Message from Father Apostolos

Emerging



I have never been a fan of the pop-rock band "The Grateful Dead." I never "got" their music and at the risk of offending any "Dead-heads," as their fans are known, I've never been impressed with their material. Still, I am aware of at least one airworthy tune with the well-worn lyric "what a long strange trip it's been."

What a long strange trip, indeed! Our last public worship service occurred at the 2nd Sunday of Great Lent four months ago! Since then, ZOOM meetings and Facebook liturgies, "COVID-hair," and the dreaded "COVID-19" (pounds) have become a new 'normal." (ugh!) But there are hopeful signs that a resumption of public worship may be at hand.

We will begin offering Holy Communion again on Sunday, August 2nd after the live-streaming Divine Liturgy. Those wishing to receive must be present when the

doors to the Cathedral are opened at 10:30. Holy Communion will be offered for about 30 minutes.

All those entering the Church are required to wear a face mask and to follow the friendly instructions from our helpful Parish Council and staff members. Once you have received the Holy Gifts, please follow the blue arrows on the floor to the north and south transept doors to return to your vehicles. Holy Communion will again be offered on Sunday, August 9th at the conclusion of the live-streaming Divine Liturgy at 10:30.

We intend to return to limited public worship on Sunday, August 16th so long as two virus-related parameters continue to improve; an ICU bed capacity remaining below 90% and the county infection rate below the current level of 13%. If either of these parameters worsen, we will again consult with our Orthodox clinical advisory board for direction.


Our resumption of public worship on the 16th of August is open to those first 50 souls who have previously registered for our hoped-for return in June. Those remaining 50 souls will be automatically registered for the liturgy on the 23rd of August. We ask that this not become a race and that we remain considerate of each other so that all our parish families have an opportunity to attend these initial limited worship services.

Those wishing to receive Holy Communion without reservations to attend a Sunday service may still arrive at the conclusion of the Divine Liturgy to receive. Those who are 65-70 or older or who are in any way immuno-compromised are strongly encouraged to instead attend the services reserved for this group. (Details forthcoming.) if anyone is not feeling well or is caring for an afflicted family member, they must stay home... duh!

For those of you long awaiting Holy Confession, please be present at 10:00 AM on Saturday, August 1st after the Divine Liturgy and I will hear the confessions of those assembled at that time. Similar opportunities for Confession will be offered frequently thereafter. If you have been patiently waiting for your baby's 40-day Churching or Baptism, please call me so we can make those arrangements. As we emerge from our long exile from the parish, what might we expect at Holy Trinity for the remainder of 2020? Online ministries like Bible Studies, weekday services, reflections, and Catechism classes will continue and expand, facilitating participation for those with limited mobility. Last Sunday's inaugural ZOOM Coffee Hour fellowship from 11:00 to Noon allowed participants to reconnect with each other and will be offered after every Sunday liturgy.

Our weekly Orthodox Christian Fellowship (OCF) college ministry meetings will be online via ZOOM, allowing Orthodox college students on every Arizona campus to participate easily! My daily 3:00 PM Instagram kids' program (I really need a name for that!) continues to attract wee ones who like to color and build LEGO creations with me as we learn about our Orthodox faith together.

Our sterling Parish Council has conducted weekly conference calls these last four months, energetically and effectively managing the affairs of the parish (check out the list of completed maintenance items in this edition!) and coordinating our efforts to keep the Holy Trinity family informed and connected! (Great job, team!)

In three-dimensional space, we intend to make the most of our opportunity for public worship and activities in the weeks ahead. We will be offering numerous weekly services, including outdoor services on the veranda adjacent the Speros Center once the summer heat dissipates! You may have the chance to experience an All Saints Camp outdoor liturgy if the virus persists and indoor worship becomes limited again!

Youth ministry events in the fall (with masks, clean hands, and physically distanced!) will also move outdoors to enable our young ones the person-to-person fellowship they (and we!) certainly need. Thank God, we have a sprawling and beautiful campus which affords us many options for worship, meeting, and fellowship spaces. Our only limitation is our creativity and our willingness to be patient and flexible! Presently, there can be no indoor meetings as such for any of our parish ministries until we receive the green light from our Metropolis.

