Message from Father Apostolos

"I Doubt It!"



The Sunday after Great and Holy Pascha is, oddly enough, set aside to consider the role that doubt plays in our faith. This abrupt change from the highs of joyously proclaiming "Christ is Risen!" to observing the morose figure of St. Thomas openly calling into question the Resurrection of Jesus Christ is stark.

And yet, the icon which depicts this encounter between St. Thomas and the Risen Christ is not referred to as "The Doubting of Thomas," but as "The **Touching** of Thomas."

As we remember from the Gospel accounts, Thomas was not with his brother Disciples when Jesus first appeared to them. And when they tried to relate to him what they had seen, Thomas defiantly replied; "Unless I place my hand in the mark

of the nails, and place *my hand* in his side, I will not believe!" (John 20:25) For him, this was too important a matter to be grasped second-hand.

What role does doubt play in our faith in Jesus Christ? Even the very question may sound odd. How can doubt and faith co-exist in the same human heart? Are we not told that "true faith" dispels all doubt? If only it were that easy!

Oftentimes, people share with me their own struggles with doubt, particularly young people. But rather than scold them or dissuade them from facing those doubts I always reply "That is great news!"

For doubt can be the catalyst for growing into a more mature and deeply-rooted faith! Unchallenged "faith" is akin to an unused muscle. It is there and functions well enough when not under pressure. But just as muscles only grow under the pressure of weight training, so too our faith can only grow when challenged.

Believing in Jesus Christ in the same way we may believe in Santa Claus or the Easter Bunny is not enough. To "believe" means to "trust in, rely upon, be obedient to, and to follow." And just like St. Thomas, this level of true faith can only be experienced first-hand. Each of us, must place *our hands* in the mark of the nails and place *our hands* in Jesus' side!

Yiayia and Papou's faith, or Mom and Dad's faith is great for them; but it is not imputed to us as righteousness. Each of us must touch Christ as St. Thomas did, struggling with our own doubts, grappling with our sometimes meager faith, and ultimately crying out to God like St. Thomas; "Lord I believe! Help my unbelief!"

God can do much more with honest doubt than with disinterested "faith." To struggle with doubts means that we are awake and that we are taking seriously our own journey of faith in Jesus Christ. There will be times in our lives when our faith lags and when our doubt seems insurmountable.

In those moments, may we show the same honest courage as did St. Thomas in encountering the Risen Christ and in touching Him with our own hands!

Sacrifice. Joy. Promise. A Message on Stewardship

Christos Anesti! Christ is Risen!

Having just finished our journey through Great Lent and celebrating the Lord's Resurrection, we are reminded of the tremendous sacrifice of Jesus dying on the cross so that we could be saved from our sins. That is the ultimate sacrifice, and not one that we should take for granted. If anything, it should be an inspiration to us that God's love for us was so deep and profound, that he suffered a torturous death nailed to the Cross so that we might live. That is not just a sacrifice, it is unselfish, it is an act of courage, and a demonstration of great faith. While we are not physically placing ourselves on the cross, we are called to sacrifice in our lives as Christians. During Lent we experience this with stricter fasting. Throughout the year we sacrifice by giving our time to God through prayer, attending church services, and stepping outside our comfort zone to help others. Another way we sacrifice is through our stewardship. We are called to give our "first fruits" to the Lord. Yes, we all have bills – mortgage, utilities, insurance, groceries and many more. But stewardship is not a "bill". Stewardship is an act of love and, yes, sacrifice. Do you give God your first fruits or just the leftovers?

When you think about it, we are here because of God. All that we have has been given to us by God. As a true sacrificial act, we should give to God first, and with abundance. Our giving should extend beyond just monetary support and into volunteerism. Our Cathedral family is large and the saying "many hands make for light work" is quite true, but it seems that those hands at our parish are getting fewer and fewer. What can you do to help your Church? Can you sing in the choir, teach Sunday School, sew altar cloths, feed the poor, bake for the Festival, or even help with small repair projects on our campus? This is also an integral part of your stewardship. Yes, this will require a sacrifice of your time, but what great joy and fulfillment you will feel knowing that you gave – not just from your pockets – but from yourself for the Glory of God and for the edification of our parish.

Holy Trinity Cathedral has been here since 1931. There is a lot of history in our community, and there has been a lot of progress. But there is no promise for tomorrow. That is up to us to chart the course for our future. What will it be? A parish that is comfortable with its past and present and thinks the future will take care of itself? I'm afraid not! The promise of tomorrow rests with us and our commitment as faithful Greek Orthodox Christians and stewards to see that five, ten, twenty and event 100 years from now, Holy Trinity Cathedral will continue to be a vibrant, God-loving community, emulating the Gospel through our actions, with a thriving a house of stewards, and a parish that is shining brightly as a jewel in the desert.

