The Baptism of the Lord

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

We hear in today's Gospel that at the moment of Jesus' baptism, "a voice came from the heavens, saying, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.'" We can hear these words as a simple proclamation of who Jesus is - the beloved Son of God -

but also as a proclamation of who we are called to be: the beloved adopted sons and daughters of God. I sometimes forget that I am also called beloved. I mistakenly think that my value depends on my accomplishments or on my faithfulness, but the truth is that my status as beloved is due to being made in the image of my Creator. If I allow myself to absorb the full meaning of that, it will not only affect how I view myself but also how I relate to others. But Christ didn't come only to show us the truth about who we are. His coming also invites us to see one another as beloved. As Peter reminds us in our second reading, "God shows no partiality." May we strive to see the belovedness that God bestows on us and on all people.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER. INVITATION. WITNESS. ACCOMPANIMENT Jesus entered fully into our humanity, including entering into communion with each of us through our common baptism, to allow for us to one day share in the perfect exchange of love of the Trinity. Our call is to take on Christ's mission of love here on earth - to speak and act in a way that proclaims the truth of who God is and who he has made us to be. How can we remind our families, our neighbors, and even our enemies of their nature as beloved children of God? And by recognizing our own nature as beloved, we allow God's grace to flow through us. We then trust that God will make himself known as the source of love itself.

REFLECT Take time this week to reflect on what it means to be a beloved son or daughter of God. What would it be like to hear, "You are my beloved child, with whom I am well pleased"? Once we root ourselves in this truth we can ask ourselves, "What act of kindness, what consoling word might I offer, what goodness might I do for others around me to help them experience a glimpse of their own belovedness?" Then, do it!

Friday of the First Week in Ordinary Time

It is not you they reject; they are rejecting me as their king. (1 Samuel 8:7)

By the time the elders of Israel asked Samuel to appoint a king for them, Israel had been ruled for hundreds of years by judges. These judges weren't permanent rulers; they were appointed by God to lead his people when they faced an enemy. But the people wanted more than occasional defenders. They wanted a king, "as other nations have" (1 Samuel 8:5).

Samuel, who was both a judge and a prophet, might have felt rejected by the people's demands. But the Lord cut through to the heart of the matter. In asking for a king in order to be like the other nations, the people were not rejecting Samuel but God himself. They were ignoring their call to be a unique people belonging to the Lord. God had called and formed them so that they could reveal a different way to be a nation—attentive to the Lord and walking in his ways. But even when Samuel warned them of the pitfalls of having a king, the people refused to listen.

Although the people were rejecting the Lord, he never rejected them. He gave them a king as they wanted. And in his mercy, he walked with them through all the lessons they would have to learn from having a king and trying to be like the surrounding nations. Time and again, he would draw them back to

himself, urging them to repent and follow him more closely. Ultimately, he sent them the King who would be the embodiment of God's own kingship over his people.

We are called to be God's people, too. And like the Israelites, we can face temptations to pursue the ways of the world. We may define success by the standards of the people around us or try to bolster our confidence by seeking worldly validation. But the truth is that we have the living God dwelling in us. And while worldly security or acclaim might be appealing, God's plan for us is much greater.

You have been set apart for God! He has called you to be his child, and he holds you in the palm of his hand. He loves you and has filled you with his life. Your life can be a great adventure as you listen to his Spirit and follow his ways. You can show the world a completely different way of living. "Lord, thank you for calling me to be your own.
