
ALTAR SOCIETY MONTHLY ROSARY will resume in September. Traditionally, the Catholic Church has devoted the month of September to Our Lady of Sorrows. The Seven Sorrows of Mary Rosary will be recited on Sunday, September 7th at 5:00pm in our church. We will meditate on the pains of Jesus through the eyes of our Lady. This devotion dates back to the 14th century as Mary, Our Lady of Sorrows, appeared to St. Bridget of Sweden and revealed this rosary prayer to her.

Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

Strive to enter through the narrow gate. (Luke 13:24)

Jesus didn't mince words. As he passed through the towns, he warned his listeners. There's a gate, and passing through it won't be easy. But you've got to get through it. This image of a "narrow gate" illustrates Jesus' mission perfectly: he traveled from village to village, "teaching as he went and making his way to Jerusalem" (Luke 13:24, 22). Jesus' whole life pointed toward Jerusalem, where he would fulfill his mission. There he would unveil his Father's plan of salvation as he freely offered his life for us. He never stopped moving toward the cross. And as he went, he visited town after town, teaching all who would listen. This was Jesus' "narrow gate," and he did not avoid it (Luke 13:24). Even more, he invited everyone to follow him through that gate of obedient, self-giving love. That's because he knows that the narrow gate is the way to eternal life. His warnings might frighten us, but Jesus doesn't want to scare us; he wants to save us. And so every day, he offers us the chance to enter the narrow gate—by our acts of love and our obedience to his commands. Just as he visited the towns near Jerusalem, Jesus visits your town, your house, and your heart. He comes to teach you how to follow him all the way to heaven. He invites you to "strive to enter" the gate that leads to eternal life (Luke 13:24). And the best news? He is the gate (John 10:7), and his arms are open wide to help you. He is always offering you the grace you need to follow him. So, open your heart to Jesus. If the gate feels too narrow, the path too difficult, or your resistance too great, confess your need to the Lord. Ask for his help! He loves you immeasurably. He embraced the cross so that the narrow gate could open wide for you. "Lord, help me to follow you through the narrow gate." 
Prayer for Successful Picnic
