Pentecost Sunday

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit. (Acts 2:4)

Today's readings seem like a study in contrasts, don't they? In the first reading, St. Luke gives a dramatic account of today's feast of Pentecost: a rushing wind, mysterious tongues of flame, prophetic declarations, and a vast crowd hanging on Peter's every word. But in the Gospel, St. John paints a quieter, more intimate picture. He tells how Jesus appeared to the apostles privately on Easter, breathed his Spirit into them, and sent them out to forgive, just as his Father had sent him to forgive. So does the Spirit inspire great excitement and grand gestures, or quiet acts of mercy? Both. It's not a matter of either/or. When Jesus breathed the Spirit into the apostles, he showed them the reason for his death and resurrection: to win forgiveness for their sins and for the sins of all the world. Then when the Spirit came rushing into them on Pentecost, he filled them with the power to proclaim that mercy far and wide.

This is the key to our celebration today: we need to experience both the mercy and the power of the Holy Spirit. We need to know, intimately and personally, just how forgiving God is. We need to know that nothing, not even the greatest of sins, can overcome the love that he has for us. But we also need to experience the powerful rush of his Spirit filling us with confidence in God's love. That confidence can propel us into the world to share the good news with everyone we meet.

Today, more than any other day, is a great day to ask for a fresh new outpouring of the Spirit. Ask the Spirit to flood you with a personal encounter with God's mercy. Then ask the same Spirit to give you the courage to proclaim that mercy far and wide.

The Life and Miracles of Saint Anthony of Padua - June 13th

Saint Anthony of Padua was born in Lisbon, Portugal, in 1195. His baptismal name was Fernando. He grew up in a rich and noble family. From a young age, he showed a strong love for God and spent much time in prayer.

At 15, he joined the Augustinian Order. Later, he met some Franciscan friars and was inspired by their simple way of life. He joined the Franciscans and took the name Anthony. He wanted to preach and serve God.

Anthony became known for his powerful preaching and simple teachings. He used stories to explain the Bible so everyone could understand. He traveled to many places, sharing his faith and helping people.

Saint Anthony is famous for his many miracles. He once preached to fish when people would not listen. He also helped find lost items and brought a drowned boy back to life. People trusted him and prayed for his help.

He died in 1231 at the age of 36 in Padua, Italy. He was canonized one year later. His feast day is on June 13. Saint Anthony is the patron saint of lost items, the poor, and travelers. His legacy continues to inspire many. (young-catholics.com)


