Message from Father Apostolos

In the Shadow of the Cross



Standing behind the granite altar stone in our Cathedral is the *Stavromeno*, the Holy Cross of Jesus Christ to which is affixed the icon of Jesus, the "Lamb of God Who takes away the sins of the world."

Jesus' arms are outstretched as if He is embracing the Altar itself as He presides over every service celebrated in the Cathedral. Jesus is the one "who offers Himself and Who is offered" in the Holy Eucharist. But once a year the Cross is removed from its customary place and becomes the focal point of worship.

It has been said that it is impossible to understand Holy Orthodoxy without

having experienced the full panoply of the Divine Services of Holy Week between Palm Sunday and Pascha (Easter.) And while each service manifests the presence of God in a unique way as we follow Jesus from Bethany to Jerusalem in His voluntary and life-giving Passion, Death, Burial, and glorious Resurrection, it is Holy Thursday evening which holds particular meaning for me.

For it is here during the singing of the 15th Antiphon of the Passion Gospels Matins service that the Holy Cross of Christ assumes its rightful place in our hearts. Singing the antiphon *"Today is suspended upon the Tree He Who suspended the land upon the waters"* as I carry the Cross around the nave is the most difficult task I or any priest is called to perform in the liturgical year.

Here, in the darkness of the candlelit Church, we experience the pathos of Calvary where God's plan of redemption is accomplished. Space and time fall away and there is only me and all my sins and shortcomings and my own desperate need for redemption and the Lamb of God Who offers Himself, though He is blameless, to ransom me from the clutches of death.

And here Jesus remains suspended on the Cross on the Solea until the Friday afternoon Vespers service when He is taken down, wrapped in clean linen, and placed upon the altar table. After the Holy Saturday morning service, the Cross is wound with the burial linen of Christ and the icon of Jesus still wrapped in His shroud is stored away until the Vespers of the Ascension forty days later when it is placed behind the Altar table again.

Somehow, this has always seemed odd to me; that this icon which so captured our imaginations and our hearts hours before is now placed in storage behind my vestments in the vestry. Was I only imagining or over-emphasizing its' significance? Is my fealty to the Cross of Christ measured only in a few hours? Am I free to disregard it's essential meaning the rest of the year?

It occurs to me that as we prepare to enter into the mystery of God's love demonstrated to us in the events of Holy Week that their significance and saving potential depend to a large extent on the energy I give them.

If I neglect to receive from God the outpouring of His Divine Spirit He offers to faithful hearts gathered together to witness the bloody Sacrifice of the God-Man, then the icon of the King of Glory becomes just an object peeking out from behind my vestments for forty days between Pascha and the Ascension.

So once again I ask for the grace of God to help me be fully present with my Redeemer, not just in body dutifully "performing" the services - but in my mind and heart, as His everlasting love is actualized in the Divine Worship of Holy Week. May this be our common lot, beloved brothers and sisters and fellow strivers in this most precious Faith, as Holy Week draws near!





On Saturday, March 23rd, a few members of the Cathedral Choir and Holy Trinity parishioners attended the "One Day, One Hymn, One Church" music workshop organized by the Orthodox Christian Choral Fellowship (OCCF).

This event was hosted by Sts. Peter and Paul Orthodox Church in Phoenix. Fr. Michael Pallad from St. Haralambos Greek Orthodox Church in Peoria conducted his new choral arrangement of "O Pure Virgin," a beautiful hymn originally written in the 14th century by St. Necktarios of Aegina.

Nearly 70 voices—with some sojourning all the way from Tucson—were present to sing! The beginning of the arrangement features a small group of about 10 young ladies who sing the melody supported by the adult women singing the ison (drone).

St. Nectarios Books & Beyond

Kali Anastasi!

To begin this month, here are a few reviews of books available regarding Great Lent and Holy Pascha:

Food, Faith and Fasting by Rita Madden—This expansion on her popular podcast helps us to eat to nourish our bodies and our souls. 264pp.

