

### Carol Oxford-Yard ~ Can Help You Protect Your Home From Crime

By her own admission, Carol Oxford-Yard is a woman who wears many hats — mom, mentor, chef, YouTube Keto cooking sensation and crimefighter.

For the past 17 years, Oxford-Yard has been a volunteer member of the Flagler County Sheriff's Office's Citizen Observer

Patrol (C.O.P.) Unit, which seeks to make our neighborhoods as safe and secure as possible. And for the past 10 years, she has spearheaded the department's STAR program, which provides home-security assessments to residents.

"We'll come out and conduct a comprehensive home inspection and show you how to secure your home against break-ins," said Oxford-Yard, a commander with C.O.P.

"We assess the outside of your home and show you how to keep your bushes trimmed around your fence, garage and windows that could present spaces for people to hide behind," she said. "We also show you how to secure your windows, your patio door, front doors and garage doors."

Once the recommended security upgrades are made, the homeowner will receive a Secure Home STAR of Approval sticker to be displayed outside the home.

The sheriff's department also offers a Vacation Watch program when residents are away on travel. Each household can get up to 20 vacation-housewatch checks per year. During these checks, officers survey the outside of the home to make sure it is secure. Homeowners are notified if anything looks suspicious. Vacation watch requests must be submitted five days prior to the start of travel.

"I enjoy what I do," Oxford-Yard said. "I've always been service-minded, and I believe that giving back is something I feel compelled to do."

held in the Family Life Center. After retiring from the Flagler County School District in 2020. Dr Jackson-Smith has been able to dedicate more "her time to calling as а transitions coach for women. specializing in counseling those transitioning through widowhood, and



retirement - helping them to discover new purposes.

Speaking from personal experience, one of Dr. Jackson – Smith's key points was that after going through the five stages of grief - denial, anger, bargaining, depression, and acceptance - one must keep in mind that healing is a process; it is a journey that allows one to grieve at his or her own pace.

Of utmost interest to the group was Dr. Jackson-Smith's sharing Bible Verses That Bring Comfort in Grief. One of those twenty verses can be found in Isaiah 41:10: "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

Dr. Jackson-Smith has been a member of Mt. Calvary Baptist Church since 1999 where she once served as youth ministry director. Her service also extends to the community through projects initiated by Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. and other local organizations.
