The Ascension of the Lord

You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses. (Acts 1:8) Today we celebrate the Ascension, the day when Jesus left his disciples and returned to his Father in heaven. Jesus had just promised them a share in his own power, which would equip them to be his witnesses, but now he was gone (Acts 1:8). How could they—alone and unsure—bring his message to the ends of the earth? By the power of the Holy Spirit! When Jesus walked the earth, he could only be in one place at a time. But now that he was ascending to heaven, he could send the Spirit to all his disciples and work through them.

Jesus always keeps his promises, and in just a few days, the Spirit did come. The frightened men who had abandoned Jesus at his death were now boldly proclaiming that he was alive. On the day of Pentecost alone, those same disciples touched more than three thousand people—and that set off a mighty chain reaction! Day by day and in the centuries that followed, countless disciples have spread the gospel to every corner of the earth.

Jesus' promise of power wasn't just for the apostles or the early Christians. It is for all people in every age. You are part of this glorious band of witnesses! Through you, Jesus can bring the good news of his kingdom to people everywhere. The same Spirit who came upon the disciples lives in you, empowering you to bring hope to the men and women around you. The darkness of fear and discouragement can be illuminated by your joyful witness. In homes and workplaces, in parishes and neighborhoods, Jesus can open hearts—through you!

So don't be afraid to share God's love. Jesus, the ascended Lord, has given you the same power that raised him from the dead. And he wants you to give it to everyone you meet. The Ascension brings us closer to Jesus

The Ascension might have felt like a moment of separation to Jesus' disciples, but in reality, it brought them closer to Him in a deeper spiritual connection. Through His Ascension, Jesus became spiritually present everywhere, continually interceding on our behalf. He is always thinking of us, presenting our needs to the Father. When we pray, we are never alone—Jesus Himself is praying with us and for us.

Prayer "power-up." Prayer doesn't have to feel good to be good prayer. It can be a real struggle to pray throughout the day, to stay focused on God, and not get distracted. That's when we can lean on Jesus' perfect prayer to the Father. We

can join our prayers to His, and know they are pleasing to God.

Offer it up. Whether it involves suffering, fulfilling a necessary duty, or performing an act of charity, when we unite these actions with Jesus' self-offering on the Cross, they gain profound spiritual significance and immeasurable value for souls — especially our own.

Mass intentions. During Holy Communion or right after Mass, take a moment to present your concerns, and your desires to God, dedicating them to the service and glory of His love. Remember, God is never outdone in generosity!

Memorial of St. Boniface, Bishop & Martyr - June 5th - The life of St. Boniface shows the importance of courage and perseverance in sharing our faith. He faced many dangers and challenges, yet he continued his mission. He trusted in God and believed that the message of Jesus was worth sharing, even when it was hard. His determination reminds us that spreading the Gospel is not always easy, but it is always worth the effort.

St. Boniface also teaches us the value of patience. He didn't give up when people were slow to accept the faith. Instead, he explained the truth with kindness and gentleness. In our own lives, we can learn from his example by being patient when sharing our beliefs with others. We might not see results right away, but persistence and love can help people understand the message of Jesus. Another lesson we can learn from St. Boniface is how he worked to build strong communities of faith. He didn't just convert people; he organized churches and trained leaders. This shows that faith is not just an individual journey, but something we should share and support within a community. Building and strengthening the Church helps all of us grow in faith together.


Raffle Prizes – If anyone would like to donate toward a raffle prize, please call or text Cheryl Stone at 210-415-9037.
