# Who Would Have 'Thunk It'? Pastor Coffie Celebrates 25 Years of Ministry

Pastor Edwin Coffie said it has only been in the past few weeks that he allowed himself to consider his **25 years as the Only pastor of the Mt. Calvary Baptist Church of Palm Coast.** Even more astonishing is that the church held its first services in the home of a member and now has a 500-seat Sanctuary, a separate Family Life Center, a Christian Education Center, and a God-focused congregation of nearly 450 members.

"Who would have 'thunk' it?" is how First Lady Carol Love Coffie said Pastor Coffie reflected on those years as they drove to the celebration of their 25th Pastoral Anniversary – held during the regular 9:30 a.m. Worship Service on January 15. The anniversary theme was "Servant/Shepherd /Man of God Committed to the Journey." The scripture was taken from *Philippians 3:13-14*.

The festive day was shared with the congregation from the Mt. Tabor First Baptist Church of Palatka, whose pastor, Reverend Karl N. Flagg, was the guest preacher. Mt. Tabor's choir provided the music, which included the songs *Great Is Thy Faithfulness* and *God Is*.

Pastor Flagg preached from *Philippians 3:12-14* and titled his sermon, "A God-Certified Servant Leader." He emphasized that a God-certified leader must "always walk with Jesus and let Him walk with them." He said **becoming a God-certified servant leader is a three-phase process:** 

- First, we must learn to admit (verse 12) "that it's all about Jesus."
- Then, we must submit (verse 13) "ourselves to the authority or will of another."
- Lastly, we must "commit (*verse 14*) to stay in the race and press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus."

"We have to learn to let go of some things and keep the main thing the main thing," Pastor Flagg said.

Both **Pastor and Lady Coffie** were presented with gifts and each shared comments of thankfulness and gratitude. "We thank you for your love and support," said Pastor Coffie.

### Pastor Coffie Celebrates 25 Years of Ministry

"When I stopped to look back over the 25 years, there have been some ups and some downs. But because it's all about God, He's brought me over some mountains and brought us through the spiritual downs. I can honestly say we never would have made it without Him."



Lady Coffie also thanked the congregation for the first 25 years and said she's decided that in 25 Part Two she's going to become a Pointer Sister (referring to the 1970s-80s singing group, the Pointer Sisters) and become a pointer. "I'm going to point to God. In everything that I do, say and all that I am, I'm going to reflect, redirect, reroute back to God," she said.

The Anniversary Service was the culmination of a two-week celebration that kicked off on



Dec. 8 with a roast and toast of Pastor Coffie by fellow pastors, who couldn't wait to spill the tea on their longtime friend. Some Mt. Calvary members also got in on the fun during the football-themed event attended by a capacity crowd at the Palm Coast Community Center.

There were stories from fellow pastors and fishing buddies about Pastor Coffie, such as the good reverend never having met a turtle trying to cross the road that he didn't like. (Can you say turtle soup, turtle tea?) Once while fishing, he fell out of the boat while trying to land a fish to the amazement of his fishing buddy.

# Homegoing Celebration

Deacon Randolph Arthur

Remembered As a Man

Who Made Wise Choices

In a celebration worthy of one who spent most of his 91 years in Christian service, **Deacon Randolph Arthur** was eulogized as a man who early in his 71-year marriage to Deaconess Margie Arthur, made the decision that ". . .as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." (*Joshua 24:14-15*)

During the **January 23rd Home-Going Celebration**, Pastor Edwin Coffie — in his eulogy titled 'Praise God', Deacon Arthur Made Some Good Choices — cited three wise choices that Deacon Arthur made.

- He chose the right wife. "Seventy-one years later, her last name is still Deaconess Margie Arthur. "They understood that God will carry you through your roughest days," said Pastor Coffie.
- *He chose the right house*, deciding early on to work in God's house. "Christian service for him was not a burden but a blessing."
- He chose to make preparations for his heavenly home. "Somewhere along his spiritual journey, Deacon Arthur made a conscious and wise decision to align himself with the word of God so that his future home would be eternally secure."

The ceremony included two beautiful musical selections by Mt. Calvary's Sister Betty Donaldson (I Asked The Lord) and goddaughter, Sister Gwendolyn Davis Young of Brooklyn, N.Y. (The Lord's Prayer). Tributes were presented by Mt. Calvary Trustee Joseph Matthews, Postmaster Darryl Baldwin of Light Lodge #25, which was founded by Deacon Arthur while living in Brooklyn, and Sister Angelyn Brown of Brooklyn, New York.