<u>Great Lent</u> by Alexander Schmemann—This one introduces the reader to the reasons for and necessity of fasting and other Lenten practices in the Orthodox Church. 140pp.

<u>Beautiful things, an Orthodox Coloring Book</u>—This is a 64-page coloring book for ages 3-5 years.

<u>The Miracle of the Red Egg</u> by Daria Fisher—This book tells how the red egg tradition started, way back in Apostolic times, as St. Mary Magdalene convinced the Roman Emperor of Christ's Resurrection. 32 pp.

April continues our Lenten journey for its first three weeks, with Complines on Mondays, Pre-Sanctified Liturgies on Wednesdays, and the Akathist Hymn on Fridays. On April 7th and 14th we celebrate the last two Sundays of Great Lent – Sunday of St. John Climacus and St. Mary of Egypt.

Holy Week, beginning with Lazarus Saturday, and Holy and Great Pascha is the holiest time of the year for Orthodox Christians. How wonderful that this year ALL Christians are celebrating at the same time!

April 20th—Lazarus Saturday: this day is not included with Great Lent, or with Holy Week. It and Palm Sunday are set apart as a joyous prelude to the days of grief to come. The resurrection of His friend Lazarus in Bethany shows us Christ's power over Death and is a precursor of Christ's own triumph over it. Also, when Jesus weeps for His friend, we see His human nature while, being God, He commands Lazarus to rise. This also shows us that, even though we sin, Christ's Love for us can renew our spirit just as Lazarus's body was renewed after being dead for four days.

April 21st—Palm Sunday: "Behold, thy King cometh!"

April 22nd-27th—Holy Week begins with three days of preparation for the Passion of Christ. Each of the services on these days is rich in meaning. Be sure to use your Holy Week book to follow along and to ponder on these wonders! Listen closely on Holy Tuesday to the Choir sing the Hymn of Kassiani, "the woman who has fallen into many sins recognizes Thy godhead, O Lord. She takes upon herself the duties of a myrrh-bearer and makes ready the myrrh of mourning before Thy entombment. ...deign to bend down Thyself to me and the lamentations of my heart, O Thou who spread out the Heavens. I will fervently embrace Thy sacred feet and wipe them with the tresses of hair of my head... Do not disregard me Thy servant, O Thou Whose mercy is boundless!" (from the Troparion of Kassiani)

April 25th—Holy Thursday: this remembers the Mystery of the Upper Room, where at the Mystical Supper the Lord gave us the Holy Eucharist. The Twelve Gospels of the Passion are read.

April 26th—Holy Friday: this is the mystery of Golgotha, Christ's Crucifixion, whereby He pays for our Salvation. As you join in the singing of the Lamentations, pay attention to the meaning of the words!

April 27th—Holy Saturday: while Jesus rests in His tomb, the Church anticipates His Resurrection in the service this day (Proti-Anastasi), ending the sorrow of His Passion and celebrating the joy of His Resurrection. This is Father Apostolos' favorite service, so let's all join him!

April 28th—Great and Holy Pascha: Christ is Risen! Truly He is Risen! Christos Anesti! Alithos Anesti! Don't forget the "Agape" Vespers in the afternoon of Holy Pascha, in which the appearance of the Risen Christ to His Apostles is read in as many languages as possible, to remind us that we ALL belong to Christ, if we answer His knock on the door of our heart!

April 29th-May 4th—Week of Renewal or Bright Week: during this week the doors of the Iconostasion remain open at all times, symbolizing the free access to the Holiest of Holies that Jesus Christ, as our Great High Priest, opened for us with His blood. There is NO fasting and NO prostrations this week, as we stand with our Risen Christ in celebration. (We kneel again at Pentecost.)

April 23rd—St. George: George was a Roman soldier who refused to pray to idols, resigned his commission, was persecuted and then beheaded in 303 A.D. During the Crusades, he appeared and encouraged the Christians many times, particularly in the hard-fought battle at Antioch. This is why the Orthodox titled him "Great among martyrs" and the "Victory-clad George"! Since his feast day comes during Holy Week this year, we celebrate on April 29th, Renewal Monday.






