**10TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

**We look not to what is seen but to what is unseen. (2 Corinthians 4:18)**

St. Paul must have been a marvel! Not only was he a passionate apostle and evangelist, but he was also a skilled theologian and writer. He founded some of the most important churches in the ancient world. More than one-quarter of the New Testament was either written by him, written about him, or attributed to him. What's more, Paul accomplished all of this while enduring ongoing persecution and suffering! What kept Paul going? Today's second reading gives us the answer: his heart was filled with a heavenly vision. Paul could consider beatings and shipwrecks as "light affliction" because he had received glimpses of the "eternal weight of glory" that awaited him (2 Corinthians 4:17.) He could make light of how his "outer self" was "wasting away" because the Lord kept renewing his "inner self" (4:16). And he was able to keep his focus off the hardships staring him in the face because he kept seeking insight into "what is unseen," the eternal truths of a loving, faithful God (4:18).

All of this may sound hopelessly out of reach, but the truth is, the kind of heavenly vision St. Paul describes is open to everyone. That's because it doesn't depend on our talents but on the Spirit's grace. All he asks of us is faithfulness to prayer, an open and humble heart, and a promise to be patient as he slowly opens our eyes. God *wants* to give you a heavenly vision! Even in the midst of any "light afflictions" you may be experiencing, he can give you his consolation and strength. Even when you can't seem to see the way ahead, he will bring the path to heaven into sharper focus. So keep fixing your heart on "what is unseen." Keep asking the Spirit to help you look at "what is seen" with new eyes (2 Corinthians 4:18). This is one prayer he loves to answer!  
"Lord, open my eyes! Fill me with a vision of heaven!"

**SAINT BARNABAS, APOSTLE (MEMORIAL) DAILY MEDITATION: ACTS 11:21-26; 13:1-3**

The Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." (Acts 13:2) Barnabas, whose feast we celebrate today, was a pivotal figure in the early Church. In fact, without his ardent desire to share the gospel and care for God's people, the Church might never have grown as quickly or spread as far as it did. We are first introduced to Barnabas in Acts 4. Out of love for Christ and his followers, he sold a piece of property and gave the money to the apostles to distribute to the needy among them. No wonder he was nicknamed "Barnabas," which means "son of encouragement" (4:36)! He must have lifted the sagging spirits of his fellow believers in the midst of their hardship and persecution.

As a trusted brother in the Lord, Barnabas was sent to Antioch to investigate reports that Gentiles were coming to faith in Christ (Acts 11:22). He then teamed up with Paul to teach these new believers, undertook a relief mission for the Jerusalem community, and finally, with Paul, was "set apart" by the Holy Spirit for their first missionary journey (11:25, 30; 13:2).

Barnabas must have possessed many gifts that helped him become such an effective evangelist. But his story tells us that his most important gift was his passion for Christ. And the source of that passion? He was "filled with the Holy Spirit and faith" (Acts 11:24).

By virtue of our Baptism, God has "set apart" each and every one of us to contribute to the building up of his kingdom. But Barnabas would tell you that you can't do this kind of work by yourself. You need the Holy Spirit, not only to equip you with talents and gifts, but to give you a burning desire to see that kingdom flourish in your midst.

Today, ask the Holy Spirit to fill you with a passion to do the work to which he has called you (Acts 13:2). If you're not sure what that work is, keep asking God to show you. If you've been doing God's work but are feeling worn out or discouraged, ask the Spirit to inflame your heart with renewed determination and hope. Then trust that he will do it! "St. Barnabas, pray for me to be a passionate disciple, just as you were."

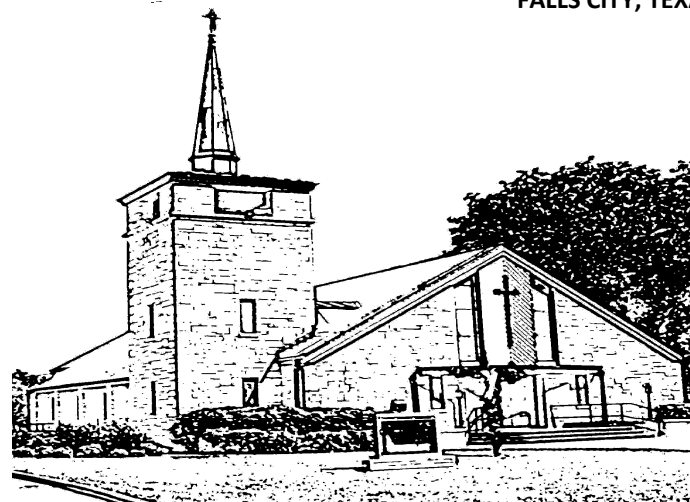