# Focus on Black History:

(Editor's Note: On October 3, 2022, Mt. Calvary member and well-known broadcaster, Glenn Walker, was inducted into the Black Radio Hall of Fame. From the beginning of this Calvary Courier interview until the end, one can clearly see God's hand at work in the life of this talented brother in Christ.)

When asked about his approximate age when he developed an interest in broadcasting, Brother Walker responded, "As a child, I grew up in a household that was always filled with music – be it radio, the record player, or the live rehearsals of a fantastic Gospel Quartet in my mom's living room."

"Were you inspired by someone else, or was this a natural inclination?" I asked. "That is a tough question," Bro. Walker declared. "I would have to say a bit of both. Outside of the industry, it was my childhood church, First Baptist Church of Opa-Locka in Dade County, Florida. Our church was full of talented musicians and singers. My aunt and my mother were both lead singers, and the male chorus was one of South Florida's best. As a pastor's son, I was surrounded by truly talented music-minded folk.

Additionally, my K-12 education was filled with fantastic music teachers, band directors and some of America's best gospel singers. I graduated from high school with five music scholarships from both PWI and HBCU band programs. By the time I was in high school, I was listening to radio all the time – be it news/talk, gospel, country, or R&B stations – I was hooked. My first radio class was at Miami Dade and my instructor was a Miami radio icon, Mr. Jack Purrington. My favorite radio personality and still my broadcast idol was Mr. Jerry Rushen at WEDR-FM Miami. I wanted to be like Jerry and now, 45 years later, we were both inducted into the National Black Radio Hall of Fame in 2022; I'm still amazed!"

When asked where he received his broadcasting training, Bro. Walker replied, "That was an easy one to answer. I started in Miami but that was only one semester at Miami Dade, and I was hooked. My college scholarship to Bethune-Cookman University was the true point of inspiration. I did not know that there was a radio station on campus until my 2nd semester as a freshman. The next year, I was not only on air but was chosen to be the student station manager. I remained in that position until my graduation date where I was blessed with a Bachelor of Arts in History (Pre-Law). During my senior year, I was chosen by Faculty and Administrators to tour the country and research college radio stations to begin the development of a Speech Communications Degree program with Radio and TV as the two major platforms."

# **Brother Glenn Walker's** Stellar Career in Broadcasting

The next questions centered around the colleges and/or universities Bro. Walker attended as well as his current position at BCU. "My college career began at Miami Dade Community College as a Respiratory Therapy student," Bro. Walker replied. "I was an only child raised by a single parent, and my mother often worked two and sometimes three jobs. College was expensive, so I talked her into letting me take one of those scholarships and go to school. Off to Bethune-Cookman College I went, and momma had to pay a full college education debt of \$149.00 for my graduation. As I mentioned earlier, I received my B. A. at Bethune-Cookman College. After over thirty years in radio and records, I attended Full Sail University in Orlando, Florida, and earned a master's degree in New Media Applications. Upon my return to Bethune-Cookman in 2005, I started as a consultant and am currently the General Manager of WRWS-LPFM and an Adjunct Professor of Mass Communications."

In addition to having been inducted into the Black Radio Hall of Fame last year, I asked Bro. Walker about other past awards or accolades he has received. He responded, "The list is long, but I find that most of the smaller honors mean the most to me." For instance, at the age of 26, he became Program Director of America's #1 medium market radio station WDOQ-FM Q-102 in Daytona Beach, the second of two African Americans sharing that nationwide distinction at the time. He also received several awards from Bethune-Cookman College/University's Wildcats Marching Band. From 1979 to 2013, Bro. Walker served as the band's announcer and was blessed with awards from his alma mater as well as Florida A&M's Marching 100. Additionally, Bro. Walker has served as halftime announcer for The Superbowl and was the first African-American halftime announcer for a Pro-Bowl in the Continental United States. A few years later, Bro. Walker won Record Promoter of the year from the Million Dollar Record Pool – one of America's largestand was then asked to lead the Florida Division. In 1995 Bro. Walker was honored by Mr. Barry Gordy of Motown Records when "he personally chose me to be the first National Director of Promotions, Public Relations and Marketing for the Motown Black College Tour." Notably, on October 11, 2023, Bro. Walker received official notice that he will "reach another major industry milestone by being honored with the Life Achievement Award on August 4, 2023, in Atlanta."

This consultant and announcer for MCBC's Audio-Visual Ministry ended the interview with these words of wisdom for young people interested in broadcasting: "Learn your craft, find a mentor, and dig in. This industry is one you must love and if you are a person of color, you really have to dig in to achieve. Call your local radio and TV stations; go meet folk who look like you and who do what you want to do. Keep in mind that we are anxious and happy to teach those who look like us and want to replace us." Words fitly spoken by one who is definitely leaving his "footprints on the sands of time." (Longfellow)