I have learned through this extended period of exile that Holy Trinity is tough, resilient, patient, and wise. We've been through challenges before and weathered them through our faith in Jesus Christ and our firm devotion to each other. Our mettle will again be tested and strengthened in the weeks and months ahead until a solution is found to the virus. The cancellation of our annual Greek Festival presents an opportunity for us to demonstrate our commitment to the Cathedral in our stewardship offerings.

As the family of God at Holy Trinity, we will find numerous avenues to exhibit our love for Jesus Christ by meeting the needs of parish families impacted by the virus which has claimed its first victim in our parish family and which has afflicted many HT families. We are not immune to its effects but we have each other for support, prayer, encouragement, and material assistance. Our "Round the Clock Prayer Chain" ministry (Check our Cathedral website for details) allows us to come together in prayer as a parish family to intercede for the needs of the parish, our city, and the world.

Our collective efforts in this historic time will write a legacy of faith and action which our grandchildren may remember decades from now in reverent tones. Now is the time for the greatness of this Cathedral to be unveiled! May Almighty God give us the grace and the strength to rise to this challenge as the people of God and as members of the Holy Trinity family!

SOON Welcome Back!

Watch for updates. Once there's the "Go-Ahead" then follow these instructions:

Welcome Back to Holy Trinity Cathedral!

It is with great pleasure that we announce the soon-to-be reopening of our beloved Cathedral! We do so, using an abundance of caution and copious preparations to keep everyone safe and healthy. Fully reopening the parish will occur utilizing a "phased-in" approach. We will begin at Phase 1 allowing for no greater than 50 participants. The phases of reopening are being conducted in accordance with guidelines from our Metropolis as well as the CDC, Arizona Department of Health, and the Arizona Governor's Office.

Divine Liturgy services will resume at 9:30am. Date to be announced.

(There will not be Orthros services during Phase 1)

The Feast of the Dormition of the Theotokos on Saturday, August 15th will be opened to our "seasoned" members 65 years and up and for any with compromised immune systems. The doors will be opened at 8:45am for the beginning of the Divine Liturgy at 9:00am for this group.

Here is What to Expect...

Prior to Your Arrival:

Registration is Required – We can only allow 50 people inside the church per service. Therefore, each family must make a reservation to secure a seat by going to:
 https://tinyurl.com/HTLiturgy and filling out the required information. Each family member's name who will be attending church must be included on the list.

We have reserved a few spots **only** for our parishioners who are not comfortable with technology. Those people may call the church office at 602-264-7863 and speak with Diana Camacho or leave a message on the machine to secure their reservation. Please include first and last name, how many people from your household will be attending, the date of the church service, and a return phone number.

For the Sunday services registrations must be made no later than noon on the Friday preceding each Sunday. Reservations may be made for only one Sunday at a time. Only family members residing in the same household will be seated together.

- Stay Home if III If you or a family member is feeling ill, please stay home. Also, please stay at home if you or a family member in your household has been exposed to someone diagnosed with Covid19 within the past 2 weeks.
- Take Your Temperature Please take your temperature at home before coming to church. Epidemiologists recommend anyone with a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher stay home.

- Bring a Face Covering or Mask We ask each person to arrive with your own face covering or mask and it must be worn upon entering the church and the entire duration of being inside the Cathedral.
- Download the Divine Liturgy All service books, prayers and bulletins have been removed from the pews. For those who wish to follow along, please download the Liturgy www.goarch.org/chapel. The Liturgy can be downloaded in either Greek or English.



