Message from Father Apostolos

Back From The Dead



The literary classic *Le Comte de Monte-Cristo* (1844) by the French author Alexandre Dumas serves as an archetype of gaining "a new lease on life." In this novel, the young man Edmond Dantes is falsely accused, unjustly convicted, and sentenced to exile in the island penal fortress off Marseilles where he is befriended by "a mad priest" who effects his escape and leads him to a horde of buried treasure with which to make a new beginning.

Such tales and others like them speak to a basic human fear of death and of oblivion, of being filed away and forgotten. Numerous accounts of so-called "near-death" experiences have been popularized into books and films, centered upon rebirth and learning from past mistakes and living differently. Even for the rest of us who (happily!) haven't endured so dramatic a moment, the yearning grows as we age to

reinvent ourselves, to cast aside our limitations and to finally become that free and fearless person we hope to be.

Pascha is nearly here! After what many of us have experienced as a lightning-fast Great Lent, Holy Week begins on the first day of April with Palm Sunday and faithful Orthodox believers will walk with Jesus from Bethany on the Saturday of Lazarus into Jerusalem and through the world-shaking events of His life-giving Passion. Our mother Church provides seventeen services from Palm Sunday through Pascha for the penitent to experience the spiritual richness of the Death and Resurrection of the Son of God.

Soon enough in the relentless flow of time, Pascha and Bright week will be behind us and even our festal leftovers will be consumed or discarded as our thoughts pivot to school graduations, summer camp, and hard-won vacations with our families. By mid-May and the leave-taking of the Paschal season, the stirring hymn "Christ is Risen from the dead" will no longer be sung; but will the power and reality of the Resurrection end for us at that time?

At every Orthodox baptism service, the epistle of St. Paul to the Romans is read which states in part; "Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, in order that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have become united with Him in the likeness of His death, certainly we shall be also in the likeness of His Resurrection." (6:4,5)

Hearing such flowery phrases may tempt us to discount them as having no basis in the gritty day-to-day reality of eking out a living to secure our "daily bread." Life places incessant demands upon us and our children and our time to such a degree that we any hope for this "newness of life" may seem forlorn at best. Does this mean for us then that our Paschal celebrations are merely moments of liturgical pageantry, devoid of any real connection to our lives once we've washed the red dye from our hands after cracking our Paschal eggs at the glendi?

St. Paul picked up this theme to the Romans in his second letter to the believers in Corinth when he wrote this: we are afflicted in every way but not crushed; perplexed but not despairing; persecuted but not forsaken; struck down but not destroyed; always carrying about in the body the dying of Jesus that the life of Jesus also may be manifest in our body. For we who live are constantly being delivered over to death for Jesus' sake that the life of Jesus also may be manifest in our mortal flesh." (4:8-10)

No, the truth is that the power of the Resurrected New Life in Jesus Christ can only be unveiled through trial and difficulty. Being as "overcomer" in Jesus Christ entails having challenges and

Speros Community Center with the 10th annual Agape Ball 2018 hosted by our Arizona Philoptochos, supporting Kids 'n' Cancer Camp Agape. The next weekend is the 12th annual HTA Toast to the Future, supporting the school and one of our own parishioner families.

Please mark your calendars for our Spring Parish Assembly on Sunday, May 6 following Divine Liturgy (formal notice and agenda to follow).

obstacles to overcome and we have no way of testing our spiritual mettle outside of the arena of true conflict. A life of luxury and ease is not, therefore, conducive to salvation. Rather, it is in the lives the hard-pressed and afflicted and not in the well-off and self-possessed that the imputed power of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ we will soon sing and celebrate is made radiant.

This "newness of life" is a promise given to us by the resurrected and glorified Son of God "who desires that all should be saved and come to the knowledge of the Truth." (1 Tim. 2:4) Far beyond a mere seasonal celebration or "religious festival," Pascha renews in the hearts of all who desire the Kingdom of God not in addition to but above all other things the Resurrection power of Jesus Christ, lifting them above the level of the mundane and ordinary and into the realm of Light and New Life in Him.

My prayer for us all is that we will lay hold on this priceless treasure and carry the hope of this New Life with us wherever our journey takes us, even into "the valley of the shadow of death" in the weeks and months to come.


