Seven days from now I will send rain on the earth for forty days and forty nights, and I will wipe from the face of the earth every living creature I have made."

What reason did God give for Noah being saved from the Flood? What did God tell Noah to do? What did God say He would do? And Noah and his sons and his wife and his sons' wives entered the ark to escape the waters of the flood.

And after the seven days the floodwaters came on the earth.




²"Clean" animals, such as cows or sheep, were suitable for sacrifice.
