Message from Father Apostolos

the impetus and driving force gained by the development of a process or course of events.



Gathering momentum in life is not something easily achieved. Some may suggest that momentum appears when preparation meets opportunity. And while this is partly true, there remains a third element necessary to gather momentum; *execution*, or the application of *effort*.

Holy Trinity Cathedral is being propelled forward on a fresh burst of momentum! Or, as someone recently remarked to me "we have our groove back." That this is happening is far from incidental or accidental; rather, this is the result of sustained effort on the part of many faithful members who volunteer time and resources to enlarge the Kingdom of God here in Phoenix. The evidence of this is readily apparent to all.

Take our music ministry, for instance. One cannot fail to perceive the diligent efforts of our choir members and chanters in the weekly worship services celebrated at Holy Trinity. Our music ministers have embraced their sacred tasks seriously and prayerfully, attending the weekly rehearsals, arriving prepared and prayed-up to not only sing but to do so reverently. The results of their devotion speak for itself!

Our Youth Ministry is also riding a fresh burst of momentum with the adoption of our Pastoral Assistant, Alexander Eliades, into the Cathedral family. Already well known to many of our Holy Trinity young ones through All Saints Camp, Alexander hit the ground running and has been gathering our youth together frequently, strategizing with our newly-elected OPA (Orthodox Parents Assoc.) officers and members, and coordinating youth events with our Valley sister parishes. He will spearhead a robust youth ministry for our parish which will bear fruit in our young ones' lives for years to come.

The care and condition of the campus itself is riding a fresh burst of momentum. It is no small task to maintain an \$11MM commercial campus the size and age of ours. Multiple layered and complex systems require constant monitoring, repair, and replacement. You will have noticed that long-deferred repairs have been made and we are now not only *reacting* to the pressing crisis but *responding* to the needs of the campus. Again, no accident here! Rather, knowledgeable and diligent volunteers and donors (and our Sons of Pericles Chapter) have stepped up to put things right! Kudos to them all!

Our Outreach Ministry is also riding a fresh burst of momentum! What once may have been viewed as "a nice thing to do," is now understood as critical for the stability and growth of our membership. Holy Trinity is a magnet for visitors in and to the Valley. It is a rare Sunday morning indeed that doesn't see a handful of visitors to our services. New members remark to me about the beauty and authenticity of our worship, of our friendly and welcoming atmosphere, and on how many other young families call the Cathedral home. We are a great place to be with a bright future ahead of us!

Lastly though not finally since I could go on and on, our Ministry of Administration is riding a fresh burst of momentum. Your Parish Council has been working very diligently behind the scenes in the pre-work of a long-range planning or strategic initiative for Holy Trinity. Assessing the various key aspects of parish life such as those listed above and others, the council is building an architecture to guide an expanded initiative which will involve the entire parish. We understand that yesterday's solutions may not avail for tomorrow's problems as we fulfill the Great Commission of

Message from Pastoral Assistant Alexander

Hello everyone!



First, I would like to extend my thanks to everyone who has welcomed my wife and me to Holy Trinity over the summer, it's been a wonderful beginning. I had the fantastic opportunity to be with our youth at All Saints Camp to begin the summer and talking about this upcoming year with the leaders of OPA and others has me so excited to get this ministry year under way! Father Apostolos and I have had many conversations recently about the great momentum that is building here at Holy Trinity Cathedral and we are eager to harness this energy and desire for growth into something real.

