# Message from Father Apostolos

#### Spiritual Influenza

To say that this flu season has been a tough one would be an understatement, a problem I knew to be chronic as I visited parishioners in our area hospitals for non flu-related medical issues. Patients were waiting in post-op for two days to find a room and others were to be found in hallways or—as one hospital employee told me—very nearly in tents outside.

Thankfully, this flu season seems to be abating somewhat and there is hope that it will soon be behind us. We can only hope that next season's vaccine is more effective than this season's! Perhaps like me, you've become quite zealous about washing your hands often, avoiding unnecessary contact with others, and disinfecting your surroundings in a bid to avoid the plague.

Physical ailments such as this nationwide flu outbreak which claimed the lives of victims young and old rightly give us cause for concern. But there are other types of ailments which may lie dormant within unwitting victims, diseases about which we seem wholly unconcerned.

Early screening for serious diseases like cancer is highly recommended. Batteries of tests are conducted to scan the body for the presence of potentially lethal abnormalities. And this self-same logic can be as accurately applied to our spiritual lives as to our physical lives.

Great Lent provides us "an annual physical" (though I suppose a more accurate term would be "an annual spiritual") as we undergo an examination through the holy mystery of confession and by attending to the well-being of our souls. The Eastern Orthodox teaching on sin equates it closely to a pathogen, a virus, a substance toxic to spiritual health and ultimately to salvation.

God's design for humanity was that we should live in union with Him and enjoy perfect health and well-being, body and soul, in a freely-chosen embrace of divine love. But the toxin called "sin" was introduced into our spiritual DNA when our first parents abandoned this embrace. And over the long ensuing generations humanity fell into so horrific a state of spiritual disease that our extinction was imminent.

When a patient is overrun by toxins and the body becomes septic, blood transfusions are often deployed to rid the body of the pathogens. Jesus Christ offered Himself to the Cross and to death so that such a transfusion could be performed in each of us, "for by His stripes we are healed." (Is. 53:5) He offers us His own Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist to help us maintain our spiritual health.

And it helps to lay aside the many wrong-headed and un-Orthodox views on sin and salvation popular today. For instance, many hold to the view that sin really only involves the breaking of a commandment and the harming of a relationship but that the sinner escapes relatively unscathed. This is not the Orthodox Christian view.

Holy Scripture reminds us that "the wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23) and "the soul the sinneth, it shall die." (Ezek. 18:20) We ought no more make light of un-diagnosed and untreated sin than we would cancer or an influenza pandemic. For while the lethality of untreated is sin is absolute, effective treatment is readily available.

Coming to holy confession on a regular basis and maintaining healthy spiritual habits (a healthy diet in the Holy Eucharist, spiritual vitamins of Scripture readings, regular exercise of fasting and taming our passions, and the pure air of daily prayer) are as essential to the well-being of our souls as diet, exercise, vitamins, etc. are to our physical health.

Understood in this way, Great Lent is like a spiritual health spa, a clinic where the unwell can be healed and where sin-weary patients can be put on the road to recovery. I pray that before this grace-filled opportunity slips away we will commit ourselves to eradicating the pathogen of sin from our souls!

#### SPRING, LENT AND GIVING

Spring is in the air! The Lenten season bring with it a time to clean out, simplify, focus inward, refresh and prepare for Pascha. The sun begins to rise a bit earlier and set a bit later giving us longer days to relish our desert sunshine. As we feel the chill lift off from the air the sun feels brighter and warm and the flowers bloom all around us. There is an anticipation in the air for what is to come.

There seems to be excitement in the air at Holy Trinity as well. Some positive and welcome changes are upon us. For one, Little Big Minds, our new tenant, has moved in to the Education Building and the much-needed revenue flow has begun. The Community Center Refresh Project is almost complete. The interior walls have been painted, the floors have been repaired. The carpet in the lounge will soon be replaced and the lighting upgrade will be completed as well. We've pulled up the blinds and will be replacing the curtains, letting the natural light in to brighten that space. It's amazing what a fresh coat of paint and a good window cleaning will do to create a renewed sense of vibrancy and life to a 40-yearold, beloved building that has housed us and served us so well.

As we see these changes happening all around us, we hope you feel a sense of excitement and anticipation in your homes and families too. Lent is the perfect opportunity to take pause and take stock of what is truly important. And we hope and pray that if you have not already filled out your 2018 Stewardship Pledge Cards that you will prayerfully consider doing so during Lent. The Lord has given us so many beautiful gifts as mentioned above, it is impossible to repay. But we can take care of our beloved Cathedral and become Stewards of the Church.

Some very important Stewardship Facts to keep in mind:

- \* Parishioners must fill out a new Pledge Card every single year. Please fill out all the information on that card as it is how we keep accurate records of our Holy Trinity families. Even if your information remains the same, a new Pledge Card must be filled out and submitted.
- \* To be on a board of a Church ministry, run for the Parish Council or hold any office, you must be a "Steward in Good Standing." So what is a "Steward in Good Standing?" A parishioner who has filled out a Pledge Card and made a financial contribution toward that pledge.
- \* Stewardship Goal for 2018 is \$380,000. So far, we have 184 families who have pledged \$222,242,68. We are well on our way but have a way to go!
- \* Fill out your 2018 Pledge Card on line! Go to: http://www.holytrinityphx.org/, click on the blue "Stewardship 2018" button and click on the "Fill Out Your Pledge Card Here." Fill out your information and hit "Submit". Then, become an on-line giver through our WeShare automated payment program.
- \* Can you give more? Each year we not only ask you to please fill out a new card but we also ask that you prayerfully consider increasing your pledge. If every single family increased their pledge by \$30 a month, Stewardship would cover all Holy Trinity's monthly expenses.

Let us come together this Lenten season and prepare for Pascha. We thank you for your continued support and generosity! 4


# Stewardship Envelopes




### Hellenic Historical Museum

#### March Holy Days:

March 4th—Sunday of St. Gregory of Palamas: this Saint expounded and defended the theological doctrine of "divine light." While we honor this saint in the Matins for the day, the main theme of this second Sunday is that healing and forgiveness of sins cannot be separated.

March 11th—Sunday of Adoration of the Holy Cross: This mid-point in Great Lent sets the Cross of Christ before us to remind us of our faith and reverence for the Cross in the history of salvation while it focuses us on the Cross to come of Holy Friday. The Cross is carried on a tray with flowers around the Church to the middle of the Church, where it is on display for all to see and venerate during the service.

March 18th—Sunday of St. John Climacus: This Saint lived in the 17th century and his life realized the ideal of fasting and penitence just as we should focus on these during Great Lent especially.

March 25th—Sunday of Mary of Egypt: The feast of the Annunciation supersedes that of this fifth and final Sunday in Great Lent. The apolytikion of St. Mary of Egypt (a symbol of conversion, contrition, and austerity) is moved to the Sunday evening compline. St. Mary expresses the last most urgent call of the Church to prepare ourselves for the coming Passion and Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

March25th—Annunciation: "Today is revealed the mystery that is from all eternity. The Son of God becomes the Son of Man..." The quote is from the matins on this feast, celebrating the announcement of the Archangel Gabriel to the most holy Virgin Mary, telling her of her impending motherhood. The greeting "Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee" is a declaration and reminder of the glory God has given to Mary and of our devotion to her. A second aspect of this feast is that we ourselves will be given revelations and moments when god will let us know His will. Jesus can be 'born' in us in the sense that our Savior takes spiritual and very real possession of our being.




