

Message from Father Apostolos

Morning Prayers



As the COVID crisis emerged, I felt prompted to open a forum on Instagram Live for daily prayers and for short encouragements. My morning prayers include two small prayers from St. Philaret of Moscow and from the Holy Elders of the Optina Monastery; short prayers which contain simple and yet profound insights into the Life in Christ.

St. Philaret perfectly describes how ill-equipped we often feel when we approach God in prayer, writing; "I know not what I ought to ask of You... for a cross I dare not ask, nor for consolation, I dare only to stand in Your presence."

And the Optina Elders end their glowing prayer of perfect humility with this line; "Guide my will and teach me to pray, to believe, to hope, to suffer, to forgive and to love." These twin statements bracket for us the essential meaning

of the holy season of the Cross we now enter in this new month of September.

It is natural for us to imagine grandiose and heroic sacrifices when we encounter the Holy Cross of Christ. Our imaginations run to gripping accounts of the Holy Martyrs whose self-offering light the path that leads us to the Heavenly Kingdom. But the Way of the Cross for most of us will be far less dramatic and, hence, easily overlooked.

These last several months have thrown many challenges in our paths, some truly monumental as for those afflicted with the COVID virus, those whose lives were claimed by it and their family members who now grieve the untimely passing of their loved ones. Others have lost businesses and livelihoods and now struggle to provide for themselves and their families with roughly a third of Americans now unable to make rent of mortgage payments.

But for a great many of us, no such sacrifices have been asked. Our challenges have involved making smaller offerings; missing the Divine Services as our parishes were shuttered to help contain the virus' spread, adhering to and embracing the hygienic protocols established to thwart its rapid spread, and remaining home throughout various periods of curfews and lockdowns.

As St. Philaret's prayer records, we "dare not ask for a cross," but we find ourselves bearing one anyway. Indeed, to be a follower of and a believer in Jesus Christ requires this. "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me" are the introductory words read over every living soul brought into the Orthodox Church through holy baptism and chrismation. A life without a cross is not a Christian life.

Yet we are gravely challenged in the hubris of our times and the voices which whisper to us that all suffering is bad and must be avoided and where shameless hucksters and false preachers delude the unwary with promises of cheap grace and a painless life filled with material abundance. Seduced by such illicit messages, we may find ourselves filled with bitterness and outrage when the unavoidable sufferings common to all of humanity appear.

And as the Optina Elders so eloquently pray, we too must ask God to "guide our will," and to "teach us

how to suffer" in the challenges which lie ahead as the various crises, of which the virus is only one, rake our landscape. Holy Scripture contains numerous encouragements and warnings that suffering cannot be avoided, as in Jesus' declaration, "In this world you will have tribulation, but be of good cheer for I have overcome the world."

Only in the Light of the Cross can suffering become for us a means of redemption and salvation. Only by perceiving in the Holy Cross of Christ the dagger thrust into the earth which stabbed the heart of the kingdom of Hades can our "light, momentary afflictions" as St. Paul described them, be filled with light and joy and meaning.



How we experience whatever further sacrifices we may be called upon to make will depend upon the presence or absence of this "Cross mentality" in our hearts. With humility, patience, and contrition, our suffering can "produce within us far more eternal weight of glory," as St. Paul wrote.

Without this "Cross mentality" residing in our hearts, our unchallenged pride will blanche at the merest inconvenience as we descend into childish sloganeering, trumpeting our rights and blind to the suffering of others. But embraced with purity of heart, the Holy Cross of Christ is the weapon against which the forces of darkness cannot prevail.

We "dare not ask for a cross," but we can submit to carry the one assigned to us, confident that we do not carry it alone, but with the strength and grace of the One who carried His for the salvation of all.



The Holy Trinity Endowment Fund was established in 1992 with an initial deposit of \$2,000. The goal was to build the Endowment Fund whereby the interest and appreciation would one day provide sufficient income so Holy Trinity would no longer be totally dependent on an annual festival to supplement stewardship income.








St. Nectarios Books & Beyond

The month of September gives us the opportunity to celebrate the Feast of the Universal Exaltation of the Precious and Life-Giving Cross

Commemorated on September 14





The Feast commemorates the finding of the True Cross of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ by Saint Helen, the mother of the Emperor Constantine.

In the twentieth year of his reign (326), the Emperor Constantine sent his mother Saint Helen to Jerusalem to venerate the holy places and to find the site of the Holy Sepulchre and of the Cross. Relying upon the oral tradition of the faithful, Saint Helen found the precious Cross together with the crosses of the two thieves crucified with our Lord. However, Helen had no way of determining which was the Cross of Christ.

With the healing of a dying woman who touched one of the crosses, Patriarch Macarius of Jerusalem identified the True Cross of Christ. Saint Helen and her court venerated the Precious and Life-Giving Cross along with many others who came to see this great instrument of Redemption.

The Patriarch mounted the ambo (pulpit) and lifted the Cross with both hands so that all of the people gathered could see it.

The crowd responded with "Lord have mercy".


This became the occasion of the institution in all of the Churches of the Exaltation of the Precious Cross, not only in memory of the event of the finding of the Cross, but also to celebrate how an instrument of shame was used to overcome death and bring salvation and eternal life.

The Feast is an opportunity outside of the observances of Holy Week to celebrate the full significance of the victory of the Cross over the powers of the world, and the triumph of the wisdom of God through the Cross over the wisdom of this world. This Feast also gives the Church an opportunity to relish the full glory of the Cross as a source of light, hope and victory for Christ's people. It is also a time to celebrate the universality of the work of redemption accomplished through the Cross: the entire universe is seen through the light of the Cross, the new Tree of Life which provides nourishment for those who have been redeemed in Christ.

FAMILY CULTURAL NIGHT






