# I Look Back and Wonder How I got Over

The sudden feeling of December, the last month of the year of 2022, reminded me of the gospel song "How I Got Over". (I have provided the lyrics sung by Mahalia Jackson for you at the end of this article. I pray that you will see their impact on me and feel their power for yourself.)

The velvety smooth voices of singers such Mahalia Jackson, Aretha Franklin, moved the emotions of their audiences but it was the listeners awareness of the struggles not just of the singers themselves but of their own struggles and the struggles of most African-Americans in this nation, during a time when discrimination because of race was an oppressive reality. The power of this song and its words is in the proclamation of unwavering faith in Jesus Christ.

While the song proclaims surprise and gratitude for the reality of the blessings of this moment in time; its spiritual power comes from its powerful expression of gratitude for the certain, unquestionable future victory over sin and death and a wonderful celebratory life in heaven, we have because of Jesus Christ. The singers lead the listeners into a celebration of the reality of what is to come as though it has already become a reality that cannot be denied. When I look back and wonder how I got over makes me grateful for what God has done for me, is doing for me, and will do for me in this life, right now, tomorrow, 2023 and beyond. But more importantly, when I look back and wonder how I got over gives me joy for the security I have in my eternal salvation and the guaranteed future in heaven that is mine because of God's grace and mercy given to me through faith in Jesus Christ.

Dearly Beloved, take a moment and look back over the year of 2022. Think about the challenges you have faced and overcome. Think about the battles you have fought and the victories you have won. Thank God for the forgiveness you have experienced. Praise God for His grace and mercy. Confess to God and yourself that God has been better to you than you deserved. Reflect with "wonder" on the words "how I got over" and try to answer the question: Why have I been so blessed when others some of which are more righteous than I am, are struggling and depending on the Blessing Box and Dallas-High Shoals Christian ministry for food to eat. Yes, I encourage you to look back and "wonder" how I got over. If that does not make your heart sing with praise and dance with gratitude and joy, it is time for some serious prayer.

Remember the classic story, "A Christmas Carol." The main character Ebenezer Scrouge had become self-sufficient. He trusted in his money and business acumen for success and happiness. Scrouge had lost the "Wonder of life" that we see in "Tiny Tim" the crippled son of his nephew Bob. The physically handicapped and financially poor "Tiny Tim" has the "wonder" of joy and faith in God. Tiny Tim shines in happiness while the healthy and rich Scrouge walks in darkness. "Wonder" is what Ebenezer Scrouge needed. "Wonder" is what all of us need. "Wonder" is that amazing gift of knowing that because of God, something good, something amazing, something supernatural, something beyond our ability to conceive of is going to happen to our benefit and the benefit of others.

Yes, December is a great time to look back and "wonder" how you got over. It's the last month of the calendar year, the last month of most fiscal years, and the last month you can make deductible donations for the Tax year. December is a great time look back and "wonder" because we celebrate the human birth of our Divine Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, who died on the cross to pay the penalty for our sins and rose from the dead to give us everlasting life. And December is a great time to look back and "wonder" how you got over because it is the beginning of Advent when we focus on our readiness for Jesus Christ's return and the beginning of eternity. Yes, now is a good time to look back and "wonder" how you got over!

My prayer for each of you is that Advent fills your hearts with "wonder" at God's grace and mercy. I pray your "wonder" generates enthusiasm for the new year! I pray you have a "wonder-full" Christmas giving thanks to God for the gift of faith and the grace of salvation for yourself and others. I pray that you enjoy the "wonder" you see in your children and grandchildren. As the door of history closes on this hallway of time called 2022, I pray you will look back with "wonder" on the blessings you have experienced.