Stewardship Envelopes

Byzantine Chant Beginners' Classes



St. Nectarios Books & Beyond

Holy Week, beginning with Lazarus Saturday, and Holy and Great Pascha is the holiest time of the year for Orthodox Christians.

March 31 — Lazarus Saturday: this day is not included with Great Lent, nor with Holy Week. It and Palm Sunday are set apart as a joyous prelude to the days of grief to come. The resurrection of His friend Lazarus in Bethany shows us Christ's power over Death and is a precursor of Christ's own triumph over it. Also, when Jesus weeps for His friend, we see His human nature while, being God, He commands Lazarus to rise. This also shows us that, even though we sin, Christ's Love for us can renew our spirit just as Lazarus's body was renewed after being dead for four days.

April 1 — Palm Sunday: "Behold, thy King cometh!"

April 2-7 — Holy Week begins with three days of preparation for the Passion of Christ. Each of the services on these days is rich in meaning. Be sure to use your Holy Week book to follow along and to ponder on these wonders! Listen closely on Holy Tuesday as the Choir sings the Hymn of Kassiani, "the woman who has fallen into many sins recognizes Thy godhead, O Lord. She takes upon herself the duties of a myrrh-bearer and makes ready the myrrh of mourning before Thy entombment. ... deign to bend down Thyself to me and the lamentations of my heart, O Thou who spread out the Heavens. I will fervently embrace Thy sacred feet and wipe them with the tresses of hair of my head. ... do not disregard me Thy servant, O Thou Whose mercy is boundless!" (from the Troparion of Kassiani)

April 5 — Holy Thursday: this remembers the Mystery of the Upper Room, where at the Mystical Supper the Lord gave us the Holy Eucharist.

April 6 — Holy Friday: this the mystery of Golgotha, Christ's Crucifixion, whereby He pays for our Salvation. As you join in the singing of the Lamentations, pay attention to the meaning of the words!

April 7 — Holy Saturday: while Jesus rests in His tomb, the Church anticipates His Resurrection in the service this day, ending the sorrow of His Passion and celebrating the joy of His Resurrection.

April 8 — Great and Holy Pascha: Christ is Risen! Truly He is Risen! Christos Anesti! Alithos Anesti! Don't forget the "Agape" Vespers in the afternoon of Holy Pascha, in which the appearance of the Risen Christ to His Apostles is read in as many languages as possible, to remind us that we ALL belong to Christ, if we answer His knock on the door of our heart!

April 9-14 — Week of Renewal or Bright Week: during this week the doors of the Iconostasion remain open at all times, symbolizing the free access to the Holiest of Holies that Jesus Christ, as our Great High Priest, opened for us with His blood. There is NO fasting and NO prostrations this week, as we stand with our Risen Christ in celebration.

April 13 — Theotokos of the Life-giving Font: the title refers to a spring near Constantinople in which many healings took place, attributed to the Theotokos, although the church in her honor was destroyed in 1821 by the Turks the fountain remained, and in 1833 a new Church was built.

April 23 — St. George: George was a Roman soldier who refused to pray to idols, resigned his commission, was persecuted and then beheaded in 303 A.D. During the Crusades, he appeared and encouraged the Christians many times, particularly in the hard-fought battle at Antioch. This is why Orthodoxy titled him, "Great among martyrs" and the "Victory-clad George"!



Greek School and Cultural Program

On March 25, 1821 the bishop **Germanos of Patras** raised the Greek flag at the Monastery of Agia Lavra in Peloponnese and one more revolution started against the Turks. The people of Greece shouted "**Freedom or Death**" and they fought the War of Independence for 9 years (1821-1829) until a small part of modern Greece was finally liberated and it was declared an independent nation.

The struggle for the liberation of all the lands inhabited by Greeks continued. In 1864, the lonian islands were added to Greece; in 1881 parts of Epirus and Thessaly. Crete, the islands of the Eastern Aegean and Macedonia were added in 1913 and Western Thrace in 1919. After World War II the Dodecanese islands were also returned to Greece.

The Greek Flag was created in 1821. The white cross is for the importance of the Greek Orthodox Church in the creation of the country and the stripes are for the Aegean Sea. Also, there are nine stripes for each letter of the Greek word ELEFTHERIA (freedom).
