Message from Father Apostolos

Dancing In The Rain



A sense of dread fell over me as the Saturday of our Festival Weekend announced itself to the sound of thunder and heavy rain. Though life-giving moisture is always welcomed in the desert, timing is everything and the sight of our grand pavilion marooned by "Lake Trinity," as it came to be called, confirmed my forebodings.

Touring the festival grounds, I soon discovered that we had our work cut out for us. Many of the booths were without power and unable to open. Tents and supplies had to be moved, pallets and plywood laid down, and creative solutions found quickly. I joked with some our dancers about "splash dancing" but it was clear that despite their many hours of rehearsals they would be unable to perform.

It is said that character is revealed under adverse circumstances and the true character of our community was certainly on display at this year's festival. One might expect to have heard grumbling or complaining, or to have have witnessed a gloomy and dejected reaction to the steady downpour but such negativity never emerged.

Instead, some iconic moments occurred which will long endure; such as the sight of our pool supply vendor's float toys drifting about in Lake Trinity. Or the viral video of some crazy Greeks ankle-deep in water as they danced in the swamped pavilion with silly grins plastered across their faces, undaunted in their joy!

And as the festival was winding down Sunday evening, one of our young adults asked me if I thought the festival was a success despite the rain to which I replied with a resounding "yes!" To be sure, our anticipated financial windfall took a hit and we must respond to this new challenge. But as I looked around at the festival volunteers busily discharging their assigned duties I was filled with pride.

For we rose to the occasion and surmounted the obstacles thrown in our way! When we could have thrown up our hands and given in to pessimism, we just worked harder. Even among our young dancers who could, by right, have been depressed at not getting to display their skills to the typically huge Saturday crowds, we found ebullient spirits as they channeled their energies into even more sparkling Sunday performances!

And what we attained in exchange for the funds we did not realize is of far greater value; the true measure of ourselves. It is easy for us to become lulled into a false sense of security as our string of sunny festival weekends seemed unending (though we knew this streak would eventually end.) We had long since come to rely too heavily on this annual windfall and had thus become complacent to an extent.

However, a parish community capable of rallying around the mission of executing our annual festival in such trying circumstances - and that with a positive can-do attitude - cannot validly say of itself "we can't" when faced with whatever new challenges lie ahead of us.

We owe it to ourselves, our children, and to those such as our beloved Tiffani Bichekas who so loved the festival and whom we lost that Sunday morning, to *remember* what we accomplished and can accomplish together! Challenges we will certainly have, but with our trust in God and in the power of our Faith in Jesus Christ we will overcome them!

+ THE HOLY TRINITY ENDOWMENT FUND +

The Holy Trinity Endowment Fund was established in 1992 with an initial deposit of \$2,000. The goal was to build the Endowment Fund whereby the interest and appreciation would one day provide sufficient income so Holy Trinity would no longer be <u>totally dependent</u> on an annual festival to supplement Stewardship income.

The Endowment Fund is obligated to preserve the donor's contributions such that the principal will remain <u>inviolate</u> and be held in perpetuity by the Church. The funds are prudently managed by the investment committee, which reports to the Parish Council. The only withdrawals from the fund the investment committee approves are from the earnings and appreciation above the donor's contributions. Withdrawals are used only to benefit Holy Trinity and its ministries.

Over the course of the past twenty-six years the committee has held steadfast to this mission, and as a result, generous donors from our Church, desiring to leave a legacy in perpetuity for their family, have made contributions totaling 520,000. Those original contributions have grown to the current value of \$882,606.

The Endowment Fund has, over the past few years returned to the Church over \$50,000 in dividends and has applied over \$110,000 of appreciated value to reduce the outstanding balance of our loan from \$998,000 to \$651,000. When the Endowment Funds were pledged as collateral at Chase to secure the loan, they reduced the annual interest rate on the loan from 7.25% to 2.45%. This resulted in an interest savings of over \$50,000 per year for over seven years. The loan was transferred to the American Bank & Trust in August 2015, (without the Endowment Funds as collateral) and is now at \$651,000 @ 3 ½%.

