PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

The Commemoration of the Lord's Entrance into Jerusalem - DAILY MEDITATION: MARK 11:1-10 Hosanna! (Mark 11:9)

The two Gospel readings today can give us emotional whiplash. As Mass begins, we hear the story of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. We may even wave our own palm branches and join the crowd in shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" (Mark 11:9). Then, in the Liturgy of the Word, we hear Mark's passion account. Once again, we join our voices with the crowd—but this time, we cry out, "Crucify him!" (15:13). How jarring!

Why does the Church have us play a role in both of these readings as we begin Holy Week?

It's all for one purpose: so that we can grasp more fully what Jesus did for the crowds back then—and for us. As we will see throughout Holy Week, he accepted the suffering set before him and freely offered himself for his people, regardless of how they responded. Whether they acclaimed or condemned him, he loved them just the same. And that's how he loves us. Jesus is not put off by our fickleness. That's good news! Because if we're honest, we can all recognize times when our own commitment to the Lord and our love for him has wavered. When life is going well, it's not so hard to praise him. But it can be another story altogether when danger threatens or sadness darkens our outlook.

So allow these passages to motivate you to pay attention to this final week in Christ's life. Acknowledge the inconstancy of your own love for Jesus and ask him to strengthen you. But don't stop there! Open your heart to the liberating truth that Jesus loves you even when you stray. Look at the cross and believe that he held you close to his heart throughout his passion, death, and resurrection.

May the Lord pour out graces on us all during this most holy week of the year!

"Lord, prepare me to receive you more deeply as I prepare for the feast of your resurrection!"

FRIDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD (GOOD FRIDAY) - DAILY MEDITATION: ISAIAH 52:13–53:12 Their guilt he shall bear. (Isaiah 53:11)

Though written nearly six centuries before Christ, the "Servant Songs" in the Book of Isaiah are remarkable for the way they seem to describe Jesus and his mission. Today's reading even sums up what Jesus would accomplish by his passion and death: "Through his suffering, my servant shall justify many, and their guilt he shall bear" (Isaiah 53:11).

Yes, Jesus willingly bore our guilt. He even bore the guilt of the very people who were complicit in his arrest, trial, and crucifixion! John's passion narrative, which we read every Good Friday, makes it clear who they are:

Judas, one of the Twelve, who followed Jesus from the beginning of his public ministry and yet still made the grievous decision to betray him.

The high priest Caiaphas, who failed to recognize Jesus as the Messiah and sent him to be tried before the Roman authorities.

Peter, one of Jesus' closest disciples, who swore that he would die rather than turn on his Master but then denied three times that he even knew him.

Pontius Pilate, who knew that Jesus was innocent but, fearing the reaction of the people, condemned him to death. The people in the crowd, who called out to Pilate, "Crucify him!"

Of this cast of characters, we only know of one person, Peter, who responded to the grace of the cross and received Jesus' forgiveness (John 21). Fully restored, Peter went on to preach the good news and ultimately give his life for the Lord.

The truth is that all the people in this story could have repented and turned to the Lord—even in the last hour of their lives. Despite their treatment of him, Jesus loved them, and by "his stripes," he offered all of them healing and forgiveness (Isaiah 53:5). And perhaps some of them did accept his mercy!

Astounding? Yes. But that's the message of the cross. Not only on Good Friday, but every day, let that message speak to you: You are loved. You are forgiven. You are redeemed.

"Jesus, from the bottom of my heart, I thank you for bearing my guilt so that I might be healed of all the wounds of sin."