Does your stewardship pledge this year really reflect your first-fruits? Perhaps you can sacrifice just a bit more. If you are not part of our steward family yet, we invite you to prayerfully pledge your support to the good and God-pleasing work of YOUR parish. Thank you!







The Sunday School program is losing Co-Director and long-time teacher Kay Ehrick, who has chosen to retire after 17 years.

Here is a letter from Kay:

Hello Holy Trinity Families,

My name is Kay Ehrick and I have had some of the BEST Sundays in the past 17 years here at Holy Trinity! I



started volunteering for the Sunday School Ministry in 2002. During that time, I have met some of the best Sunday School volunteers that anyone can meet or be a part of in their lives. For me, that was a huge part of my experience as a Sunday School teacher.

Why did I get involved? Very simple, really. My oldest daughter was about 3 1/2 years old and we were back in Wisconsin where I grew up. While at church, Zoe's Nouna wanted to take her up for Communion. As they were walking up, my child decided to scream bloody murder while I am looking at them in awe. I saw other kids the same age walking up so reverently and my first thought and/or feeling was embarrassment. Needless to say, after the screaming and me going up to the line to take her hand so we could both walk her up together, Zoe took her Holy Communion. When the service ended and we walked up for our anditheron, the priest said to me..."You don't bring her to church enough." I walked away a little angry and embarrassed, but Father E was absolutely right! So, when I came home from that trip I met Juli Pritsos and Kalli Schneider and was HOOKED into Sunday School and Holy Trinity!;) Thank you, Ladies!

I started teaching Sunday School with the 5th and 6th grades, eventually graduating to the 7th and 8th grade. I have had a blast the entire time! I cannot even explain the feeling I have when I see so many of these kids that now are in their mid-late 20s. I think "WOW!" they are here going to church and are involved in our church. That, to me, is the BEST feeling! Yes! I can tell you that the generation has changed but many of the classroom discussions have stayed the same. There definitely is a lot more media to go around these kids and with so much more of that today, we need God's help to place his arms around these kids even tighter.

A quote that I have used throughout the years in my class has been, "We are all Fisherman amongst men". I hope that all my students past and present can remember that discussion. For me, I believe this so strongly as I think of my experience as a Sunday School teacher. To be able to toss out God's net into the classroom and try to catch as many "Fish" as I can. I am happy and blessed to say that I have caught quite a few!

The BEST conversations with all of your kids has been to read the Gospel that was written thousands of years ago and still relate the message into today's world, your children's world. So many GREAT stories and all in ONE BOOK! If I have learned anything, it has been learning it through new eyes, here at Holy Trinity on Sundays with these kids. Holy Trinity has GREAT kids and I can't wait to watch them grow and be the Orthodox Christians that they are meant to be.

Nothing could have worked out better for me than to volunteer for the Sunday school ministry and relearn God's word alongside these awesome kids! I mean all the kids, past, present and future! Please think and pray about volunteering for this ministry. You will be amazed at how much more you can do and learn!

May Holy Days:

There is NO fasting and there are NO prostrations this week, as we stand with our Risen Christ in celebration.

May 3rd—Theotokos of the Life-giving Font: the title refers to a spring near Constantinople in which many healings took place, attributed to the Theotokos. Although the church in her honor was destroyed in 1821 by the Turks, the fountain remained, and in 1833 a new Church was built.

May 5th—Thomas Sunday: where our Resurrected Christ appears again to His Apostles and Thomas calls Him "My Lord and My God," removing any lingering doubts that Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior IS God!

May 12th—Sunday of the Myrrh-Bearing Women: the women set out early in the morning, bearing spices with which to anoint the body of Jesus. They don't know how they will be able to roll away the great stone before His tomb, but they go anyway. We also must trust in our belief and "set out" to seek Our Lord, no matter the unknown obstacles we may encounter. The women do not go empty-handed but carry spices for their Lord. So, too, can we carry an offering of our belief, and of our prayers.

This is also Mothers' Day. What greater gift for our Mother than to be in Church worshipping with her?

May 19th—Sunday of the Paralytic: although this miracle occurred in the early days of Christ's ministry, we remember it here because it reminds us that only Christ, Who raised *Himself* from the dead, has the power and authority to heal humanity.

May 21st—SS. Constantine & Helen, Equal to the Apostles

May 22nd—Mid-Pentecost: we are already halfway to Holy Pentecost, when we begin kneeling once more.


May 26th—Sunday of the Samaritan Woman: at first glance this meeting of Jesus with the woman who drew Him water from the well seems to have no connection to the Resurrection. Yet, this Sunday is the Sunday after Mid-Pentecost, or the "middle of the feast," and in another Gospel reading it is in the "middle of the feast" that Jesus preaches about the Living Water, referring to the out-pouring of the Holy Spirit. Here, Christ, through His Resurrection, is leading us to "Jacob's well" of the Holy spirit descending upon the Apostles (and each of us) on Pentecost.






