Youth Services

- ❖ **The Starr Institute, Inc:** Funding provided in 2023 to this Tampa-based nonprofit, which is committed to educate, engage and empower youth and the community about child sexual abuse and exploitation. The organization offers in-person and virtual workshops that are interactive, culturally relevant, age appropriate and fun for youth ages 12-17.
- ❖ **S.T.E.M. 101, Inc:** Funding provided in 2023 to the Striving to Empower Many (S.T.E.M.) nonprofit, which offers mentoring and coaching to youth in Ocilla, Georgia, and surrounding communities. The program's goal is to engage and educate youths in middle and high school through interactive training, and workshops. S.T.E.M. also provides workshops and training on suicide prevention, and youth crisis intervention.
- ❖ **Every Girl Shines:** Funding was provided in 2022 to this Fairburn, Georgia-based nonprofit to help further its mission of mentoring and providing college scholarships to girls, working with them from middle school through high school, pairing them with professional women role models.
- ❖ **West Augustine Historical Community Development Corporation:**
Provided funding in 2022 to St. Augustine, Florida-based nonprofit to purchase iPads for students (grades K-5) to use onsite in its Kids Safe Zone Afterschool Tutorial & Enrichment Program (KSZ). The program prioritizes positive intervention and provides a safe environment, after-enrichment activities, camp for 35 at-risk and engagement of youth and structured school tutorials, mentoring, and a summer low-income youth.



- ❖ **Inspiration of Hope Community Resources, Inc.:** The Palm Coast, Florida-based nonprofit received funding in 2022 in support of its mission to provide resources and assistance to empower Flagler County youth through life skills classes, employment, and training resources.

Community Health

- ❖ **Volusia Volunteers in Medicine:** This Daytona-based nonprofit medical facility received funding in 2023 to assist in its mission of providing primary healthcare and dental services for the working and unemployed residents of Volusia County, Florida, who have no health insurance and need medical care.

Community Services

- ❖ **Volusia County Chapter of the National Hook Up of Black Women Inc.:** NHBW, which received funding extended in 2023, improves the lives of women and their families through support of education, health and wellness, and human service programs.
- ❖ **Casa San Pablo Apartments:** Funded extended to this Daytona, Florida-based nonprofit that houses mobility impaired and residents 62 and older, many of whom are classified as or below the income poverty limit. Funding enables staff to continue providing approximately 90 households with self-stable food items.

Natural Disasters

- ❖ **Maui, Hawaii Fire relief:** Provided financial resources to support the immediate and long-term recovery needs for the people and places affected by the August 2023 wildfires that devastated the historic resort town of Lahaina. More than 100 people perished in the fires.
- ❖ **Morocco Earthquake relief:** Funds provided to support the September 2023 Morocco Earthquake relief efforts. The 6.9 earthquake killed more than 2,900 people and 5,500 people were injured.

- ❖ **Turkey/Syria Earthquake:** Working through CARE USA, donations were provided in 2023 for emergency assistance to victims of the massive 7.8 earthquakes that resulted in more than 50,000 deaths and affected the lives of more than 12 million people in both countries.
- ❖ **Kentucky Flooding:** Donated to the American Red Cross to help with disaster relief in eastern Kentucky, which was devastated in January 2022 by powerful storms that killed 77 people and spawned tornadoes, caused flash floods, power outages, and severe property damages.
- ❖ **Colorado Wildfires:** Donated to the American Red Cross to assist with disaster relief in Colorado, where in January 2022, the state suffered through the most destructive wildfires in its history. Three people were killed, and more than 1,000 homes were destroyed.
- ❖ **Gladiolus Food Pantry** in Fort Myers, Florida. provided direct assistance for food insecurity to residents of the Harem Heights neighborhood after the facility was severely flooded during Hurricane Ian in September 2022.



- ❖ **The Agape Perfecting Praise and Worship Center** in Orlando, Florida, assisted in facilitating emergency relief efforts in the Orlo Vista community for families that were displaced by Hurricane Ian in 2022, by purchasing \$100 gift cards for supplies and goods not covered by FEMA or other government agencies. The storm displaced families and left 233 homes with severe water damage and mold.

Foreign Missions/Evangelism

- ❖ **Community Coalition for Haiti:** This Christian-based Vienna, Virginia nonprofit received funding in 2023 to help in its mission of transforming the lives of the people of Haiti through long-term and community-driven solutions in healthcare, education, and community development in this economically depressed country.
- ❖ **Abe Brown Ministries:** TIF donations in 2023 have contributed to the efforts of the Tampa, Florida-based Abe Brown Ministries' Reentry program, which attempts to break the cycle of recidivism by supplying formerly incarcerated men and women with tools and resources to find gainful employment and successfully re-enter the workforce and society. - ❖ **Flagler County Family Assistance Center (The Sheltering Tree):** Funding was awarded in 2023 to The Sheltering Tree. This Bunnell, Florida-based nonprofit is a coalition of individuals, faith-based communities, and service organizations dedicated to feeding the hungry, providing shelter to the homeless while helping them transition to permanent affordable housing, and preventing at-risk individuals from becoming homeless.
- ❖ **Networking Hearts of Hope for Africa International:** A Mississippi-based nonprofit foreign mission received funding in 2022 for assistance in constructing a multipurpose facility in Nakanyonyi, Uganda, to serve as a church and school for more than 300 children, youth, and adults. In addition to discipling Ugandan children, youth, and adults, Hearts of Hope for Africa focuses on educational needs, children's welfare and violations of human rights, youth empowerment through technical and life skills training, and Christian leadership training.
