It is the systems coordinator for the emergency food network comprised of 22 hunger relief programs operating in neighbourhoods across our city helping more than 17,000 local people each month.

Every \$1 donation provides \$5 worth of food.

Only one medal shall be awarded on a yearly basis.

Recipients need not be a member of the Order.

## OUR ORDER IN CANADA – Part I

If you search the internet for Orders of St. John, you will uncover a veritable feast of Orders all proclaiming to be legitimate and the "real" Order.

The leadership of our Order decided a long time ago that time spent in proving legitimacy or provenance was time wasted that could be better spent helping our fellow man. We publicly state that we recognize all chivalric and fraternal orders that help humanity.

Our present-day Order was reformed in 1965 when King Peter II of Yugoslavia ordained our constitution. We still recognize and are governed by this Constitution today. At the time of the formation, there were several Orders of St John throughout the world and North America.

In Canada, our Order was known as the Knights of St. John and Malta in Canada. The Malta Order was first introduced to Canada in 1829 when a regimental "lodge" attached to troops stationed at London, Ontario was instituted. In 1841 the Grand Master of Scotland, George Donaldson, resigned his office in Glasgow and set out for Montreal with authority to organize the Order in North America. Within ten years a half dozen encampments had been established, from Quebec to London, and two Grand Priories organized. In 1858 the two Grand bodies were merged, but within a few years the order began to slip downhill until by 1863 there was, but one encampment left, and it expired in 1867.

In 1870 a fresh start was made, this time at Toronto. St. John's Encampment No. 1 was established at that time in that city. It was destined to survive almost seventy years and, less its number (no longer used), to be revived once more in 1970 as the first commandery of a rebirth of the Order, now called "Hospitaller," in Canada. 
Today, on behalf of the Hamilton Commandery of the Hospitaller Order of St. John, KCdr Bob DeWolfe, KH, Hamilton Commander and myself DCdr Lynda Murdoch-Furchner, DH, Deputy Commander visited the offices of Hamilton Food Share to deliver our donation cheque for funds raised through Oblations collected in 2024.

On hand to accept the cheque, was Haleigh-Rain Eady, Senior Manager, Fundraising and Development. She also provided a tour of the facilities, which we found quite informative.

Food donated and purchased is sorted by category, then allocated to the over 20 local food banks and organizations that Hamilton food share supports. They appreciate cash donations as \$1 of donation can buy \$5 of food due to the large discounts they can get from suppliers.



Operating since 1990, Hamilton Food Share is the emergency food shipping and receiving hub and emergency food systems coordinator for the network of agencies we support in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada. They provide industrial-scale food resources to hunger relief agencies, operating emergency food programs open to the public. The food is equitably delivered to food banks and meal programs to ensure that people living in poverty have access to healthy food for themselves and their families. Most of the food distributed is donated by our generous local food industry, including wholesalers and farmers. Some is purchased in bulk at deep discounts and the remainder comes from local community groups through food drives or special events.
