Do's and Don'ts for Play Sessions

Based on Louise Guerney's first seven Don'ts, 1972

Do

- 1. Do set the stage.
- 2. Do let the child lead.
- 3. Do track behavior.
- 4. Do reflect the child's feelings.
- 5. Do set limits.
- 6. Do salute the child's power and effort.
- 7. Do join in the play as a follower.
- 8. Do be verbally active.

Don't

- 1. Don't criticize any behavior.
- 2. Don't praise the child.
- 3. Don't ask leading questions.
- 4. Don't allow interruptions of the session.
- 5. Don't give information or teach.
- 6. Don't preach.
- 7. Don't initiate new behavior.
- 8. Don't be passive or quiet.

Check your responses to your children.

Your responses should convey:

- 1. I am here.
- 2. I hear and see you.
- 3. I understand.
- 4. I care.

Your responses should not convey:

- 1. I always agree.
- 2. I must make you happy.
- 3. I will solve your problems.