I was asked to give a run down of how the year will take shape and also about Youth and Young Adult Ministry in general, so before we go too far, we do need to talk about what our ministry plan is here at Holy Trinity. Our goal for all ministry is simple: to grow closer to Christ and His Church. That's it. No tricks or bait and switches, just Christ. The real question is this: how can we do this effectively? This has been the question for the Church in America since we arrived here. We have tried the Sunday School model, which can be effective but will never be enough for us to learn about Christ and *own* our faith (imagine only sending your kids to school for math for 30 minutes *per week* and expecting them to be math whizzes by the end of High School). We have tried different "programs" more or less related to the faith to try to get the kids "more involved;" we have seen the result and it is not encouraging. We have tried the "fun" approach but there will *always* be somewhere more "fun" than the Church. However, what the world and most of all our youth need is The Truth, and The Truth is found nowhere but the Church. I'm not here to say I have all (or even some of) the answers. What I'm here for is this, to help everyone earnestly grow towards Christ as best as we all can.

I harped on three things with the kids we had at camp and they will almost be our maxims of ministry this year:

- ✓ Ask questions! We all have questions about the faith that we run into every once in awhile, in fact some of these questions can be doubts. *This is good!* A faith without questions is dead. We are not told to blindly believe but to "come and see" and "search the Scriptures." Let's do it!
- ✓ I also asked our campers if they were at peace while at camp; not necessarily "happy" all the time, but at peace, and all of them said yes. I posited to them that this was not just because we were "with our Greek friends" but because we prayed. We prayed every day and night together, before every meal, and before a most of our activities. There was a culture of prayer and unsurprisingly, when we invited God into our lives, we became peaceful. Not perfect, but peaceful and God-centered.
- ✓ Finally I told them this: Holy Trinity is your home. It is not a place that we should feel shy or inhibited or most of all afraid to be. Come all the time! Come see Father and I any time you feel sad, or lonely, or happy, or exuberant, come talk to us, come talk to God. Come ask us questions. Ask us to open the Church for you so you can simply sit in the presence of God and pray there whenever you want. We are here for you, this Church is here for you, use it! Never be afraid to ask us questions or simply to talk to us. We are all a community and family here at Holy Trinity and a true family is always there for each other and their homes are always open for others.

So what will this year look like in a more concrete sense? We want to build our outreach to every age as much as we can. This means from preschool to parents and even grandparents, we want you to grow towards Christ! We will most likely have

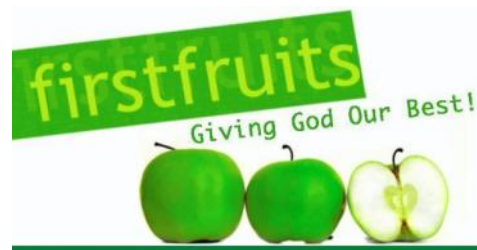

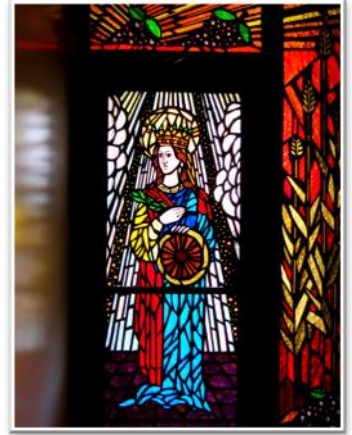

Maintenance Corner

June and July have been busy months for your maintenance committee. The parking lot light project is in process. Ted Fourlis and Peter Bilitsis replaced all the bulbs in the back lot around the Speros Community Center with LED lighting bulbs. The back lot is much brighter now. The main parking lot lights install is in full swing. Peter Bilitsis has done amazing work finding the right solution to gain brighter lighting while saving electricity costs in the main parking lot. New LED housing and lighting was purchased. Jim Contes had to machine each bracket so they can be secured to each poll. Peter, Jim, and Ted are in the process of changing out each light fixture. There are 29 lights to change out and it is a difficult process requiring a lift and boom to reach all of them. As you pass through our parking lot, please take a look at the newly installed lights. They are slim and give off a bright white light making our parking lot more visible and secure, not to mention energy saving. Thank you, Peter for all your hard work!

