

Message from Father Apostolos

A Family Lenten Survival Plan

Ask any harried mother of school-aged children as she's packing lunches during Great Lent and she will affirm that raising Orthodox Christian children in our decidedly heterodox world is not easy. The simplest things like school lunches and planning weekly activities can suddenly become quite complex; there is only *so much* peanut butter and jelly a child can be expected to eat, after all!

And then there's the "extra" services of Great Lent and the emphasis on things like repentance and confession when everyone else is basking in the sun while it can still be done safely. It feels very much as if we Orthodox folk are badly out of sync with the world around us! Time stubbornly marches on and our hoped-for Lenten menu selection looks less and less appealing well before Holy Week. "Maybe next year it'll be better" we think to ourselves as the lament of enforced veganism reaches a fever pitch!

As another Great Lent begins, many may quietly ask themselves "What's so great about it?" And if our experience of this seasonal opportunity to repent and to go deeper in Christ is confined to arguments over meal planning then this is a valid question. Is Great Lent really *only* or even *primarily* about abstaining from animal products? Clearly not, but organizing one's family Lenten journey will take careful planning if one is ever to move beyond such basic considerations.


Where to begin? Start with the family calendar and plug in the Lenten services of each week; Monday Great Compline, Wednesday Pre-sanctified Liturgies, Friday Akathist Hymn services, and Sunday evening Pan-Orthodox Vespers services. Is it likely that your family will make *every* service? Nope! But without sufficient planning you'll likely not make *any* and it is appropriate to move other appointments and time commitments in order to attend as many Lenten services as possible.

Do your children (or do you for that matter) know the Lenten Prayer of St. Ephraim? Can you carve out the time each evening to lead your children in evening prayers before tucking them into bed? Do you have a collection box from one of our Archdiocese national ministries for the poor? Do your teens have the "Daily Readings" app from the Archdiocese on their phones? Have they registered yet for the Desert GOYA Lenten Retreat?

Feeling overwhelmed? If so, great! This is frankly overwhelming... but staring down into the eyes of our little grandson recently reminded me all over again just how important it is for Orthodox parents to lead their young into the fullness of the Faith. Nobody's perfect, and parenting is more art than science anyway, but even a *little* planning can go a long way toward refocusing our attention off of "how many things can I make with rice and beans?" to more important things like prayer, forgiveness, and growing in Christ.

Soon enough another Great Lent will have come and gone, but our goal should be greater than merely to *survive* another fasting period. And with the right planning we and our children can experience the true joy of new life in Jesus Christ. May the Holy Mother of our Lord give us strength and inspiration to take our little ones by the hand and lead them through the "gates of repentance" in this beautiful Lenten Spring!

May it be blessed!


Historical Museum

HTA is one of 25 Greek Orthodox parochial day schools across the United States that comprise the Archdiocesan School System and operate under the auspices of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America. All day schools adhere to local and state mandated

curricula and offer a program of studies that includes the teaching of Modern Greek language, Greek history and culture, as well as elements of the Greek Orthodox faith. In addition, HTA offers Fine Arts and their newest program, Παιδική Κήπος (Children's Garden), that teaches children how to plant, grow, and care for a garden.

It is amazing to be part of such an elite group responsible in part for the spiritual and academic growth of the children who attend their schools and a role that HTA takes very seriously. We know that the first five years in a child's life are the most important for their development. The bond that is created between their parents and what they learn over those first five years is astounding and while what they learn is incredible, the most important things are the bonds they develop with their caretakers.


The HTA staff are all early childhood educators and know that preschool is usually the child's first step away from home. From teaching children how to appropriately express themselves to developing independent thinkers, we cover a lot of ground. We also know that while our bond with the children is important, the bond we make with the family is too. Our students have amazing families who are engaged and participate in their child's lives and we are so proud to partner with






Greek School

“Yiasas!” Irene Dartoozos-Mackos (Kyria Eirini) announces cheerfully and her class of Level 1 students responds, “Yiasou!”



“Ti lei ee koukouvayia seemera,” she asks her class. The kids shout their answers.

At St. Cosmas Aitolos Greek School at Holy Trinity, students are learning Greek at every grade level, year after year, beginning in preschool when they’re still perfecting their ABCs and learning to read basic sentences in English.

Kyria Eirini, Kyria Georgiana and Kyria Eleanna meet 2 hours per week. By the time they leave St. Cosmas Aitolos Greek School at Holy Trinity, students are expected to speak, write stories and answer questions in Greek, she said.



Giving all kids at Holy Trinity an early taste of a world language can spark them to learn more. If they opt to take Greek every year in middle and high school, they will have been exposed to 13 years of instruction before graduation. Adults feel more proficient to talk to family and friends.



The cultural program appreciates the culture, traditions, history and geography of Greece. They are learning key-terms such as Filotimo, Filoxenia, Axioprepia and Ypohreosi.

The mission of St. Cosmas Aitolos Greek School at Holy Trinity Greek is to provide education and instruction of the Greek language, culture, and heritage, to enhance bi-cultural and bilingual awareness, and to promote the moral and ethical values of the Greek Orthodox families.



Greek Language & Culture School

\$350 per year/ per child

Culture School meets every 3rd Friday from 6-7pm.


