# "Wherever God gives vision, God gives provision." Our NEXT

The final church-wide meeting with consultant, Bro. Olu Brown, was held on May 21, 2024, but this is not the end or final step in our process to implement change for our NEXT as we return to the pioneer spirit that launched Mt. Calvary 26 years ago. So, you may ask, "What's Next?" Glad you posed the question.

Bro. Olu has repeatedly indicated that "Next is not to be feared.

We must embrace it and engage in creative and innovative thinking and partnerships, NOW." We can move forth by looking at "Less but Better!" This encompasses a process termed, "Essentialism." The Essentialist way for the church means living by design, not default; distinguishes the vital few from the trivial many; eliminates nonessentials; and removes barriers (presentation by Bro. Olu).

In addition, it is important that the church leaders adopt <u>Spiritual Entrepreneurship</u> (by Carey Neiuwhof. Web access-<u>https://careynieuwhof.com/11-characteristics-spiritual-</u>entrepreneur/) which tells us that leaders must bring innovation

and experimentation of the business world to the church. The defining principles are as follows:

Think big. 2. Believe God can. 3. See abundance, not scarcity.
 Think vision first, resources second. 5. Invest in personal and team development. 6. Believe this is bigger than them. 7. Ship first, improve later. 8. Are fine with ambiguity. 9. Will risk it all without guarantee of success. 10. Never wait for consensus.
 Let the critics talk while they act. 12. Break rules.

Over the next 12 - 24 months the Core Vision Team will continue to meet and make suggestions to the church for our next. With church participation, Bro. Olu has suggested considering four changes:

- A. Worship (Sunday service #1)
- **B.** Worship (Sunday service #2)
- **C.** Youth Worship (teens)
- **D.** Children's Worship

These areas will impact: (1) Ministry Function, (2) Church Operations, (3) Volunteer Opportunities, (4) Finance, and (5) Staffing. There are risks. However, we are equipped with the spirit of prayer and God's word to lead **up into "More in 2024!"**