You may have noticed the grass around the community center and field is dead. Ted, Jim, Peter, Paul Katsenes, Jim Manelis, Adam Venetis, and John Katsaros have been working on a main line irrigation leak that was discovered. We are currently working on a solution to re-route a main line to the valves that control the watering around the Speros Center and field. We hope to complete this project in the next week or two so we can begin the watering process and green up our field and Speros Center grounds.

The last storm and rains exposed a leak in the Large Hall of the Speros Community Center roof, and broke a tree limb off the tree in front of our Cathedral. John Katsaros was able to cut and chip the broken branch immediately so it did not impede access to the Cathedral stairs. The leak in the Speros Center roof caused a significant amount of water to enter the Hall, and caused a ceiling tile to collapse causing a mess in the Hall. Thank you, Paul and Dimitri Valonis for cleaning up after the damage caused by the roof leak. We are working with the roofing company to fix the roof leak.

Adam Venetis has been working very hard maintaining our air conditioning systems in the Cathedral and the Education Building. This is no small task and we are very fortunate to have Adam working on our comfort.

St. Nectarios Books & Beyond

August brings us to the end of the Ecclesiastical Year. As we look forward to the new beginning of the ecclesiastical cycle, the Church honors the Holy Theotokos, first with the fifteen-day fast and then with the commemoration of the Dormition.



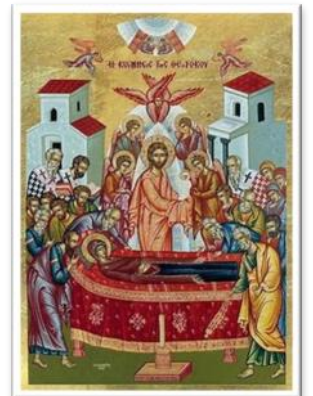
I am amazed (although not surprised) that yet again the wisdom of the Church is revealed by having this feast of the Mother of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ prepare us for the coming of the new year. Just as the Theotokos nurtured and guided Christ until He was ready for His ministry on Earth, we are now reminded by the many hymns of the Canons and Paraklesis services which relate to the life of the Theotokos of how we are loved and cared for and nurtured by God throughout our own lives, of how He is preparing us for Life Eternal with Him, if we allow Him to lead us. For as the Christ Child was obedient to His Holy Mother, and always to God the Father, so must we choose to be obedient to God our Father and our mother the Church.

August Holy Days:

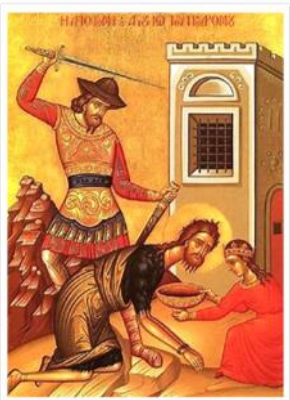


August 6: Holy Transfiguration – As Christ was approaching His time of the Passion, He took His three most intimate disciples to the top of Mount Tabor, where He was transfigured and revealed as the Light of the Holy Trinity. The voice of God once more stated that “This is my beloved Son,” and admonished His Disciples (and us through them) to “Hear Ye Him.” It is important to note that this revelation and Transfiguration came only after the effort was made to scale the heights of the Mount. So must we, too, make a personal effort to endure this life’s struggles yet persevere to reach the Goal of being with Christ and in Christ forevermore.

August 15: Dormition of the Theotokos – From the liturgical point of view, this is the most important of the feast days dedicated to the Holy Virgin. It is preceded by the two-week Lent of the Theotokos. Only in the Vespers and Matins is her death given reference; the Gospel and hymns of the Liturgy draw from the other feast days of her life. Through her death, the hymns state “the source of life is laid in the tomb, and her tomb becomes a ladder to Heaven.” In Mary, human nature reached its goal.



August 29: Beheading of John the Baptist – This feast does not celebrate so much the man who baptized Jesus and preached repentance as it does he who championed the moral law, and was killed because that law was hated. (The Year of Grace of the Lord)