This is your opportunity to put your lifetime thumbprint in the history of Holy Trinity Cathedral.

We have been blessed by the generosity and foresight of the individuals and families listed on the next page. We benefit today from their kindness and vision. If your circumstances allow you to give a gift above and beyond your annual stewardship commitment, then please take this occasion to join the others in creating a legacy by pledging your gift to Holy Trinity Cathedral's perpetual Endowment Fund. Gifts of \$10,000 or more will be separately listed along with others who have reached that level. Your pledge can be made over as many as three years.

Any gift, no matter the amount will be combined into the general endowment fund, and will be greatly appreciated.






St. Nectarios Books & Beyond

November is a time of Thanksgiving, and is the beginning of the preparations for Nativity of our Lord (Christmas). Advent, as this fasting time is also called, is like Great Lent in that it lasts for forty days, but it doesn't have the same liturgical restrictions and strictness. Instead, it is a time for feeling more intensely our individual awareness of the grace the coming of our Lord affords us.





Our featured new CD, "Living in an Orthodox World," is a great way to help each of us prepare for the coming Holy Days! The hymns each present "directly or indirectly, a liturgical service or theme in a way that is simple, sing-able, memorable, and educational. Some songs incorporate potions of prayers, [hymns] and melodies from liturgical services to implant a familiarity and desire for the services of Church." (Fr. Michael Shambour) And our own Youth Choir is learning to sing some of them for us! The CDs are reasonably priced so they will make great gifts for family and friends. Come and listen to the CD this month in the Bookstore!

November Holy Days:

November 1: SS. Comas and Damianos, the Unmercenaries – these two twin brothers were early martyr physicians who treated the poor and needy for free. ("Mercenary" means motivated only by profit.) *They are also commemorated on July 1st.*

November 8: Synaxis of the Archangels, also known as the Feast of St. Michael and All the Holy Angels—angels are pure created spirits whose purpose is to adore and reflect the Divine Beauty. They intervened with patriarchs, prophets; ministered to Jesus in the desert, in His agony and at His Resurrection; and were intimately involved in the lives of the Apostles and the beginnings of the Church. Scriptures mention only three Angels by name: Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael.

November 9: St. Nectarios the Wonderworker – we are celebrating the Feast Day of our Patron Saint on Sunday, November 11, with a small "Coffee And" on the courtyard in front of the Education Building. Come and join us, please!

November 13: St. John Chrysostom – a priest and Patriarch of Constantinople, his name means "golden mouthed" because of his eloquent sermons and his liturgical reforms. It is his Divine Liturgy that is celebrated every Sunday! He is also commemorated on January 30th.

November 14: St. Philip the Apostle, and also St. Gregory Palamas – Philip (or Phillip) was the fourth Apostle chosen by Christ, and the only one with a Greek name. He probably spoke Greek. St. Gregory expounded and defended the theological doctrine of 'divine light', as in "I am the Light of the world." He is also celebrated on the second Sunday of Great Lent.

November 15: Nativity Fast begins.

November 16: St. Mathew the Apostle and Evangelist – "Matthew" comes from Hebrew, meaning 'gift of Jehovah." He was a tax collector who became one of the Twelve Apostles and wrote the first Gospel of the New Testament.

November 21: Entry into the Temple of the Theotokos – two themes give us the spiritual meaning of the presentation of the Mother of God into the Temple. First, the holiness of Mary herself is indicated; she is as a small child devoting her life to her God. Second is a comparison of the physical Temple (made of stone) and the living Temple, a life that is holy and pure with God. It is the living Temple which sanctifies the building. Through the Theotokos, this living Temple unites each of us to Christ, as she is the instrument of the Incarnation. "Know ye not that you are the Temple of God?" (1 Cor. 3:16)