Upon Your Arrival:

- **Social Distance Greetings** Please remain at least 6' away from others at all times. This includes 6' to the front, back, left, and right. Please refrain from embracing or touching other parishioners. Remember, this is not just for your safety but for the safety of your fellow parishioners.
- **Please use Hand Sanitizer** Please use hand sanitizer prior to entering the Cathedral. Hand sanitizer stations will be available for use outside the Cathedral.
- **Follow the Signs** Signage will direct you once you arrive. Please follow the signs and arrows placed on the ground and throughout the Cathedral.
- Let us Guide You Your Parish Council members will be on duty to seat, guide, and direct you. Please follow directions and instructions from your Parish Council members. Remember to please be patient as we will be seating families together using social distancing measures.
- Candles and Donations You can still light a candle in the Narthex and leave a donation, however, candles will be distributed to parishioners by the Parish Council members. Other donations or stewardship contributions can be placed in these baskets as well.
- **Venerating Icons** Upon entering the Narthex, please refrain from using physical contact when venerating the icons.

During Liturgy:

- No Trays Will be Passed We will not pass the offering trays during the service. We ask parishioners who wish to make their regular stewardship contribution or wish to make a donation, to please do so in the candle offering trays in the Narthex.
- Communion Communion will be offered at the very end of Liturgy for those who are prepared to and wish to receive. As always, rows will be released by Parish Council members. Parishioners are asked to stay a minimum of 6' apart from one another while waiting in line to receive communion. Please remain on the lines that are placed on the carpet down the center aisle. As you approach the chalice, place your hands over your chest, tilt your head back and Father will distribute communion in your mouth. Do not touch the spoon or cloth. Once you receive communion you will be directed by the Parish Council to one of the side doors to exit the church and proceed to your car. Please be prepared to not return to your pew once you receive communion. Antidoran will not be distributed during Phase 1. Parishioners who do not receive communion will be instructed to leave following communion through the side doors.

- **Using the Restrooms** Please use caution when using the restrooms in the Cathedral as they are small and have tight quarters. Please thoroughly wash hands and keep 6' apart from others.
- Paperless Worship All Liturgical books and prayers have been removed from the pews. Please feel free to follow along with the Liturgy on your cell phone.

Upon Your Departure:



RESUMING PUBLIC WORSHIP

The Feast of the Dormition of the Theotokos on Saturday, August 15 will be opened to our "seasoned" members 65 years and up and for any with compromised immune systems. The doors will be opened at 8:45 for the beginning of the Divine Liturgy at 9:00 AM for this group.

Our first public Sunday Divine Liturgy will take place the next day, Sunday August 16th for the first 50 members who previously registered to attend the aborted service mid-June. 





St. Nectarios Books & Beyond

The month of August celebrates the Dormition of the Theotokos.



The Feast of the Dormition of Our Most Holy Lady, the Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary is celebrated on August 15 each year. The Feast commemorates the repose (dormition and in the Greek kimisis) or "falling-asleep" of the Mother of Jesus Christ, our Lord. The Feast also commemorates the translation or assumption into heaven of the body of the Theotokos.

At the time of her death, the disciples of our Lord who were preaching throughout the world returned to Jerusalem to see the Theotokos. Except for the Apostle Thomas, all of them including the Apostle Paul were gathered together at her bedside. At the moment of her death, Jesus Christ himself descended and carried her soul into heaven.

Following her repose, the body of the Theotokos was taken in procession and laid in a tomb near the Garden of Gethsemane. When the Apostle Thomas arrived three days after her repose and desired to

see her body, the tomb was found to be empty. The bodily assumption of the Theotokos was confirmed by the message of an angel and by her appearance to the Apostles.

This great Feast of the Church and the icon celebrates a fundamental teaching of our faith—the Resurrection of the body. In the case of the Theotokos, this has been accomplished by the divine will of God. Thus, this Feast is a feast of hope, hope in Resurrection and life eternal. Like those who gathered around the body of the Virgin Mary, we gather around our departed loved ones and commend their souls into the hands of Christ. As we remember those who have reposed in the faith before us and have passed on into the communion of the Saints, we prepare ourselves to one day be received into the new life of the age to come.





Security Grant Award

Our Holy Trinity Community has been awarded a \$100,000 grant from the US Dept of Homeland Security. These funds are awarded to improve overall security of our Cathedral and campus buildings. Thanks to Phyllis Mack (Bette Maniatis' niece) and her friend Cam Kowal for completing the government application for Holy Trinity. 


