The Most Holy Trinity

The Spirit of truth . . . will guide you to all truth. (John 16:13)
It’s no coincidence that we celebrate Trinity Sunday on the Sunday after Pentecost. The mystery of the Holy Trinity is so deep that we need the Holy Spirit, the “Spirit of truth” (John 16:13), to help us understand it. And even more important, it’s only through the Spirit, who was poured out on Pentecost, that we can enter into an ever-deepening relationship with our awesome triune God! It’s the Spirit who moves us to pray and worship God. He both puts that desire in our hearts and teaches us to pray. He opens our ears so that we can hear God speaking to us, and he opens our hearts so that we can come to know the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in a personal way.
The Spirit also opens up the Scriptures for us, revealing to us who God is. He illuminates our minds through God’s word and helps us to grasp his sweeping plan of salvation. He makes real to us God’s constant desire to make us his own sons and daughters.
Perhaps most amazing, it’s the Spirit who pours “the love of God . . . into our hearts” (Romans 5:5). We know intellectually that God is love (1 John 4:8), but the Spirit helps us experience the immensity of that love. He shows us that we are the apple of God’s eye, beloved from before time began. He shows us the love that moved the Father to give us his Son, so that we might live with him forever.
Jesus reassured his disciples that the Spirit “will speak what he hears” (John 16:13). On this special feast, let the Spirit speak a word of reassurance to you about our mysterious, awe-inspiring God. You will never fully grasp the mystery of the Trinity, but you can be grasped by it. You can know God and the love he is pouring out into your heart—today!

Growing in Faith

Want to know someone? Find out what he or she loves. So what is Jesus passionate about? It's simple – He is passionate about you. Not humanity in general, but you.

When Jesus looked at the crowds, He didn't see a blur of faces. He saw each person—knew them, loved them. The Crucifix and the Eucharist aren't just symbols; they're proof that His love goes to staggering lengths to be with us and bless us. It's a love so personal and intense, it demands a response. So how do we respond?

Start simple: "Thank you. I love you." We assume people know we love them, but it still matters to say it out loud. The same is true of Jesus. In His appearances to St. Margaret Mary and later to St. Faustina, He shared how deeply wounded He is by indifference and ingratitude, especially in the Eucharist. in return. He is as present now as He was at the Last Supper. Simply showing up to be with Him is an act of love — and a bold act of faith.

Receive His Mercy. When we come to Him in Confession, genuinely sorry, He doesn't scold—He celebrates. Not because of our sin, but because He gets to pour out His mercy. *"Souls that make an appeal to My mercy delight Me"* (*Diary of St. Faustina*, 1146). Confession doesn't just free your soul—it fills His Heart with joy.

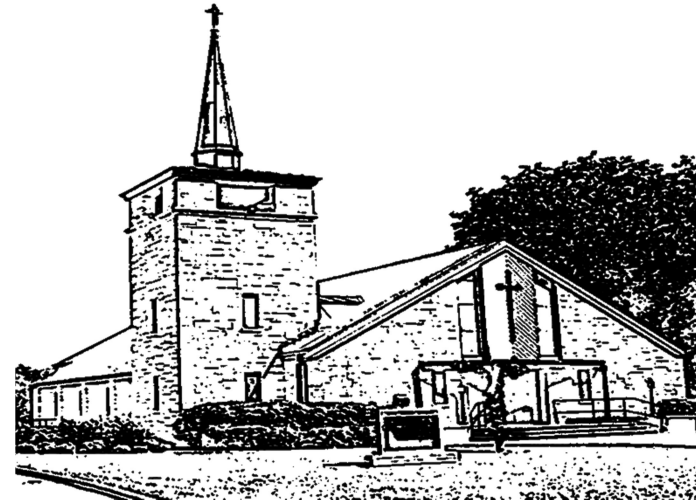
