist INC fellow and a member of The Dramatists Guild. Her narrative work is included in the anthologies, Love Walked In (Fiction) and When Women Become Business Owners (non-fiction) and she is featured in the film documentary, Black and Write. She is a sought-after speaker and workshop presenter. Jeanette has received numerous awards and recognitions including the Atlanta Black Theatre Festival, the DC Black Theatre Festival, the Kingdomwood Christian Film Festival, the National Black Theatre

Festival, the Pacific Northwest Multicultural Conference, and the National Women's Theatre Festival. Her work has been read and or presented at the Art City Council (Huntsville AL) Black Spectrum Theatre (Queens, NY), Woodie King Jr/New Federal Theatre (NY), the New Harmony Project (Seattle, WA), Winston-Salem State University (NC), and WOW Productions (Columbia, SC), the Black Pearls Magazine Literary Excellence Award and Urban Playwrights United Soaring Eagle award. She was inducted into the Luther B. Smith Hall of Fame for her work in bringing awareness to the impact of social issues in the **African American community.** With a catalog of over 100 plays, Jeanette is currently working on a new series, The Front Porch Divas, which chronicles the lives of several sassy, seasoned, sexy, and soulful Black women over forty!

growing up on the Southside of Chicago. Now Crown Heights, Brooklyn, is where I live and write. In my


poetry, songs, short fiction and plays, I celebrate the divine in the ordinary - the music that's made me,




numerous theatrical companies, both in and out of New York. She wrote, choreographed, and directed
